



Cloud Seeding Operations Sum- mary For Aug. 18 - Aug. 24, 2025

BISMARCK, N.D. — South-
western North Dakota experi-
enced a hot and dry start to last
week with high temperatures
approaching 100 degrees. Mild-
er temperatures in the 70s and
dry conditions arrived in time for
the weekend.

In the District 1 operations
area, which includes Bowman
and part of Slope Counties, one
hail suppression seeding flight
and one reposition flight were
flown last week. Rain enhance-
ment operations remained sus-
pended.

This week, southwestern
North Dakota should see a con-
tinuation of milder temperatures
and dry conditions during the
work week and then a chance
for showers and thunderstorms
arrives by the weekend.

Radar facilities in Bowman
operate around the clock during
the NDCMP. Radar images can
be viewed on the Department

of Water Resources' web site
at <http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb>.
The NDCMP will be extended to
September 8 due to wet condi-
tions delaying harvest.

BEEKEEPING 101

Have you been "itching" to
learn more about honey bees?

and planting to encourage bees

of honey bees within the hive,
how workers know what their
job is, communication within the
hive and the different races of
bees available. Learn when and

where to purchase bees and
how to place them in your hive.
In the Equipment and Tools
section, you will learn about the
components of the Langstroth
hive and how it fits together
and you'll learn the tools of the
trade and why we use them
in bee keeping. Gardening
for pollinators is important to
encourage honey bees and
other pollinators into your
garden to ensure you have a
successful fruit set. Finally, you
will learn what the top pitfalls are
for a new beekeeper and how to
avoid them.

come and appreciated.






"Salute To Farmers & Ranchers"

One careful footstep after the other, I recently walked into a field of agriculture that was standing up proud and soon to be harvested. Everywhere I drive in this beautiful rural part of America, the 'World of Agriculture' is all around me, and that's always GOOD ENOUGH for me! The 'Farms & Ranches' are not hidden; they are in plain sight. Yet, how often do I really think about the complex nature of the agricultural process as it actually operates? Every day, I should recognize and express gratitude to the "Farmers & Ranchers" for their hard work in helping to supply the food that I can simply buy by driving to my preferred grocery store of choice. "Talk about a no-brainer."

The practice of 'Farming & Ranching' may at first sight appear straightforward: plant a seed crop or replant a hay field, let nature water it (or NOT), and watch it develop, sadly or with a welcomed spirit. But when I slowly and gently walked further into the field, I came to understand that 'Farming & Ranching' is anything but straightforward. It requires a careful balancing act between science, dedication, determination, and generations of hard-earned wisdom passed down through generations. "Salute To Farmers & Ranchers" :)

The complexity of each stage of the 'Farming & Ranching' business in 'Today's Agricultural World' is nonetheless an unexpected journey year after year, to say the least. Choosing the best production seeds, managing the land's soil, the health among the livestock, the seemingly never-ending, complicated governmental regulations and procedures (often known as "RED TAPE"), and the necessary daily/monthly bottom-line financial records and plans. Many considerations must be taken into account by 'Farmers & Ranchers,' each of which is essential to their long-term success.

In addition to analyzing soil samples to verify that their field soils contain the right nutrients. 'Farmers & Ranchers' maintain a well-managed yet productive relationship with their livestock. They have to constantly adjust their operations based on weather forecasts. There is no

one-size-fits-all strategy; each season presents unique difficulties, each field crop has unique requirements, and the livestock also have their demands, like clean drinkable water, good quality hay, and sufficient pasture land. 



Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We continue today to consider the verse we began last time, 1 Peter 2:15: "For this is the will of God, that by doing good you may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men." We saw that the word "this" refers to God's Word. Instead of basing our beliefs upon any uncertain foundation which originates with the fallible ideas of men, let us learn to confidently anchor our hearts and minds in the truth of Scripture. For then, says the apostle Paul in Ephesians 4:14, we will "no longer be carried about with every wind of doctrine."

The last half of the verse shows what happens when believers do live by God's Word. Peter says "that by doing good you may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men." He is telling us that by doing good, believers may silence those who ignorantly attack Biblical Christianity. The word "good" here is synonymous with "the will of God," mentioned in the first part of the verse. And so, when Peter tells us here to do good, he means that we are to live in accordance with the instructions of the Word of God.

There are two parts to the testimony of a believer in Jesus Christ. It is necessary that believers witness by words. It is essential to tell people how they can be restored to a right relationship with God by placing their trust in Christ alone, whose payment for sin on the cross completely satisfied God the Father. The gospel has definite content, and this must be explained to people so that they will know what they must believe in order to be saved. But Peter here is focusing on another way that Christians wit-

ness to others, and that is by the way we live. The godly life of a believer gives undeniable credibility to the gospel. There are many people who are looking for ways to discredit Christianity. Why? Because those who live by and proclaim the gospel are a constant source of irritation for people who are wanting to live any way they please. The godly life of a believer illustrates what God requires, and many people don't like to be reminded of that. That is why many believers throughout history have suffered persecution. In the early days of Christianity, there were great persecutions against the believers by the Roman Empire. Yet there were repeated testimonies from unbelievers admitting that the believers had amazingly transformed lives and were some of the most loving, caring, hardworking, law-abiding, and helpful people in the whole Empire. One of the reasons why a godly life is so useful in silencing critics and in causing others to consider Christianity is that this proves what the gospel claims. The gospel claims to be much more than a set of beliefs. Oh,

make no mistake about it, the gospel is a set of beliefs. All Christians ought to be diligent students of the Bible and know what they believe. But the Christian is one who has been given new life by the Holy Spirit, which then leads a person to believe on Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. That one has become a new creation in Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17).

Critics can claim all sorts of arguments against Christianity. But the changed lives of God's people they cannot deny. When they see those who were foul-mouthed or unkind or drunkards or drug abusers or lazy or immoral or dishonest or lawless becoming loving and faithful and pure and law-abiding and honest, what can they say? They certainly cannot say that Christianity has hurt them.

Christians, let us realize what responsibilities and privileges are ours. We represent the Lord Jesus Christ in this world. Let us seek to so live that we silence the critics, and God willing, be used to lead them to new life in Jesus Christ.

The brand that has been around for over 55 years decided that removing the man sitting beside the cracker barrel was the reason that they are not attracting younger people to their restaurant. The origin of the cracker barrel dates back to the days when food had to be shipped long distances. Crackers were shipped in barrels to country stores throughout the late 19th and early 20th centuries as a way to preserve them and keep them fresh, but this practice started to decline around the late 19th century as Adolphus Green began boxing crackers as Uneeda Biscuits, a precursor to modern packaging. The term 'cracker barrel' itself comes from these barrels of crackers that served as gathering spots for customers to chat and play games like checkers. The well-

known restaurant chain, Cracker Barrel, adopted its name from this tradition, as the owner wanted to create a warm, rustic atmosphere reminiscent of those old country stores where people gathered around the cracker barrels.

The restaurant chain has long been known for it's family atmosphere, catering to a group of people that wanted some of the down-home type food often found on the family table. The decorations were items found on farms and in houses of the 19th and early 20th century, mostly recognized by the older generation. It featured a game on the table to take up some of the wait time until your meal showed up, which was a bit different from

It also featured the iconic wooden rockers at the entrance, and had a lot of items for sale to browse through before or after your meal, and I would imagine that there were more than a few people that picked up some of the old fashioned candy from their youth. The chain indicates that this will not change, but the more they try to change for a different clientele, the more they may drive away some of the most loyal group, the older customers that have been patronizing them for years.

2 T. butter
2 T. Worcestershire sauce
1/4 c. brown sugar
2 T. vinegar
2 tsp. lemon juice
Pepper and Salt, to taste
1/2 tsp. garlic powder
1 tsp. dry mustard
1 1/2 c. water
1 c. catsup
