BISMARCK, N.D. — Mainly
dry conditions and above aver-
age temperatures in the upper
80s to low 90s made for good
harvesting weather in south-
western North Dakota last
week.

In the District 1 operations
area, which includes Bowman
and part of Slope Counties, one
seeding flight was flown last
week. Rain enhancement oper-
ations were suspended last
week due to the ongoing har-
vest.

A cool down is in store for
southwestern North Dakota
this week. High temperatures
should hover in the 70s during
the work week with low 80-de-
gree highs returning by the
weekend. Thunderstorms make
a brief appearance at the begin-
ning of this week and then dry
conditions are again forecast to
return.

Radar facilities in Bowman
operate around the clock during
the NDCMP. Radar images can
be viewed on the Atmospheric
Resource Board's web site at
<http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb>. The
NDCMP will continue through
the end of August.

Alzheimer's Association introduces new Empowered Caregiver live broadcasts in North Dakota throughout September

BISMARCK, ND (August 14, 2024) – The Alzheimer's Association Minnesota-North Dakota chapter is partnering with local organizations throughout south-west North Dakota on a four-part class series for dementia caregivers. 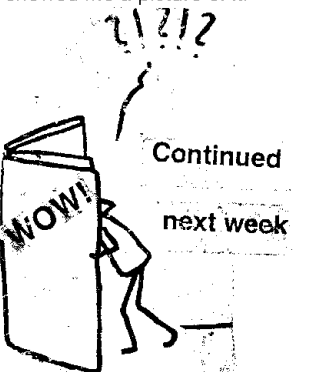
"Sweety, my knees hurt me so bad I can hardly stand on the ground. I don't know how I'd stand on the ice."

Be Careful How you Make Vows to God

Pastor Julian Burgess - Western Plains Baptist Church

As we are looking in Judges this week, we have come thru the era and time of Moses. Moses was that guy that God would talk to face to face and had a very open relationship that had never been before or after him. Then at the death of Moses Joshua became the leader of the Children of Israel and led them into the Promise land. Joshua was a very faithful and obedient servant of God. But, like Moses he had his moments that he disappointed God like we do today. The good part is that God does not call us into perfection, but, obedience.

In the Book of Judges God used different men and women to lead His people and get them out of bondage where He had sent them for disobedience. Judges 10:10 and the children of Israel cried out to the Lord saying, We have sinned against You, because we have both forsaken our God and served the baals. God had to listen to Israel often cry out to Him for their disobedience to Him. Just like Israel did to Moses when he led the people of Israel. They would be disobedient to God and then, they expected Moses to go to God and ask God to forgive them and make it all better. But, God from time to time told Israel no. Judges 10:13 therefore I will deliver you no more. Go and cry out to the gods which you have chosen; let them deliver you in your time of distress. The thing here is, God loved Israel so much, Judges 10:16 so they put away their foreign gods from among them and served the Lord. And His soul could no longer endure the misery of Israel. The Judge we are looking at today is Jephthah beginning in Chapter 11:1. He was a Gileadite and a mighty man of valor, but he was the son of a harlot. This is not the first time that God used a harlot to be about His business.

As people today our biggest downfall is the way we look at people. We judge others by all kinds of different ways. Where they live, the way they dress, the kind of car they drive on and on. God looks at the heart, and could care less about their outward appearance. That is kinda the way people judged Jephthah, as an outcast and denied to be part of the family inheritance. So he left the home town till the people were in bondage again and the folks of his home town Gilead wanted him to lead them. Judges 11:8 and the elders of Gilead said to Jephthah, that this is why we have turned again to you now, that you may go with us and fight against the people of Ammon, and be our head over

all the inhabitants of Gilead. God was with Jephthah and He was the one that God had for the job this time. God had already chosen Jephthah to lead the people, but Jephthah just had to have the last word.

Judges 11:30 and Jephthah made a vow to the Lord, and said, If you will indeed deliver the people of Ammon into my hands, then it will be that whatever comes out of the doors of my house to meet me when I return in peace from the people of Ammon, shall surely be the Lord's, and I will offer it up as a burnt offering. His daughter that he loved very much and his only child daughter or son was the first thing out of his house to meet him after defeating Ammon. It is unclear how she was sacrificed, but most believe that she was consecrated to the Lord and died a virgin never married and never had children. The lineage of her father stopped with her. Jephthah did not think when he made his vow to God that his daughter could come out the door first. In his day it could have been a goat, lamb, chicken or some other animal, he let his arrogance get the best of him and it cost him. God was going to honor Jephthah obedience and God was going to use him to free Israel. His obedience to God was all he needed to do and not say a word.

Ecclesiastes 5:4-5 when you make a vow to God, do not delay to pay it. For He has no pleasure in fools. Pay what you have vowed. Better not to vow than to vow and not pay. God honors His promises in the Bible and He expects us to honor what we say. When God calls us to do something for Him, He is not gonna ask but once. If you say yes to Him, better be intending to be obedient to that call. Sadly, we make God promises all the time that we do not keep. Just like 9-11 and the Towers fell that day, Church doors were left open 24 hours a day so people could go and Pray. Now, all these years later, people done forgot all about that like it never happened and barely remember who God is.

God puts things in the Bible for a reason. He gives us instructions on how to live this life and how to make the right decisions. Sad though, today most people will not Pray nor pick up the Bible and read it, they just do not have time, that is unless there is a tragedy and then they treat Jesus like a jannie, rub His head and get a wish and back in the bottle till the next time. Jesus is a relationship. Through a daily Prayer time and through a daily time of Bible reading and study we strengthen our relationship with Jesus daily.

If you're looking for "Something, Old, New or Repurposed" the Red Barn Studio, Prairie Pearl, 200 & 9 or Cow Chip Creations are what you're looking for. These quaint little stores can be found around the area. The Red Barn Studio, 1278 52nd Ave SW- Hazen, The Rural Pearl, 200 & 9, 321 9th Ave NW - Hazen and Cow Chip Creations is right in your backyard at 152nd Ave SW- Bowman all are on Facebook.

A few weeks ago Dave and I visited the Red Barn Studio a few miles south of Hazen, North Dakota, owned by Lynell and Daryl Tagestad. The Red Barn Studio is what Lynell referred to as an "Occasional Market," Open 1-2 weekends May thru October since 2021.

Prior to opening the Red Barn, Lynell was a wedding decorator and used the barn for storage; eventually her Daughter took over the business. The empty barn stared Lynell in the face wondering what was next. Lynell had always been crafty and thought it was time to branch out.

The barn was a working barn and needed much cleaning and updating. The siding and roof had already been done now it was time to roll up her sleeves and scrub ceilings and walls. With the help of Daryl and other family the beams were painted, walls sanded and oiled and the floor painted. The process took most of a summer to complete and the end result was a rustic, artsy space now known as the Red Barn Studio.

The Red Barn Studio is now stocked with repurposed items, painted furniture, antiques and the like. Lynell and Daryl find most of their items at thrift stores, garage/rummage, and estate sales and on-line auctions. To-date Lynell has never been to an actual auction sale! Their travels have taken them across North Dakota, Montana, South Dakota and Minnesota.

Lynell posts pictures weekly on Facebook and dates she's open. If you see an items pictured on Facebook Lynell will set it aside for you. Customers

come from across the state and country with many repeat customers. By keeping her prices reasonable it's easy to see why pickup loads of merchandise were headed to a new home.

As we walked around the barn a tall man came up and asked, "Is your name Dave, Dave Hernandez?" As it turned out Lynell's Husband Daryl worked with Dave over 30 years ago: They both worked for USDA-Soil Conservation Service and spent the rest of the time reminiscing.

In the first few verses of 1 Peter 1, we have seen that the apostle Peter is seeking to encourage believers who are experiencing afflictions. Last time we saw his reminder that for the Christian, suffering is temporary. That brings us to a further point which Peter makes to help us put sufferings into the right perspective. He tells us a great purpose for them 1 Peter 1:7: "that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ." Here Peter states that the believer's sufferings demonstrate that his or her faith is genuine. He likens the purifying of the believer's faith to the process of purifying gold. Most precious metals are mined from the earth in the form of raw ore, which is very impure. Raw gold ore must be melted

to the point where it turns to liquid. The impurities will then rise to the top, where they can be skimmed off.

In like manner, God causes His people to become more holy, more like Christ, by trials. Sufferings in the believer's life are intended to have a beneficial and not a harmful purpose. How often have believers undergoing hardships asked, "Why is God letting this happen to me?" The implication is that God must be angry and have some sort of punishment in mind by allowing such a thing to happen. But that is not the case. Though the sufferings themselves are painful, God's purpose is to accomplish good in the lives of His children. Peter's analogy of the process of purifying gold by fire indicates that sufferings are often very painful and intense. Gold does not begin to melt until heated to a temperature in excess of 1,975 degrees Fahrenheit. And yet, look at the results. When all the impurities are removed, gold is beautiful and has great value. In the same way, we might say that God is "turning up the heat" in the lives of His people in order to purify them.


Friends, there is a popular false teaching that the life of a believer in Christ should always go smoothly. Some false teachers actually say that if a person is not experiencing health, wealth, and prosperity, his or her faith must be deficient. See what God's Word tells us in Hebrews 6:8-11: "For whom the LORD loves He chastens, and scourges every son whom He receives. If you endure chastening, God deals with you as with sons; for what son is there whom a father does not chasten? But if you are without chastening, of which all have become partakers, then you are illegitimate and not sons. Furthermore, we have had human fathers who corrected us, and we paid them respect. Shall we not much more readily be in subjection to the Father of spirits and live? For they indeed for a few days chastened us as seemed best to them, but He for our profit, that we may be partakers of His holiness. Now no chastening seems to be joyful for the present, but painful; nevertheless, afterward it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it."

It is a great comfort for believers to know that our sufferings, though painful, have a good purpose. Friend, if you have not placed your trust in the Lord Jesus Christ alone for salvation, please go to God in prayer and ask Him to forgive you and make you right with Himself on the basis of Christ's perfect payment for sins on the cross. You will then have the double comfort of knowing that your sufferings are accomplishing a good purpose and that you will spend all eternity with Jesus, where suffering will not exist.
