Scripture offers wisdom for daily living

With so much going on around us today in our families, our communities, and our world, it can be hard to focus. We are distracted by our schedules and our attention is easily highjacked by the barrage of messages screaming at us from a myriad of news and information sources. So how do we stay centered, how to we give our attention to the things that matter-our relationship with God and our relationships with others?

in the fourth chapter of the Apostle Paul's letter to the Philippians, Paul offers us a guide to daily living that helps the peace of God settle on us, over us, in us, and around us. In verse 4 Paul says, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice." When we begin each morning with this simple thought-rejoice in the Lord always-we begin the day focused on our relationship with God. Paul goes on to say, "Let

WORDSMITH

I was in the library reading the blurb (arbitrary coinage) on the new books. This whole book was an oxymorism. What it said was not what it meant and I'm not hip enough to figure out what the real story said ... or didn't say. An oxymorism is a contradiction in consistency. It is an incongruity (Latin: incongruous, lacking harmony.) For instance, no means no in every language, but yes can mean any number of things in every language. People say, 'awfully good' or a 'benevolent tyrant'. How can something be awfully good? How can a tyrant be benevolent?

Oxymorism comes from the Greek meaning 'sharp'. How about 'pretty ugly' or 'together alone'? My father was an uneducated carpenter, but he could make an 'accurate estimate' when he cut a 2X4 with a handsaw that fit 'almost exactly.' How far is a 'close distance? Do you climb down a close distance? It would be 'seriously funny' if you could buy some 'jumbo shrimp'. Did you know that as you age 'you grow shorter?'

A troublesome teenager may be passive-aggressive. (We had a cow one time that fit that oxymorism.) Passive rebellion has two prefixes: pass and re from the Latin passus, that is to step back like one does when he does not want to be noticed, and re. to back up. My mother would say, "that's a double negative'. In passive rebellion, the young person is required to do a specific job such as wash the dishes. She doesn't dislike the job, but she is rebelling against her parent's authority to tell her to wash the dishes. So she stands in front of the sink and plays in the soap suds for as long as she can get away with it. That is passive (no action) rebellion (inactive resistance.)

If a crowd (Old English: crouden) meaning to squeeze, is pressing or squeezing it would have to be more than a few. When the Apostle Paul, speaking about Noah and his family, said they were a few, then a few must be eight which is not a crowd. Revelation speaks of a great crowd so huge that it couldn't be numbered.

The strange thing about the word crowd is that when people are in close proximity it has a negative connotation and is often translated 'mob.' Acts 17:5 & 19:40.

The prefix, di, (Latin, bis) means 'two' or 'twofold' or 'twice'; you know, bi-cycle, biped but ped is a suffix having to do with feet. In Greek, pedon is the ground where feet walk and the walker is a ped-estrian. However, pedrestian can also refer to someone who lacks interest or imagination. He can't see himself walking anywhere and he can't afford a car, so he buys a used bi-cycle that he can ped-al. Same difference? That's an oxymorism.

Cloud Seeding Operations Summary for July 25-31, 2022

BISMARCK, N.D. - A cold front moved through southwestern North Dakota at the beginning of last week bringing a brief round of rain and cooling temperatures until the weekend. There were five operational flights for hail suppression, reconnaissance, or repositioning on July 25 in the Bowman and Slope County project area.

This week looks mainly dry over southwestern North Dakota with above average high temperatures in the 90s to start the month of August. Smoke will likely be noticeable this week from ongoing fires in the western U.S.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at www.dwr.nd.gov/arb.

Participation in the NDCMP was determined through a county-level public process. District 1 is comprised of Bowman County and seven townships in Slope County. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.

"Treehouses Are GOOD For KIDS"

"Treehouses Are GOOD For KIDS" because they help to uncover the true faces of the unobjectionable live surrounding sounds and signs of Nature! Also, while being outside - The SUN's Vitamin D (exposed responsibly) helps a kid's body use phosphorus and calcium to make strong teeth and bones.

Kids' treehouses, known to some children as their playhouse, fort, or hideaway are commonly wood structures built within a tree or several trees, possibly suggesting at least 9 or 10 feet off the ground, though children's safety always has to be considered FIRST. Treehouses are a natural extension of a kid's love of climbing trees.

It's said that treehouses can help reduce stress in a child's life as they adapt to change; such as moving into a new neighborhood or starting a new school year, or sadly adjusting to illness or death in the family.

Treehouse Air is BETTER, I think! It encourages 'Elementary Aged Kids to play Outside MORE' and-less on their household electrical devices, as in watching TV, playing video games, or using a computer or smartphone (cellphone). It's believed that treehouse play helps to build a child's attention span (American Journal of Public Health), and it's also believed that children who play outside more- have better vision (Optometry and Vision Science: The Journal of the American Academy of Optometry).

"Treehouses Are GOOD For KIDS" because they build strength in children by providing them exercise from running and climbing, and help to increase their coordination skills. Treehouses can help to inspire children with courage, spirit, and hope while enjoying their imaginative play, as well as pos-

sibly increase their social skillsshould the neighborhood kids be invited over.

Let me add my two cents worth of opinion. Whether your children have a tiny backyard or their living on an acreage, make room for a treehouse; possibly add with it a swing or two- a cautiously safe climbing rock wall and, or a rope ladder along with stairs. Install a slide, or smooth surfaced sliding board if you'd like. All of my suggestions in this feature article are sincerely meant to promote Kids FUN- but put the children's safety consciously FIRST.

Possibly consider letting your children help you build the treehouse... because doing so can be 'Great Fun' and memorable (pictures/video) for all of you to collectively take part in. Likely, they have not yet constructed anything that could be considered a permanent childhood structure. Allow their young minds to go safely wild, and let their creativity be unleashed to learn new skills as you directly supervise them. The power tools necessary to build a treehouse are dangerous and kids need to learn how to properly use them. You literally can make a real mess of things. Kids can get seriously injured. Kids do not have the skills until (perhaps) later in their teen years to build it. However, there can be no better father-son/daughter time. "Don't forget to include Mom." This is an excellent way to help your children develop some building skills. It teaches planning and precision and will help them build self-confidence. Remember this is a teaching moment and keep both a positive attitude and let them do as much of the work as they are able.

Southwest Healthcare Services seek input from area residents about community's health needs

BOWMAN - In an effort to gauge the overall health needs of Bowman County, Southwest Healthcare Services with Southwestern District Health Unit will survey area residents during an approximately three-week period beginning on August 1st. Results of the survey will provide guidance to local health organizations on ways to improve community health and provide better services. The survey is part of a community health needs assessment initiated by the local hospital and public health unit. They are receiving assistance in conducting the assessment from the Center for Rural Health at the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences.

The local health-related organizations strongly encourage all area residents to participate in the survey. Surveys will be distributed to area residents through various channels, including social media, and at local businesses. Additionally, written copies are available by calling the hospital at (701) 523-5555 or the public health unit at (701) 523-3144. All survey responses are anonymous, and there is no way to track responses back to individuals. Survey responses are returned to the Center for Rural Health to help ensure anonymity. A postage-paid return envelope is included with each written survey. Residents may access

an interactive, online version of the survey at www.tinyurl.com/ CHNABOWMAN2022 . It can also be accessed on Southwest Healthcare Services homepage: www.swhealthcare.net.

The survey will allow local health organizations to learn about community health concerns, learn of the community's perceptions about local health care services being provided, hear suggestions to improve health in the area, learn about community assets and collaboration, and determine preferences for using local health care versus traveling to other facilities. In addition to specific questions, the survey also seeks general, open-ended input from residents about the community's health needs and the delivery of local health care. Completing the survey takes about 20 to 25 minutes.

"This is a great opportunity to give input on what you want to see for your healthcare in the community," said Dennis Goebel, CEO of Southwest Healthcare Services. "Being able to give your input helps the community participate in molding the healthcare they want."

A periodic community needs assessment is one of the new requirements of the Affordable Care Act. The new regulations require non-profit hospitals such as Jacobson Memorial Hospital to assess the community's health needs periodically. A health assessment is also part of accreditation requirements for local public health units.

All items are individually made from genuine range-worn barbed wire. Living in ranch country access to old barbed wire is not a problem: Jerome has over 2 miles of barbed wire to work with. Working with old brittle barbed wire is definitely a challenge: Jerome has worn out many pairs of leather gloves and wire cutters. Jerome uses an acetylene torch to weld the pieces together.

His first project would be a fancy barbed wire heart, a Valentine's Day gift for his wife Joan: This was in the early 2000's. Prior to this Jerome had never



done anything artistic in his life: From that humble beginning Jerome now has a showroom full of interesting barbed wire art. The artwork has been featured in several magazines resulting in calls from around the country for custom art pieces.
