Remember this Christmas. Not the power, but



"Twas the Beginning of Advent"

I believe we all like to tell stories, and to hear stories, be they stories from long ago or something that happened just the other day. Telling stories is a part of our lives that spans the ages, especially during the holiday season. I realize we tell stories throughout the year but during the holiday season the stories take on a deeper meaning, sometimes of a loss that has been suffered, sometimes of a remembered joy from long ago, sometimes it is a combination of both to make a point of how important this season of the year is in our lives.

I do not have a story to share today but I do have a poem of what the Season of Advent means for our lives that I first read a number of years ago. The poem was written by J. Todd Jenkins the Pastor of First Presbyterian Church, Fayetteville, Tennessee. I read this poem each year at the start of Advent as I believe it puts into perspective what we are preparing to celebrate during the Advent season, the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ. I share it with you now and maybe it will be a story you will share in the years to come.

"Twas the Beginning of Advent"

'Twas the beginning of Advent and all through the Church
Our hope was all dying—we'd given up on the search.

It wasn't so much that Christ wasn't invited,
But after 2,000 plus years we were no longer excited.

Oh, we knew what was coming—no doubt about that.

And that was the trouble—it was all "old hat."

November brought the first of an unending series of pains

With carefully orchestrated advertising campaigns.

There were gadgets and dolls and all sorts of toys.

Enough to seduce even the most devout girls and boys.

Unfortunately, it seemed, no one was completely exempt

From this seasonal virus that did all of us tempt.

The priests and prophets and certainly the kings Were all so consumed with the desire for "things!" It was rare, if at all, that you'd hear of the reason For the origin of this whole holy-day season.

A baby, it seems, once had been born In the mid-east somewhere on that first holy-day morn. But what does that mean for folks like us, Who've lost ourselves in the hoopla and fuss?

Can we re-learn the art of wondering and waiting, Of hoping and praying, and anticipating? Can we let go of all the things and the stuff? Can we open our hands and our hearts long enough?

Can we open our eyes and open our ears?
Can we find him again after all of these years?
Will this year be different from all the rest?
Will we be able to offer him all of our best?

So many questions, unanswered thus far, As wisemen seeking the home of the star. Where do we begin—how do we start To make for the child a place in our heart?

Perhaps we begin by letting go
Of our limits on hope, and of the stuff that we know.
Let go of the shopping, of the chaos and fuss,
Let go of the searching, let Christmas find us.

We open our hearts, our hands and our eyes, To see the king coming in our own neighbors' cries. We look without seeking what we think we've earned, But rather we're looking for relationships spurned.

With him he brings wholeness and newness of life For brother and sister, for husband and wife. The Christ-child comes not by our skill, But rather he comes by his own Father's will.

We can't make him come with parties and bright trees, But only by getting down on our knees. He'll come if we wait amidst our affliction, Coming in spite of, not by our restriction.

His coming will happen—of this there's no doubt.
The question is whether we'll be in or out.
"Behold, I stand at the door and knock."
Do you have the courage to peer through the lock?

A basket on your porch, a child in your reach.

A baby to love, to feed and to teach.

He'll grow in wisdom as God's only Son.

How far will we follow this radical one?

He'll lead us to challenge the way that things are.

He'll lead us to follow a single bright star.

But that will come later if we're still around.

The question for now: Is the child to be found?

Can we block out commercials, the hype and the malls?
Can we find solitude in our holy halls?
Can we keep alert, keep hope, stay awake?
Can we receive the child for ours and God's sake?

#### A Little Birdie **Told Me**

A Little Birdie Told Me: "Advent Calendars are a Tradition Which I Loved Growing up." We had an Advent Calendar growing up and we shared that tradition with our kids: I recently bought Advent Calendars with chocolate treats behind each window for my two grandsons. Originally I was only going to buy one but realized with chocolate in each window each boy would need his own calendar, sharing isn't their best attribute.

"Like many others aspects modern Christmas practices, the Advent calendar is of German origin. From the early nineteenth century, at the latest, German Protestants began to mark the days of Advent either by burning a candle for the day or, more simply, marking walls or doors with a line of chalk each day.

A new practice of hanging a devotional image every day ultimately led to the creation of the first known handmade, wooden,

Advent calendar in 1851. Sometime in the early twentieth century (either 1902 or 1908 dependon who you believe) the first printed calendars appeared, followed by Gerhard Lang's innovation of adding small doors in the 1920s; he is thus often seen as the creator of the modern calendar. Others added short bible verses behind the doors alongside the traditional picture from the 1930s. Lang's business closed shortly before the outbreak of war; subsequently cardboard was rationed and with a Nazi ban on the printing of calendars with images, the calendars disappeared and might have done forever.

But after the war ended Richard Sellmar of Stuttgart almost miraculously (considering the paper shortages) obtained a permit from the US officials to begin printing and selling them again. His company Sellmar-Verlag, this year celebrating its 70th anniversary, remains one of the most important producers of such calendars.

From Asia to North America, there are undeniable traditional and festive Christmassy Colors that blend themselves through legend, history, religion, pop culture, and, of course, modern-day marketing:

Faith. It is a celebration when

Christians celebrate 'God's

JESUS.

The Color RED ... is one of the most important, famous, and respected Christmassy Colors, because of its deep hue, like red holly berries with their spiky leaves, which symbolizes the crown of thorns that encircled Jesus' head and the blood that Jesus Christ (the person whose Birth- Christmas celebrates) shed on the cross

...Notably, RED throughout

the year represents Love, romance, and courage. So, it's acceptively associated with Santa Claus and his distinctive outfit. RED is the color of a Catholic Bishop's Robe and would have been worn by the 3rd Century Bishop, 'Saint Nicholas' who was famous for his charitable work amongst the poor. During the Civil War period, cartoonists depicted 'Saint Nicholas' as a 'Jolly, Smiling Man' who wore a red-hued suit that was lined with white fur. By the 1930s, Coca-Cola launched an ad campaign in magazines depicting the now iconic image of Santa ('Jolly, Bearded Man') with his RED Santa Claus Coat happily drinking a bottle of Coke; it further entrenched RED as one of the most significant Christmas

...In The Middle Ages, Christmas plays were performed with RED apples tied to a Paradise Tree (LIVE Fir Christmas Tree) to represent the Garden of Eden and the fall of Adam when he ate the forbidden fruit. In those days, The German People set up a Paradise Tree in their homes on December 24th- Christmas Eve.

... The Color GREEN ... Evergreen Trees and plantslike ivy, holly, and mistletoe are used at Christmastime to represent Christ's Life and the Never-Ending Nature of Jesus Christ. In pagan times, Green Foliage was a powerful remind-

keep growing, even through the 'Cold Winter' and that Spring was approaching and Winter would then end. Our Forebearers have long since exercised their beliefs in the same fashion. 



#### Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

In our study last time, we saw that Jonah disobeyed God's command to preach to the people of Nineveh by taking a ship headed in the opposite direction. But as was mentioned in the previous article, God has ways of getting man's attention. And we see how He did just that in Jonah 1:4: "But the LORD sent out a great wind on the sea, and there was a mighty tempest on the sea, so that the ship was about to be broken up." The word "sent" here is literally "hurled." In other words, God threw a storm with Jonah as His target. Jonah can't escape from God. He has the whole universe at His disposal.

Friends, let us remember that God is sovereign over the weather. Weather is neither meaningless or arbitrary. God has a purpose for it all. Earthquakes, tornadoes, hurricanes, storms, snow, and beautiful sunshine all accomplish His will. We read in Psalm 135:6-7: "Whatever the Lord pleases He does, in heaven and in earth, in the seas and in all deep places. He causes the vapors to ascend from the ends of the earth; He makes lightning for the rain; He brings the wind out of His treasuries." And Psalm 148:8 tells us, "Fire and hail, snow and clouds; stormy wind, fulfilling His word." We find a striking passage about God's control of the weather in Job 37:10-13: "By the breath of God ice is giv-

en, and the broad waters are frozen. Also with moisture He saturates the thick clouds; He scatters His bright clouds. And they swirl about, being turned by His guidance, that they may do whatever He commands them on the face of the whole earth. He causes it to come, whether for correction, or for His land, or for mercy." You may remember the awestruck reaction of the disciples after Jesus calmed a storm: "And they feared exceedingly, and said to one another, Who can this be, that even the wind and the sea obey Him!" (Mark 4:41). Let us not make the mistake of attributing weather to "mother nature." All weather comes from the Sovereign God of the universe to accomplish

The storm would prevent Jonah from making any headway in his course of disobedience, and that is what God uses as a first step to bring Jonah to repentance. He pursues His straying prophet with a storm

arrest man's attention, just as

He did with Jonah. Not only is He sovereign over weather-He is the sovereign ruler over all things. Paul describes Him in Ephesians 1:11 as the One "who works all things according to the counsel of His will." People are prone to complain when our plans are frustrated, when things don't go according to our desires. But it behooves us to stop and reflect. Perhaps God has brought a storm across our paths to get our attention for some reason-perhaps to turn us, like Jonah, away from a wrong course. Whatever the reason, if you are a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ, you have the promise of Romans 8:28 that God is working ALL THINGS in your life together for your good. If you are not a believer, perhaps God may use adversity to awaken you to your need for a Savior. All of us come into this world in a state of rebellion and alienation from God. and we need to be restored to a right relationship with Him. The only way for this to happen is for us to rely only on what Jesus did on the cross as He paid the penalty for the sins of His people to God's satisfaction. As the angel told Joseph, "You shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins (Matthew Please be sure that you God often uses adversity to are trusting Jesus alone as your Savior.



As I sit here in my warm little house under my blanket with my cat at my feet, for the time being at least, I do feel quite thankful that I do not have to travel far for work. I had an appointment in Bismarck the day of the blowing snow and even tho when we left in the morning it did not appear to be a bad travel day, there was quite a shock after passing Flasher. Within a few miles, the wind which was gusting quite strongly was blowing snow which reduced visibility to as low as 10 feet in front of us.

Now having been a resident of ND for most of my life, this is not a shock, but as we have gotten older it is harder to want to be out on the road at certain times. Before sunrise, after dark and certainly on days when visibility is questionable is no longer something I am happy with doing unless it is an emergency, so if I had known how bad the blowing snow was, I may have changed my appointment. Unfortunately, it is impossible to know what the weather is everywhere you go so sometimes. you just have to grit your teeth and get through it. So to the appointment I went and directly after that, it was back on the road

and home as soon as possible.

The problem of living in small town North Dakota is that if you have something special that you need or want to do, it most probably is out of town. There have been a few times in my years when we went out on days that should have been a given to stay home, but it was important at the time to go, so there we were creeping along at 35 mph, risking it all. Somehow over the years, that has not been so frequent. Now we actually take time to consider if it's worth it to go and keep everybody happy or stay safe and upset someone - that seems to be easier to do than it used to be. Being warm, comfortable and safe is much more important and family trips now are planned for nice warm days when driving is more pleasurable.

The other consideration other than the road and the weather is the other drivers on the road. You may be the most capable person and have years of experience driving, never had an accident and have a great car, but can you say the same for the other people sharing the road with you? Not to say that

there are a lot of bad drivers out there, but some of those that are on our roads today may be a bit overconfident. 



### A Christmas Story 1942

It was Christmas Eve 1942. I was fifteen years old and feeling like the world had caved in on me because there just hadn't been enough money to buy me the rifle that I'd wanted for Christmas.

Not only wasn't I getting the rifle for Christmas, now he was dragging me out in the cold, and for no earthly reason that I could

see. We'd already done all the chores, and I couldn't think of anything else that needed doing, especially not on a night like this. But I knew he was not very patient at one dragging one's feet when he'd told them to do something, so I got up and put my boots back on and got my coat. Mommy gave me a mysterious smile as I opened the door to leave the house. Something was up, but I didn't know what.

We came in from the blind side of the Jensen house and unloaded the wood as quietly as possible then we took the meat and flour and shoes to the door. We knocked. The door opened a crack and a timid voice said,

"Who is it?" "Lucas Miles, Ma'am, and my son, Matt, could we come in for a bit?"

Mrs.Jensen opened the door and let us in. She had a blanket wrapped around her shoulders. The children were wrapped in another and were sitting in front of the fireplace by a very small fire that hardly gave off any heat at all. Mrs.Jensen fumbled with a match and finally lit the lamp.

"We brought you a few things, Ma'am," Daddy said and set down the sack of flour. I put the meat on the table. Then he handed her the sack that had the shoes in it. She opened it hesitantly and took the shoes out one pair at a time. There was a pair for her and one for each of the children - sturdy shoes, the best, shoes that would last. I watched her carefully. She bit her lower lip to keep it from trembling and then tears filled her eyes and started running down her cheeks. She looked up at my Daddy like she wanted to say something, but it wouldn't come out.

"We brought a load of wood too, Ma'am," he said. Then turned to me and said, "Matt, go bring in enough to last awhile. Let's get that fire up to size and heat this place up." I wasn't the same person when I went back out to bring in the wood. I had a big lump in my throat and as much as I hate to admit it, there were tears in my eyes too. In my mind I kept seeing those three kids huddled around the fireplace and their mother standing there with tears running down her cheeks with so much gratitude in her heart that she couldn't speak.

My heart swelled within me and a joy that I'd never known before filled my soul. I had given at Christmas many times before, but never when it had made so much difference. I could see we were literally saving the lives of these people.

I soon had the fire blazing and everyone's spirits soared. The kids started giggling when Daddy handed them each a piece of candy and Mrs.Jensen looked on with a smile that probably hadn't crossed her face for a long time. She finally turned to us. "God bless you," she said. "I know the Lord has sent you. The children and I have been praying that he would send one of his angels to spare us."

In spite of myself, the lump returned to my throat and the tears welled up in my eyes again. I'd never thought of my Daddy in those exact terms before, but after Widow Jensen mentioned it I could see that it was probably true. I was sure that a better man than Daddy had never walked the earth. I started remembering all the

times he had gone out of his way for Mommy and me, and many others. The list seemed endless as I thought on it.

Daddy insisted that everyone try on the shoes before we left. I was amazed when they all fit and I wondered how he had known what sizes to get. Then I guessed that if he was on an errand for the Lord that the Lord would make sure he got the right sizes.

Tears were running down Widow Jensen's face again when we stood up to leave. My Daddy took each of the kids in his big arms and gave them a hug. They clung to him and didn't want us to go. I could see that they missed their Daddy and I was glad that I still had

At the door he turned to Widow Jensen and said, "The Mrs. wanted me to invite you and the children over for Christmas dinner tomorrow. The turkey will be more than the three of us can eat, and a man can get cantankerous if he has to eat turkey for too many meals. We'll be by to get you about eleven. It'll be nice to have some little ones around again. Matt, here, hasn't been little for quite a spell." I was the youngest. My two brothers and two sisters had all married and had moved away.

Mrs.Jensen nodded and said, "Thank you, Brother Miles. I don't have to say, May the Lord bless you, I know for certain that He will."


Out on the sled I felt a warmth that came from deep within and I didn't even notice

He had given me the look on Mrs. Jensen's face and the radiant smiles of her three children. For the rest of my life. Whenever I saw any of the Jensens, or split a block of wood, I remembered, and remembering brought back that same joy I felt riding home beside of my Daddy that night. He had given me much more than a rifle that night, he had given me the best Christmas of my life.




