He repeatedly thanked me for bringing him. He cried through much of the concert.

My heart always skips a beat when I hear the introduction of Unchained Melody.

Some years later Bobby Hatfield passed as well.

Later my husband Tom I went to see the New Righteous Brothers.

Bill Medley is still singing and he has a young guy with him. He has a wonderful voice and does the music justice.

I wondered how they would do the song that featured Bobby's high voice.

Beautifully. At the end of the show Bill sits on a stool with video images of Bobby playing behind him. He sings the song in his beautiful bass voice.

Again; magical. It is forever a piece of my heart.

Music and certain songs are inspiration for our memories and emotions.

It is a major influence on our lives. It is successfully used as therapy for Alzheimer's patients. This time of year especially, the Christmas carols take us to another time, another place. Childhood holidays with family and friends are easily recalled when we hear certain songs. It's a gift.

Life is good today.

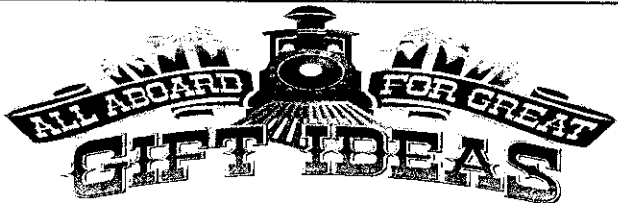

Expressions of HOPE

Reflections on the Words of Life

We have begun a study of the book of Jonah, and last time we saw that God sent "a mighty tempest on the sea" to cause Jonah to repent for his disobedience. The storm was obviously severe, as the sailors fear that the ship will be destroyed and they will drown. For we read in Jonah 1:5, "Then the mariners were afraid; and every man cried out to his god, and threw the cargo that was in the ship into the sea, to lighten the load. But Jonah had gone down into the lowest parts of the ship, had lain down, and was fast asleep." The sailors perceive that this is no ordinary storm, and gripped with fear they take emergency measures. In this crisis, they realize that the things of the earth, even the ship's precious cargo, are of no value compared to their lives. Oh, that all people would understand how infinitely valuable is every soul which will spend eternity somewhere.

It is interesting to note that these sailors, who were obviously pagans, cried out to their gods. Romans chapter one tells us that all people know that God exists, yet most suppress this truth. We see here that in a dire predicament, even these idolaters grope for some kind of god.

A lesson we can glean from our verse is that the believer who is disobeying the Lord will bring trouble not only to himself, but also to those around him. The entire nation of Israel suffered defeat at Ai because a man named Achan stole some of the prohibited items from Jericho (Joshua 7). Christians, we are constantly having an influence—either good or bad—on those around us. How we should seek grace to be like Christ and honor Him in our lives.

While the sailors are desperately trying to save lives and pleading to their empty idol-gods, Jonah is sleeping through the whole incident. How ironic that the man whose attention the storm was designed

to arouse is sleeping while the pagan crew seeks supernatural help. People, including believers, will try all kinds of tactics to get their minds off their disobedience. Jonah is seeking refuge in unconsciousness.

Next time, Lord willing, we shall see more about Jonah, but I would like to close by referring to an earlier comment about the infinite value of the soul. Friends, every human being is created in the image of God and therefore has great worth. We read in Psalm 139:13-14, "For You created my inmost being; You knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise You because I am fearfully and wonderfully made." It is heartbreaking that in our society today we are seeing human lives so devalued that babies, both in and now even outside of the womb, are considered expendable. It seems that many people have a greater regard for the lives of cats and dogs than for children. Surely our country is experiencing God's judgment because of this very thing, among many others.

Let us never be swept up by the unbiblical thinking of the culture. Tragically, even some churches have capitulated to the pressures of culture and rejected the word of God. Let us remember that God is the One who creates life and that we should treat each human being with dignity and respect. The eternal Son of God took upon Himself human flesh and became a man. We are told in Matthew 1:21 that He did so "to save His people from their sins." Jesus became a true man, though He was still fully God, and His incarnation is being celebrated by many this very month. The eternal Son became man, perfectly obeyed God's law, and took upon Himself the punishment for all the sins of all His people. By trusting in this payment alone for salvation, we are restored to a right relationship with God and can look forward to an eternity with Him in heaven. Friends, no Christmas gift can compare with this. Have you received it?

Obviously our grandparents did not have access to the type of equipment and knowledge that we have available to us now and many of them were immigrants that came to this country with little or nothing to build their lives from scratch. Long hours and little money and hard physical work was their lot in life to strive to make a living and bring up their children to have a better life in the future. Food was not always readily available and mothers made do with what they had making every dollar stretch to feed large families that were often the norm especially in farming families of which sometimes not all survived.

Our parents were raised by people who made do, wore it out and saved for the future. Many times they were not given much of an opportunity to try anything new. Their options were to leave or to just listen to their parents and make the best of it until they had the chance to try something else. Even if they did get away, they were raised to work hard and do the best they could with what they had as their parents were often unable to send them to school. If they did get to go to college, money was scarce and it generally required them to work as well as go to school and live on very little. Loans were possible, but there were the inevitable years in their future to pay back those loans and they sacrificed time with their children to make sure that they did not want for those things that were important to them. Many are the parents that gave up personal trips and their own welfare to ensure their children had the best that they could give them.

Now it may be that children have gotten used to not having to work as hard as their parents. This may be because they have been told by their friends, their counselors and even by everything they see in television programs and social media that it is their right to enjoy life no matter the cost. So what if your parents think you should have a job. Although everyone has a right to go to college, is it really what the child wants to do? Are we putting our wants and desires in front of the needs and desires of our children? Have we made college and having a good experience there more important than getting training for a good future? Not every child is college material as every child learns differently and that must be taken into consideration as well. If a trade school or on the job training is something that is more practical, who are we to decide for someone what their future should be when school may not be something that the child enjoys or even can manage without severe stress.

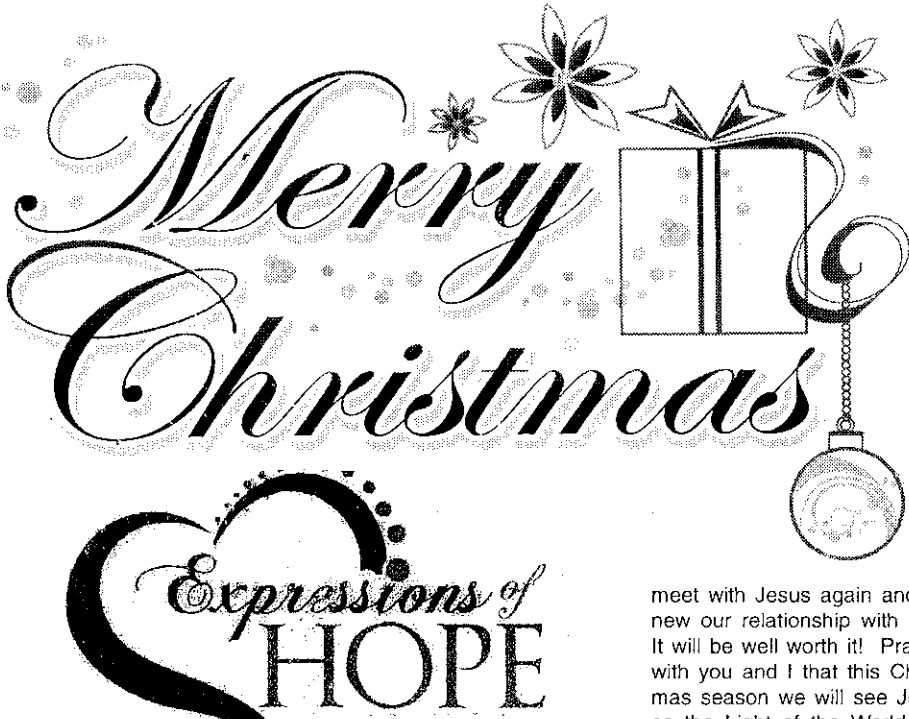

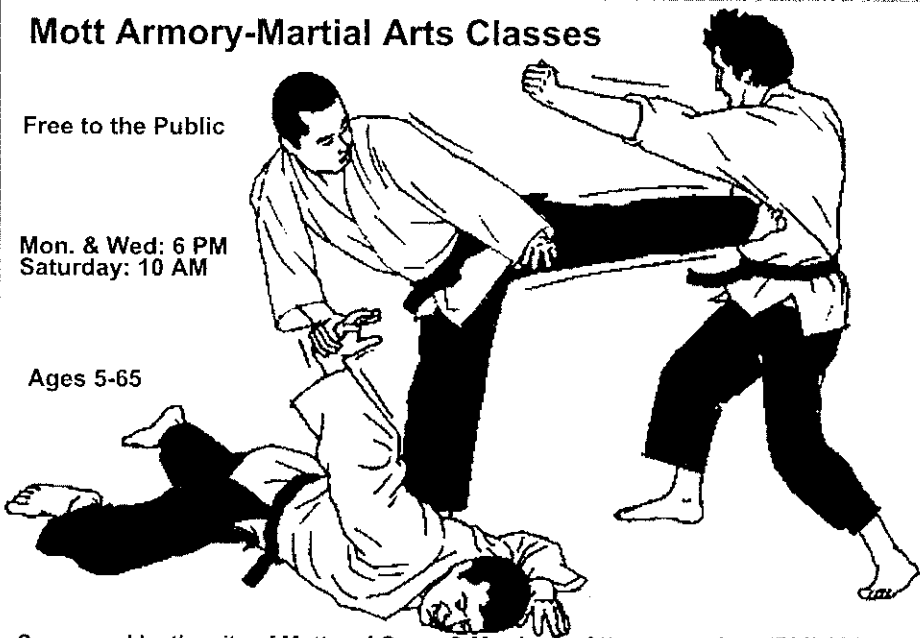

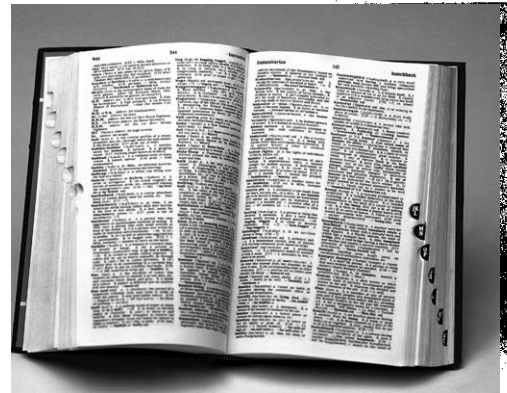

to wear. They are de-signed for a better fit than fig leaves.

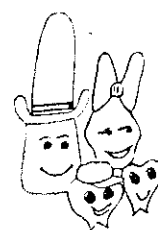

"The Christmassy Colors"

as RED and GREEN, though it certainly does play very well as a classic Christmassy Color. There are many BLUE shades to experiment with, from soft pastels to rich, deep navy.

... The Color GOLD ... Sparkling GOLD is one of the most popular Christmassy Colors because it symbolizes the illuminating Son of God and brings light where there was once darkness. GOLD also symbolizes the 'Three Wise Men's Gifts' (GOLD, Frankincense, and Myrrh) that were brought to 'The Baby Jesus - The Christ Child'. Today people still give GOLD as Christmastime Gifts, as the color GOLD is considered to represent prosperity, luxury, royalty, and wealth. Poor people, in earlier times, who couldn't afford gold-colored their decorations in yellow.

...In biblical times gifts consisting of Frankincense, Myrrh, and GOLD were only given to Kings. Therefore, scholars believe these valuable gifts reinforced the prophecy that "Jesus Christ" is a King.

...Gold is multifaceted, often denoting generosity and compassion, as well as being synonymous with divinity and power in many religious settings.

...The color GOLD is also the color of the 'Roaring Fire-like Sunlight' which is very important during the cold months of Winter when the SUN provides much-needed warmth.

... The Color PURPLE ... PURPLE is the color of royalty, and many (Christians) associate it with the King of Kings, "Jesus Christ". PURPLE is used throughout Advent, the four weeks leading up to Christmas. A PURPLE candle is lit three of the four Advent weeks (with the exception of Week 3 which is PINK) to signify the coming of 'The Christ Child'. A PURPLE Candle is lit in Week 1 symbolizing hope, called the "Prophecy Candle". / Week 2 (PURPLE) represents faith, called the "Bethlehem Candle". / Week 4 (PURPLE) marks the final week of prayer and penance as we await the birth of our Savior, called the "Angel's Candle". The 3rd Week has a PINK Candle that symbolizes Joy, called the "Shepard's Candle". "Jesus" brought us hope, love, joy, and peace.

...Adding PURPLE to "The Christmassy Colors" adds richness to 'Holiday Decor' and it also helps to create feelings of Celebration and Rejoicing. PURPLE is associated with the deeply spiritual period before

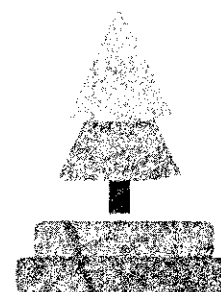

ried the girl he had met through Lutheran Student Association, Ruth Nyjordet. They went back East, and he continued with GE in Lynn and Pittsfield, Mass. He liked engineering and even got a patent during his second year with GE, but he felt dissatisfied with his Christian witness since he was giving all time and energy to engineering problems. One day he asked his Ruth out of the blue: "If you had a chance to back up and start over again, what would you rather do?" Without much hesitation she said, "Be a missionary." That is the same thing he was thinking though he had not told her.

So he resigned from GE and applied to Luther Seminary in St. Paul. Looking through his academic record, they said he would have to get Greek and a few other subjects before admission. So he went to Augsburg College in Minneapolis and found a part time job as an electrical engineer with an aeronautical research firm in Minneapolis. After that year of preparatory studies he was admitted to the Seminary. During those years at college and seminary they had all four of their children—three sons and a daughter.

Upon graduation he applied to the Division of World Mission, and they were assigned to the mission in Cameroon. The first four years there, they worked among the Dowaayo people. Missionaries had already established churches in several Dowaayo towns. Since there were many tribes in the area, they first learned the Fulani language which is the lingua-franca for Northern Cameroon. They soon learned that this was inadequate for reaching the Dowaayo people, so learned their language as well.

After a year of furlough, speaking in churches in the upper Midwest, they returned to Cameroon and were assigned to create a recording studio to prepare broadcasts in the Fulani language for transmission from Radio Voice of the Gospel transmitters in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. After a little over a year of building and traveling around to recruit workers, the first broadcast was made in November 1966. During the years as director of the studio, he did a lot of traveling throughout West Africa to visit the areas inhabited by the Fulani people who are traditionally nomadic cattle herders. Thankfully, the broadcasts, coupled with personal witness bore fruit with new believers in Cameroon and many in other coun-

tries as well. These followers of Jesus gather in villages to help and encourage one another as well as to have Christian fellowship with others who understand their language and their situation.

Since retirement in 1995, Ron made twelve trips back to Africa. The latest was a four-month trip at the end 2017 and the beginning of 2018. Each time, he was asked to come and teach among the new believers. They are not tied to any denomination and are working out their own plans for fellowship and growth in the faith. One of these new believers has had Bible school training, so he serves as a leader and teacher. They wanted Ron to return as often as possible and to remain as long as possible. After his beloved Ruth passed away in 2006 and was buried in the cemetery south of Bucyrus, he lived by himself in Hettinger until 2019 when he moved to be with his daughter Karen and family in Ohio.

Ron loved and served his Lord Jesus with joy throughout the course of his life. He treasured his family, including his beloved bride, Ruth, his parents, siblings, children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren, and prayed faithfully for each one. The Fulbe (Fulani) people of West Africa were also close to his heart for the last 60 years of his life, from the time he first went to Cameroon. He greatly enjoyed music, playing and teaching violin. He was adventurous and was quick to find humor in life, while exhibiting a deep trust in the grace and goodness of God.

Ron was preceded in death by his beloved Ruth Beverly (Nyjordet) Nelson on October 15, 2006; his parents, Lester and Myrtle; his sister, Betty Rickerson; great-grandsons, Paul Daniel Brewer and Asa Warren Reineke; and his first-born son, Steven Paul Nelson, at the age of 46, who left a wife, Dottie, and daughter, Debbie Ruth.

He is survived by three of his four children: Philip (June) Nelson of Fargo, ND; Nick Nelson of Bismarck, ND; and Karen (Rick) Negley of Lewis Center, OH; daughter-in-law, Dottie Nelson (Samuel) Galvan of Tucson, AZ; 9 grandchildren; and 18 great-grandchildren; his brother Jerry Nelson of Davenport, IA; nieces, nephews, and many friends in the U.S., Africa, and Europe.

A funeral is planned for Wednesday, December 21, 2022 (10:00 AM Mountain Time) at Hettinger Lutheran Church, 904 S Second Ave, Hettinger, ND 58639, followed by burial in the Cemetery at Bucyrus, ND. A memorial service is also planned for Sunday, January 8, 2023 (3:00 PM Eastern Time) at Berlin Church, 5175 S Old State Rd, Lewis Center, OH 43035, with live streaming on the church's YouTube channel. Alice "Dybe" Jacobs Rites Held

Alice "Dybe" Jacobs, 96, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, November 29, 2022 at



the Southwest Healthcare Long Term Center in Bowman.

Mass of Christian Burial for Dybe was on Saturday, December 10, 2022 at 1:00 p.m. at the St. Charles Catholic Church in Bowman. Fr. Ben Franchuk celebrated the Mass with a burial that followed in the Bowman Cemetery. There was a Rosary and Vigil Service on Friday, December 9, 2022 at the St. Charles Catholic Church beginning at 7:00 p.m. Visitation was on Friday, December 9, 2022 12-5 at the funeral home chapel and 6-9 at the St. Charles Catholic Church.

Dybe was born near the Hettinger/Slope county line to Annie and Soren Nielsen, Danish immigrants with a farm near New England. She went through many transitions in her 96 years - she was a farm kid, town kid, teacher, home maker, civic leader, retiree and nurse for Wally.

Dybe started school a year early, in an effort to help her family learn English. Dybe attended New England Public School, where she loved the singing roles in school performances, and was nicknamed "Dybe" in 8th grade. Daily life consisted of farm chores, church activities and Saturday nights in town with her cousins. In 1944, Dybe received both her High School Diploma and her teaching certificate from Dickinson College. Her first job was teaching in rural Hettinger County schools. The blue bicycle she bought with her first paycheck was her only transportation and a prized possession. Earning \$80/month was enough to treat herself to a fancy pair of shoes or a scarf once in a while. This is when she started dating Wally. Courtship was Saturday night dates and dancing; often with Wally's many siblings tagging along.

In October 1947, Dybe married Wally Jacobs. They honeymooned on the West Coast, a place they would visit and vacation through the years. Dybe and Wally lived and worked on J.Q. Jacobs family farm (now known as the Heritage House), again with many of Wally's siblings, until 1949 when the two of them plus Rita, settled in Slope County, where they farmed, ranched, milked cows, raised six children and served their community for 5 decades. Some of her happiest memories were putting each of her newly bathed babies to bed with a story and a prayer. Mom and Dad loved to go dancing with friends

and we all remember their 50th wedding anniversary dance.

In 1972, a traveling artist offered oil painting classes in Amidon. This was a pivotal event in Dybe's life, granting a break from farm chores and an outlet for her creativity. Dozens of her paintings adorn the homes of her children and friends, and earned a ribbon or two at the county fair.

Food was Dybe's love language. Whether it was coffee for a neighbor, a houseful after church, bridal showers or 20+ people for a holiday, she was happy planning, preparing and serving food. It earned her the role of "Mrs. Olsen" in a Folgers Coffee spoof at the Slope County Fair Show. Her caramel rolls, divinity, jelly roll and homemade bread were the best. Wally loved "snitching" warm sour cream chocolate cupcakes from the cooling rack. Dybe was a great gardener, serving meals where "not one thing on this table came from a store". This passion followed she and Wally to town in retirement.

Dybe and Wally were pioneers: Dybe (and Wally) worked to build and enhance their community, long before "community" was a buzzword. Mom served on countless boards and committees including Homemakers, Altar Guild, 4-H, School Board, Slope County Fair Committees, and Prayer Circle. She and Wally were early adopters of no till farming and super early investors in ethanol, long before the term "green" became popular.

Dybe was a survivor. Her strong faith no doubt helped her live through the Great Depression, survive a tornado as a child, and become a 40-year breast cancer survivor. A horse kicked her, leaving the scar on her chin. Her legacy speaks of the excitement and happiness of V-Day, when the end of World War II was declared. In her lifetime she saw the arrival of many new technologies such as plastic, rural electricity, indoor plumbing, microwaves and computers.

Dybe faced another challenge as lead caregiver for Wally when his health deteriorated. She dedicated years to his care, achieving their goal of not having to move out of their house before he died. She got to a point that she was teaching newer nurses the care for Wally's lungs.

Dybe will always be remembered for some of her famous "rules" - like do not butter the top of her caramel rolls. She ingrained values in her family. She was a fierce defender of an individuals' worth, and quick critic of overblown egos. She never wavered from holding people accountable, but never let a stranger or child feel unwelcome.

Although we are saddened to lose our touch stone, we know she is elated to join Wally. Some of Wally's last words were "I am not afraid to go, I am just sad to leave Dybe. You kids will need to take over loving her. I am sure you know by now, she is easy to love".

ets in memory FFA members and loved ones who've passed.

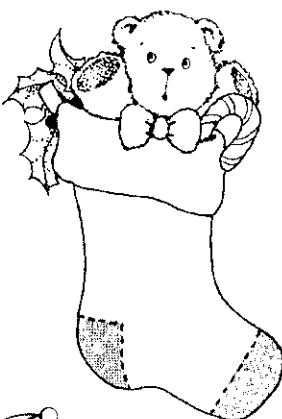
