
Then Sally remembered the wish she had forgotten but still carried deep in her heart - she repeated it - - I

Reflections on the Words of Life by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace

Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last time in our study we left Jonah sleeping through the "mighty tempest" which the Lord had sent to call His prophet to repentance, while everyone else on the ship was frantically praying to his idol god and taking measures to try to save the lives of those aboard. We see in Jonah 1:6 how Jonah was finally made aware of the situation: "So the captain came to him, and said to him, 'What do you mean, sleeper? Arise, call on your God; perhaps your God will consider us, so that we may not perish."

Expressions 3

"Captain" here is literally "chief of the rope pullers" and refers to this man's expert skill in managing the rigging and sails of the ship. Now the lips of a pagan seaman issue the call of the Lord to Jonah. Here is an idolater telling a prophet of God to pray!

Sometimes it is the unbelieving world that has to rebuke the believer! How right the captain was that Jonah should have been praying, and first and foremost, praying a prayer of repentance for his disobedience. How often. I wonder, should we be praying and do not? Believers in






Christ are commanded to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17). If we but realized what a great privilege it is to be able to pray to the Sovereign Creator and Sustainer of the universe, I think we would be much more people of prayer. Of course, what the captain does not realize is that Jonah is in no mood for prayer. The last thing he wants to do is pray because he is trying to run from God. What he needs to pray at this moment is a prayer of repentance.

The words "perhaps your God will consider us" gives a good insight into the thinking of the unbelieving pagan who sees God, or "the gods," as those who are unaware of what is going on, and something has to be done to get their attention. And his words "so that we may not perish" go far beyond the captain's understanding and intention. If they do survive physically, it will be due to something Jonah's God does. But there is a deeper and more important spiritual meaning here. How close to perishing is every living human being on this earth who is without a saving relationship to God through Christ. How little did that captain know that Jonah's God is indeed ready to hear the prayer of the one who cries to Him for forgiveness based on the saving work of Christ. One of the greatest promises of Scripture uses the very word this captain used. John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." Friends, God gave the

greatest gift when He gave His Son. Man's greatest need is to be restored to a right relationship with God; and, as the angel told Joseph about his betrothed, "And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." 

The12 Days of Christmas begin on December 25th and end on January 6th with the arrival of the Three Kings: Epiphany. The age ole song commemorating the 12 days of Christmas dates back to1558 in England when Catholics were prohibited from ANY practice of their faith by law, private or public.

"The Twelve Days of Christmas" was written in England as one of the "catechism songs" to help young Catholics learn the tenets of their faith - a memory aid, when to be caught with anything in *writing* indicating adherence to the Catholic faith could not only get you imprisoned, it could get you hanged, or shortened by a head - or hanged, drawn and quartered."

"The songs gifts are hidden meanings to the teachings of the faith. The "true love" mentioned in the song doesn't refer to an earthly suitor, it refers to God Himself. The "me" who receives the presents refers to every baptized person. The partridge in a pear tree is Jesus Christ, the Son of God. 



That tree makes me think of the the woods and walking in the snow. I'm glad it's come to stay with us for just a week or so.




Little Piccola **Christmas Story**






How sad, how sad it was! Now Santa Claus would come, and perhaps be angry because he couldn't find any place to put the present.

This last weekend I put up my Christmas Tree and as I was enjoying the colorful lights, I got to wondering when we started putting lights on trees to celebrate the season. History tells us that Christmas lights actually started out just as candles. These candles were attached to the tree using wax or pins. The practice began in Germany during the 17th century and over the next 200 or so years; it became an established practice in Germany and began to spread out into other countries of Eastern Europe.

The practice was originally started in order to bring illumination to the ornaments that were placed on the tree. This practice continued until around 1900 when candle holders became popular and people started to use them instead of wax or pins to hold the candles to the trees. The purpose however, stayed the same. It was to illuminate and make those beautiful works of art that decorated the tree become even more visible.

History also says that Edward H Johnson put the verv first string of electric Christmas tree lights together in 1882. Johnson, Edwards friend and partner in the Edison's Illumination Company, hand wired 80 red, white and blue light bulbs and wound them around his Christmas tree.


One of the joys of Christmas when children are little is to help to decorate the tree. I can remember being a little girl and

getting so excited when it was time to put up the tree. Not only did it smell so wonderful, since we did have a real tree in those days, but being able to help to hang the ornaments on the tree once I got old enough to do so, was a real treat. My Mother had some beautiful ones that were quite fragile so most of the time I just got to look at them but with her help, she would let me hang one or two of them. Then of course I got to hang tinsel on the tree - one strand at a time and since I was pretty small, of course the bottom of the tree got a lot more decorated than the top.

After the tree was fully decorated, we used to turn off the lights in the room and just sit there in the dark watching the lights twinkle on the tree. There is something magical in watching the lights in the dark and just enjoying the look of the tree and each and every night after dark until the tree was taken down again. We did not do any outdoor decorations back then and I cannot even imagine my parents thinking of doing that.

Not everyone decorated a lot back then. My Grandmother's idea of decoration was to put a ring of some kind with an electric bulb in the middle in the window of the living room and dining room of her house. It could be seen from the road as a red light in the windows - not sure if that was all good, but it was what she had and they did not believe in spending money for decorations.

Today, a Christmas tree with lights and ornaments is something that most people do. Of-



ten the ornaments have special meaning, purchased for various events such as a first child's Christmas, one for each child or maybe a new ornament for each year that the tree was put up with the family. Sometimes ornaments are passed down from generation to generation and hold special memories.


