





Reflections on the Words of Life

Lately in considering the importance of the believer's living for Jesus Christ in every area of life, we have looked together at the Christian in various relationships. Today we come to the section dealing with marriage. Next to the believer's relationship with God, marriage is the most important relationship in life. Peter begins by addressing wives in 1 Peter 3:1-2: "Wives, likewise, be submissive to your own husbands, that even if some do not obey the word,

they, without a word, may be won by the conduct of their wives, when they observe your chaste conduct accompanied by fear."


Before delving into our passage, let's consider an important question: Whom should a believer marry? The apostle Paul addresses this in 2 Corinthians 6:14-15: "Do not be unequally yoked together with unbelievers. For what fellowship has righteousness with lawlessness? And what communion has light with darkness? And what accord has Christ with Belial? Or what part has a believer with an unbeliever?" The words "unequally yoked" refer to being bound together in a close rela-

tionship. The expression came originally from a situation where a farmer might put two animals together in a yoke for the purpose of pulling or plowing. If the animals were not of the same strength and ability, many problems would arise, making it almost impossible for them to accomplish the farmer's goal. Paul is saying that two people who do not share the same commitment to Christ cannot pull in the same direction toward mutual goals.

If a Christian man desires to honor God in his business, he should not partner with unbelievers. Their standards and goals would be incompatible. How much more important this is in marriage, the most intimate human relationship. It is critical that the goals, priorities, and desires of both partners be the same. The prophet Amos asked in Amos 3:3, "Can two walk together, unless they are agreed?" A believer should not marry an unbeliever. The primary goal of every believer should be to love, obey, and serve the Lord, something the unbeliever could not seek. Sadly, many Christian young people have ignored this instruction in God's Word, only to have many regrets afterward.

In our passage Peter addresses Christian wives, some of whom were married to unbelievers, for we read, "even if some do not obey the word." This was a common situation in Peter's day because Christianity was very young. Many to whom he is writing were probably married before becoming believers. It seems the case here, that some of the wives had become Christians while their husbands had not. What should a believing wife do who finds herself married to an unbelieving husband? Note that Peter does not tell her to leave. Nowhere does the New Testament advise a believer to leave an unbelieving spouse. Paul says in 1 Corinthians 7:13, "And a woman who has a husband who does not believe, if he is willing to live with her, let her not divorce him." Peter tells the wife to be a strong Christian witness to her husband. HOW she is to do that is important. He does not tell her to preach to her husband or nag him to go to church, but to be submissive to him. This is always the instruction given to Christian wives, whether their husbands are believers or unbelievers. We see in Ephesians 5:22-23, "Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is head of the wife, as also Christ is head of the church." A Christian wife is to obey and submit to her husband in everything, unless she is asked to do something which God's Word prohibits.

Lord willing, we shall continue with this passage next time. In closing, I remind us that the



His friend who did wood work made him a cross -- now they are all over the world - made in Fargo, ND - best thing is that Bob Splichal, formerly of Bowman, ND introduced the crosses to us and now cancer patients are recipients of these crosses -- it all started with --

First Jesus, Loved

now it continues.

The recent milestone of celebrating the making of our 100,000th prayer cross was quite the event for the Prayer Cross Ministry of Hope Lutheran Church in Fargo. The family of the friend that the first cross was made for, Ron Messelt, was there to brand the 100,000th cross. What a great way to look back and celebrate both the memory of Ron, to remember the start of the ministry and to celebrate our milestone. Although the crosses have changed in shape, texture and finishing, the message is the same. Through Faith in Jesus Christ, we can find Love and Hope in a world that often seems like it is filled with chaos and hardship wherever we look. The cross reminds us of the promise of a better life and how we can make the most of our life on earth by loving and serving our fellow man. They are symbols of God's unconditional love for us no matter how undeserving we feel we are. Rubbing the crosses uses the oil from our skin to finish the crosses. They are imperfect crosses made by imperfect people. As God puts the "finishing touches" on each of us so do our hands finish the crosses.

We passed another milestone last month. We

broke the record of 1500 crosses/month by finishing over 3500 crosses. As more and more people see what the crosses do in people's lives, they are interested in becoming part of the ministry. We average over 30 people in an evening that are working on whatever job they can do. Jobs include drawing crosses on the aromatic cedar boards, cutting crosses out on a scroll saw, sanding the crosses, routing the edges or branding both sides of the crosses. We start our evening with pizza and a devotion time. We then turn on the 4 dust collector systems and start our work. Over the top of the noise of the dust collectors you can hear the visiting and laughter as we enjoy each other's company. "Where two or more gather in my name, I will there be." No doubt, God is watching over us and smiling. I can almost hear him saying, "this is how my children should love each other."

I hope that you can hold one of these crosses when you need it the most, or better yet, give one to someone else that needs God in their life at that time.





2026 FIRE EMERGENCY DECLARATION & BURN RESTRICTIONS

Grant County, North Dakota

Date: December 17, 2025

WHEREAS, Grant County, North Dakota has experienced and has forecasted dry weather conditions, combined with significant vegetative fuels available; and

WHEREAS, all available resources remain committed to protecting life and property; and

WHEREAS, Grant County has either sustained or been threatened with rural fires in the past and the local Emergency Management Office has been in consultation with local fire departments; and

WHEREAS, the impact of fires could threaten the health, well-being, and safety of the citizens in Grant County; and

WHEREAS, the cost of response, inordinate equipment wear/tear and fire damages may be beyond available Grant County resources; and

WHEREAS, the Grant County Commission wishes to regulate activities within Grant County which pose a potential hazard for such loss, should the present weather conditions continue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Grant County Commissioners declare a Fire Emergency and Burn Restrictions effective when the North Dakota Rangeland Fire Danger Rating is in the *High, Very High or Extreme Rating and/or Red Flag Warning* for Grant County, North Dakota, effective immediately until rescinded or through December 31, 2026.

What's Included: No Burning When Activity Matches Below

Burning is Prohibited if the Fire Index is in Extreme Category as Issued by NWS (ND Administrative Code - Title 33.1 Article 15 Chapter 4)

Low	No restrictions. Controlled burns (i.e., pits, wood piles, tumbleweeds, tree piles, pits, etc.) and cropland/ag burning must follow the "2026 GRANT COUNTY, ND CONTROLLED BURN PROCEDURE" found at grantcountyn.com .

THE PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS BURN RESTRICTION IS A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37.17.1-10.1: MAXIMUM SENTENCE OF 30 DAYS IN JAIL AND A \$1,500.00 FINE).

2026 GRANT COUNTY, ND CONTROLLED BURN PROCEDURE

Any person planning a controlled burn in Grant County must follow this procedure.

- Note:** Small fires such as campfires, burning barrels, etc. do not fall under this procedure.
- Residents wishing to burn should start by checking if what they intend on burning is legal and does not need a variance permit with the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality: <https://deq.nd.gov/AQ/permitting/openburning.aspx> (also linked at grantcountyn.com)
- Next residents need to check the North Dakota Fire Danger Rating Map, and Grant County Fire Emergency Declaration & Burn Restrictions. This information can be found at [www.grantcountyn.com](http://grantcountyn.com).
- Before a controlled burn begins, the person(s) conducting the burn must contact State Emergency Communications Center (State Radio) at 701-328-9921 or 1-800-472-2121 to request a controlled burn, so that emergency responders are not dispatched for reports of fire. Be prepared to give your name, contact number, what is being burned (i.e. a field, garbage pit, tree piles, etc.), location of the controlled burn and anticipated duration of the burn. State Radio will notify the Grant County Sheriff's Office of the location of the burn. The Sheriff's Office will contact the fire chief of the fire district where the burn is located.
- After the burning is completed and the fire is out, again contact (State Emergency Communications Center) State Radio at 701-328-9921 or 1-800-472-2121 to inform them of the completion.
- A controlled burn needs to be physically monitored at all times. Once the fire is started, do not leave the site unattended until the fire is completely out.
- Be prepared if the fire gets out of hand. Call 911 immediately and have resources available on site to mitigate the effects (water, extinguisher, tractor, shovels).

Following this procedure ensures that the State Emergency Communications Center, fire departments, and the Grant County Sheriff's Office are aware of the controlled burn and not unnecessarily called out unless there is a real emergency.

After the goose came the pudding, all ablaze, with its sprig of holly in the middle, and was eaten to the last morsel; then apples and oranges were set upon the table, and a shovelful of chestnuts on the fire, and Mr. Cratchet served round some hot sweet stuff out of a jug as they closed round the fire, and said,

"A Merry Christmas to us all, my dears, God bless us." "God bless us, every one," echoed Tiny Tim, and then they drank each other's health, and Mr. Scrooge's health, and told stories and sang songs.

Now in one of Mr. Scrooge's dreams on Christmas eve a Christmas spirit showed him his clerk's home; he saw them all, heard them drink his health, and he took special note of Tiny Tim himself.

out, with a wistful glance at the little crutch in the corner as he shut the door. Mr. Scrooge saw all this, but, wonderful to relate, he woke the next morning feeling as he had never felt in his life before.

"Why, I am as light as a feather, and as happy as an angel, and as merry as a schoolboy," he said to himself. "I hope everybody had a merry Christmas, and here's a happy New Year to all the world."

Poor Bob Cratchet crept into the office a few minutes late, expecting to be scolded for it, but his master was there with his back to a good fire, and actually smiling, and he shook hands with his clerk, telling him heartily he was going to raise his salary, and asking quite affectionately after Tiny Tim! "And mind you make up a good fire in your room before you set to work, Bob," he said, as he closed his own door.

Bob could hardly believe his eyes and ears, but it was all true. Such doings as they had on New Year's day had never been seen before in the Cratchet's home, nor such a turkey as Mr. Scrooge sent them for dinner. Tiny Tim had his share too, for Tiny Tim did not die, not a bit of it. Mr. Scrooge was a second father to him from that day, he wanted for nothing, and grew up strong and hearty. Mr. Scrooge loved him, and well he might, for was it not Tiny Tim who had unconsciously, through the Christmas dream-spirit, touched his hard heart, and caused him to become a good and happy man?






