as prisoner of war and how did you ever escape -- you know Henry, everyone in the community will want to hear your story and yes I agree, some secrets, if they hurt someone need not be told, but some if they help others are not really secrets but words of wisdom to be shared." So Henry began.

"What a beautiful Secret Henry, is needs to be shared with the community, I think with the whole world. Let me do some checking. I'll set up a speaking engagement for next week, you need to tell your story - - okay, is that okay with you?" "Guess if you think it's that good, kinda scared. I'm not a speaker." "You'll be fantastic, people need to hear - -."

Big night arrived, auditorium filled to capacity. Henry stood at podium - - Jenny introduced and he began - -.

Dumb choice. I was angry at my father cuz he wouldn't let me use the car, so I left and joined the service -- months went by, basic training, then shipped off to another country. Thought a lot about home - memories were all good - wish I could have been home so kept thinking of how happy I was at home, what dumb mistakes I had made, then one day we were captured.

Prison guards were, needless to say, you can't imagine, we were being moved to another location - - this mean, young prison guard was so cruel, beat everyone - - well when he pushed me into the stinking, filthy, disgusting cell, I tripped and fell face down into the cell full of dung." Auditorium silenced - not a sound.

Henry continued - "the prison guard laughed and pushed my face a little deeper into the dung. I pulled myself up - - you would think I was mean bull angry, but I began to laugh cuz all I could remember was when my brother Joe did the same thing to me, only he tripped and his face landed smack into a fresh cow pie, boy was he angry and I just laughed.

The prison guard who was always ready to fight, beat us up, well my laugher must have shocked him enough that he locked the door and



left. Then I told the other prisoners I was with, about Joe - - they too laughed. We sat up most of the night telling funny things that happened to us, laughed and helped each other thru the night.

Every day the same prison guard came around. Some days he would throw the food at us, we would laugh and talk about it at night. It was like when we would feed the pigs - - everything he did we connected with something on the farm.

Every day we had the same young, bully prison guard. One day he came into the room, handed each of us a cookie that he had tucked in his coat sleeve - - sat outside the cell and told us he wanted to be like us, can you imagine our surprise. He told us he wanted to laugh, be happy - didn't know what it was until he had to deal with us. He shared his story of being raised by a warden father and how in his heart he knew something was wrong. We became Secret friends. One night he heard of a plane coming to America, helped us escape, took us to the plane - - will I ever see him again - - don't know, but one thing I do know, forever he will be my Secret Friend.

Community Chorus 64th Annual Concert

Bowman Community Chorus will kick off the Christmas season this year with its 64th Christmas Concert, December 4. 2022 at the Bowman Lutheran Church, at 2:30 PM.

The Chorus purchased a new cantata, "Let There Be Christmas," this year. It contains a number of familiar Christmas carols and the audience is actually invited to sing with the chorus on some of them. The program contains a number of individual songs too. Wade Howard, Ekalaka, MT, will be directing the Chorus again this year. This marks the 5th year of his involvement with the Chorus. Saxy Brass lends a wonderful rich brass sound. They will perform the prelude, intermission and will accompany one chorus number. Charm Martian, Bowman County High music teacher, directs that group of musicians. Donna Marie Dettmann is accompanist for the remaining selections.

Bowman Community Chorus has a rich and varied history. Joan Thom brought the Bowman Lutheran Choir and the Bowman Methodist Choir together in a Christmas Concert in 1959 and from there a new tradition was formed. She continued to direct the choir through 1968. Ron Bowman took over the directing duties the following vear. Ron directed the Chorus through the years until 2019. A number of assistants helped direct from 2011 to 2019. Although Ron has passed from this life, we still do our best to continue to carry on the yearly traditional community concert at Christmas time.

Throughout the years, people from all walks of life have come together to enjoy performing in this wonderful musical opportunity. Over 600 people have sung with the group, throughout the years. Usually the group is about 50 or so strong, this year we have 40 voices. Parents, children and grandchildren have sung together. This year there are two sets of three generations singing in the Chorus. Ranchers, farmers, school teachers, business people have all worked together to make a tremendous musical experience and in only 8 or 9 practices, yearly!

In 1984, the Chorus started honoring longtime members with the 25 Year Club and added increments every five years. It is now up to the 50 year level plus for some. Two members will be moving up to the next level this year. Diane Silha moves up to 35 years and Becky Holsti will have been with the Chorus 45 years. Quite a number of people have been in the choir or influenced by the choir to go on into a musical career. Kat Perkins, Megan Case, and Derek Still are the three most prominent. The choir has given back to several of these young singers with scholarships aimed at keeping them in the musical field.

Although the focus of the Community Chorus has been the Christmas Concert performed every first Sunday in December, they have sung for



Come and enjoy an afternoon of good music. There will be refreshments and merriment after the concert where you can visit with the Chorus members and your friends and neighbors.

I believe we all like to tell stories, and to hear stories, be they stories from long ago or something that happened just the other day. Telling stories is a part of our lives that spans the ages, especially during the holiday season. I realize we tell stories throughout the year but during the holiday season the stories take on a deeper meaning, sometimes of a loss that has been suffered, sometimes of a remembered joy from long ago, sometimes it is a combination of both to make a point of how important this season of the year is in our lives.

I do not have a story to share today but I do have a poem of what the Season of Advent means for our lives that I first read a number of years ago. The poem was written by J. Todd Jenkins the Pastor of First Presbyterian Church, Fayetteville, Tennessee. I read this poem each year at the start of Advent as I believe it puts into perspective what we are preparing to celebrate during the Advent season, the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ. I share it with you now and maybe it will be a story you will share in the years to come.

"Twas the Beginning of Advent"

'Twas the beginning of Advent and all through the Church
Our hope was all dying—we'd given up on the search.

It wasn't so much that Christ wasn't invited,
But after 2,000 plus years we were no longer excited.

Oh, we knew what was coming—no doubt about that.

And that was the trouble—it was all "old hat."

November brought the first of an unending series of pains

With carefully orchestrated advertising campaigns.

There were gadgets and dolls and all sorts of toys.

Enough to seduce even the most devout girls and boys.

Unfortunately, it seemed, no one was completely exempt

From this seasonal virus that did all of us tempt.

The priests and prophets and certainly the kings Were all so consumed with the desire for "things!" It was rare, if at all, that you'd hear of the reason For the origin of this whole holy-day season.

A baby, it seems, once had been born

Reflections on the Words of Life


We have arrived today at Jonah's response to God's command to go to Nineveh, the capital of Assyria, and cry out against it for its wickedness. We read in Jonah 1:3, "But Jonah arose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the LORD. He went down to Joppa, and found a ship going to Tarshish; so he paid the fare, and went down into it, to go with them to Tarshish from presence of the LORD."

Jonah's reaction is astonishing in that he heads in the opposite direction from the one where God has commanded him to go. Commentators tell us that the journey to Tarshish could have taken up to as much as a year to complete and would have cost Jonah a great sum of money. It is always costly to the child of God to deliberately go against his heavenly Father's will. And it is especially foolish that a prophet of God could even think he could get away from the presence of the Lord. Anyone who thinks he or she can run from the Lord is a fool. Trying to get away from the Lord is like trying to get away from air. David said in Psalm 139:7-10: "Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence? If I ascend to heaven, You are there; if I make my bed in Sheol, behold, You are there. If I take the wings of the dawn, if I dwell in the remotest part of the sea, even there Your hand will lead me, and Your right hand will lay hold of me."

Note that in Jonah 1:3, Jonah is said to go down to Joppa and then down into the ship. These words symbolically indicate that Jonah's life is taking a nose dive, both physically and spiritually. He is going down and not up. Jonah did not flee because he was afraid of the Ninevites, nor because he was afraid to tell them that God's judgment was hanging over their heads. Many of us have a fear of man that keeps us from delivering the gospel message. But that was not Jonah's problem. What made Jonah run in the other direction is that he hated the people the Lord was telling him to go to. And he was afraid that they might repent and that God just might end up showing mercy to them.

Jonah well knew that Israel had been rejecting the word of God for many decades. Could his being sent to Nineveh mean that now the center of God's plan was shifting from the Jews to the Gentiles? Jonah did not like that thought at all. Oh, how stubborn and rebellious the ner, can be in defiantly disobeying the Lord. Even in the believer the heart has such potential to rebel that it must be our constant prayer that God will keep us from sin.

As we shall see later, God has ways of getting man's attention, and He will very effectively deal with Jonah. Man will not be able to thwart God's plan. Every single person needs to hear the message that God was sending Jonah to announce at Nineveh. We come into this world estranged from the God who created us, and we desperately need to be restored to a right relationship with Him. That can occur only when we place our trust in the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, whom God sent into this world to take the punishment for the sins of His people. In Jonah's day, man was to trust in the Savior to come; now we are to trust in the One who has come. Friends, may we all be given grace to repent and believe on the Lord Jesus.

The North Dakota Farm Bureau held their 80th annual state convention in Bismarck on November 18-19, 2022. Attendance was down due to weather conditions and icy roads in many parts of the state. Hettinger County was represented by President Alex Nielsen of New England, board member Trey Fischbach of New England and Secretary Marlene Kouba of Regent.

"Farmers and ranchers are beneficial to North Dakota as it is the number one economy. The Farm Bill will be important and affect all of us. North Dakota leads in producing several commodities. Inflation is tough on all of us. The current energy bill is hurting us. Trade is a huge issue now but was growing just two years ago. Conservation easements should not be permanent," were some of the comments by President Daryl Lies in his opening statement.

Four young men competed for the Collegiate Discussion Meet. There were two from DSU and two from NDSU. Winner Kyle Anderson of Montana attends college in Dickinson and will compete in Jacksonville, Florida in March.

The delegate session reviewed many policies that will guide their state lobbyists during the next session of the Legislature. AFBF Economist Bernt Nelson spoke on cattle trends. He said there were 98.8 million head of cattle this year but that number is down 2%. One cycle of cattle takes about 10 years to reproduce. We export beef to Japan, South Korea, China, Mexico and Canada. The outlook for 2023 is positive.

How many words can you make with the letters in AGRI-CULTURE? That was the challenge for fifth graders throughout the state in a contest this


Emily Grist of Mott/Regent Public School found 67 words and four of her classmates

Preheat oven to 350°. Layer the first 6 ingredients in a greased 13x9 inch baking dish. In a large bowl, whisk flour, eggs and milk until smooth. Add corn, salt and pepper, mix well. Pour over top; let stand 15 minutes. Dot with butter and sprinkle with pecans.

Cover and bake 35 minutes. Uncover and bake 30-35 minutes or until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean.
