

13,000 books by North Dakota
authors or about North Dakota.
About 10 years ago he added
on a large room to his house to
make an area for them and just
ordered another bookcase for
more space to display them.

Carvel said he got interested
in state history when he was in
the combined class of seventh
and eighth grades. He was in
the seventh but listened to the
other class as they discussed
"Know Your State". (I think it
was a thick reddish-brown book
as I remember studying it, too.)
As he got older he got more
interested and started collecting
with a goal of 600 books. It
wasn't long before he went way
beyond that total.

He has some unusual books
in size and content. Some are
by famous authors and some
are by little-known writers.
There are historical books,
some with maps, some are fiction
and others are non-fiction.
There are high school year-
books, city and county history
books and many more of various
sizes.



Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

In our last study we saw something of the amazing grace of God, even in His discipline of His rebellious prophet Jonah. After the sailors threw Jonah overboard to what seemed certain death, the Lord prepared a great fish to swallow him. Then Jonah finally prayed. We read in Jonah 2:2, "And he said: 'I cried out to the LORD because of my affliction, and He answered me. Out of the belly of Sheol I cried, and You heard my voice.'" This is likely one of those split-second prayers that are often uttered in times of urgent crises. It is reminiscent of Psalm 120:1: "In my distress I cried to the LORD, and He heard me." There is nothing wrong with crying out with those split-second prayers when in emergencies and danger. What is sad is if those are the ONLY kinds of prayers a person ever prays. Believers in Christ should be acknowledging God in all our ways (Proverbs 3:6).

Jonah's prayer is the prayer of a true believer who, when all seems hopeless, continues to hope and cry out to God. Faith looks to the unseen things of

God while surrounded by seemingly hopeless circumstances. We would not be surprised if Jonah had simply said, "This is it for me. The Lord has every right to take my life. I have been running from Him. I will soon be dead." But he has hope even now, because he knows what God is like and what He can do. And his split-second prayer has been met by a split-second deliverance in the form of a great fish.

It is amazing that the Lord answered Jonah's desperate prayer. It would not be surprising if He had ignored this prophet who was running from Him, and had let him go ahead and drown. But He did neither. Jonah's prayer, "Out of the belly of Sheol I cried, and You heard my voice" is a testimony of God's grace. When Jonah had demanded to be cast overboard, he expected to die. Sheol is the abode of the dead, and Jonah here seems to be comparing it to the belly of the great fish. But God did not give Jonah what he deserved. Instead He showed him amazing grace.

There are some notable parallels between Jonah's history and the history of our first parents. God created a garden and filled it with unimaginable beauty and delightful foods. He creat-

ed man and woman and placed them there with only one prohibition. Adam and Eve disobeyed God, causing disastrous ramifications for the entire human race. For now, every human being is born in a state of enmity and rebellion against their Creator. God could justly have given up on the human race and brought immediate eternal judgment upon Adam and Eve. But like Jonah, our first parents were not treated according to what they deserved. Instead God gave them the first gospel promise in His pronouncement to Satan in Genesis 3:15: "And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel." God here promises that there will one day be born of woman Someone who would defeat Satan. Of course, we now know that this was our Lord Jesus Christ. He paid the penalty for every sin of every person who would ever place his or her trust in Him alone for salvation. Through faith in Christ we are forgiven; we become beloved children of God; we look forward to an eternity with Him forever in heaven. Friends, this is amazing grace. Are you a partaker of it?

I was in the Library reading the blurb on the new books. (You can't tell a book by its blurb). This whole book was an oxymorism. This is, what it said was not what it meant and I'm not hip enough to figure it out.

So a few must be eight which still isn't a crowd. Revelation says 'a great crowd' or 'multitude' and compared them to the sands of the sea.

The strange thing about the word 'crowd' is that people in close proximity to others suggests a lack of order or control and is often translated, 'mob'. Acts 17:5 & 19:40.



Tuesday, February 7, 2023 a group of nine law enforcement officers, and their K9 partners, came to Mott for a K9 training event, held at the former Good Samaritan Nursing home.

The training was led by a master K9 trainer from Bismarck Police Department. The participants consisted of K9/handler teams from around western North Dakota who practiced narcotics searches inside the former nursing home. Each K9/handler team was tasked with

searching rooms for narcotics hidden by the trainer. The rooms may have had narcotics hidden in multiple places or none hidden at all. The locations or presence of drugs were never known to the officer being tested. The group conducts similar day-long trainings each month at different locations around western North Dakota in order to keep their K9s in good working shape. The purpose of consistent training is to reinforce legal search procedures, to update officers regarding changes to state or national legal standards or requirements related to the use of police K9s, as well as to maintain the proficiency of each officer and their K9 partner. The participating agencies were Hettinger County Sheriff's Office, Dunn County Sheriff's Office, Stark County Sheriff's Office, McKenzie County Sheriff's Office, Williston Police Department, and Bismarck Police Department.

Snow Control- Windbreaks can serve as "living snow fences"" controlling drifts near roads, buildings, or livestock or distributing snow evenly over large areas like crop fields.


Livestock Protection- windbreaks can be used as "outdoor barns," sheltered areas for feeding, and calving.

Reduce Soil Erosion- Windbreaks prevent wind erosion for 10 to 20 times their height downwind. They also filter windblown soil particles from the air.

Wildlife Habitat- In open areas where windbreaks are needed for wind reduction, they may also provide the only woody cover and food necessary for some wildlife species.

Crop Protection- windbreaks can increase crop yields up to 44%. Wind protection can reduce crop water use, increases a plant's ability to make food, and may increase pollination.

*Energy Conservation -*windbreaks can reduce winter heating costs 20 to 40% by reducing cold air infiltration into buildings.



Waddington Brothers take 2023 SPBGMA Band Championship

When the 2023 SPBGMA International Band Championship was decided last month in Nashville, the The Waddington Brothers, from southwest North Dakota, were declared the winners. Over multiple rounds, they came out on top out of 15 competing groups during the SPBGMA national convention.

We always like to highlight the contest winners, but their bus broke down on the way home in Omaha, NE, so we gave the guys some time to make it back to North Dakota before scheduling an interview.

But we caught up with Ethan Waddington over the weekend, who plays banjo with the four piece family band, and he shared some background on their group, and their SPBGMA experience. It turns out the four brothers are part of a larger musical family of seven siblings who used to tour all over the US and Canada with their parents as The Waddingtons. Their three sisters, and mom and dad, pulled out in 2011, when current bass player, Job, now 17, was just a boy.

Ethan tells us that eventually, he and his twin brother, Jacob, who plays mandolin, and older brother Seth on guitar, started the band up again.

"When the family band quit, we didn't perform together for about seven or eight years, and then we decided that us brothers would start up a bluegrass band. That was when COVID started, so all our work we booked starting out was cancelled.

When we started back we met up with Special Consensus, and Greg Cahill told me that we should go to SPBG-

MA and showcase, and all that. Once we saw that there was a contest, we figured we needed to be involved.

Last year was our first time in the Band Championship, and we came in fourth. There is nothing like this in North Dakota, and we loved being down there, and meeting people. We did it mostly to get on the big stage, but we also made a lot of contacts.

We decided to come again this year, with no goal or expectation of winning. We mostly hoped to crack the top three. But we did do a lot of preparation beforehand."

They did more than crack the top three, taking first place with their brother harmony on traditional bluegrass music, along with a polished stage performance.

Here is one of their songs in the final round, the gospel classic, Will There Be Any Stars in My Crown.

Ethan said that the welcome they received in Nashville was both gratifying and humbling.

"I was just blown away by how well the people accepted us. It was kind of overwhelming. Bluegrass people are great people.

We want to do more and more of this, playing bluegrass music. Our next step is talking to booking agencies and record labels. Now's the time to try to move forward."

He also admitted that North Dakota isn't exactly bluegrass central.

"There's not much bluegrass up here. Seth Mulder is from here, and Jasper Lorentzen from The Po' Ramblin' Boys. There are just not many bands. I guess it worked for us because we're brothers."

SPBGMA, the Society for the Preservation of Bluegrass Music of America, has designed the contest so that it is difficult for pickup bands to

beat out groups that actually work together regularly. The competition is spread over three rounds, with only 12 making it to the finals. Bands

must perform two songs in the first round, and three in the finals, and no songs may be repeated across the several rounds. Judges score

each contestant using a point system awarded over seven different categories.







Yes, they are rated for 18 and older, however, you cannot tell me that there are lots of under age 18 kids playing these games. By inhabiting violent characters in video games, children are more likely to imitate the behaviors of those characters and have difficulty distinguishing reality from fantasy. Exposure to violent video games is linked to lower empathy and decreased kindness. So there again, how do we raise children that are kind and understanding if they play these types of games?

But we are not talking just about children, as there are many young adults, especially males that play these games. Sure it is just a game, but is it really? When it becomes all encompassing and they have no other outside life other than coming home and spending their entire evenings and weekends playing games such as these, is it healthy? Do they also have lower empathy and decreased kindness with their families? I would bet that there are no statistics showing that as that may cause a decrease in the sales of those popular video games. Hopefully, at some point in their lives, they find that interaction with actual people is more rewarding than the game, but I am sure there are some that never grow up and spend their lives thinking that this is better than anything out there.

So the point I am trying to make here is that it is critical that parents of young kids take the time to check out any games that their children are interested in as well as movies. Don't be fooled by all the offerings on the phones nowadays and let your child have access to anything they want. Some things look very innocent until you research them a little bit. There are many that start out with a story of a woman being beaten and thrown out of the house to fend for themselves with a young child. How can this be a good thing to show? Maybe the game afterwards is just a simple jigsaw puzzle or a match 3, but why would they start out with that type of situation? This is just sad that game programming has to pick these kinds of topics. If you do see this setup, take the time to explain things to your children, or maybe find another game instead. If you don't it can mean that kids will come to think that this is an okay situation and maybe will accept or cause it in real life. If you really want a kinder more understanding world, it takes the involvement of parents in every aspect of a child's life. My wish is that people start to complain about these things, but I have little hope that it will change much in today's world. The dollar is mightier than the complaints in most cases. God Bless you all.

RECIPE OF THE DAY

NUTTY CARAMEL BARS

1 c. butter
1 egg
2 c. flour
1/2 c. sugar
1 tsp. vanilla
Topping:
1/2 c. butter
3/4 c. brown sugar
1 c. lightly salted whole mixed nuts
1/4 c. honey
1/4 c. whipping cream

Mix together 1 cup butter, and sugar until fluffy. Beat in egg and vanilla. Stir in flour. Mix well and press into a 9" x 13" pan. Bake at 350° for 15 minutes or until edges are lightly brown and center looks dry. Remove from oven and prepare topping. Bring to a boil in a saucepan the 1/2 cup butter, honey and brown sugar. Boil for 2 minutes and remove from heat. Stir in whipping cream and nuts. Spoon over crust. Bake another 10 minutes or until caramel bubbles.

Last Wednesday I had an appointment in Hettinger, it was such a nice day I decided to take my chances and drive to Lemmon with hope of getting to stop at the thrift store. As I turned down Main Street I couldn't just drive past Grandma's Chocolate Shop, especially with Valentine's Day just around the corner. Ann Abel the owner recognized me from my previous visit and I picked some chocolate treats for my Grandsons and Husband. As she added up my purchase I remembered she only accepts cash or checks, I had all of a \$5 bill in my purse, I went out to my vehicle to get my checkbook only to realize it was sitting at home where I'd been paying bills. I returned to the shop embarrassed and told Ann, "You'll have to put everything back I forgot my checkbook!" Ann insisted I take my purchases and pay her the next time I'm in Lemmon, which could be months or longer. Ann joked, "I don't know where you live but I do know where you work!" I took the candy and vowed to send



the check as soon as I got home.

My next stop would be the thrift store, I was greeted by volunteer Connie Horrigan and explained I was interested in doing a story. She gave me the grand tour as I shopped, knowing they would only take cash or a check: I was able to keep my purchase under \$5.

The Lemmon Thrift Store got its start over 40 years ago: Five Counties Hospital Axillary was looking for a way to raise money. The hospital has since closed and Five Counties Nursing Home Auxiliary Volunteers run the Thrift Store. Some 20 years ago Lyn Fiest organized a group of volunteers and the City of Lemmon built the building they currently call home. Over the years the Thrift Store has donated; drapes, beds, lifts and recently a new industrial washing machine. Some 20 volunteers keep the donations sorted and put out for sale. The store is open Tuesday – Saturday, 1:00 – 4:30, they are closed Mondays when volunteers spend the day sorting donations.

I headed back to Hettinger and had to stop at the Clothes Closet just in case they had something I couldn't live without. I'm always on the lookout for clothes for my three Grandsons and I hit the mother load that day. With less than \$3 I knew I'd have to get cash, so off to the grocery store to make a small purchase and get cash



back. I've never actually gotten cash back with my debit card and had forgotten or never setup a password. The clerk was very patient and went away for a minute and came back with \$40: I assumed she just charged it to my debit card. I returned to the Clothes Closet paid for my lute and was on my way.

Friday morning I was doing my on-line banking and realized the \$40 was not deducted from my account. I promptly called Kennedy's Super Valu in Hettinger and the same clerk answered the phone. I explained who I was and wanted to make things right with the store, She checked with the store manager and everything had balanced out on Wednesday. Eventually the clerk remembered the incident; she had given me \$40 of her own money! I was speechless! I'm still having trouble believing it really happened. I thanked her many times over, got her address and sent her a check.
