

LENT

Where has the time gone? It seems like yesterday, we were celebrating Christmas, and here we are about to begin Lent. It is true, time does fly! As we begin Lent, many people are probably asking "What should I do during this Lenten season?" I find myself reflecting on this exact question and can think of many things that are "good" for me, but is Jesus asking me for more? I was listening to a podcast recently and they presented 3 probing questions which have stuck with me over the last week.

1. What is the greatest wound/area of weakness in my life?

2. How is the evil one using that area in my life to keep me from God?

3. What is a way to act against the evil one and promote healing in my life?

These probing questions can only be answered by us, hopefully in prayer with God. I encourage all of us to pray with these questions instead of answering them on our own.

The first question, "What is the greatest wound/area of weakness in my life?" We all have these places in our life that are a struggle for us. Honestly, it is something that many times we choose to forget, but it is something that greatly affects who we are and our reactions to certain situations. It could have something to do with some authority figure when we were young, always needing affirmation, or some other thing that greatly hurt us. These are not fun areas to probe into, but at the same time, areas that need to be brought to our attention because they truly do affect our lives and those around us. I en-

courage all of us to ask this very difficult question and ask God to help us through whatever it may be.

The second question is much easier than the first question. "How is the evil one using this area of my life to keep me from God?" God is a God of love who wants great healing in our lives especially in those areas of weakness. The evil one on the other hand wants to use those areas to keep us away from God and can be very successful at times. Once we see our greatest wound, we can come to see how he is using that against us and keeping us away from God. Seeing this leads us into the last question "What is the way to act against the evil one and promote healing?" All of us want to be healthy, it is in our nature. Let's act in ways that make us healthy this Lent!

After asking these 3 questions, we will have a better idea of how God wants us to walk with Him during this Lenten Season. Imagine the effects of asking these questions and then responding in a way that God is asking instead of doing things we think are "good" on our own. It may not be the simple and easy path we usually take, but the results will also not be the usual results either. These questions will help us to dig deeper this Lenten Season and grow in our relationship with Him instead of simply being a self-help project. I encourage all of us to spend the time necessary to ask God His plan for you this Lenten season, and to know that it will produce great fruit in your life.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have begun considering the desperate prayer that the prophet Jonah uttered from the belly of the great fish, and we resume today in Jonah 2:3: "For You cast me into the deep, into the heart of the seas, and the floods surrounded me; all Your billows and Your waves passed over me." You probably recall that it was the sailors who threw Jonah overboard, yet here Jonah attributes this action to God. Jonah is rightly seeing all things and people as doing God's bidding. The storm, the sailors, and the great fish were but instruments to carry out God's plan. The billows and waves which passed over Jonah before he was swallowed by the great fish are here called God's waves and billows. Such things are not incompatible with God's love, for they are designed to bring about restoration.

Jonah's prayer continues in verse 4: "Then I said, 'I have been cast out of Your sight; yet I will look again toward Your holy temple.'" Here Jonah seems to feel that God has completely forsaken him. The worst suffering for the true believer is to think that he or she is separated from God. He may not think that he has lost his salvation, but to have God seemingly at a distance with His disciplining hand heavy upon him is excruciating. However, the true believer, even in despair, can know that


God will not forsake him. Jesus promised in John 6:37, "All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will by no means cast out."

The word "yet" in verse 4 indicates that though Jonah was under discipline, the LORD was not through with him. Even while falling into the water, he sensed that God was holding him up. This is demonstrated by his words, "Yet I will look again toward Your holy temple." The temple represented the place of God's special presence in the midst of His people and the place of reconciliation for sinners who realized that the sacrifices being offered there were pictures of the salvation God would provide to restore sinners to Himself.

King Solomon prayed at the dedication of the Temple in 2 Chronicles 6:21: "And may You hear the supplications of Your servant and of Your people Israel, when they pray toward this place. Hear from heaven Your dwelling place, and when You hear, forgive." In the belly of the great fish, Jonah remembered the Temple with its holy of holies and the mercy seat, where God promised to forgive the sins of

those who came seeking reconciliation through the blood of the Lamb. As one commentator wrote: "If a sinning, selfish, loveless, disobedient servant of the Lord under the Old Testament has such boldness in approaching the very God he has offended, how much more should you approach the throne of grace with boldness? When you are suffering severe chastening from the Lord, admit your wrong and return to Him." For we no longer look to some earthly Temple, but to the Lord Jesus Christ. Those whose trust is in Him have full and open access to God. Thus the writer of Hebrews says in Hebrews 4:14-16, "Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need."

God welcomes the unbeliever who comes to Him in repentance and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. And He is always ready to restore His erring child. None of us is likely as far gone as Jonah. And our heavenly Father, like the father of the prodigal in Luke 15, is ready to receive us with bounteous love.



A Little Birdie Told Me

A Little Birdie Told Me: "Lent Begins on February 22 With Ash Wednesday." The tradition of Lent has its origin dating to 325 AD following the Council of Nicea. Lent is 46 days before Easter but only 40 days are dedicated to prayer, fasting and almsgiving: Sunday being the Lord's Day is not counted. This fact has been a bone of contention with some people, but growing up Catholic I can assure you, Sundays are a day off from Lenten practices. My good friend Debbie Gunderson introduced me to The Chosen series and I will be forever grateful to her. The Chosen is the first-ever multi-season series about the Life of Jesus. I've watched my share of movies about the life of Jesus none of them compare to The Chosen. Writer/Director Dallas Jenkins has brought out the humanity of Jesus, making it so easy to fall in love with him. 





Giving Hearts Raise \$697,827 For West River Health Services Foundation!



That's not a misprint! Almost 500 Giving Hearts from around the USA helped the ever-growing local 501 (c) 3 nonprofit, West River Health Services Foundation, raise \$697,827 leading up to and on "Giving Hearts Day" this past February 9th. The fundraising and development arm for West River Health Services and Western Horizons Living Centers, the WRHS Foundation has been involved with Giving Hearts Day, by far the largest single day fundraiser in North Dakota, the last five consecutive years. The total amounts raised at WRHSF for each of those years was \$147,440 in 2019; \$191,672 in 2020; \$220,670 in 2021; \$216,227 in 2022; and now \$697,827 in 2023! Wow! We guess it was a terrific idea to join this amazing platform – raising \$1,473,836 in five years. We have exceeded our goals each and every year thus far. This year we exceeded goal #1 – by exceeding our matching funds of \$100,000. Then we surpassed our goal #2 – to raise \$250,000! We are grateful.

Of course, the three Roger Follmer Estate gifts totaling \$475,000 (so far) have made a huge impact on this giving day for the WRHS Foundation. But even without those funds, our area giving hearts gave \$222,827! And the two days following Giving Hearts we brought in another \$9,388! Unbelievable! We are thinking our believers really want this healthcare system to thrive here.

Ted Uecker, Fund Development Officer at WRHS Foundation is amazed at the giving. "We are so grateful. Never in our wildest dreams did we think we'd be raising these types of funds in a community of 1,055 people and an area community of approximately 15,000. However, our reach is USA-wide and we still offer top-quality healthcare 'close to home,' which everyone here needs. As do visitors to our area. A few weeks ago we had a state representative from the eastern part of North Dakota as a patient here. She raved about our caring people and top-quality facilities and equipment."

Although the \$475,000 Follmer Estate Funds are currently sitting in an investment fund, the WRHS Foundation Board of Directors is diligently trying to figure out the best future use of these funds. We'll be sure to keep the public informed during



this process. The remaining Giving Hearts Day funds were mainly gifted toward our "Healthcare Heroes Endowment Fund," although we also received many amazing gifts for our West River Ambulance, Physician Recruitment Endowment, Partners In Health Club, Western Horizons Living Centers, Surgery Center, WRHS Clinics and the General Fund.

Uecker also pointed out that it is truly a TEAM effort at the WRHS Foundation. "We have terrific support from our Administrative Staff to run with events like 'Giving Hearts Night With The Nighthawks & Bulldogs.' Plus, we've had tremendous contributions from Cindy Ham, Dr. John Kludt, Jill Sailer and our

WRHS Board of Directors. And our local downtown merchants continually step up to promote our efforts and give. It seems like if people have a connection to West River or the Hettinger area, they realize how important this organization is to our area community. So TOGETHER we are making a difference for the future of WRHS/WHLC."

Currently, the "Healthcare Heroes Endowment Fund" Campaign has made a huge jump the last few months to \$423,913 raised! And this is in only seventeen months! Our original goal was to raise \$500,000 in five years or less. Since then, we have revised the goal to \$500K in three years. But maybe we can do it in two! You never know

about the believers in top-quality healthcare "close to home." They seem to be determined not to let this pillar of the area community crumble.





benefits.


