Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie,
Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We pick up our study today in 1 Peter 3:8, where we have been considering the duties that believers in the Lord Jesus Christ have toward one another: "Finally, all of you be of one mind, having compassion for one another; love as brothers, be tenderhearted, be courteous." Last time we dwelt on the instructions to have compassion and to love as brothers. That brings us to the next quality which the apostle Peter mentions. And this one helps us to understand better what brotherly love is like. He says that we are to be "tenderhearted" toward one another. Being tenderhearted is the opposite of being calloused. All too often we are so caught up in our own little worlds with our own desires and concerns, that we do not take time to allow the concerns and needs of our brothers and sisters to affect us. But to be tenderhearted is to be ready to feel and show affection toward others. It probably seems funny to us that the original meaning of this word is to have healthy inward parts or bowels. But that was the way people spoke of affections in those times. It is much the same as our saying we love someone from the bottom of our heart. Peter is saying that the love we have for one another ought to be one in which we care and feel deeply, from our inmost being. And this should lead to very practical acts of love on our part. As the apostle John wrote in 1 John 3:16-18, "By this

we know love, because He laid down His life for us. And we also ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. But whoever has this world's goods, and sees his brother in need, and shuts up his heart from him, how does the love of God abide in him? My little children, let us not love in word or in tongue, but in deed and in truth."

One of the best ways to cultivate tenderheartedness is by praying for one another. Not only does praying for our brethren keep them on our minds and hearts, but as we do this before God, He motivates us to care about the things that concern them and to seek ways of being helpful to them.

The last quality of Christian love mentioned in verse 8 is that of being humble minded. There is some discrepancy in the manuscripts about the word used here, but the best attested manuscripts seem to support the word which means "humble minded" rather than "courteous." It is obvious why this ingredient is so essential for loving the brethren. For it is only when people have an attitude of putting others before themselves that they can really love. The

supreme example of this is, of course, the Lord Jesus Christ. The apostle Paul instructs us in Philippians 2:4-8, "Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others. Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross."

Friends, there is no greater humility than for the eternal God the Son to take on human flesh, to endure a life of unimaginable suffering and excruciating death on the cross. And all of this He did to pay the penalty for sin and rescue helpless, hopeless sinners from eternal condemnation. Such love and such humility are staggering. Friends, are you trusting in this loving, humble Savior alone to make you right with God? Can you see that no good works we could possibly do could ever come close to what Jesus has done for the salvation of His people? Please be sure you are relying on Christ alone to restore you to a right relationship with God. Acts 4:12: "Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

The Lenten Journey through the Gospels

When I despair, I remember that all through history the way of truth and love has always won. There have been tyrants and murderers and for a time they can seem invincible. But in the end they always fall. Think of it: always. Whenever you are in doubt that that is God's way, the way the world is meant to be. Think of that and then try to do it his way.

Mohandas K. Gandhi

The words of Gandhi quicken the heart: Every age has reasons for despair. Our world is not the first in a mess.

Despair can surface when we observe chaos and confusion, financial and environmental crises, dissension and division. Phone and computer algorithms feed us more of the same.

Enter the gospels in Lent which deal with these human conditions in striking fashion, and address what Gandhi alludes to.

The first Sunday details Jesus' temptations, providing a template for later issues: appetite, mortality and control.

Appetite. The Samaritan woman at the well on Sunday 3 hints at the things we do to satisfy that urge for pleasure. She also reminds us of the consequences of satisfying those desires: being ostracized by peers. The story illustrates how we satisfy longings and, at the same time, judge those who transgress boundaries and good common sense. Blatant promiscuity, hyper-sexualizing of almost everything; gross consumption of material things; and the waste of natural resources—all these give reason to despair. Sadly, we participate in some of these, often unwittingly. Will we ever change? Will others never improve? What is the point in trying to do anything?

Mortality. On Sunday 4 the man born blind puts sickness, illness and disease on center stage. Science and medicine have made great strides in eradicating some diseases or controlling problems. Then a new strain or variant arises. The treatment no longer delivers. We cannot escape our limitations; we all must face death. We mask the reality of death with attempts to ease, avoid, or sanitize it. What's the point? Why bother? Maybe if I keep busy and distract myself, ill health and death will go away!

Control. On Sunday 5, Lazarus' resurrection looks like a defeat for death. Closer examination reveals it is more about control. The sisters of Lazarus send for Jesus because their brother is ill, and they subtly play on Jesus' emotions, "the one you love. . ." (So, use your power to heal him!) Jesus fails to show up in time, recriminations follow: "If you had been here . . ." Such power plays lead to abuse. The abuse of power breeds tyrants. And that, in turn, breeds despair. Can I stand up to abuse? Or do I simply give up: that's just the way the world is.

NEVER GIVE UP

BE GRATEFUL.

Gandhi touches the right chord: God is always present and ultimately the way we go is his way.

The element missing from the retelling of these gospel stories is the presence of Jesus. In each, Jesus first acknowledges the person in his or her situation without judgment.

Jesus lets the Samaritan woman know he is familiar with her story, but he does not condemn her. In fact, he treats her better than almost anyone else has. He offers her the possibility of change and hope. **Recognized as a person of worth, treated with dignity and respect, she changes her life dramatically.** No longer afraid to approach her neighbors, she becomes an agent for change and conversion in *their* lives!


With the man born blind, Jesus does indeed heal his blindness, but, more importantly, he affirms him as a person. Freed from the constraints of his disability and the legalism of societal demands, he can choose for himself. **No longer defined by his condition, he stands up to the authorities and expresses opinions freely.** His shackles have been cast off. Much more important than his restored eyesight is his newfound dignity.

In the story of Lazarus, as Gandhi reminds us, we see God in charge. We want things according to our plans and rationale. When things do not go that way, we think that all is over, we're doomed. With tyrants wielding power, we assume the worst, we fight back and we grow impatient—we give up. **This story highlights another way, one unforeseen.** Jesus' presence and action opens doors.

The words of Gandhi ring true; the gospels of the Lenten journey illustrate his point.

The gospel from Sunday 2, the story of Jesus' Transfiguration, counteracts despair at its root. We partake of that vision on the mount along with the disciples. In that truth we find the antidote to despair. As Jesus repeatedly admonishes his disciples: "Do not be afraid."

Let the Lenten journey begin!
