

Reformed Church of the Lord

Our study today resumes in Jonah chapter 2, continuing with the prophet's prayer from the belly of the great fish. There we read in verses 5 and "The waters surrounded me, even to my soul; the deep closed around me; weeds were wrapped around my head. I went down to the moorings of the mountains; the earth with its bars closed behind me forever: yet You have brought up my life from the pit, O LORD, my God." None of us would like to have followed Jonah in this dismal part of his life. Yet there was one Man who did. He went all the way to death. God poured out His wrath for the sins of all His people upon Him. The stone enclosed Him in the tomb. And for three days He remained silent in the grave. Yes, our Lord Jesus Christ endured things far worse than Jonah-and not for any sin of His own, for He had none, But He endured these horrors for all who would ever place their trust in Him to make them right with God. He drank not a mouth full of water, but the cup of God's wrath against sin. He paid in full

the deepest and all possibility of deliverance seemed gone, the Lord intervened. As we read in verse 5, "You have brought up "Pit" here refers to the grave. In the place where death usually reigns, Jonah found life, and his worst fears of dying as a prisoner at the bottom of the sea were not

Why did God rescue this disobedient prophet? Why not just send another man to preach to the people of Nineveh? God did this so that Jonah might be a sign for us of Christ's rising from the dead. The Lord Jesus Himself used Jonah as an example when He said in Matthew 12:40, "For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish, so will the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth." As Jonah did not remain in the depths of the ocean, trapped in the belly of the great fish. so Christ did not remain in the sealed tomb but was gloriously raised to life.

Jonah illustrates the fact

that man cannot lift himself out of the miry pit in which he is helplessly stuck and headed for eternal condemnation because of his sin against God. Only the resurrection power of Christ can bring deliverance, provide forgiveness, and create life out of death. The psalmist says in Psalm 40:2, "He also brought me up out of a horrible pit, out of the miry clay, and set my feet upon a rock, and established my steps." This verse is actually the testimony of every believer in the Lord Jesus Christ. God has brought each one out of the miry pit of the kingdom of darkness that leads to eternal condemnation. And God has transferred him/her into the Kingdom of the Son of His love (Colossians 1:13), destined for an eternity of blessedness in heaven. Friend, have you experienced this transfer? Are you relying on Christ's payment for sinand that alone—to make you right with God? May it be so, by God's grace.

Courtesy

In our Mott martial arts program at the Armory, the first tenet is "courtesy". Most people think that studying combatives is some sort of sport or, self-esteem fitness program. A tenet is a guiding principle, whereas, in sports it would be good sportsmanship or in a fitness program, according to personal trainer Jerry Diaz, it would be individuality. I started studying karate in 1963 at age 5. That was 60 years ago and a lot has changed both inside the dojo and in our country. We were taught the code of Budo-self-discipline and interaction with others in a constructive manner. Think of it like the Chinese saying, "There are no secrets only Kung Fu". Not to go all DreamWorks on you but Mivamoto Musashi (17th Century Master) said there are different personality types for all potential students and, only one will stay to learn the truth about the foreaoina riddle.

First, the lazy pupil--he/she only scratches the surface of the training and, never really dedicates themselves to eradicating their own bad habits and gaining wisdom-they soon quit and move on to the next shiny thing. The second is the abstract thinker who prays to the riddle, writes it on a banner and declares it unknowable and, therefore, the great secret of life. That student inevitably starts at the end, moves backward and, quits to start their own cult-never really mastering anything except signaling their own virtue. Finally, the logical thinker who understands that without knowing the definition of the phrase "Kung Fu", he/she cannot even begin to learn. Pull out the old Chinese-English dictionary and "kung fu" means "hard work." There are no secrets only hard work. "Dojo busting"-showing up at a competitor's school and "challenging" the lead instructor not understanding that immature bragging does not replace kung fu-the hard work the other fellow was putting in training gakusei (students) to be the next generation of soke (founders). I fell prey too until the early 2000's when it dawned on me that the respect and courtesy that was drilled into my head as a child had been replaced with that chest-thumping, arrogant all-about-me mentality that was infecting every aspect of American life, particularly, disrespect toward your mentors. Today, if your neighbor disagrees with you or complains, he is the enemy to be defeated at all costs. Words are Violence? The contemptuous "OK Boomer" mentality trumpeted by social media. Forgetting, as I forgot, that my grandfather and father WERE wiser than me-until I became a senior citizen myself! They seem a lot smarter now. So. I'll end this column with what my first law enforcement mentor taught me in 1980, "Don't make it worse when you get there." Every day try to make the world a little better by embracing the ethos, "might for right...not might makes right." Try it...you'll

Transmission Line

Last November there was an article in the Hettinger County Herald about a new transmission line coming through southwestern North Dakota. On February 3 there was more information in The Bismarck Tribune with Public Service Commissioner, Julie Fedorchak as they issue the permits.

What is this all about? A group of land agents have been meeting with land owners to get their permission for a sure getting paid Gatherings of land owners have been held and a public meeting will be held later. One was held in Mott at the Knights of Columbus Hall on October 27. It consisted of several posters with agents beside them to answer questions but there was no speaker. A lunch was included.

The proposed transmission line would be about 385 miles long from Colstrip, Montana to St. Anthony where a substation would be built and then north to Square Butte Substation at Beulah. It is estimated to cost about \$2.5 billon to connect three regional electric markets. Allete Inc. of Duluth is working with Houston-based Grid United on the North Plains Connector line. It would create 3,000 megawatts and could support 10 typical-size wind farms in the state or equal to about three-fourths of the electricity consumed by all of the customers in North Dakota at any peak time. This project is supposedly an important step toward a more reliable energy grid that ties transmission projects being developed in the Upper Midwest and the Western Interconnection.

North Dakota currently produces more electricity than we consume and exports it to other states. Allete, which owns BNI Energy in Bismarck and Grid United, have signed a memorandum of understanding with plans to finalize an agreement early this year. They expect to pursue at least a third of the land owners and would oversee the line's operation. Building could start in late 2025 and the line could be operational by

How would this be done? The company is taking a landowner-first approach. To do this they studied plat maps to search for landowners and where they lived before contacting them. About 350 landowners will be involved in North Dakota and

Montana. There would be four to five towers per mile constructed through the middle of Slope, Hettinger, Grant and Morton Counties. The towers will be self-supporting steel monopoles with wide conductors on top and the company would have an easement of 100 feet on either side of them along the line. No eminent domain is involved. About 300 to 500 temporary construction jobs as well as permanent jobs will be created.

The Hettinger County Zoning Board changed their height regulations since July to accommodate this line.

Each landowner paid a one-time amount for each tower on their land. The towers will be 120 feet to 195 feet tall with a base of 8 to 25 feet in diameter. They will be buried up to 50 feet deep, depending on terrain. They will have a life expectancy of 100 years. Some landowners are strongly against it while others want it-maybe for the payments. Renters and nearby neighbors have had no say in the proceedings.

After the route was planned, there have been numerous changes. The company claims they chose this route versus aoing along Interstate (which they said would be too expensive but no one explained how) and that a line along our southern border would interfere with habitat of an endangered species. One agent said they chose it as it was less populated. The present route would be a few miles north of Amidon and about 3 miles south of New England. It would continue east to one mile north of Black Butte before crossing the Enchanted Highway near the Pheasant Family and meander east into Grant County and Morton County. A route map can be seen at the County Auditor's

There are wind turbines in Adams County, Hettinger County and Stark County and now it seems there will be huge transmission lines in the area,







Other area "College Upperclassmen" receiving \$1,000 scholarships from the WRHS Foundation included: Hailee Kuske from New England High School, who is working on her Radiologic Technology degree at Minot State University. 




