Coming from a family of twelve kids our life consisted of hand-me-downs, home-made clothes, and sometimes jeans turned paddle pushers just to stretch them little further.

I find myself wondering what life would have been like if we had prom when I was in school. .. None of us were particularly ugly, regardless of how many times my sister Lorraine got barked at. We are hoping to remove that factor giving girls of all financial backgrounds the opportunity to come together and look beautiful without over taxing their family's pocketbook.

I know without an event like this my family would never have been able to send us to prom. and there are families today in the same situation.

During Advent and even through Christmas, a common Gospel we hear in the Catholic Church is the Genealogy of Christ given by Matthew and Luke. This Gospel is hard to listen to because it is very detailed with names, hard to preach because of the names listed, and often misunderstood as to why it is important in the life of a Christian. I find myself asking "What is the point and why do I have to hear this Gospel every year on Christmas?" I found my answer this year in the words of Pope St. Leo the Great.

"To speak of our Lord, the son of the Blessed Virgin Mary, as true and perfect man is of no value to us if we do not believe that he is descended from the line of ancestors set out in the

Matthew's gospel begins by

setting out the genealogy of Jesus Christ, son of David, son of Abraham, and then traces his human descent by bringing his ancestral line down to his mother's husband, Joseph. On the other hand, Luke traces his parentage backward step by step to the actual father of mankind, to show that both the first and the last Adam share the same

No doubt the Son of God in his omnipotence could have taught and sanctified men by appearing to them in a semblance of human form as he did to the patriarchs and prophets, when for instance he engaged in a wrestling contest or entered into conversation with them, or when he accepted their hospitality and even ate the food they set before him. But these appearances were only types. signs that mysteriously foretold the coming of one who would take a true human nature from the stock of the patriarchs who had gone before him. No mere figure, then, fulfilled the mystery of our reconciliation with God, ordained from all eternity. The Holy Spirit had not yet come upon the Virgin nor had the power of the Most High overshadowed her, so that within her spotless womb Wisdom might build itself a house and the Word become flesh. The divine nature and the nature of a servant were to be united in one person so that the Creator of time might be born in time. and he through whom all things were made might be brought forth in their midst.

For unless the new man, by being made in the likeness of sinful flesh, had taken on himself the nature of our first parents, unless he had stooped to be one in substance with his mother while sharing the Father's substance and, being alone free from sin, united our nature to his, the whole human race would still be held captive under the dominion of Satan. The Conqueror's victory would have profited us nothing if the battle had been fought outside our human condition. But through this wonderful blending the mystery of new birth shone upon us, so that through the same Spirit by whom Christ was conceived and brought forth we too might be born again in a spiritual birth; and in consequence the evangelist declares the faithful to have been born not of blood, nor of the desire of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God."

The Genealogy of Christ is important to background the fact that God became a true man He has a genealogical history that can be traced just like you and me. It is the genealogy that points us even more to a real person that wants a relationship with us. As we begin the new year, I encourage us all to make a resolution to encounter the person of Christ, not just the idea, and have a real encounter and relationship with Him. Know of my continued prayers. God

It was done But some of the Kings of other neighboring Countries and towns heard of all the destruction that Joshua and Israel were doing, plus they heard the deal with the Gibeonites, so, in Joshua 10: 2-3 Adoni-Zedek King of Jerusalem sent King of Hebron, King Jarmuth Piram, King of Lachish and Debir King of Eglon. 5 Kings in all were set to go against Gibeon because all these Kings were afraid of them because of their size and they had made a covenant with Israel. So. naturally Joshua had to honor the covenant with Gibeon and agreed to go and

fight with them. 2 things here first- God honored the covenant with Gibeon. in Joshua 10:8 and the Lord said to Joshua, do not fear them, for I have delivered them into your hands; not a man of them shall stand before you. Now here is the beginning of the lost day, Joshua 10:12 then Joshua spoke to the Lord in the day when the Lord delivered up the Amorites before the children of Israel, and said in the sight of Israel: sun, stand still over Gibeon; and Moon in the Valley of Aijalon. So, the stood still, and the moon stopped, till all the people had revenge upon their

Is it not written in the book of Jasher? So, the sun stood still in the midst of the Heaven, and did not hasten to go down for about a whole day. That time was about 23 hours and 40 minutes. Next, we look in the Book of Isaiah 38:2-8 Hezekiah King of Judah gets sick and God tells him to get his affairs in order he is fixing to die. Hezekiah whines and gets upset with God. So, God extends his life 15 years. So, as a sign, Isaiah 38:8 the sun had gone down on the sundial of Ahaz 10 degrees and God allowed the sun to return 10 degrees which it had gone down. Now the time of the sundial returning 10 degrees was about 20 minutes. Both these were give or take a little tine either side, but real close to 24 hours.

Ever heard that person was a scapegoat for someone else's wrong. In Leviticus 16:9 we are told about the use of a scapegoat in the Bible. And Aaron shall bring the goat on which the Lord's lot fell, and offer it as a sin offering. But the goat on which the lot fell to be the scapegoat shall be presented alive before the Lord, to make atonement upon it, and to be let go as the scapegoat into the wilderness. God allowed a goat to have the sins of Israel placed on its head and released into the wilderness.

The meaning of the word Ichabod is this, the Glory has departed from Israel, for the Art of God has been captured. In that day nothing more horrific could have happened to Israel than to have the Art of the Covenant captured by an enemy of Israel, but enemy of God.

Ever heard that ole saying the hand writing was on the wall, oh I knew it would not be long before he was caught, hand writing was on the wall. Daniel 5 Belshazzar was having a party and decided to show off in front of his guest. So, he brought out the vessels that belonged to the temple of God in Jerusalem. They drank out of the gold, silver and bronze vessels praising the gods of gold, silver and bronze.

Then the hand began to write on the wall and wrote a message. This is the message Mene, Mene, Tekel, Upharsin. Mene. God has numbered your kingdom and finished it; Tekel you have been weighted in the balances and found wanting; Peres your kingdom has been divided and given to the Medes and Persia. That very night Belshazzar was dead.

All this is to say read the Bible. Study the Bible. Pray as you read and study God's Word. This is all about Him and the Life that He wants for you. But it is a Choice, you have to choose what life you want to live. Jeremiah 29:11 He know the plans that He has for you, plans to help you not to harm you. But you have to choose Him. ON FORGIVING GOD

Suppose God has sent (or allowed) some hard experiences in the past. Suppose we are in a hard spot right now, a "spot" sent or allowed by God. In the Psalms and in much other sacred scripture, we encounter prayers of lament, complaints to God. Perhaps we are afraid to lament or cry out in our distress. Perhaps we think to make nice around God, even though we feel sorely hurt. Be assured, we can lament in prayer. We can be honest-to-God in our distress. And maybe, just maybe, in time and with God's grace, we can manage to forgive God for suchand-such hardship.

Can we forgive God? Is it preposterous to even speak of forgiving God? What can God have done amiss? How could God ever be in our debt, need-

Of course, God cannot have ever done anything amiss. God is not quilty in our presence. God does not owe us an apology. But in our human emotions, it is common to feel as if we have been disappointed, betrayed, let down, abandoned, deeply wronged by God. The death of a child. The death of a spouse, parent, sibling, in-law. The manner in which a death came to pass. The illness and the sufferings. One's own illness and sufferings. Unemployment. Substance addiction. Mental illness. Suffering comes under many cloaks, making unwelcome visits, overstaying its welcome.

We may well be holding a grudge against God. God is guiltless, but not in the court of our own opinion. We can feel disappointed with God, angry at God, feel abandoned by God. We may need to cut God some slack, to declare peace, to let God off the hook for such-andsuch. And in our human emotional manner of expression, we may even say to God, "I forgive you, God, for....

Much of what we suffer, I suspect, is not caused by God's sending suffering upon us. Rather, it is within God's permissive will that accidents happen, disease happens, misun-

derstandings happen. We might for a time blame God, but a new day awaits, when we see our benevolent God upholding us through our present sufferings. In the meantime, we could do much good by offering our sufferings to bless others in their need.

OPEN WINDOW

Is your prayer life cramped? Are there certain conversations you are not ready to have with God the Father; with Jesus; with the Holy Spirit? What in your life is "off the table" during your prayer times? Is there a "dead horse" under your bed, and you make nice talk to God about anything, just anything else? One of the uncomfortable conversations we must have with God at times is about hurts, disappointments, unanswered prayers. We may find renewed freedom in prayer if we lay it all on the table. And this may require (in our human way of thinking) our forgiving God for this and for that. We can open a window, admit some fresh air into our prayer, by letting God off the hook, and renewing our trust in God's perfect good will toward us.

PRAYERS OF LAMENT

Are we squeamish about praying in lamentation to God? Perhaps a few examples would make clear what I mean here. The following are some brief prayers of mine, jotted down in recent weeks, most often in the wee hours of the night.

"O Jesus, it hurts to be afraid. I don't want to be afraid. I don't want to be afraid. I don't want to be afraid. But I've never died before. Hold me. Just hold


"Jesus, I feel so lost. I have never died before. You have to get me through this, be with me, take me through the veil to the other side when my time

"O Father, I feel so alone, pulled off to the side of the road while, for others, life goes on. I feel so alone. Be with me here on the roadside of life."

Reflections on the Words of Life

In our study of 1 Peter 1:18-19, we have seen that the answer to the great question, "What can wash away my sin?" is "NOTHING but the blood of Jesus!" As we continue in verse 20, we find more remarkable truths: "He indeed was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you." Sadly, errors abound about God's plan of salvation. Some teach that God has done everything He could do to save man by sending His Son to pay the price of redemption, but that whether or not anyone benefits from this is determined by man himself. In other words, they believe that God made salvation possible but did not actually save any-

Now it is true that each person who is saved has to come to the point of acknowledging his or her sinfulness and need for a Savior and place his/her trust in Jesus Christ alone for salvation. But because all are born "dead in trespasses and sins" (Ephesians 2:1), no one could make such a decision unless God first opened his eyes and drew him to Himself. Jesus said in John 6:44, "No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him." Scripture presents God as totally sovereign, in complete control of all things. (Psalm 115:3: "Our God is in heaven; He does whatever He pleases.") It teaches that God has determined to save a people for Himself and guaranteed that they will come to Him. (Romans 8:29: "For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren." John 6:37: "All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will by no means cast out.")

The Bible proclaims that God has chosen a people and purchased them with the sacrifice of His beloved Son, and made sure that they will be brought to faith in Jesus Christ as their Savior and Lord. In the passage we are focusing on, Peter deals with the plan and outworking of these truths. We see that God alone is the Author of salvation. He left no part of it to chance. Peter tells us here that God planned to provide Jesus as the Savior of His people

even before He made the world. He knew before creation that one of His angels, whom we now call Satan, would fall into sin. He knew that many angels would side with Satan and become demons. And He knew that Satan would tempt Adam and Eve to sin, that they would fail that test and thus plunge the whole human race into sin. All of these things were part of God's plan.


Interestingly, Peter made the same point he is making in our passage on the Day of Pentecost. He tells a large crowd in Acts 2:22-23, "Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a Man attested by God to you by miracles, wonders, and signs which God did through Him in your midst, as you yourselves also know; Him, being delivered by the determined purpose and foreknowledge of God, you have taken by lawless hands, have crucified, and put to death." Notice that Peter asserts two truths that from our perspective do not seem to fit together. That is because God's ways are so much higher than our ways, and unfathomable to our finite minds. He tells these fellow Jews that they are responsible for putting Jesus to death. Likely some hearing Peter were in the crowd which cifixion. Yet, though the crowd's decision was the uncoerced result of their hatred for Jesus, Peter says that He was "delivered by the determined purpose and foreknowledge of God." God knew that there was no other way to save mankind, no other way that His own holiness and justice could be satisfied in paying the debt of sin. Because Christ is both God and man, His sacrifice is of infinite worth to pay the price for our sins. And He gives His perfect righteousness to those who believe on Him, which makes them righteous before God. We read in Philippians 3:9: "And be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which is from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith." Lord willing, we shall continue this study next time. But I leave you with the plea to make sure that you are trusting in Christ alone as your Savior.


