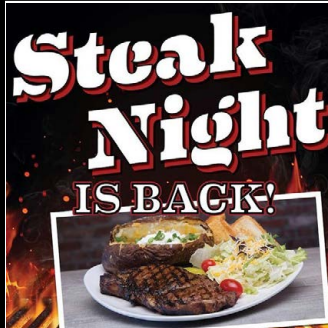

District 31 of the 68th Legislative Session

by Senator Don Schaible

Greeting from the 2023 Legislative Session. Many changes are apparent with many new faces and lots of changes on committee assignments. I have also faced new challenges in my position as your Senator. This session, I have been given opportunity to serve on the Appropriations Committee with Education and Environment being my sub-committee. I am very excited to serve on budgets of which I have a lot of interest in and be able to have a much louder voice on how the people's money is spent.

With the seniority I have, I also serve as the Senate Pro Temp, which means when our new Lt. Governor, Tammy Miller is not there to lead the senate, that responsibility falls to me. It will be quite an honor and a bit frightening and the same time.

With only the second week of the session, there is 180 bills introduced and with an expectation of well over 800 bills, we will be at full speed very soon. Tax relief is going to be one of the biggest issues with the governor suggesting income tax reduction and with my idea of property tax relief as the only other tax relief bill so far, we will most likely have some very spirited debate on a subject that most like will be unresolved until the end of the session.

With our revenue projec-

tions well above expectations, it is already obvious that many are here with their hands out, but what was not expected is that everyone grew two more hands. Truthfully there is a lot of money available to solve problems and invest in infrastructure, but we will have to be very cautious of the cost of continue of government spending for its very easy to create an animal that we cannot sustain or afford not so far in the future.

Employee contribution, high cost of inflation and the concerns in workforce shortages are issues that will take more than a little of creative thinking to find solutions to these issues. With a bit of good news for our cities and counties and with all the snow that they have been dealing with, is sounds like help is on the way.

Prairie Dog money should be released soon, fast tracked bills of around \$20 million for emergency snow seems to have much support and there seems to be willingness to provide help to our political subdivision. One thing I can promise is that there will be much to visit about in the coming weeks and months. I would encourage your questions and comments and if you are interested in visiting and sitting on the Senate Floor during a session, please let me know and we will try to make that work.



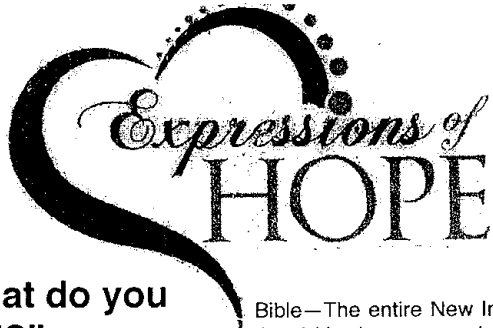

I have three spiritual resources that I read on a daily basis: the first is the devotional “Christ in Our Home” which is a publication that covers three months of the year at a time, the second is the “Daily Texts—2023” with has two daily scripture readings, a prayer and also a number of suggestions on how to further our spiritual relationship with God, the final resource I use is “The One Year

Bible—The entire New International Version arranged in 365 daily readings”, each day a person reads a lesson from the Old Testament, the New Testament, the Psalm, and a passage/s from Proverbs. This has been a practice I have followed for a number of years, but this did not happen overnight. It took some time to develop and become a daily practice.

So why am I sharing this with you? Why is a spiritual practice that I follow important to you? Well, I guess it all depends on how you want to grow in your relationship with God. I often share in a sermon how we as Christians are to live out and proclaim the good news of the gospel, the good news of Jesus the Christ in our lives. And I realize that can be hard for many

to do. Publicly proclaiming our faith in God is not something many people are comfortable doing, living out our relationship with God is much easier. For many people the relationship they have with God in Christ Jesus is lived out through their actions, helping friends and strangers who are in need, without saying a word about why they do so. And that is ok, God knows your heart, God knows you. But, let me return to the daily spiritual resources I use and how they come into play.

A few weeks ago I prepared, as usual, a sermon for Sunday worship. I finished the sermon on Saturday, I went over the sermon and practiced it in preparation for the Sunday service. I was set and ready to go. Then on Sunday morning I began the day as I usually do—reading through the three spiritual resources I have shared. And low and behold as I read the devotion from “Christ in Our Home” I thought: “Hey, this is my sermon for today, just a shorter version” and it truly was.

I have no idea when the author of the devotion, Pastor Lisa A. Smith who lives in Alaska, wrote the devotion but her message is basically a condensed version of the sermon that I was going to use that Sunday. That is the power of the Holy Spirit at work in our lives. We do not know when or how a devotion written months or even years ago can speak to our lives when we need to hear the message that it shares. I realize this does not happen every day, but I have heard far too often someone say how the devotion they read spoke to their life in a specific way, it spoke to them what they needed to hear and know at that time. I believe that is the power of the Holy Spirit working in our lives bringing us the good news of Jesus the Christ for us to share and proclaim in the best way we can.

Reading daily spiritual resources can and does help us grow in our relationship with God. What do you read?

Maybe its something that is happening to another person in our lives, but we have con-

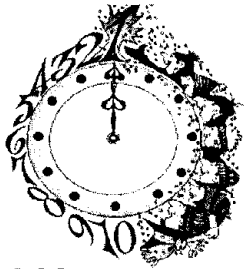

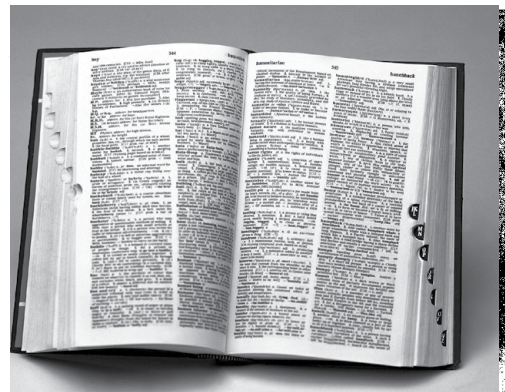

The prefix TELE is from the Greek TELL. I guess they had a lot to say even when they were following Alexander the Great from Greece to India. They left so many Greek words and offspring that some of them never went back to Greece. But the Romans had set up a rail route that was so efficient that news of the then current conquests were constantly being received in Greece. These letters were speech over distance; ie tele and phone; pronounced fo-nae and is Greek for 'sound'.

Hence, we get 'tele' and phone or telephone...sound from a distance. Can't you just hear the pounding of the horses hooves as they went into battle? Can you hear the swords and lances when they clashed in battle? Can you hear the wounded and dying groaning and screaming as they lay in the desert sands? No need to send a letter. They could probably hear it from Asia minor to India

and that's a long tel.

Phone on the back side of tele then is sound from afar.

A cell phone is so called because it contains very small complex units of electrodes and electrolyte either for generating electricity by chemical reactions or for decomposing compounds by electrolysis.

Maybe it becomes a telephone when it rings and you are afar and you don't want to talk to anybody.

The cell part of cell-phone is where the electricity is stored.

Seventy-five years ago you quickly lost your friends if you were a tattle-tale. The old cell phones could not be traced. This brought about a boon of illegal transactions.

Hence cometh the word Euphemism. The eu (pronounced oo) from French is translated 'good' or 'good omen. I associated 'omen with superstition, old wives tales and false prophets. Actually an 'omen' can be good or bad.

During the IWWW, the expression oo-la-la came from the French for 'good-looking'. When a pretty woman walked by the soldiers idling in the streets would whistle and yell, 'eu' (oo...good).

Since most American girls did not speak French they didn't know what the young men were referring to phonetically, but their body language told on them.

Unless the girl was being escorted by an admirer, the 'oo-la-la' was nonconfrontational. That seventeen letter word could easily be translated 'not face to face but with appreciation'.

To confront someone you have to 'get in his face', literally. These days they say, 'You are standing in my personal space' which could quickly go from nonconfrontational to confrontational from the Latin for forehead. (To butt heads.)

Something new added to our area schools ask your children about them

Kid Scoop News makes reading fun

A newspaper just for kids is doubling its circulation this month in North Dakota. Children across southeastern North Dakota are among those who received their first issue in January.

Kid Scoop News began delivery in August to schools in northwestern North Dakota, where the reaction has been very positive. With reading proficiency rates for young people dropping at both national and state levels, Kid Scoop News, is promoting reading and writing as well as many other subjects taught in North Dakota schools. Students just know they like it.

"I like the word search," said Arianna Nygaard, a first grader in Crosby. "My grandma does word search and I help her."

Her classmate, Leighton Nygaard likes reading about people in history, among others, "and about the three little pigs and that they built houses," in a lesson aimed at identifying facts versus opinion.

Sophia Ekness, a first grade teacher at Divide County Elementary, said she uses Kid Scoop to reach students at varying learning levels.

She finds some of her lower level readers enjoy the puzzles and word searches because they might not be able to read some of the longer articles, but they find the games more manageable.

"It's fun to have some games and reading material to go home with them. They get excited about their paper," Ek-

ness said.

In a recent interview with Minot Trending Topics News, Cindy Cook, 19-year principal at Sunnyside Elementary School, Minot, said she introduced Kid Scoop as a curriculum aid in September.

The staff at Sunnyside have been using Kid Scoop News in their lessons since the first issue was released in September.

"We told teachers you're getting a great new resource," said Cook. "Take a look through it and see what you think."

Some teachers use it as part of their morning work time, choosing an article or puzzle when the students come in, while others use it for a reward at the end of the day.

Then when they are done with them they get to take them home.

"Families have fewer books in the home and are watching a lot more videos. They're not being exposed to language and literacy and words," said Cook. "We try to provide them with lots of chances to expose them to literacy."

Kid Scoop's focus on reading includes comprehension questions and classic literature review for the older grades, while the younger grades do the word searches and silly story games.

The January issue of Kid Scoop, for instance, spotlights snowflakes, offers a STEM lesson on the sun and cold temperatures along with a second STEM page on the chemistry of ice hockey.

If all that happens is the newspapers go home with

kids, said Project Leader Cecile Wehrman, publisher of The Journal, Crosby. "That's great."

"We've also provided Kid Scoop News to families who homeschool, on request. We're hearing the issues spark family interaction around learning and that some parents enjoy the activities as much as their children."

The 24-page tabloid is made by the same educator who for decades has been producing the Kid Scoop page for newspapers around the country.

Each issue covers a broad range of subjects. Regular features include a Money Matters page teaching children about finances, a How to Draw page with step-by-step examples, an animal page -- January features jelly fish, and even a page for parents.

Almost every month a page addresses news literacy -- from how news stories are assembled, to definitions outlining the difference between news and opinion, and how to evaluate sources for objectivity.

At the end of nearly every activity is a footnote denoting which educational standards are represented such as mathematical reasoning and letter sequencing.

The longterm goal, said Wehrman, is one everyone can get behind.

"We want literate citizens to be able to vote and understand government and what the issues are," said Wehrman. "In order to do that we need people who not only can read but enjoy reading."

This month Kid Scoop expanded from serving 11,000

students to more than 22,000, thanks to a grant for \$100,000 through Strengthen ND.

Kid Scoop is now printed at three different plants -- one in Minot, one in Garrison and one in Bismarck, with delivery directly from local newspapers serving each community, or by carriers adding on to existing delivery routes, and some by mail.

The nonprofit cooperative effort has been almost universally accepted across western North Dakota, said Wehrman.

"We all want future literate citizens to be able to read our newspapers," said Wehrman. "So by putting a fun thing in their hands that is on newsprint we hope this will encourage them to pick up a real newspaper one day and get involved in the community."

Kid Scoop News is provided at no charge to students or schools and it contains no advertising.

Wehrman said fundraising continues with an aim to grow Kid Scoop News to statewide distribution.

Other donors have included the John & Elaine Andrist Charitable Trust, the North Dakota Newspaper Association Education Foundation, NCC and Farmers Union Insurance.

Upon receiving his December issue of Kid Scoop just before the Christmas break, Ray elementary fifth grader Logan Thiege summed it all up in two words, "Pretty cool."





Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last time in our study of Jonah, we saw the runaway prophet's admission to those aboard the ship heading for Tarshish that he was fleeing from the presence of the Lord. But though he owned up to his sin, he had not repented. He was still running from the Lord. We have seen how God had already sent a mighty tempest as a wake-up call to Jonah. Now we shall see that He will proceed to step two in dealing with His recalcitrant prophet.

We read in Jonah 1:11: "Then they said to him, 'What shall we do to you that the sea may be calm for us?'--for the sea was growing more tempestuous." Here the sailors ask Jonah to become his own judge and jury and to determine his own punishment. This shows amazing patience and restraint on the part of the mariners. Knowing that Jonah is the reason for the storm, we might expect them to get rid of the troublemaker without hesitation. But we see here that even pagan man made in the image of God instinctively knows that there is something very serious about taking the life of another human being. Jonah responds by stating his proposed solution in verse 12: "And he said to them, 'Pick me up and throw me into the sea; then the sea will become calm for you. For I know that this great tempest is because of me.'"

Jonah believes that once he is dead, the storm will subside because it has fulfilled its purpose. He knows that the Judge of all the earth will do right (Genesis 18:25). But while Jonah gives his advice, One greater than Jonah (Matthew 12:41) is directing the events. That One is still pursuing His rebellious prophet who is trying

so hard to escape from Him.

The Bible does not try to hide or gloss over the sinfulness and failures of men, even godly men. God's Word tells us clearly that Jonah has been a very selfish man. He has been willing to bring trouble on other people and to put their lives at risk in order to avoid preaching to the citizens of Nineveh, Israel's enemies. Even when he tells the sailors to throw him overboard, he does not so much as offer a prayer for them or for himself.

How different is the prophet Jonah from the One greater than Jonah. The Lord Jesus Christ willingly took the trouble of others upon Himself. He took their greatest burden by bearing their sins and suffering the wrath and judgment of God for all His people so that by trusting in Him they would be forgiven and have everlasting life. He alone paid the debt of sin to God's satisfaction. Friend, are you relying on what this One greater than Jonah did to make you right with God? Please give careful consideration to this eternally important matter.

Happiness is a choice, not a result. Nothing will make you happy until you choose to be happy. No person will make you happy unless you decide to be happy. Your happiness will not come to you. It can only come from you.



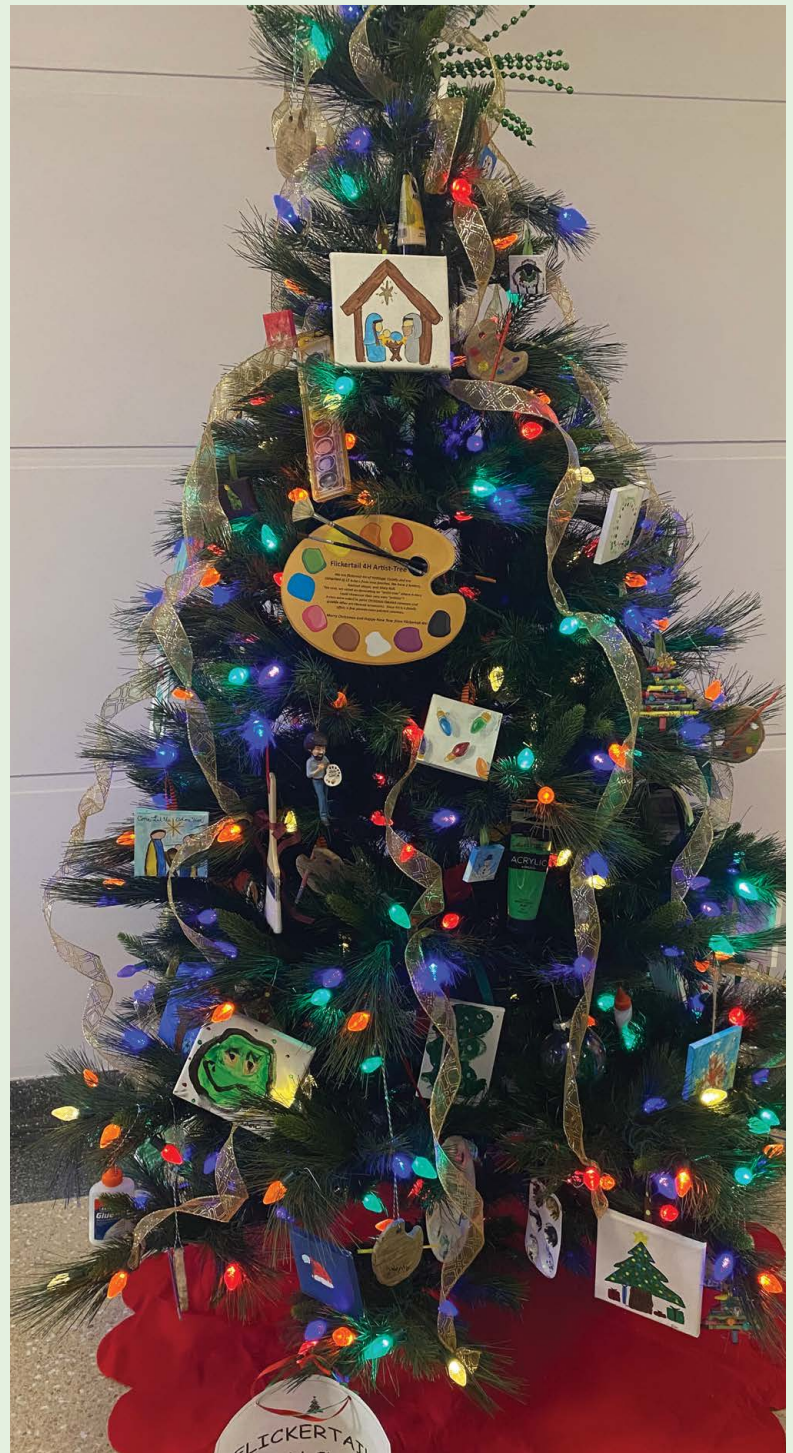
ty groups. Gather your ideas for trees next December as we are always willing to have more groups decorate trees.

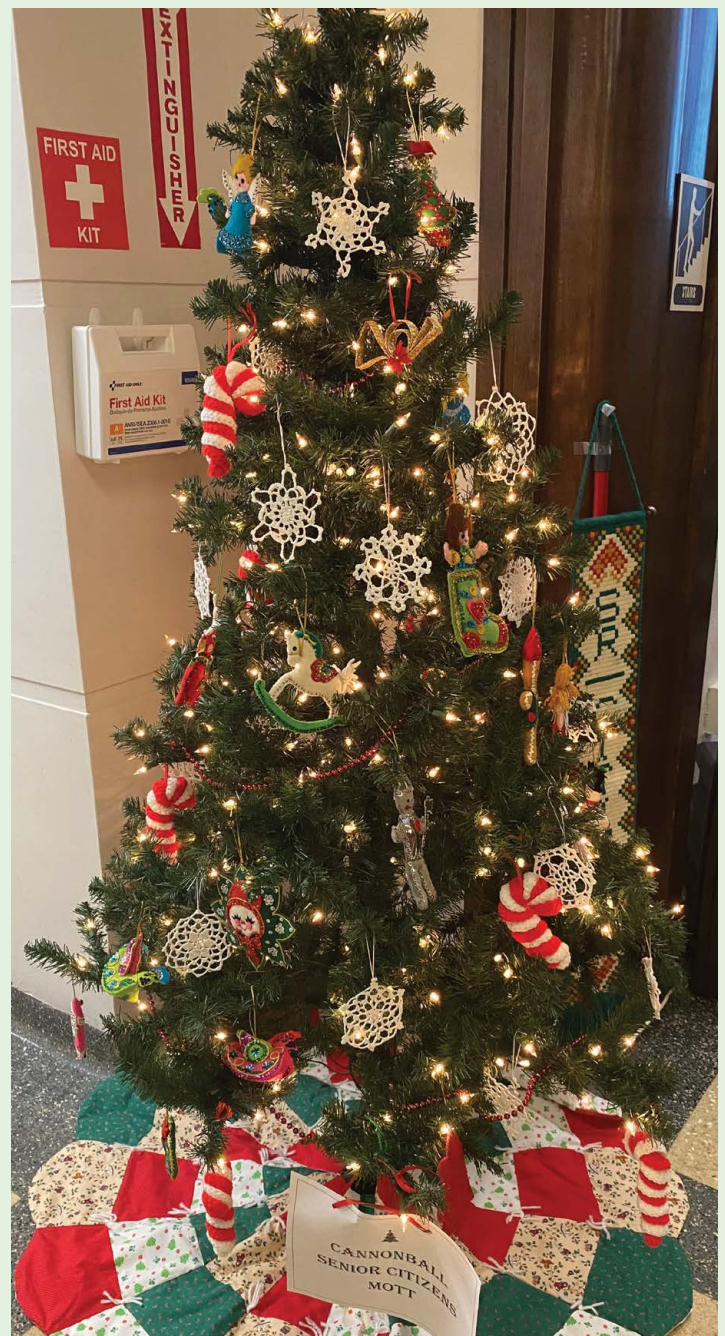

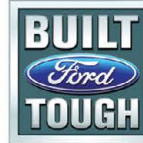
