Thoughts for the Week

Now that the holiday season is behind us, comes the season in which every one starts to think of paying Taxes or filing a tax return to retrieve monies that have been sent in by us or by our employers. Obviously those that get money back for various reasons are much more anxious to file a return as those that have to send in additional mon-

In 1862, President Lincoln signed into law a revenue raising measure to help pay for Civil War expenses. The measure created a Commissioner of Internal Revenue and the nation's first income tax. It levied a 3 percent tax on incomes between \$600 and \$10,000 and a 5 percent tax on incomes of more than \$10,000. Congress repealed this tax in 1872, but the concept did not disappear. In 1894 as part of a high tariff bill, Congress enacted a 2 percent tax on income over \$4,000. The tax was almost immediately struck down by a 5 to 4 decision of the Supreme Court, even though the Court had upheld the constitutionality of the Civil War

1909, progressives in Congress again attached a provision for an income tax to a tariff bill. Conservatives, hoping to kill the idea for good, proposed a constitutional amendment enacting such a tax; they believed an amendment would never receive ratification by ¾ of the states. Much to their surprise, the amendment was ratified by one state legislature after another, and on February 25, 1913, with the certification by Secretary of State Philander C Knox, the 16th amendment took effect. Yet in 1913, due to generous exemptions and deductions, less than 1 percent of the population paid income taxes at the rate of only 1 percent of net income. This document settled the constitutional question of how to tax income and, by so doing, effected dramatic changes in the

American way of life. And with those thoughts, there are many people out there trying to tell you how to spend your money to lower some of those taxes. Something all of us need to be aware of in this day of electronic solicitations and constant barrage on television screens, is that not all the people who are asking you to give your hard earned money to them are legitimate. Same with the ones who are asking you by email, phone and mail solicitation to give your personal information to get a 'windfall' that can be yours for the small price of your banking information. We were all taught that before we cross a rail road track we need to Stop, look and listen. I think these words work very well for those solicitations that you are seeing everywhere today. Stop do not give out any personal information to anyone that you are not aware of personally or that you have been informed by a well known reliable person that you have personal contact with. Look - at the offer that they are giving you and if it is 'too good to be true' as we were always cautioned about, it most probably is. Listen - to those people who you know or have personal contact with over a prolonged period of time when they tell you that something is not right. P. T. Barnum was quoted as saying that there is a 'foolish person' born every minute. Do not let

brew word YAHWEH. This is the name of the only true God. It is the name that God gave to Moses in Exodus 3, and it means, "I AM WHO I AM." God is in a category all by Himself, and YAHWEH is His sacred name. Three times these pagan sailors cry out to YAHWEH. This is the only incident in Scripture of unbelievers praying to the true

should Christians spreading the word that there is only one true God. And the only way to know Him is through Jesus Christ. As Peter said in Acts 4:12. "Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

The sailors' plea, "Do not charge us with innocent blood. for You, O LORD, have done as it pleased You" reveals several important points about these men. First, they have a reverence for life and know that murder is wrong; thus they fear the Creator's disapproval in what they are about to do. They seem to understand that God is sovereign and will judge human actions. They also believe He cari be appealed to for justice. What a contrast is their cry to that treacherous cry of the Jews at the trial before Pilate concerning the only innocent Man who ever lived: "His blood be on us and on our children" (Matthew 27:25).

Astonishingly, the prophet Jonah, the one who knows YAH-WEH, remains prayerless while these pagan sailors fervently pray to Jonah's God. Lord willing, we shall see the outcome of this dire situation next week. But I close by reminding us how vital it is that we be right with the God of the universe. Oh, may we heed the words of Jesus in John 17:3: "And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent."






