





Forgetting

Ed Kvaale - Bowman Assembly of God Church

A new year is a natural time for us to reevaluate our life physically, financially, and hopefully spiritually also. Paul says in Philippians 3:12-15 "Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus".

Of course, we cannot literally forget everything good or bad in

our lives that hold us back from serving Jesus. However, we can seek Jesus and surrender to His grace and forgiveness and trust that His transformation will change us. What is interesting though as you look through the book of Philippians is that Paul is not only wanting to "forget" the bad and the sinful aspects of his old life; Paul is also wanting to forget his past successes of his old life. Those "successes" within a religious worldview which rejected the truth of Jesus would appear to many as a picture of what we want in life: prestige, influence, and power. Yet, the truth is that anything which holds us back from loving and serving Jesus is "rubbish" or garbage. It is worthless. No amount of money, prestige, or power can save us. Only Jesus' grace and forgiveness can save us. This new year I would encourage all of us to reevaluate where we are spiritually and ask the Holy Spirit to show us if we are hanging onto any "garbage" (hurts, pain, bitterness, unforgiveness, etc.) or anything that seems "valuable" that is not as valuable as we think because it is actually an idol preventing us from loving and following Jesus and receiving His grace and forgiveness. Jesus said in Mark 8:34-37 "If anvone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life. for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul"? Let us ask Jesus for the strength to follow Him selflessly this new year and "forget" and leave behind what we need to leave behind from






Tomorrow Tom will go out on a charter fishing boat. It's been a lot of years since he's done that here as a kid.


We've been walking a lot. Yesterday we walked about 2 miles down to the beach. Again, it was a beautiful day.

Reflections on the Words of Life

We arrive today at Jonah 1:15, where the sailors finally give in to Jonah's instructions to throw him overboard: "So they picked up Jonah and threw him into the sea, and the sea ceased from its raging." Their fear had driven them to cry out to Jonah's God and plead with Him that He would not charge them with innocent blood. Now, it seems, their fear has progressed from terror to reverence and awe: "Then the men feared the LORD exceedingly, and offered a sacrifice to the LORD and took vows" (Jonah 1:16). These sailors have made a life-changing discovery because they have come into contact with the living God. It appears that they have become genuine worshipers of the LORD, of YAHWEH, "I am who I am" (Exodus 3:13-14). And let us not forget that all this happened while Jonah, the prophet of the one true God, was living in disobedience to Him. God brings glory to Himself despite Jonah. Again, we see irony dripping from the account. The prophet has run from God because he doesn't want to see the heathen converted. And what has happened? Even in the midst of his disobedience, the heathen have been converted. True conversion always results in worship of the true God. These men aboard the ship have become God-fearers and

Jonah, in the meantime, in a state of disobedience, has lost the will to live. The child of God will certainly make himself miserable when living in deliberate disobedience to the Lord. No doubt, at this point the crew of the ship assume Jonah is now drowned. But God has prepared a "deliverance" which the last verse of the chapter tells us about and which, Lord willing, we shall consider next time.

Friends, the gospel is a message that every person needs to hear. It deals with man's greatest need. We all need to know that we are born in a state of alienation and rebellion against God and that if something is not done to change that, we will go into an eternity of separation from Him in hell. But God has made a way for us to be restored to a right relationship with Him. 

Thoughts for the week

Winter is still with us and thank goodness for a few days of sunshine and warmer, slightly warmer weather. Although we reside in a northern area, it is not far enough north to prevent at least a few hours of sunlight whenever the clouds part. Sunlight is something that we all need in our lives as it not only provides Vitamin D but can prevent S.A.D. which is short for seasonal affective disorder.

S.A.D occurs in climates where there is less sunlight at certain times of the year. Symptoms include fatigue, depression, hopelessness and social withdrawal. That is not to say that all of those that do not do a lot of social interaction during the winter months are suffering from S.A.D. Mostly I think we just like being somewhere where we are warm and comfortable. Also maybe explains why some of us in these northern states become snowbirds and fly south where it is noticeably warmer and sunnier.

Even though we like to be in

our cozy corners during these winter months, it is important that we realize that without sunshine our bodies cannot function without a certain amount of vitamin D. Most of us get our vitamins from food and supplements, but the more natural way to get it is plain old sunshine. Not only does getting out once in a while make us feel better, but getting a few rays in our faces helps to replenish vitamin D in a more efficient manner. A vitamin D deficiency, when the level of vitamin D is too low in your body, can cause your bones to become thin, brittle and misshapen. It is often paired with Calcium for that same reason, to prevent osteoporosis, which can cause your bones to break more than normal. Vitamin D also appears to play a role in insulin production and immune function, and how this relates to chronic disease prevention and cancer, however, this is still under investigation. It is beneficial to us all to remember that having fruits and vegetables high in vitamin D are necessary for us all, so they need to be encouraged on a daily basis.

Growing evidence has also demonstrated that Vitamin D has a role in sleep regulation, specifically Vitamin D deficiency

sleep difficulties, shorter sleep duration and nocturnal awakenings in children and adults. Maybe that's why when we were children, our parents encouraged us to bundle up and play outside whenever it was sunny out in the winter time. Not that we had to have much encouragement as we enjoyed getting out of the house even in the winter. Nowadays, it doesn't appear that children enjoy going outside after a certain age. It is more likely that the older a child gets, the less likely they are to go outside unless they are forced into it or they have an agenda of their own. I realize that there is a real desire to stay inside when the weather is cold, but sometimes we must be cruel to ourselves and our loved ones to be kind in the long run. 
