

A billion here, a billion there...what's the big deal? Is that really, the media talking heads' perspective as the public taxpayer is now asking, "Uh... guys...it's actually OUR money here, what's up?" I have never witnessed before blatant attacks by one political party to another. It kind of makes you sick to watch the ignorance and corruption running amuck with elected leaders.




Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie,
Grace Reformed Church of the
Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Our recent studies have dealt with how Christians are to conduct themselves in various relationships. Last time we came to Peter's instructions to wives: "Wives, likewise, be submissive to your own husbands, that even if some do not obey the word, they, without a word, may be won by the conduct of their wives, when they observe your chaste conduct accompanied by fear" 1 Peter 3:1-2. We saw that Peter is likely writing to many wives who became believers after being married and whose husbands were still unbelievers. His first instruction to them is to submit to their husbands, and we noted that God's Word in several places gives this command to wives. The wife is always to be under her husband's authority unless the husband should require her to disobey God's Word.

The apostle's next instruction for the believing wife is to have chaste conduct. This refers to living a pure and godly life. Note that Peter puts the emphasis upon the wife's being a witness to her husband by the way she lives. When a woman consistently lives in a submissive and chaste manner before her husband, it can have a very powerful effect. Peter says here that the unbelieving husband, "may, without a word, be won by the conduct of his wife." It is hard to argue with a godly life. The respectful, chaste conduct of a wife can have a powerful influence upon her unbelieving husband. And indeed throughout history, it has proved true that many unbelieving husbands have been drawn to faith in Christ through observing the lives of their godly wives.

We come now to another point which Peter tells all Christian wives, whether married to believers or unbelievers, and that is how they can be beautiful. The apostle stresses the importance of inner beauty, which he approaches first negatively, then positively. He says in 1 Peter 3:3, "Do not let your



adornment be merely outward; arranging the hair, wearing gold, or putting on fine apparel." Some take this verse to mean that Christian women should not go to a hairdresser or to put on makeup or jewelry or fancy dresses. You see, the word "merely" is not in the original Greek. The verse simply says, "Do not let your adornment be outward." But I agree entirely with the insertion of the word "merely" because I believe that Peter is deliberately using overstatement to make his point. He is saying, "Christian woman, do not depend on outward things to make you beautiful." Christian wives should make themselves attractive for their husbands. But they must resist the temptation to define beauty as the unbelieving world defines it. Many women may become discouraged because they do not look a certain way or cannot spend exorbitant amounts of money on outward appearance. Ladies, don't let the world squeeze you

into its mold. Be God's woman. Be your husband's woman. And know that there is a beauty far more important than outward beauty. That is the point Peter goes on to make in a positive way in verse 4: "Rather let it be the hidden person of the heart, with the incorruptible beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is very precious in the sight of God." The most important beauty in God's eyes is inward beauty. Peter says that a gentle and quiet spirit is "very precious in the sight of God." Lord willing, we will have more to say about this verse next time.







About New Years

New Years Day is the first day of the calendar year. It is celebrated as a holiday in almost every country in the world. It is a time of gaiety, sharing with friends, remembering the past, and hoping for good things in the future. In the United States, thousands of people jam Times Square in New York City to welcome the New Year at midnight. The transition between New Year's Eve and New Year Day is an exciting one. In Times Square, people count down the seconds to welcome the new day as the New Year ball slowly descends and lights up the area.

Not all countries or cultures celebrate New Year on January 1st. The Chinese, Egyptian, Jewish, Roman, and Mohammedan years all have different start dates. Chinese New Year starts on a different day each year. Thousands of years ago, the Egyptians celebrated their New Year about the middle of June. That was the time when the Nile River usually overflowed. January 1 was recognized as New Year Day in the 1500's with the introduction of the Gregorian Calendar. The Julian Calendar places the New Year on January 14. The Jewish New Year, a feast day, is celebrated about the time of the fall equinox, in late September.

In ancient Rome, the first day of the New Year honored Janus, the god of gates, doors, beginnings and endings - the month of January, named after Janus, was originally called 'Januarius'. Janus had two faces - one which looked ahead to see what the new year would bring, and the other looked backward to see what happened during the past year. Ancient Romans celebrated New Year by giving gifts to friends and family members - some even gave gifts to Senators in exchange for favors!

The expression "cleaning the slate" came from this custom. It means making resolutions to correct faults and bad habits. People resolve to make themselves better in the New Year. It is still customary even today to make a list of New Year resolutions for the coming year.



Linda enjoyed from an early age putting jigsaw puzzles together. She continued this for the rest of her life. She also liked to play card and board games.





 2 cans refrigerated crescent dinner rolls
 1 c. shredded Mozzarella cheese

Brown beef; drain. Stir in tomato sauce, seasonings, and onion. Simmer while preparing the crust.

Separate each can of dough into 2 large rectangles. Press 2 rectangles of dough onto bottom of a greased 9 x 13 inch pan. Spoon meat mixture over this and sprinkle in cheese. Place remaining 2 rectangles of dough on top. Bake at 425° for 15 to 29 minutes. Cut into squares and serve.
