



A small shrine appeared on some bare dirt near the intersection where a transient had been struck and killed. Neighbors brought candles, roses, prayerful messages written on cards. The next day the City cleaned up the guttered candles and withered roses and tossed the messages into a plastic bag to be thrown away.

Carly, during a walk through the neighborhood, looked down at the dead patch of dirt. She wondered why a nameless person had drifted along her street. All that remained beside the sidewalk were windblown leaves. And one faded rose. Carly leaned over, picked it up.

She took the spent thing back to her apartment. She put it in a damp paper towel. She made a quick trip to the store to buy a clay pot and small bag of soil. She prepared the stem for propagation. Her mother. long gone to heaven, had once taught her how. Carly put the cutting into the soil and placed the pot in her small apartment window. She was careful to keep the soil moist and warm. Early one morning, when nobody was about, she walked down the sidewalk back to the intersection and its dead patch of dirt. She brought a hand shovel. Every morning after, she brought a water bottle.

Many years after Carly had joined her mother, those who walked by the intersection would pause to marvel at the strange abundance of wild, beautiful roses. Hundreds of blooms crowded the sidewalk.

It seemed the Hand of Fate had birthed an improbable garden. Nobody knew where the roses had come from. [The Hand of Fate by Richard Schul-

In the coming year, perhaps we can ask ourselves what sort of thing can I do that will make a difference to others also. 

Here we are the Last Sunday of 2024 and the first Sunday of 2025. What are your expectations for the new year ahead. Any new year resolutions that you plan on attempting to make past February. Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last week we looked together at 1 Peter 1:18-19: "Knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot." We considered the fact that the blood of Jesus alone can pay the price for sin. In Old Testament times, God required the Israelites to offer animal sacrifices for sin. The blood of thousands upon thousands of animals was shed. And yet the very God who required those sacrifices tells us that they did not pay for one single sin. We read in Hebrews 10:4, "For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sins." Then why did God require the shedding of animal blood? Scripture answers the question. All those sacrifices were designed to point to Christ, showing us that we needed a sacrifice which COULD pay for sin. And so the writer of Hebrews, speaking of Christ, tells us in Hebrews 10:12, "But this Man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down at the right hand of God." Understanding this will lead us to understand why John the Baptist reacted the way he did the first time he saw the Lord Jesus. We are told in John 1:29, "The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, 'Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" John realized that Jesus was God's provision for sin, that He was the only Lamb whose blood could cleanse from sin.

Do you remember that in the Old Testament, the animals that were offered had to be without any physical defect? We read in Deuteronomy 17:1, "You shall not sacrifice to the LORD your

Listen with your heart

God an ox or a sheep which has a blemish or any defect." This, too, was a picture of Jesus. For He is the only one who lived a perfect life in obedience to all that God required. And so when He offered Himself as a sacrifice on the cross, He was unblemished. His sacrifice was the perfect sacrifice. It was the only one which could please the Father and pay the infinite debt of sin. Furthermore, Jesus' perfection is the basis of the gift of righteousness which God gives to everyone who believes on the Lord Jesus Christ as his or her Savior. Jesus lived a perfect life not only for Himself, but also for His people. We see this in 2 Corinthians 5:21: "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in

Finally, Peter tells us at the end of verse 18 that the redemption which Jesus provides leads His people away from the aimless, or FUTILE (New American Standard Bible translation) way of life which they inherited from their forefathers. Peter describes the life of the unbeliever as FUTILE. Dear people, let us learn to look at life from God's perspective. Wealth, fame, power, success-these things will not matter in the end. The only thing that will matter is if you have seen the loveliness of Jesus Christ and the perfection of His saving work and have trusted in that alone for the saving of your soul. The words of Rhea Miller's hymn are a fitting conclusion to what Peter is saying in the verses we have been considering: "I'd rather have Jesus than anything this world affords

Thoughts on Living with Cancer (#1)

THE JESUS PRAYER Fr Lawrence Wagner, OSB, said, in a monastic retreat conference, that he daily prays his own form of the Jesus Prayer: 'Lord Jesus Christ, Son of Mary, I thank you for your mercy and love." The more traditional wording would be: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy upon me (a sinner)." Notice that Fr Lawrene converted the traditional petitionary prayer into a prayer of gratitude, and he names Jesus as Son of Mary (cp. Son of God).

This prayer might be uttered now-and-then in the course of one's day. It might also be uttered continuously, until it is ingrained in one's mind and body, a kind of constant petitionary prayer for mercy; or constant thanks for divine mercy and love, in Fr Lawrence's version.

Sometimes, when my prayer in tongues seems very repetitive in its phrases, I wonder the more what I am praying at that moment, me voicing, the Holy Spirit giving the mysterious words. Perhaps it is something like the Jesus prayer, repeated over and over, or like the song I Surrender, (just above), a kind of reveling in a theme, be it repentance, surrender, praise, adoration, thanksgiving, and sometimes prompting emotions appropriate to the words, though the words be unknown

A LIFE IS NOT IMPORTANT to the one praying in tongues. HAVE YOUR OWN WAY IN ME

What to do when you have IN THE IMPACT IT HAS suffered a golden wound, or when you have been pierced with love for God? Pray through the experience. Pine for deeper friendship with Jesus; for more familiar and regular time with our heavenly Father; for the active grace of the Holy Spirit in the present moment. Pray with longing for heaven, to be with Jesus and all the saints in our Father's house.

I often find myself pleading Jesus to make me more like him, to make me a saint (knowing this is costly). Who can become more like Jesus without changing. Change is uncomfortable at best and sometimes profoundly so. Am I willing to be changed, to be worked on by my Brother and Redeemer, Jesus? Am I willing that our perfect heavenly Father send or allow challenges to befall me, that I might grow through those challenges (theme of part 13)?

I face a major life-challenge right now, diagnosed as I was (five and a half months ago) with what specialists regard as a terminal, incurable cancer. Three months into chemotherapy, my oncologist called my latest PET scan images "miraculous." What will my next PET scan (perhaps in January) reveal? I continue to pray often for the grace to accept whatever the Father grants as my lot. I ask for remission. I ask for complete cure of my cancer. I ask for grace to accept and live joyfully, whatever the outcome, however soon or far off my exit for heaven. Thus, my focus in this essay on repetitive prayers, prayers which are simple, to the point, and repeated often.

Why the repetitiveness? Because God is slow in hearing? Not at all. I think I need the repeated praying of the same basic lines. Jesus, make me more like you. Jesus, make me a saint. Father, call me home when and as you will. Thy will be done. Have your own way in me. Have your own way in

I suffer plenty, no doubt, yet I tend to postpone "offering it up" until in extremis in my final decline to death. But why not now? A cousin wrote to me, relating how she offers up her grief and my sufferings for many causes close to home-for another family member currently grieving; for this one who is also facing cancer; for that one who is a bit lost in young adulthood and struggling to find her place. Wow, that's a lot of blessings going out, some of them from my sufferings, offered up by a cousin. God is very clever. And, inspired by this cousin, perhaps "we are there already"—time to offer up my sufferings to bless
