"Grandpa wants that book about the 7th Calvary."


"It's on the floor by his bed," she said.

In the heat of the day James and his father sat in the shade of a low hanging box elder tree and hydrated themselves from the drinks in the cooler.



#### Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus. New Leipzia

Earlier in Jonah 4:4, we saw that God asked Jonah whether it was right for him to be angry. At that time, the prophet was angry with God because He was extending grace to the repentant people of Nineveh. Today we resume in verse 9, where God repeats the question, but for a different reason. Jonah 4:9: Then God said to Jonah, 'Is it right for you to be angry about the plant?" Remember that God had prepared a plant to shade Jonah from the scorching heat while he waited to see what would happen to Nineveh. Then God prepared a worm that ate the plant, causing it to wither.

Continuing in verse 9, we read Jonah's response: "And he said, 'It is right for me to be angry, even to death!""

Jonah's insistence that he is right in being angry reminds us of the parable which Jesus told in Luke 15 about the prodigal son. This son had moved far away and wasted all his inheritance. When he came back in repentance to his father's house, the father was so thankful and delighted that he threw a party. But the older brother was not happy. Jesus tells us this in Luke 15:28-30: "But he was angry and would not go in. Therefore his father came out and pleaded with him. So he answered and said to his father, 'Lo, these many years I have been serving you; I never transgressed your commandment at any time; and yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might make merry with my friends. But as soon as this son of yours came, who has devoured your livelihood with harlots, you killed the fatted calf for him." The elder son, like Jonah, was preoccupied with vindicating himself. Both were convinced that they were right and were unwilling to consider the possibility that they could be wrong.

However, God always has the last word, and today we shall begin to consider His response to Jonah. "But the LORD said, 'You have had pity on the plant for which you have not labored, nor made it grow, which came up in a night and perished in a night" (Jonah 4:10). We see a striking contrast here. It was perhaps strange, even to Jonah's ears, to hear God telling him that he pitied a plant. In Jonah's case, this is strictly self-pity. Jonah missed the comfort of the shade that he had received from the plant. But God pities people. We are told that when Jesus and His disciples were trying to rest and take a little break, multitudes of people were coming out to Him. How did He react? We read in Matthew 9:36, "But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were weary and scattered, like sheep having no shepherd."

Lord willing, we shall see more of the unfolding of Jonah's situation next time. But for a closing application, let us consider God's grace and mercy in providing the plant for Jonah. Jonah did nothing to plant it or help it to grow. It was simply a gift. It is the same with salvation. We do not earn or deserve God's favor. The forgiveness of our sins, the provision of Christ's perfect righteousness, the blessing of eternal life in heaven are all free gifts, received by faith alone. As we read in Ephesians 2:8-9, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." Friends. have you received God's free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ's payment, and that alone, to make you right with Him? Please be sure.





#### Thoughts for the week

Gratitude is the quality of being thankful, readiness to show appreciation for and to return kindness. It's about focusing on what is good in our lives and being thankful for the things we have. Gratitude is pausing to notice and appreciate the things that we often take for granted, like having a place to live, food, clean water, friends, family and even computer access.

It often seems like the world has stopped thinking about what they have and are more concerned with what others have. Sure, its commonplace in our country to have what we consider basics of a roof over our heads, running water, electricity and food on our tables. But do we ever consider how many people there are that don't have these things and the fact that if our circumstances change, we might lose these things as well?

Children born after the Great Depression learned to use whatever they had until there was no use left in it, to wear clothing that was long out of fashion and worn out beyond repair, and to eat whatever was put in front of them and be happy about it because there may not be anything on the plate the next meal. When they said that they used everything, they weren't kidding. Every part of every animal had a

purpose of some sort and there was no turning up your nose at anything if you were hungry enough, This is probably where a lot of the meals we think are so ethnic came from. Germans used a lot of flour type dishes, such as shoopnoodle, cream noodles, cheese buttons, strudle and more that made the small amount of meat, or possibly no meat, stretch to feed a family. Southerners got way more personal with some of the things that they used, such as chitlins. and most probably because the poorer that you were, the less access you had to prime cuts of meat. You ate whatever was handy, and if it was squirrel, grits and collard greens, it was food on the table. I wonder how many children there are out there right now, where their Mom is preparing something for each child to eat separately from the main dish being served because the child refused to eat it. Not at my table when I was a kid. You ate what was there or you didn't eat. We may not have liked it, but we ate it anyway, or we sat until we did. Now that is considered borderline abusive. but according to one comment made on social media, by a father that ran into this situation. their children learned to appreciate the food and the effort made to put that food on the table. He didn't have the money to cater to all his children's wants but was more concerned about

their needs. Something to think about there.

Then there are the clothes. It was very common in my day to either get hand-me-downs from other children in the family or cousins, or Mom may have sewn an outfit or two for us. We didn't have a closet full of clothes, and generally got one new outfit for the first day of school, for Christmas and for Easter. If Grandma got you an outfit for one of those occasions, that was just a lucky break. You just got used to it, but since most of the class was in the same boat, barring the kids who's parents had money, it was no big deal. And we took care of our clothes - coming home from school and taking it off and putting on our play or work clothes was a requirement and the only way our good jeans had holes in them was when we wore the holes into them. Now.

everyone feels like new clothes are necessary on a regular basis and if you don't have nice ones, then you are looked down upon. Holes are a necessity in the jeans and the more money you pay for them, the better. And why take care of them? Isn't that what Mom is for? Just drop them on the floor or kick them under the bed and who cares. When you need them again, they will miraculously find their way into your closet all nice and clean again. So if you have a hard time deciding what to wear, why not try on a few or several and just leave them lying around. They will find their way back into your closet just like in the movies. Or will they? Depends on the Mom and how much respect you have for her and your clothes.

So what do we do with the fact that gratitude is in short supply in many cases. If a child has not been told the worth of something, is it their fault when they are not happy with what they have? Who is responsible for explaining that everything that you get costs somebody something, so whether it was what they wanted or not it was bought with someone's hard work. Teaching a child to say thank you for a gift should be a given, no matter what the worth

of that gift is. This is how we teach gratitude and raise people that are grateful and kind. If there is no cost to something, there is no value placed on that item, therefore it can be destroyed or lost without consequences. Spend time instead of money and raise children that are filled with kindness and gratitude for life and what it gives them. God Bless you all.






