So, I was talking to my buddy and asking how his vacation (with his wife) went. He was perplexed because he said, "It was great except when I was driving on the highway in Colorado." He went on to explain that he was driving along, in the left hand lane, so he could gain a little better speed, and cars kept flying up on his tail end, riding his rear bumper and. then, swerving around, passing on the right and, (let's just say) giving him half of a peace sign as they passed. He could not understand such disrespectful maneuvers given the courtesy of our local drivers. Well, I hated to explain it to him because, in Florida or Texas or Missouri, DRIVING along in the PASSING lane can get you shot at by other drivers and, ticketed by the po-

lice. He was aghast! And, folks, in North Dakota, the same actually holds true. NDCC §39-10-08 makes it a 2-point moving violation if you fail to "drive" in the right-hand lane. The most common problem is a 4-lane highway like I-94.

So, if the road you're on has sufficient width, you must drive in the right lane (right half) except when actually in the process of overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction. And, if there's an obstruction making it necessary to drive in the other lane, you still have to return to the right lane after you pass the obstruction. And, of course, no matter what, a driver still has to yield the right of way to all vehicles traveling in the proper direction upon an unobstructed portion of the highway. The rule is simple...stay in the right lane unless you are in the process of passing another

I hope that helps and, don't forget, on Friday July 11th, it's Hapkido night at the movies here in Mott. Opioid dependence treated at JMHCC clinics Throbbing pain, silenced by prescription painkillers. Then

another pain occurs - addiction. And another silence - an unwillingness to come forward for help until it's too late. But help is here, and hope is near with medications for opioid use dis-

The Elgin Community Clinic has now joined the Glen Ullin Family Medical Clinic and the Richardton Clinic, all operated by Jacobson Memorial Hospital Care Center of Elgin, in treating the addiction to opioids.

On average, 224 people died each day from an opioid overdose in 2022, according to federal government statistics. The misuse of and addiction to opioids - including prescription pain relievers, heroin and synthetic opioids such as fentanyl is a serious national and local crisis that affects public health as well as social and economic welfare.

The statistics regarding opioid abuse are staggering, and our local communities are not immune to this nationwide epi-

Roughly 21% to 29% of patients prescribed opioids for chronic pain misuse them. In 2023, there were 116 drug overdose deaths in North Dakota, a

rise from 4.5 in 2014.

The Glen Ullin Family Medical Clinic and the Richardton Clinic have been poised to help stop this epidemic, with specially trained medical providers who can help patients manage their opioid use disorder. Now, the Elgin Community Clinic is ready to help as well.

Addiction occurs when uncontrollable cravings cause someone to become unable to stop using a drug, even though it leads to harmful results. Dependence happens when the body physically adapts to a drug and becomes tolerant to it. This leads you to need more of the drug to create the same effect.

And it can happen to anyone, says Rhonda Schmidt, a family nurse practitioner (FNP) at the Glen Ullin Family Medical Clinic.

The providers, including Rhonda Schmidt at the Glen Ullin Family Medical Clinic, Jolene Engelhart, an FNP at the Richardton Clinic, and Trevor Stavig, a DNP at the Elgin Community Clinic, offer treatment for those with opioid dependence. Treatments can reduce withdrawal symptoms and drug cravings.

For those who have become addicted to narcotic pain relievers, the providers are experienced in prescribing Suboxone. Coupled with a complete treatment plan, Suboxone is used in the treatment of opioid

dependence.

"It's been very successful," Schmidt says. "The patients that have used it said it has changed their life, mainly because they can now function and feel good." Offering this treatment program in rural clinics is also important, with local access to treatment.

"I feel that anyone who is dealing with addiction issues, no matter where they are in life, would greatly benefit from addiction treatment here at JMH-CC. Providers will listen to your requests and will treat you with dignity and respect. At JMHCC, we will be here for you," Stavig

"I like helping people and it's not only about providing them with health care, but also including both their mental and spiritual health. Overall, I enjoy helping patients through different stages in their life," Schmidt

That includes caring for patients who need chronic pain management.

"A lot of these patients, I feel, fall through the cracks," Rhonda said. "If they are having pain, someone should be there to listen to them and help them. It may not always be with pain medication. There are other ways that you can help them manage their pain and maybe even decrease the use of nar-

cotics." "It's an awesome responsibility and privilege to be able to assist someone in whatever level of health care need they have, whether that's for something simple or for something complex," Engelhart says.

"If there's ever developing a relationship with your patients. it's with those with substance abuse disorders. Addiction can be devastating, so it's awesome when they can change things around and you help play a small part in that by prescrib ing medication to help them," she shares. "It's helping them through their struggles and celebrating their victories.

Physical therapy available

Another aspect of the treatment of those with opioid addiction is managing their original, pain symptoms.

Jacobson Memorial Hospital Care Center, has a physical therapist available. Patients may make an appointment with him at JMHCC in Elgin by callina 584-3338.


"I'm just too busy to pray." I'd imagine most of us have uttered this thought at some point. We know that prayer is essential to the life of faith-that we need to communicate with God to maintain an intimate relationship with Him- yet we can be often weighed down with so many obligations that it seems impossible to pray every day. Today I'd simply like to offer some tips on how to integrate prayer into our lives, even amidst the busyness.


 Pray in the morning and at night- The privileged moments when we wake up and before we fall asleep can be beautiful times to offer to God. Even if only for a few minutes, we can take time in the morning to offer our day to God and ask His grace to be with us. Taking a few minutes before bed to prayerfully review our day, ask pardon for our sins, and thank God for the blessings He has given can also be a truly transformative disci-

· Make a brief visit to the church- It doesn't require much time to make a brief stop at your church to spend a few moments with Jesus. This can perhaps be done during a lunch break or before heading home for the day. It can be a powerful gesture of prayer to simply stop in to say "hi" to Jesus.

· Pray during the drive-Many of us spend a lot of time in a vehicle throughout the day. This can be a blessed time to speak with God or make use of a number of great prayer apps, such

- · Pray during monotonous chores- Doing dishes, mowing the lawn, folding laundry. These necessary tasks typically do not require much mental exertion and can thus be fitting times to commune with God.
- · Gratitude-Offer thanks to God for the blessings He gives. This can be done spontaneously as we receive His gifts or intentionally at any other time we find to pray.
- · Offer God our tiredness-We may often find ourselves tired or distracted in the moments we technically have time for prayer and so we think, "I can't pray now. I'm too tired. I won't be able to pray well." Our tiredness should not prevent us from prayer. God knows we are exhausted and He doesn't ask for perfection. Prayer isn't about saying the right words or being "good enough," but simply about being with God in whatever state we find ourselves.
- · What could be cut out?- I once served with a priest who would often say, "If you're too busy to pray, then you are too busy." If we really have no time for prayer, then we need to examine our lives to see where time can be made. I'd imagine most of us spend plenty of time on our phones which could be used better. Ultimately, even if our day truly is full with good things, we need to remember that nothing should take priority over our relationship with God. Work, hobbies, and even family can become idols if they keep us from that which is most important. God is never outdone in generosity. If we give ourselves generously to Him, He will take care of everything and fill us with His love and peace.



Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.

Reflections on the Words of Life

We have spent a good while in 1 Peter 2:9-10: "But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light; who once were not a people but are now the people of God, who had not obtained mercy but now have obtained mercy." So far we have touched on various aspects of this passage which describes the church, God's new Israel. But I have purposely saved one section until now, and that is what Peter tells us is the assignment of all those who have received His mercy and become a part of the chosen generation, the royal priesthood and the holy nation of God's new Israel. He tells us that assignment in the second half of verse 9: "that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light."

Please note what Peter does not say. He does not say that the first and greatest assignment of a believer in Jesus Christ to is to tell others how they might be saved. Nor does he in the first place tell us what work we are to do for God. Those things are important, but they are not primary. The great assignment of believers in Jesus Christ is to praise the Lord for taking them out of the darkness of sin and the grips of the devil and for bringing them into His marvelous light! This is what Peter is saying: Let your praises to the God of grace

abound! Just think of it, believer: You are one of the special, the chosen, the royal family of God. Doesn't that make you want to praise the Lord? He deserves all the praise. None of the dignities God has heaped upon believers are deserved. We were in utter darkness, estranged from God, but He rescued us and brought us into His marvelous light. Our greatest work is to praise Him all

Charles Wesley at the end of his hymn entitled "Love Divine All Loves Excelling" speaks of believers being "lost in wonder, love, and praise" because of what God has done for them. Indeed this is what we should be. Our highest and greatest work, brethren, is to begin to do now what we will be doing for all eternity. The apostle John tells us of what it will be like when believers surround the throne of God in heaven. In Revelation 5:13 he tells us that all creatures will praise God saying, "Blessing and honor and glory and power be to Him who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb, forever and ever!"

Christians, do you find yourself praising God? I encourage

us to think much upon what God could have given us if He gave us what we deserved. Let us think much upon that fact that instead of eternal hell, He has given us eternal glory with Him. Think much upon what He was willing to give in order that we might be His own. And may such thoughts fill our hearts with thankfulness and praise.

For those who have not trusted in Christ alone for salvation, I ask you to think much upon something else. Think much upon where you are headed for all eternity unless, by God's grace, you are brought to see your sinfulness and flee to God through Jesus, who is the only way of access. We do not know how much time is left for each of us. Please do not delay. May this be your day of salva-
