A Little Birdie Told Me: "Earl's Bison Museum in Bison SD is Not Your Ordinary Museum." As I promised last week my travels took me farther east on Highway 20 to Prairie City, Bison and Lodgepole, SD. I visited these towns because they are in our circulation area and often while we are stuffing papers someone will say, "Have you ever been to such and such a town?" I can honestly say, "Yes I have been to Bison, Prairie City and Lodgepole!"

The former residents of Strool, SD founded Prairie City in 1946: Strool is ghost town founded by Homesteader Benjamin Strool. Strool was best known for its thriving culture, baseball team, Jewish community and the practice of renting land rather than selling it. If you're passing through be sure to look north to see the collection of railroad memorabilia.

Just a few short miles down the road is Bison SD. Bison has a proud sporting history displayed on three large billboards. As I drove through town I noticed a sign for a museum, what luck! Earl's Bison Museum makes its home at the back of the Bison Public Library. Kallie Kronberg is the librarian and museum caretaker. The library has an active summer program and several local youth were taking advantage. Kallie opened the museum and I stepped into a


taxidermy zoo. Earl Engerbreston was the local taxidermist and started the museum on his ranch near Chance, SD. Earl's career started at the age of 12 when he took a correspondence course. He opened the museum in 1954: in 1995 a year before he died he donated the collection to the town of Bison. The variety of animals is just incredible! All types of prairie wildlife including several raptors, large

Across the street on its original site is the Perkin's County Historical Society Sod House: First House in Bison SD dated 1907: Built by Anna Carr. In an effort to preserve the sod house a steel building was constructed over it. Sadly this has had the opposite affect, the sod requires humidity to remain stable: Part of the foundation has started to deteriorate. The interior is well preserved with the Anna Carr's family photos displayed.

Bison, SD has another claim to fame, it's home to the last hanging in South Dakota on Dec. 3, 1913. A replica of the jail and gallows are on display at the courthouse along with photos of the: victims, sheriff, deputy and the murderer.

If you're thirsty or hungry at the end of the trail the K Bar T is the place to stop. Located on Highway 20 it features a C-Store, Restaurant & Bar.



When the Gertie and Hefty's second girl was born on May 31, 1951, she shared a birthday with one of Gertie's sisters, Lola, thus, her parents named the baby girl Lola in her honor.

Lola attended Fredlund School all eight grades, then graduated from Hettinger High School in 1969.

After high school, Lola started college at the University of North Dakota-Ellendale Branch. Unfortunately, two of the main

campus buildings burned down in January 1970, and the branch closed in 1971.

Lola then attended Northern State University for a brief time working toward a degree in elementary education. She eventually moved back to Hettinger and worked at the Community Memorial Hospital. Although he and Lola were never able to meet in person, he wrote a wonderful tribute to her after she passed away.

Lola eventually returned to college at Dickinson State University in Dickinson, ND, and graduated with a degree in elementary education. She started teaching as the kindergarten teacher in Bison, SD, taught second grade and first grade

(sometimes two grades in the same room) for 37 years.

Lola was a multi-faceted faculty member, serving as the cheerleading advisor for many years and was able to watch her group perform in Texas at the national convention. She was one of the IT coordinators for the school and spent many hours ensuring that the school's technology was up to date. She was the head negotiator for the Bison Education Association as the school went through both good and tough times financially.

Most important, Lola was generous, loving, good-humored person, in one of the entries on her obituary page, a mother wrote, in part, "She was the first-grade teacher for five of our kids and we had many good laughs together over the years. She also graciously allowed me to bring kids to her house after school and on weekends so she could pull loose teeth which grossed me out to have to do."

She and her long-time friend sold tickets for basketball games, and she was able to visit with adults during that time. Lola loved to make scrapbooks and she and one of her sisters had a long-standing joke of who had the most paper, stickers, and materials with which to create the books.

Her high school class celebrated its 50th reunion in 2019. The husband of one of her classmates drove to Bison and brought her to Hettinger for the banquet. She stayed until the very end and then he took her home. She had a wonderful

Reflections on the Words of Life

By Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We come today to one of the best-known chapters in the Bible, containing the account of Daniel in the lions' den. As chapter 6 opens, we see how the predictions made earlier are being fulfilled. We can recall Nebuchadnezzar's dream about the four-part image, representing four successive kingdoms. In chapter 6, we see the fulfillment of the transition from the first part of the image, the golden head of the Babylonian kingdom, now being succeeded by the chest and arms of silver which represents the Medo-Persian Empire.

But there is an added dimension here that we should not miss. For while the Babylonian kingdom has come and gone, Daniel remains on the scene, even with the coming of the new empire. Though Daniel is but a man, he is representative of the Kingdom of God. He illustrates for us here the truth that while the kingdoms of men and nations come and go, the Kingdom of God continues. While Daniel had lived under a Jewish king as a young boy, then under at least two Babylonians kings, and now a Medo-Persian king, he never stopped serving the King of

Kings. It must be incredibly difficult to take over a world empire. But that is the situation Darius found himself in. One mark of good leadership is the ability to recognize the need to surround himself with good helpers. We read in Daniel 6:1-2, "It pleased Darius to set over the kingdom one hundred and twenty satraps, to be over the whole kingdom; and over these, three governors, the satraps might give account to them, so that the king would suffer no loss." The satraps are comparable to state governors, to rule the various provinces of the empire..

Darius appears to have been a judge of human character, realizing the potential for the 120 governors to use their positions for their own gain. Apparently, conditions in the Medo-Persian Empire were not very different from those that frequently exist in our own country today. Darius knew that in addition to needing help with ruling such a massive empire, he also needed a few good men who would be looking out for the best interests of the

It is remarkable that Daniel should be chosen as one of the three overseers. He had been a high official of the Babylonian Empire. It was often the practice of new rulers to imprison, exile, or even kill certain key officials of old administrations, to make it clear that the new administration demanded complete loyalty. Verse 3 tells us why Daniel was chosen: "Then this Daniel distinguished himself above the governors and satraps, because an excellent spirit was in him; and the king gave thought to setting him over the whole realm," Daniel had "an excellent spirit." He was a man of impeccable character. He could not be bribed or bought. Daniel's character and practice provide us with a good model of the kind of men we ought to be looking for to hold public office. Furthermore, he represents the kind of person every believer in the Lord Jesus Christ should seek to be.

I want to make it clear, though, that it is not impeccable character which makes a person a Christian. The Christian is one who has trusted only in the Lord Jesus Christ to make him or her right with God. God's Word tells us that when one places his trust in Jesus Christ, he is given the perfect righteousness of Christ as a free gift. 2 Corinthians 5:21 tells us, "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." The sins of every believer were placed on the Lord Jesus Christ, and He bore the penalty for them on the cross. In exchange, every believer receives the perfect righteousness of Christ. Living a righteous life as Daniel did is not the MEANS of becoming a Christian, but the RESULT of becoming a Christian, as one grows in grace and of whom Daniel was one, that in the knowledge of Christ. It is very important not to get the cart



Drier conditions and above normal high temperatures in the 90s are forecasted for most of this week in southwestern North Dakota as an upper-level ridge builds into the western U.S.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.


