Two psychologists, who had become good friends over the years, due to meeting in college, had been communicating with each other since college. Living in two different areas, but seemed like their emails to each other were similar, decided it was time for a week together to sort through the turmoil of the issues they were dealing with. Issues now were different and they agreed maybe talking to each other might help them solve some of these issues.

The week went fast but the conversations, time spent together, fun, work, resting all were very beneficial. They agreed it had to be done together in a neutral place and the patients had to be identical twins - - so an all points bulletin was put out, place was chosen and - - the twins who got the job - - all 4 years college paid for.

The findings of the two psychologists was very beneficial. They had been suspecting that was the answer but had to make sure. Because of their intense observation of people the State Board had requested them to give a presentation on what they thought. But to be sure, they needed this experiment.

Auditorium was filled to capacity. One letter was read, then another - then they presented their case - explained what they thought, what they could see was the problem and maybe someday could help all those present and work on a solution.

They explained - they chose identical twins, same IQ score - same grade - same everything. Then we agreed we ask the same questions, same wheat field, same time of day, only one of us would be sure to point out the positive of the grain of wheat and the other would be sure to point out the weeds. In a weeks time - - one always hearing positive, the other only hearing negative, show us the great importance of all focusing on the great wheat fields, corn fields, canola, peas, that feed you and me - - instead of the weeds - -.

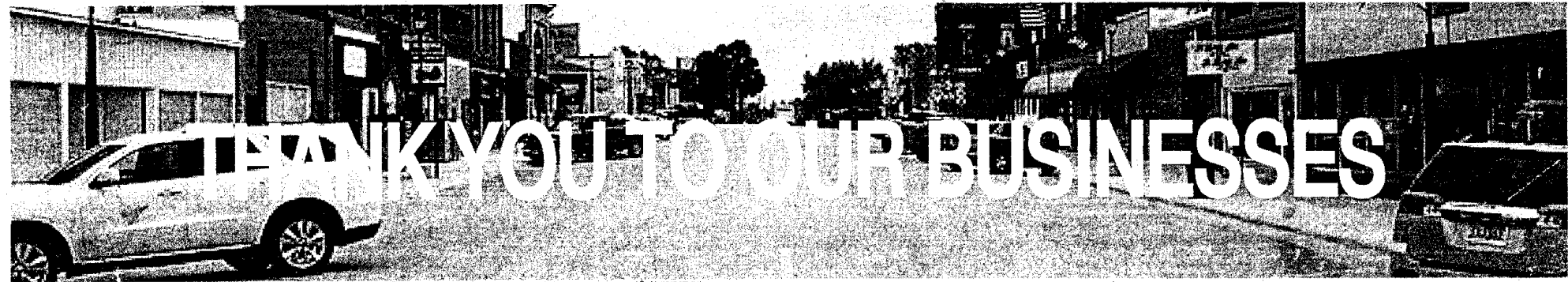





And the Band Played on . . .

Stars begin to appear in the deepening blue overhead as cars and pickups, lining both sides of Hettinger's Main Street from north to south, spill into side streets. Mostly dressed up and in good spirits, crowds of people fill the sidewalks going in and out of stores, bars and cafes throughout the evening. It is another 1950s small-town Saturday night on the Northern Great Plains and the Hettinger Cowboy Band is about to play.

Dressed in red satin western shirts with white leather fringe, white trousers, cowboy boots and hats, the mix of adults

and high school-age musicians moves to the center of Main Street and forms a large circle. It is not long before strains of John Philip Sousa's marches waft over the crowd. Three high school majorettes in snappy matching outfits inside the circle throw their shining batons high into the air as little girls with their own batons try to emulate them outside the circle.

That city /community band became the Hettinger Cowboy Band, and has, of 2025, been in existence for well over a century, about 118 years.

It's had its ups and downs, almost dissolving in the 1970s, but through long time, loyal

members such as Janet (Felde) Schauer, who this year celebrates her 70th year as a snare drum player, the band is alive and well today. Various directors (usually the school's music director) and faithful members have come and gone, but the band keeps playing. Not many small towns in the Northern Great Plains can make that claim, this long.

Present director, Gina Joyce, remembers many good memories playing with so many people over the years in area towns such as Reeder and Dickinson, ND; Lemmon, Faith and Bison, SD; Baker and Ekalaka, MT, as well as the Days of '76 in Deadwood, SD. In the 1950s, the Cowboy Band marched and played on the main streets of Chicago, Illinois!

Sunday July 20, the Dakota Buttes Museum west of the Hettinger Armory, hosts a celebration of this iconic group. The program begins at 2:00 pm MDT in building two with Kristi Kay Miller's presentation on the community/cowboy band. Following that, the Hettinger Cowboy Band will play a medley of favorite band selections, followed by coffee, lemonade and goodies.

The event is free and open to the public.

Anyone driving around back roads will have noticed abandon country churches and old one-room school-houses. Some communities have taken up the cause to save and restore these pieces of history for future generations.

The 2-room Heil School located just south of Highway 21 between Elgin and Carson is one such project. The foundation and front step repairs will be the first priority and most expensive. Secondly the windows and painting of the exterior, sprucing up the interior will be the final stage.

The Grant County Historical Society is spearheading the project and spreading the word about the many historical sites and charming towns in Grant County. Once the project is completed school children from all over will be invited to take a field trip to the Heil School to experience what it would have been like to attend a 2-room school.

The committee has started a GoFundMe account and had a successful fundraising event during the Highway 21 Treasure Hunt for the Heil School Fund. The Grant County Historical Society will be forming sub-committees for the restoration and fundraising if you are interested in helping out contact Shawn Udell at 701-390-8444.

Bowman's original veteran wall, which was created privately by a local area Veteran, was dedicated in 2007 during Bowman's Centennial Celebration. In the years since that original wall was created, Bowman County Commission has wished to expand the area veteran wall. In the Fall of 2022, Laci Coates, Bowman County Veteran Services Officer, began work on the expansion of the area veteran wall through the formation of a Veteran Wall Committee.

When the Veteran Wall Committee started this endeavor, it was believed that they would gather approximately 500 additional Veteran names - bringing the combined Veteran Wall total to just over 1,000 names. However, that goal of 500 names was quickly surpassed



Just when you thought that our elected officials in Washington, DC, had gaslighted us as much as they could...you ain't seen nothin' yet. The current faux pas is that federal ICE (US Immigration & Customs Enforcement) agents are not "federal law enforcement agents." To set the record straight, even 10 seconds of research reveals that ICE was created in 2003 as part of the new Department of Homeland Security (HSI). It's mandate? They may also carry a firearm and, serve any order, warrant, subpoena, summons, or other process issued under the authority of the United States. And, under the definition of any reasonable person, if they can arrest you and take you to jail (whatever you may subjectively call it), folks, that's a law enforcement officer who has a sidearm that says if you don't comply, I can use force to make you. You know...a cop! Their authority, like any other cop, is constrained by the US Constitution and, their rules aren't as complicated as the progressives would like to make them.

In fact, HSI is ICE's criminal arm comprised of federal law enforcement officers who investigate crimes that threaten national security, human trafficking, child sexploitation, cybercrime, money laundering, intellectual property theft, and illegal exports of weapons and sensitive technology. They can make investigate stops, detentions, searches, arrests without a warrant and, interrogations of suspects. So, when an elected talking head tries to convince the public that these guys don't have the authority to stop, detain, question and arrest folks...it's misinformation (false). Just because the progressives want open borders does not mean they can interfere with these officers and, to think otherwise...well...ain't all that smart. Have a great week.



Reflections on the Words of Life
by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

For several weeks we have been looking together at a passage which shows us that the church is God's new Israel. Last time we saw that the assignment of the church is to proclaim the praises of the Lord, who has called us out of darkness into His marvelous light.

Today we come to the next verse, in which Peter makes an immediate application of the truths he has been proclaiming. 1 Peter 2:11: "Beloved, I beg you as sojourners and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the soul."

If we as believers in the Lord Jesus Christ enjoy such a special status as the one Peter has previously set before us, then the way in which we live before a watching world becomes very important. Note that Peter starts in verse 11 by reminding believers WHO THEY ARE in this world. In other words, he begins with the reason WHY we should abstain from fleshly lusts before giving us the command to abstain from fleshly lusts. Peter appeals to believers with the word "beloved." This in itself says much. Christ's apostles did not view themselves as being aloof or above the rest of the believers. Peter does not assert his apostolic authority to command believers to live a certain way. Rather, he speaks as one who loves his fellow Christians very tenderly, and appeals to them as one who cares deeply about them. This has an application to all of us who profess to be believers in the Lord Jesus Christ. Sadly, believers can assume a competitive attitude toward one another. We can easily fall into the trap of looking down on those of other denominations or those who do

not think exactly the way we do on certain points. But the body of Christ should be a place of love and fellowship and mutual concern. It should be a place in which we encourage and help one another to live for the Lord.

That being said, I must add as a preacher of God's Word that I am under obligation to point out errors that exist within the church at large. It is my God-given duty to do so. But in doing this, I must be very careful, for all of us have errors and blind spots of some kind. And the Lord Jesus loves every single one who is trusting in Him alone for salvation. Therefore, we must not turn the exposing of errors into a matter for pride or a reason for not loving every true brother and sister in the Lord.

Note next, the way in which Peter makes his appeal. He says "Beloved, I beg you." Peter is pleading with us and urging us to pay attention to what he says. His sense of urgency is due to his desire to see believers have the greatest possible impact for Christ in this world.

Next time, Lord willing, we shall continue with the words "sojourners and pilgrims." But I close by pointing out that this message from Peter, which is ultimately from the Lord through the words of Peter, is addressed to believers in the Lord Jesus Christ. Friend, are you one of those? If you have not come to the point of realizing that you, like every other human being, are a sinner in need of a Savior and that Jesus provided the only payment for sin which God accepts, please ask Him for grace to see these truths and to place your trust in Christ alone to make you right with God. There is nothing greater in this life than being one of God's people, and that blessing continues throughout eternity. Please be sure where you stand on this most important of all issues.

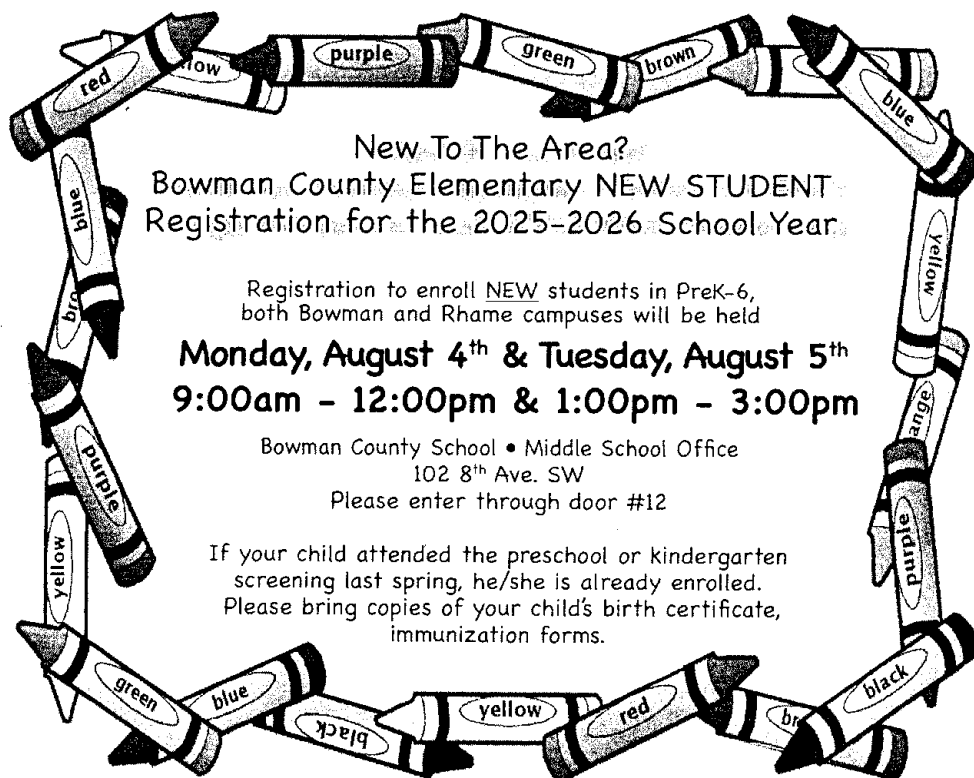

RECIPE OF THE DAY
