

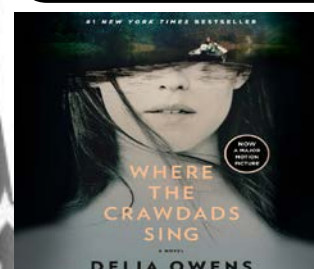

Reflections on the Words of Life

By Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last time we observed that while Daniel's impeccable character was greatly appreciated by King Darius, it caused Daniel's peers to hate him. We should not expect unbelievers to applaud a life of holiness. On the contrary, they will often feel guilty and uncomfortable in the presence of a godly, uncompromising Christian.

Another observation we should make is that for a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ, the battle is never over in this life. Christians should not think that they can make for themselves a comfortable little nest in this world, where they can relax and take it easy. Daniel's life shows us what the typical Christian life will be like. He has been fighting spiritual battles all his life, and here in his eighties, he is facing what may have been the most difficult test ever.

Believers, we need to have the right view of what we are doing in this world. We are ambassadors for Christ with the job of telling others how they can have eternal life by placing their trust in Him alone for salvation. While on earth, we are to live as aliens and sojourners (1 Peter 2:11). The world for us is not a playground but a battleground.

If we do not mentally and spiritually prepare ourselves with this mindset, we will be very vulnerable to Satan, who prowls about like a roaring lion, seeking to devour God's people (1 Peter 5:8). The believer's time of rest is coming. Indeed, God graciously gives us periods of refreshment even in this life. But we must not take off the armor of God. We must live close to Him and seek to be ready for whatever He may call us to do.

Daniel's enemies could think of only one possible course of action. We read in Daniel 6:5, "We shall not find any charge against this Daniel unless we find it against him concerning the law of his God." Their reasoning went like this: "The cause of Daniel's integrity is his devotion to his God. Therefore, we must put him in a position where he must choose between loyalty to his king and loyalty to his God." Knowing that Daniel had a track record of loyalty to God, they knew that was what he would choose. And in so doing, he would fall right in with their plan and become the cause of his own demise.

But in order for their plan to work, they must get it past King Darius. However, with the methodology they have contrived, Darius will be a pushover. We read in verses 6 and 7, "So these governors and satraps thronged before the king, and said thus to him: 'King Darius,

live forever! All the governors of the kingdom, the administrators and satraps, the counselors and advisors, have consulted together to establish a royal statute and to make a firm decree, that whoever petitions any god or man for thirty days, except you, O king, shall be cast into the den of lions." Notice the methodology they are using to appeal to Darius. It's the old story of "everybody's doing it." How often have children appealed to their parents on the basis that they should be allowed to do something because all the other children were doing it? And as

most often is the case, this was a lie. But it was a very convincing lie because ALMOST ALL of the leadership was there to petition the king. All, that is, except the one named Daniel.

Christians, we are going to have to resign ourselves to being in the minority on almost all major issues. The world's standards are generally opposite to the Word of God. Now more than ever, we need to have ringing in our ears the words of Jesus, "Take up your cross and follow Me." May God grant us the grace and courage to do so.

This past week I got down on my knees, and I pulled weeds from under the evergreen trees in the backyard of the parsonage. I did what needed to be done because the weeds were unsightly and drawing away moisture that the trees and the flowers we planted needed much more. In the process I did something that I do not like to do, but in this case I felt it was necessary. I went into the house and found a can of "OFF" and sprayed the bug juice over me from top to bottom. Bowman New Home of Regional Council

As of July 1, 2022, Bowman County Development Corporation entered into a management services agreement with Roosevelt Custer Regional Council to provide organization and program management, community development, and business services. Roosevelt Custer Regional Council (RCRC) was seeking to revamp their organization, loan programs, and regional assistance, and the contract was a unique opportunity for both organizations. 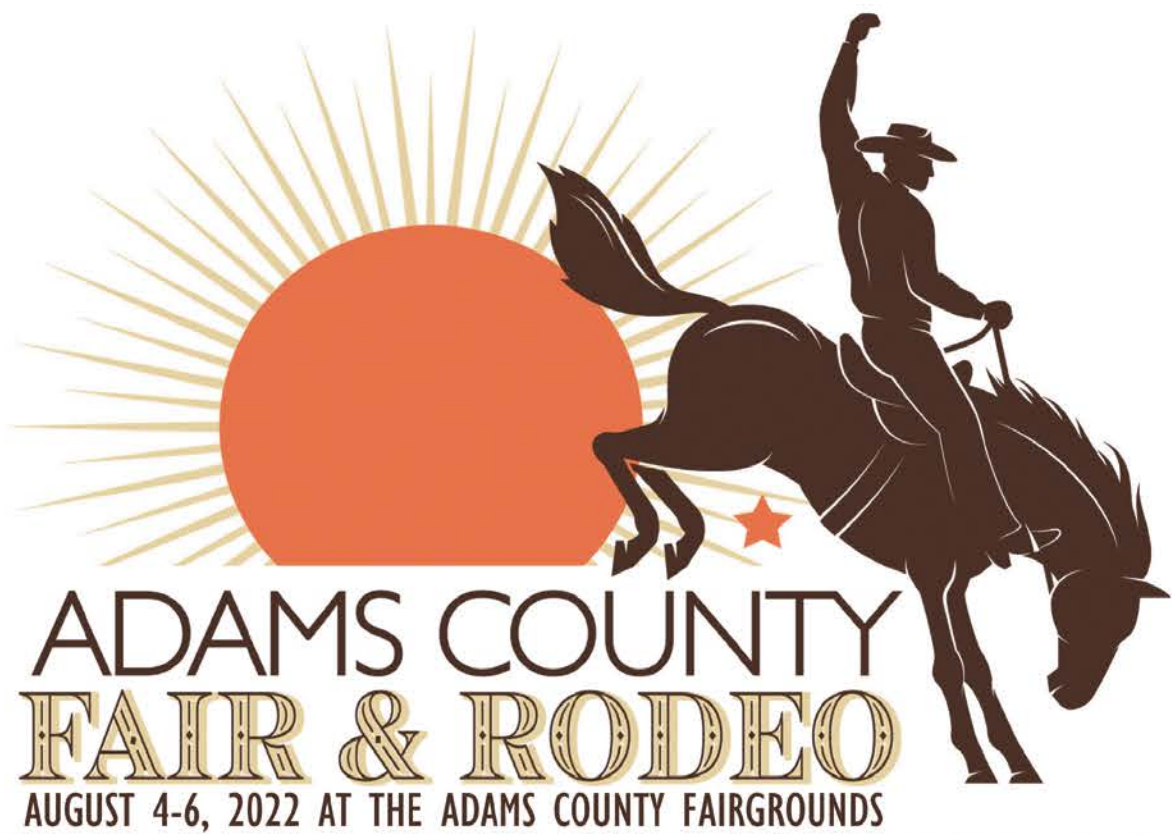

West River Health Services highlights Visiting Nurse Department

West River Health Services has an entire team dedicated to bringing healthcare to the home. The West River Health Services Visiting Nurse department has been providing healthcare and assistance to patients in southwest North Dakota and northwest South Dakota homes since 2009.

Licensed by the North Dakota Department of Health and certified by Medicare, the West River Visiting Nurses department offers skilled care directly in the patient's home, offering clinical assessments for many chronic conditions such as heart failure, high blood pressure, respiratory disorders, diabetes and pain.

In addition to clinical assessments, nurses in the department regularly provide wound care and complete lab draws for patients in the region.

"We provide instruction and education to each patient on their chronic conditions to ensure that the patient can continue to live safely at home with support services in place," said Visiting Nurse Manager Mari Stelter, RN.

Stelter said the Visiting Nurse department allows patients to receive professional care in the comfort of their own homes, a service that greatly benefits an elderly population and those in need of in-home services.

"Patients benefit from consistent oversight of a licensed nurse to provide routine clinical assessments and safe medication management which helps to keep the patient's chronic conditions stable," said Stelter. "Visiting Nurses works closely with the patient's physician to communicate timely changes in the patient's condition, which leads to decreased clinic visits and hospitalizations."

The Visiting Nurse department is also a key part of the West River Health Services ecosystem. The Visiting Nurse department has three locations throughout the West River Healthcare system with Offices are based out of the rural health clinics located in Hettinger, Mott, and Lemmon, South Dakota.

On a typical day, Stelter said the Visiting Nurse will see between 4-6 patients and may sometimes drive up to 200 miles per day depending on the patients' location, covering southwest

North Dakota; northwest South Dakota; and Adams, Hettinger, and Grant Counties in ND; and Harding, Perkins, and Corson County in SD.

“Each day for a Visiting Nurse can be different,” she said. “We usually try to keep a consistent schedule for each patient, but that can change based on the patient’s status that day and any medical appointments they may have.”

According to Stelter, the Visiting Nurse department currently serves about 75 patients within the local and surrounding communities and usually average about 300 visits/month.

According to Stelter, a potential patient of the Visiting Nurse department

must have an order by their physician to start receiving healthcare from the department. Once the referral is received, the Visiting Nurse manager reviews the patient’s medical record and a determination is made, if the patient qualifies for skilled services.

“If the patient does not have Medicare, other insurances are reviewed such as VA, Medicaid, and other supplemental insurances,” said Stelter. “Private pay is also an option if the patient does not qualify for homebound status or is not covered by their other insurance.”

If a patient meets the criteria for Visiting Nurse services, an RN will be assigned to the patient and a phone call will be placed

to the patient’s home to schedule a visit. The Visiting Nurse will develop the patient’s plan of care and an initial certification is signed by the patient’s physician.

According to Stelter, Visiting Nurses usually see patients an average of 1-2 times per week, but the frequency may change based on changes in the patient’s condition. Patients are re-evaluated every 60 days for continuation of services and the re-certification is signed by their physician.

Stelter said that anyone who has questions regarding the Visiting Nurse department and services that are provided may contact the department at 701-567-6171.

Cloud Seeding Operations Summary for July 18-24, 2022

BISMARCK, N.D. - A continuation of warm and dry conditions occurred last week over southwestern North Dakota. There was one brief operational flight for reconnaissance on the evening of July 18 in the Bowman and Slope County project area. Rain enhancement operations resumed in the project area last week due to drier conditions.

An upper-level low pressure system in Canada will influence North Dakota's weather for most of this week. The main opportunity for precipitation in

southwestern North Dakota should be on Monday as a cold front moves through. Beginning Tuesday, cooler temperatures and dry conditions are likely to remain in place until next weekend when an upper-level ridge could bring a pattern change and warmer temperatures.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at <http://www.dwr.nd.gov/arb>.

Participation in the NDCMP was determined through a county-level public process. District 1 is comprised of Bowman County and seven townships in Slope County. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.

Rites Held for Leet E. Fowler

Leet E. Fowler, 87, of Belle Fourche, SD, passed away on July 18, 2022 at the Spearfish Regional Medical Center in Spearfish.



Funeral Services for Leet were held on Friday, July 22, 2022 at 11:00 a.m. at the St. James Lutheran Church in Belle Fourche. Pastor Kari Webb officiated the funeral services. Visitation for Leet was held at the church from 9-11 on Friday. Burial was held at the Buffalo Cemetery, Buffalo, SD, at 3:00 p.m. with Pastor Jean Helmer officiating the burial.

Leet Ellsworth Fowler was born February 10, 1935 in Camp Crook, South Dakota, to Bertha and Charles Fowler. He was the youngest of their five children, though he never got to know his father, who passed away when Leet was 14 months old.

Leet spent the first years of his life living in Buffalo. When he was five his mother married Ted Matson and the family moved to the ranch. His brother, James Matson, was born in 1941. Leet worked hard at a very young age, and was given responsibilities beyond his years.

He attended a one-room schoolhouse with several neighboring children, including his future wife, Maurine Brengle. He

completed high school in Brookings, South Dakota, an agriculture-based school, and attended some college there. He also attended Black Hills College. He won the saddle bronc riding at the Buffalo Labor Day Rodeo in 1954. He served four years in the U.S. Navy. He was stationed on the USS Oriskany and then the USS Lexington in several locations around the Pacific.

A pivotal point in his life came when he married Maurine Brengle on June 18, 1961. They celebrated 61 years together and were excellent partners. Early on, he worked for Lloyd and Helga Gilbert. Later he had a trucking business for several years.

In 1972, the Fowlers moved back to the family ranch. In 1976 they formed Grubbing Hoe Ranch, Inc., with Matsons and Fowlers as shareholders. Ranching was Leet's life work and legacy, and he proved himself an astute businessman. He worked extremely hard, he thought constantly about ways to improve the operation, and strategically grew the ranch.

Due to his brother, Chuck's influence, he was an early adopter of computers. Leet admired Chuck greatly. Beginning in the early 1980s, Leet used the computer for ranch book-keeping. He embraced technology whenever he could, from weather radars, to live camera feeds monitoring calving heifers, to smart phones and online banking.

In 2006 Leet and Maurine began spending part of their time "semi-retired." They split their time between their home in Belle Fourche and on the ranch.

Leet was a lifelong learner. If he wanted to know how to do something, he learned how. He was naturally ingenuitive. He

was a cowboy; he was a carpenter; he was a plumber; he was an electrician; he was a heavy equipment operator; he was a trucker; he was a barber; he was woodworker; he was a pilot; he did much of his own veterinary work. He played cards and cribbage. He was a self-taught musician, playing piano, accordion, and guitar. He collected clocks, and built a grandfather clock. He liked to get all the clocks wound and ticking, creating a cacophony of noise that he enjoyed immensely.

He respected people who knew and did things, and as much as he liked talking about cattle, he was happy to learn about others' area of expertise. He loved to laugh and tell stories; he loved to tease. He loved hitting various coffee stops around Belle, and going to the sale barn on Thursdays. He also enjoyed naps in front of the tv "watching" Gunsmoke and rodeos. He could be a little intense; he wasn't shy about saying what he thought. When the rubber met the road, he had a remarkable ability to tap into a reserve of calm and patience. He could sleep through a calf-killing blizzard so he was rested and ready to work the next day. He had a rough exterior but could also express his love and affection.

He loved Maurine. He loved his family and was proud of them. He loved his friends and continued to make new ones his entire life. He was a 59-year member of the Masonic Lodge, serving as Master of the Cedar Branch Lodge Number 179 in 1985, and was a Naja Shriner. He was a member of St. James Lutheran Church. He was a member of Harding County Stockgrowers and served as a director for the South Dakota Stockgrowers Association.

He is preceded in death by his parents; sisters Marion, Eleanor and Kay; brothers Charles and James; and his dear friend Pat Coffield. He's survived by his wife, Maurine; sons Ty (Melissa) and Aaron (Tricia), and daughter Teddi; four grandchildren, one great-grandchild, several nieces, nephews, and friends.

Services were live streamed on Aaron Fowlers Facebook page. A link was added the day of the service.

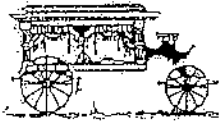

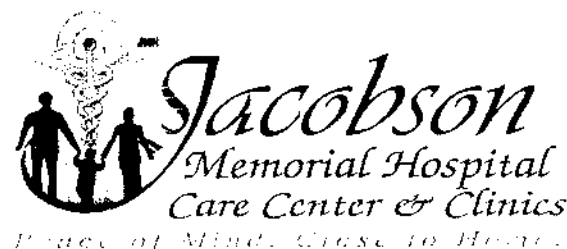

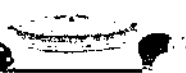

Thoughts for the Week

There is an old saying that goes: If you don't know history, it's as if you were born yesterday. If you were born yesterday then any leader can tell you anything." Howard Zinn, American historian (1924-2010)

The parable of the blind men and an elephant is a story that illustrates ontologic reasoning. It is a story of a group of blind men who have never come across an elephant before and who learn and imagine what the elephant is like by touching it. Each blind man feels a different part of the elephant's body, but only one part, such as the side or the tusk. They then describe the elephant based on their limited experience and their descriptions of the elephant are different from each other. In some versions, they come to suspect that the other persons are dishonest and they come to blows. The moral of the parable is that humans have a tendency to claim absolute truth based on their limited, subjective experience as they ignore other people's limited subjective experiences which may be equally true.

If you watch any historical movie, or documentary or even read a historical book, the story is written by the author from their perspective. Hopefully it is close to the actual truth of what happened, however, we must remember it is written by someone that did not actually live the events. True history is written by those that lived it, but since people do not live forever, we must depend on those that choose to research the facts and write them down in a way that we can understand. Sadly the truth can be changed just in the way it is written or reported. Just because a story is written based on historical events, does not mean the story bears much relation to the actual events, hence the disclaimer that prefaces the movie in many cases. Many times a book or a movie is

written very loosely on the facts and more for the entertainment value.

The same thing can happen when a family tells a story from the past. Depending on who tells the story it is said from their perspective. This does not always mean that the story is wrong, but that it may not be the whole story because they see and remember it as it applied to their own person. Embellishments may be made to the story to put the person telling it in a better light or maybe put someone else in a worse light. This is human nature and not always done with any malice, but sometimes just for greater impact for the people who are listening to the story.

So can you believe all that you read and hear? Not hardly, but we have the ability as thinking people to sort through what we see and hear and pick out those things that are true for us. We may not always be right, but we can do the best we can to listen to opinions from many and choose what is most right. Kind of like taking a test when we were young. Nothing is always wrong and nothing is always right, but by experience and knowledge we determine what is appropriate. We should not blindly believe all that we hear as that is the way of those that refuse to see the entire picture nor should we refuse to hear from others as that helps us to determine the outcome of our future. Is this an easy task? Again, not a true statement as each of us must use the information that we hear to form our own opinion as that is the one we live our life by. The moral of the story is to remember that we are the authors of our own lives and no one else knows what is right for us but us. We can choose to share that opinion with others, but we cannot force others to abide by our opinion nor should we do so. How sad and boring this world would be if there was only one opinion for all. A Little Birdie Told Me: “Glen Ullin, ND has a Great Museum and Very Gracious Tour Guides.” Glen Ullin is located on the Old Highway 10 Scenic By-Way and the highlight is the Museum. The museum features 4 buildings: a church, one room schoolhouse, steel building and the Cannel Home donated by William (Bill) Jones.

The church has religious items from all the churches in the area. The former Bethany Church has a large mural from the Sacred Heart Catholic Church hanging on the back wall and depicts the Resurrection of Jesus: The scene from the Passion of Jesus overlooks the empty tomb below.

The schoolhouse was moved to its present location in 1984, the school closed in 1965 or 1966. Originally located 11

miles south of Glen Ullin on the Norman Schmautz farm. On one of the chalkboards is a list of all the former teachers. I’m always taken back to my grade school years at St. Mary’s in New England. The grade school was in the old McKenzie Mercantile building. When I was in 1st, 2nd and 3rd grade my brothers had wrestling practice after school so my brother and I had to help clean the classrooms after school. We had to lift up those old desks that were all connected and one of us would run the dust mop under. To this day I don’t know how we were able to lift a whole row of desks!

The Cannel Home was a real treat a two story lovely home with beautiful vintage furnishings. Most incredible are the dolls!! According to my guide Lance Gartner a collector donated the dolls to the museum. Dolls, dolls and more dolls over 800: In every room and everywhere you look, DOLLS!

The steel building holds everything you’d expect to see in a farm community museum. One of the most unique items is the “Sno Bird.” The Sno Bird was used as a mail truck in the 1950’s and 60’s. Built by Herman Schultz it started out as a Sno Plane but he didn’t like it so he tore it apart and built a Sno Bird instead. Another interesting item is the old movie theater projector from the City Hall Auditorium. A replica of the Ideal Farm is also a highlight, the detail is just amazing: the actual farm is just north of the interstate on highway 49.

My other guides were Dennis Hintz and his Daughter Mara. Mara has done Living History Re-Enactments and looked right at home in the displays. If you are interested in visiting the museum give Lance Gartner a call at 701-348-3740.

Sadly no coffee shop in Glen Ullin but I had a nice lunch with my friend Fr. Gary Benz at the Wet Spot: The Wet Spot is a clean, family friendly bar and eating establishment.

If you travel to Glen Ullin be sure to look up on the hill overlooking the cemeteries, a majestic statue of Jesus looks down over the town. If you’re looking for an extended stay check out the Rock Roof Inn Bed & Breakfast.
