Bo, finally reaching the right age, wanting to be a Dr., said his good-byes and left for college - - took a few years eventually reached his desire, and came back to serve his community.

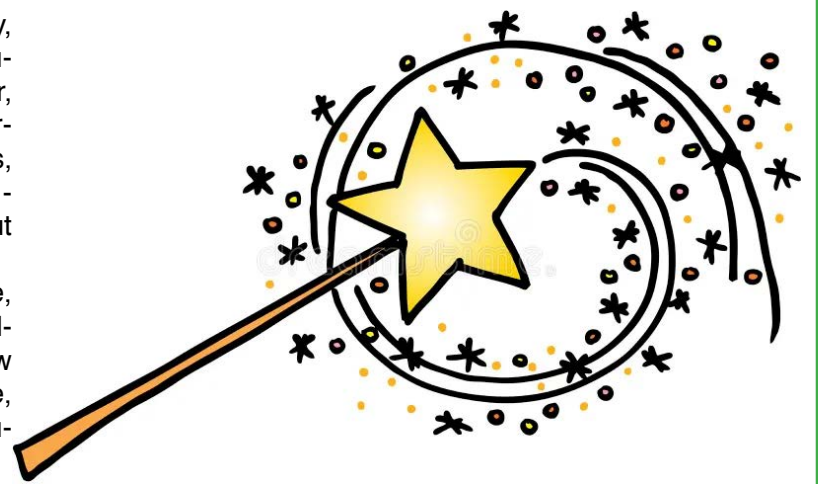
Happy, finally serving his community,. Bo fell in love, was about to marry, when something seemed to happen - - he heard - - someone said - -.

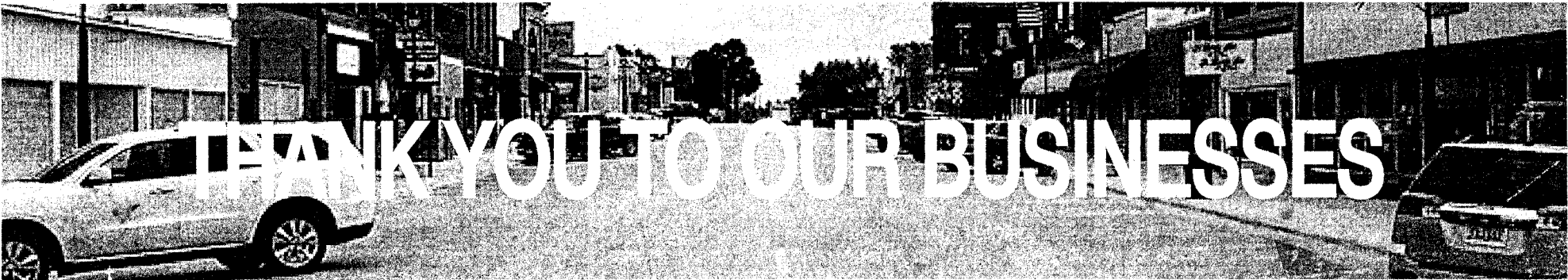

**Cloud Seeding Operations Summary For June 23-29, 2025**

BISMARCK, N.D. - Last week, southwestern North Dakota experienced high temperatures in the mid to upper 70s and nearly daily showers and thunderstorms.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, aircraft conducted three seeding flights, two flights for reconnaissance, and one flight for repositioning last week.

This week's weather forecast for southwestern North Dakota includes near normal high temperatures in the low 80s to around 90 degrees and increased chances for showers and thunderstorms beginning mid-week and continuing into the holiday weekend.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at <http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb>. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.

Well, I tried. Since this recreational marijuana legalization nonsense got started, those of us who have children suffering from mental health issues because they decided to take one for the team have tried to warn you. Suicides and trauma-related deaths made up much of the increase." Does that sound like a ringing endorsement for legalization? There is still a thriving illegal marijuana trade, so, taxing it and legalizing it have simply not worked. So, my advice? Ignore the media and stop hitting yourself in the head with the pot hammer because it feels so good when you quit! Have a great week.

Of course, Ted and his accommodating Fun Run crew of Jennifer Sanchez, Andrea Kendall, Molly Wolf and Jill Sailer were at the entrance/exit, ready to greet and help all customers -- with signing up for the drawing prizes, plus completing their pre-registrations for the "Fun Run & Walk" event on July 4th; and offering \$5 raffle and/or \$2 bucket draw tickets. Fifteen people pre-registered for the Fun Run on this day for only \$25. This rate will hold through June 27th; \$30 thereafter through race day on the 4th. We also sold 208 raffle tickets and 226 bucket draw tickets! Can you believe it! We all are suffering from writer's cramps in our hands! A terrific problem to have -- when we're hustling to raise \$11,000+ in net dollars to give back to our area communities. Total dollars on this day alone: from ticket sales (\$1,467); registrations (\$375); Kennedy's gift (\$342.50); and we also received eight amazing WRHS Foundation gifts (\$2,850)! You read that last one right! We had a \$2,500 gift from one family. Grand Total for the day: \$5,034.50! Unbelievable!

## Reflections on the Words of Life

For the past several weeks we have been making our way through 1 Peter 2:9-10: "But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light; who once were not a people but are now the people of God, who had not obtained mercy but now have obtained mercy." We have now reached the last description of God's people, His church: "Who once were not a people but are now the people of God, who had not obtained mercy but now have obtained mercy."

These statements come from verses found in the first 2 chapters of Hosea: "Call her name Lo-Ruhamah [no mercy], for I will no longer have mercy on the house of Israel, but I will utterly take them away" (Hosea 1:6). "Call his name Lo-Ammi [not My people], for you are not My people, and I will not be your God" (Hosea 1:9). But in the next chapter: "Then I will sow her for Myself in the earth, and I will have mercy on her who had not obtained mercy; then I will say to those who were not

My people, 'You are My people!' and they shall say, 'You are my God!'" (Hosea 2:23).

Here we see another remarkable instance of Peter's applying what was once true of the Old Testament nation of Israel to God's new Israel, the church. When the prophet Hosea proclaimed these words to Israel, he was speaking of the fact that although God had to punish them for their unfaithfulness and send them into captivity in Babylon, yet He would continue to show His love to them by bringing them out of captivity and back to their own land once again.

Peter is taking what was said to the literal, physical nation of Israel and applying it to believers in the Lord Jesus Christ. We as believers have also been delivered from captivity. As Peter says in the earlier part of our passage, we have been called out of darkness into His marvelous light. In other words, God has freed His people, the church from the bondage of sin.

The Israelites of Jesus' day entirely missed the fact that God had long ago promised that the gospel would go to all nations and that He would have a people for Himself that transcended all boundaries and racial distinctions. They forgot the promise to Abraham that in his seed, all

the nations of the earth would be blessed. In fulfillment of that promise, ever since the Lord Jesus Christ came to this earth as the God-man and established the New Covenant in His blood, He has been showing mercy to a people who had never known that mercy and making a people for Himself out of those who were dead in trespasses and sins and had no interest in Him whatsoever.

So this passage is really about the awesome grace of God to anyone who has come to believe on the Lord Jesus Christ. If you are a believer in Christ, it is because God is so good. He chose to place His

love upon you and make you one of His people. He gave His only begotten Son to die for you and pay the price for your sin. He granted you the gift of faith to place your trust in Christ alone for salvation. And He has shown you mercy by pardoning all your sins for Jesus' sake.

If you have not trusted in Christ's payment for sin as the basis of your forgiveness and right standing with God, won't you do so before it is too late? We will all spend forever somewhere, and our eternal destiny depends upon whether we were God's own special people through faith in Christ alone—or not.

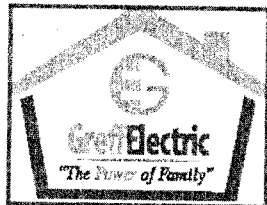

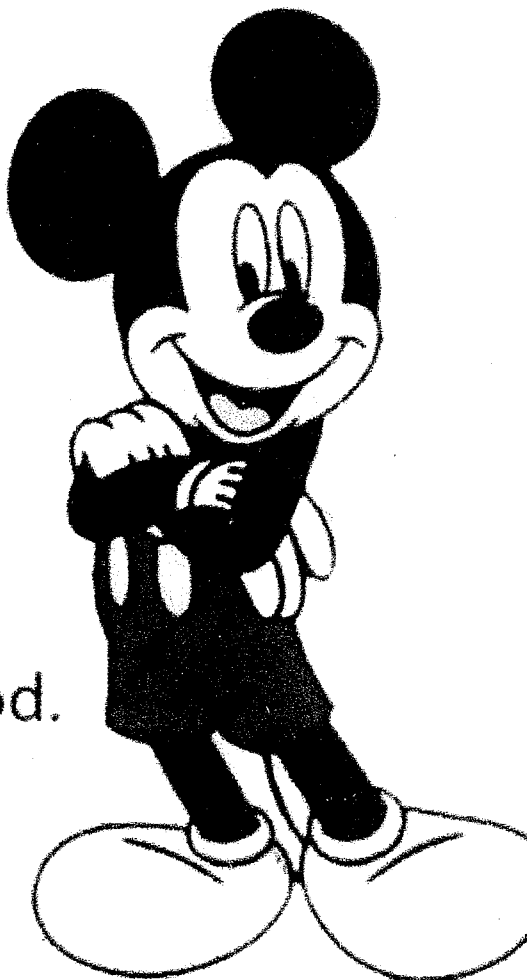

## North Dakota Community Foundation Grants \$12.9 Million in 2024

Bismarck, North Dakota . . . The North Dakota Community Foundation (NDCF) has announced that it awarded more than \$12.9 million in grants and charitable program expenses in 2024. The organization was founded in 1976 to improve the quality of life of North Dakotans through charitable giving and promoting philanthropy.

NDCF currently manages more than 1,000 charitable funds, including 69 local community foundations in the state and over 200 scholarship funds for North Dakota students. It also administers organizational endowment funds, donor-advised funds, school foundations, and special interest funds for individuals and nonprofit organizations across North Dakota.

Most of NDCF's assets

are in endowment funds, providing permanent grant dollars to North Dakota communities, schools, and nonprofit organizations. The organization has awarded more than \$121 million in grants and charitable program expenses since its inception. NDCF has offices in Bismarck, Larimore, Dickinson, and Wahpeton, North Dakota.

Some of the community foundations at NDCF in this area of the state are the

- Golden Valley County Community Foundation
- Killdeer Area Community Foundation
- Bowman & Slope County Community Foundation
- New England Area Community Foundation
- Mott-Regent Community Foundation
- Adams County Community Foundation
- Dickinson Area Community Foundation

The Golden Valley County Community Foundation was established in 2008 and had assets at the end of 2024 of \$256,424. The fund has awarded 43 grants, totaling more than \$139,000, which includes \$100,000 of grant dollars provided by Grid United's North Plains Connector project. Grantees have included over the years the Golden Valley County Fair Board, Community Ambulance Service, the Golva Rural Fire Protection District, the Golden Valley Historical Society and the City of Beach for the hiking trail and baseball field improvements.

The Killdeer Area Community Foundation was established in 2012 and had assets at the end of 2024 of \$218,503. The fund has awarded eight grants so far, totaling more than \$17,000. Grantees have included Dunn County Social Services, the Hill Top Heritage Foundation, the Dunn County Historical Society, the Grassy Butte Quick Response Unit, and the Dunn County Food Pantry.

The Bowman & Slope County Community Foundation was established in 2014 and ended 2024 with \$391,265 in total assets. It has awarded 46 grants to date, totaling more than \$340,000, which includes over \$208,000 in grant dollars provided by Grid United's North Plains Connector project. Grantees have included the Amidon Community Cupboard, Bowman Parks & Recreation, the Scranton Quick Response Unit, Southwest Healthcare Services, Bowman Regional Public Library, the Slope Farmers Fair Association, and Hope and Healing Therapeutic Riding.

The New England Community Foundation had \$179,698 in assets in 2024, which includes assets from the Ishmael & Rose Diede Fund for New England. It has awarded 37 grants totaling over \$178,000, which includes \$117,000 in grant dollars provided by Grid United's North Plains Connector project. Grantees have included New England Public Schools, the New England Community Renovation Project, the New England Community Grocery Store, Hettinger County 4-H Council, the Open Door Food Pantry, and the New

England Theatrical Arts Committee.

The Mott-Regent Community Foundation has assets of \$176,287 at the end of 2024, which includes assets from the Ishmael & Rose Diede Fund for Mott-Regent. It has awarded 67 grants totaling more than \$239,000 since its inception, which includes over \$170,000 in grant dollars from the Grid United North Plains Connector project. Grantees have included the Mott Food Pantry, the Hettinger County Historical Society, Playhouse Theatre, the Maercklein Conservation & Charitable Corporation, the Hettinger County Sheriff's Office K9 program, the Mott Gallery of History and Art, and the Fire Protection Districts of both communities.

The Adams County Community Foundation had \$195,521 in assets at the end of 2024. It has awarded 11 grants since its inception in 2015, totaling more than \$11,000. Grantees have included Adams County Social Services, the Hettinger Golf Association, Dakota Prairie Helping Hands, Hettinger Public School and the Adams County Food Pantry.

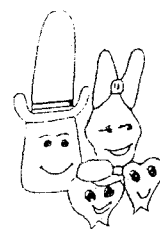
The Dickinson Area Community Foundation was established in 2016 and ended 2024 with \$548,291 in net assets in its endowment fund. It has awarded 36 grants totaling over

\$120,000 since its inception, which includes grants from its non-endowed fund. There are several other project-specific funds at NDCF for the Dickinson area, including the Town Square Dickinson Endowment and Non-endowment Funds, the Friendship Park Endowment and Non-endowment Funds, the Dickinson Rotary Charitable Endowment Fund, and the United Way of Dickinson's Endowment Fund.

All of NDCF's community endowment funds are guided by advisory committees made up of local volunteers who are responsible for fundraising to help grow their endowment fund and who recommend grant awards every year. All gifts to community endowment funds are tax deductible. In addition, individuals who donate at least \$5,000 and businesses that donate any amount to a community endowment fund at NDCF may be eligible for the 40% ND state tax credit.



## Thoughts for the Week

Did a little traveling this last week to show some out of town friends some special places in North Dakota. The plan was to pick them up and do a bit of a circle before coming back to Mott. We started in Bismarck and went north. It had been quite a while since we drove to the northern part of the state, and it's really something, if you don't do a lot of traveling, how much difference there is in parts of the state when you don't see it every day. We went from rolling plains, not really flat, but a lot of seeded ground, to some pretty wooded areas to some really 'badlands' terrain.

Our first stop was Rugby, which is listed as the geographical center of North America. The marker is made of stones and there is a plate designating it as such. It sits by itself in a parking lot and I guess it has it's fair share of visitors, but it's not located in any special park. We actually got a bit sidetracked as the biggest landmark was located in a park, which was a large metal sculpture and once we got close enough to see the plate, it was something called Northern Lights, and it was also marked as a Veterans Memorial location, which I didn't see much about that. After a good meal and a rest at a very nice motel in Rugby, we started out for our next destination.

Speaking of traveling, we did use the phone for GPS as it's the easiest way to find the best route, but it did bring to mind the way we used to travel. I remember having to pick up a map, plot your location and when one was driving, the other would navigate so that we would get on the proper road or maybe locate another way in case of road construction. That was always a bit of an adventure as the map would open

quite nicely, but was bulky to spread out and figure out where you wanted to go. Then when you wanted to fold it up again, it sometimes took a few minutes to figure out which fold went where and if you didn't have the patience of Job, you kind of crammed it together so it would fit in the glove compartment. Being one of those people that gets frustrated if it isn't put back the right way, there were always a few words exchanged on the situation before I accomplished it. We also purchased a Garmin after a while, but not always updated it, or maybe those streets were not always mapped, so there were a few times where it wanted us to drive into a field instead of a road, so that could be frustrating in it's own way. Nowadays, with navigation imbedded in the newer vehicles and of course the phones we have that Google provides maps, it's quite a bit easier to get from point A to wherever you want to go. Sure saves a lot in arguments.

The next destination we had was the International Peace Gardens. In case you want to make the trip, you need to make sure you have a passport or your birth certificate along with your id. It's not necessary to have it to get into the park, but in order to leave it, you have to go through Customs. If you don't have it, you may have to have a long discussion with the people there and it will be a problem as you actually leave the Country so you have to be able to prove citizenship in order to get back. They were very nice, and as long as you follow directions and don't try to pull some kind of trick on them, its a breeze. The International Peace Gardens are quite beautiful, and if you have never been, it is a sight to see. If you have been there, you need to know that the designs change every year in a lot of the garden, so what you saw before is most probably different. It does take some time

to get through the garden, so be prepared to walk, so good shoes are a necessity. If you need a little assistance, they do provide wheelchairs for use, so just ask. There is also an indoor display

that is very unusual, as it is a desert area, with plants that are very spiky. The variety of these plants are amazing and come from many areas of the world, so if you think it's only cacti from the US, it's not. Succulants and varieties in many colors are displayed, so it's very interesting to see. It's very warm in the room, so be prepared as your comfort may be stretched a bit, but well worth it to tour.

I will try to continue this in my next article as there were a few more sights that we went to, but the whole point is to tell you that ND is not just our flat plains, but varied and each is beautiful in it's own way. If you are looking for something to do for not a lot of money, consider a trip around the state that you live in. You may be surprised at what you see. God Bless you all.

1 package (16 ounces) miniature smoked sausage links

2 cups frozen cut green beans  
2 cups frozen lima beans  
1/2 cup packed brown sugar  
1/2 cup thinly sliced fresh carrots  
1/2 cup chopped onion  
1/2 cup ketchup  
1 tablespoon cider vinegar  
1 teaspoon prepared mustard
