**New Splash Pad and Park Opening Soon at Bowman Rotary Park**

Bowman Rotary Park will be the new home of a splash pad and playground, designed to provide enjoyment for children of all ages. The playground, tailored for children aged 1-5, complements the existing equipment for ages 7-12. Additionally, the new splash pad features 28 water attractions

suitable for kids of all ages.

The grand opening is anticipated for mid-July, when both playgrounds will be ready for use.

This project was a collaborative effort among Brosz Engineering, Inc., School of Promise, and Bowman Parks and Recreation. By integrating the wet and dry playgrounds, the projects shared resources and labor. Following the concrete pour in early June, the community eagerly anticipates the final stages: applying an anti-slip

coating and pouring a soft protective surface under the playground equipment. The concrete must cure for a minimum of 28 days before these layers can be added.

The splash pad began as part of the 2020 Bowman County Community Challenge, initiated by Brosz Engineering, Inc. Since then, the project has grown significantly, thanks to numerous donations and grants. Key contributors to the splash pad include Brosz Engineering, Inc., Bowman County Develop-

ment Corporation, North Dakota Parks Grant, City of Bowman, Bowman County, Apex Clean Energy, Dakota Western Bank, and Dakota Community Bank and Trust.

The dry playground project was funded by private donations to the School of Promise, designated for a new playground upon their closing. Major contributors to the dry playground include the School of Promise through its generous donors and Bowman Tax and Tourism.

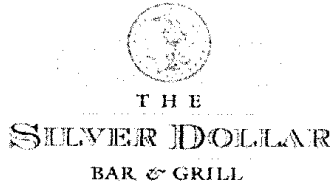

## Three Kids Find Rare Juvenile T. Rex Fossil Now on Display at the Denver Museum of Nature & Science

DENVER (June 4, 2024) — The Denver Museum of Nature & Science announces the incredible discovery and display of a juvenile T. rex fossil in its new temporary experience, "Discovering Teen Rex" opening to the public on June 21, at 1:30 p.m. What started as a family hike in North Dakota by two young brothers, Jessin and Liam Fisher, their dad, Sam Fisher, and their cousin, Kaiden Madsen, turned into a significant moment for science as only a handful of juvenile T. rex skeletons have ever been found. "I'm excited for Museum guests to dig into the "Teen Rex Discovery" experience, which I think will inspire the imagination and wonder, not only our community, but around the world!"

This remarkable story was captured on film and featured in the new 40-minute documentary "T. REX," showing on the Museum's giant-screen Infinity Theater on June 21. ## AARP Awards Grant to Bowman Theater as Part of Nationwide Program to Make Communities More Livable

They will also install additional sound equipment, including speakers and microphones, so this same community may attend other events (presentations, concerts, etc.), without fear of not being able to hear. The execution of this grant will allow so many more community members to once again return to the theater for a movie or to enjoy countless other events.

President Walker says, "When my family took on trying to keep the theater open at the end of 2021, one of the first and most frequent things we heard was older community members expressing how much they wished they could still come see a movie, but they just could not hear it anymore. This is the generation that really built the foundation for movie theaters to once be such a successful business opportunity. Now, most small community theaters are community owned or nonprofits due to movies being so accessible from home and families being so busy now. From day one, we wanted to make the theater

a place that the generation that built it could enjoy once again. With AARP's help, we are extremely grateful and blessed to be able to bring that dream to fruition."

This year, AARP awarded three different grant opportunities, including flagship grants, capacity-building microgrants for improving walkability, bikeability and accessible home modifications, and demonstration grants that focus on equitable engagement to reconnect communities, housing choice design competitions and improving digital connections to endure disasters.

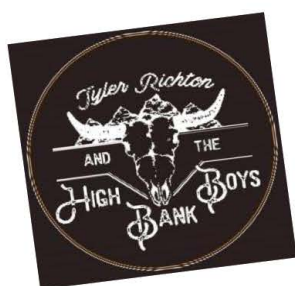

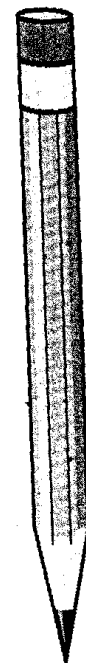

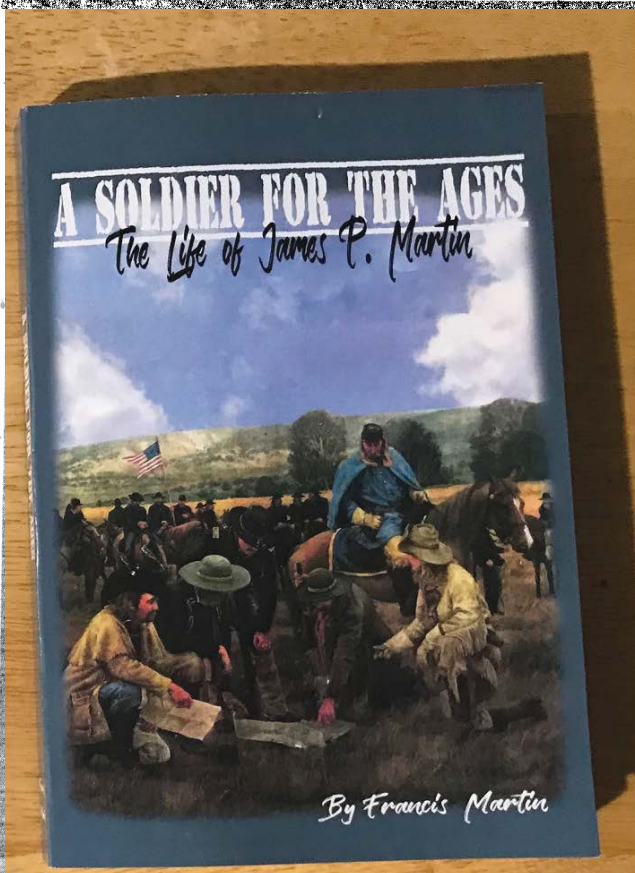

**SOLDIER FOR THE AGES**

Continued from last week

After talking this over with James' parents and her brother, she decided to take them to court. Cause of death unknown. The lawyer had argued (pro bono) "How could he escape into a new life when his only way to travel was on a horse? None of the farm vehicles were missing. No car thefts had been reported in that area for ages." The court handed down a decision. The cause of death was 'UNKNOWN.'

through the door and tackled Shorty around his knees. Shorty grabbed him around his waist and held him upside down until he yelled, UNCLE.

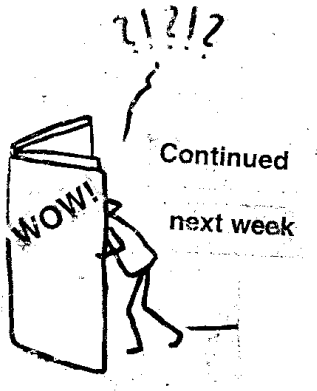
She wasn't fooled. "What you mean is let's go through Montana and visit Custer's Last Stand. Right?"



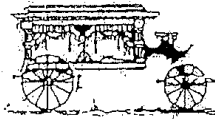

**Reflections on the Words of Life**

Last time we began considering 1 Peter 1:3: "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." We saw that praise is a necessary response for believers when we consider the greatness of God's mercy toward us. The payment for believers' sins was absorbed in full by Christ, but the Savior's work on the cross did more than cancel sin's debt for God's people. It also purchased an infinite ocean of grace for them.

We might look at it in this way: Man's sin was like a huge dam built over Niagara Falls which prevented any water of God's blessing from flowing to sinners. But that dam is removed in Jesus Christ, and now the water of God's grace can come with full force into the believer's life. God's mercy is abundant, and He is unlimited in His capacity to bless. A person with small resources and abilities can bestow only small blessings. But God is infinite in resources and abilities and has no limit to His ability to bless.

The first of these abundant blessings which Peter mentions here is the new birth. Peter says that God's abundant mercy "has begotten us again." We rarely use the word "begotten" in contemporary English. The Greek word that is used here means "to cause to be born again." In theology this is referred to as "regeneration." It is a very important truth of Scripture which we must seek to understand.

The believer in Christ has two births. The first birth is physical and causes us to inherit the nature of our forefather Adam. The nature we inherit from Adam is sinful and is the cause of all that is sinful in our lives. But the second birth is a spiritual birth. In this birth we inherit the

nature of the second Adam, the Lord Jesus. This, just like our physical birth, is a work of God. No one decides to be born. God causes it to happen. In the same way, no one decides to be born again. God causes it to happen. John puts it this way in John 1:12-13: "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God."

You may have heard people say, "When you believe on Jesus Christ as your Savior, you are born again." That statement is not accurate; it puts the cart before the horse. Believing in Christ is not the cause of being born again, but is the result of it. How do we know this? We know it because the Bible says that every single person comes into this world spiritually dead (Ephesians 2:1-10). A spiritually dead person cannot do anything requiring spiritual life any more than a physically dead person can do anything requiring physical life. Death means total incapability. No one can have faith in Jesus until God first does something in that person to make him or her alive spiritually. In the new birth, the Holy Spirit causes those who were spiritually dead to suddenly become alive toward God. Then, once they have been made alive, they can understand and believe the gospel.

Lord willing, we shall see more about regeneration next time. But I leave you with the question, "Have you been born again?" Has God shown you that you are a sinner who needs a Savior, and have you placed your trust in Christ alone to make you right with God? Please be sure. This is the most important issue in life.

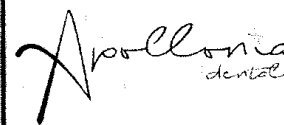

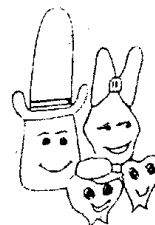



Her opinion, which of course she is entitled to, is that when the word female is used, it diminishes a woman and indicates that she is lesser than a male. This is quite typical of the current climate of the world. I wonder how we got this far away from common sense!

Unfortunately, I would think that talk like this makes it worse for us and not better. For whatever reason, instead of being proud of what we are in this world and striving to be the best person that we can, we are deferring to people who not only share their opinion but have decided their opinion is the only opinion. Where did the opinion go that we can be whatever we want to be as long as we have the desire and the fortitude to work for that goal? It was proven during WWII that a woman can do whatever she desires and needs to do, since when there was a lack of men to do jobs that were considered 'men's work' they accomplished the job and many excelled at it.

If we go back far enough, it was thought that the only job that a woman was capable of doing was to take care of a house, sometimes a whole farm, the husband and have children on the side. Men were considered the breadwinners and they were the ones that did all the jobs outside the home. It was decided that women, by men, that due to their fragile personality and lack of intellect they could not handle anything else. However, they were the ones in the home that had to take whatever money was brought in, decide how it should be spent and have to feed and clothe the household on that money. Unfortunately this was not considered a job. This also did not take into consideration the women that lost their husbands and had to support and raise a family on a farm. Obviously women did a lot that was not considered actual work.

After the war, things began to slowly change as women were no longer content to sit in the house and rely on a man to take care of them. They began to step up and demand that they be considered for all kinds of jobs and once they had proved that they could do the job, it was found that some women were actually better at some jobs than men were. Since they are gen-

erally more detail orientated and have a better hand for fine detail work, they quickly found themselves jobs. However, since they were not the head of the household, they were often paid a lesser wage for the same job as a man. This was true even if they were the only breadwinner of the family as it was not acceptable in society, so employers often were able to reconcile their pay scale because of that.

Over the years, this has changed with men doing jobs that were generally considered female jobs and women taking jobs considered male jobs. Not everything is equal in pay in many cases but is much closer than it used to be. What it should be based on is merit, not what you are but what you can do and what you accomplish in the job. Good work should be rewarded with good pay, so putting your best foot forward and doing the best job that you can no matter the job should be a goal of every employee. Just putting in the hours with the least amount of work that you can do, no matter who you are is not showing anything to anyone.
