



Reflections on the Words of Life

By Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We saw last time how King Belshazzar was transformed from an arrogant blasphemer of the living God, to a terrified, weak man desperately trying to learn the meaning of the handwriting that had appeared on the wall. He turned to the astrologers and soothsayers in his kingdom for answers, but once again we see the failure of the world's wisdom. Revelation from God was foreign to these magicians. Their magic and astrology were useless. 1 Corinthians 2:14: "But a natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God; for they are foolishness to him, and he cannot

inderstand them, because they are spiritually appraised."

In Daniel 5:9, we see the despair of the ungodly: "Then King Belshazzar was greatly alarmed, his face grew even paler, and his nobles were perplexed." The "great people" of Babylon have no answers, no hope, and can only sit in terror and alarm. The revelry of their drinking party is over.

This scene is a fulfillment of the warning of Isaiah, who prophesied the ultimate humiliation of Babylon in Isaiah 47:10-11, "And you felt secure in your wickedness and said, 'No one sees me,' your wisdom and your knowledge, they have deluded you; for you have said in your heart, 'I am, and there is no one besides me.' But evil will come on you which you will not know how to charm away; and disas-

ter will fall on you for which you cannot atone, and destruction about which you do not know will come on you suddenly."

What we have seen here about Belshazzar is in stark contrast to what we find about Daniel in verses 10-12. Interestingly, this testimony comes from an unlikely source, the queen mother: "The queen entered the banquet hall because of the words of the king and his nobles; the queen spoke and said, "O king, live forever! Do not let your thoughts alarm you or your face be pale. There is a man in your kingdom in whom is a spirit of the holy gods; and in the days of your father, illumination, insight, and wisdom like the wisdom of the gods were found in him. And King Nebuchadnezzar, your father, your father the king, appointed him chief of the magicians, conjurers, Chaldeans, and diviners. This was because an extraordinary spirit, knowledge and insight, interpretation of dreams, explanation of enigmas, and solving of difficult problems were found in this Daniel, whom the king named Belteshazzar. Let Daniel now be summoned, and he will declare the interpretation."

Daniel, who at one time was a very highly esteemed man in Babylon, had been largely forgotten. But there is one woman who remembers his great deeds. She refers to Daniel here in typical heathen fashion, as one "in whom is a spirit of the holy gods." Not knowing the true God herself, she does not realize that it is the Holy Spirit who indwells Daniel. Yet, what comes through to her is the fact that Daniel is different, that

Friends, the queen could not describe Daniel in Biblical language, but she saw the qualities of Christ in him. She saw his godliness, integrity, and humility. Oh, may this cause those of us who are believers in Christ to pause and consider whether those around us see something of the character of Jesus Christ in our lives. May God enable us to let our lights so shine before men, that glory will be given to God. He wants those who represent Him to tell others about Him. Like Daniel, we can warn the world of coming judgment. But we can also point people to the only One who can deliver them from judgment. We can tell them how Jesus humbled Himself and came to pay the ransom price to redeem us from our sins. We can tell them that if they will believe on Him, they too can have everlasting life.
