Spiritual Life

I recently read an article on Dietrich von Hildebrand's 5 categories of spiritual life. It was fascinating as he described the categories how relatable they are in our lives. We all know people who fall into each category. As you read, reflect upon those people and honestly ask the question, "Which of these categories honestly describes my spiritual life?"

The first category Von Hildebrand introduces the denier of the spiritual universe. This person knows only what the physical world can teach him. He may have a moral code, but only in as much as it benefits his survival and well-being. His primary goal in life is to eat, drink, and be merry.

The second category is the acceptor of the spiritual universe but only to his own utilitarian benefit. This man says, I believe in God so much as it benefits me. My eternal salvation is on the line, so I'll do good only to gain this prize, not out of love for my Lord. I dodge the crosses I receive. I give to the poor only from my excess. I pray with my lips, but not my heart. Jesus loves me, so clearly He wants me to be comfortable all the days of my life.

The third is the man who accepts the spiritual universe and believes that he has attained perfection already. The man successfully reasons that his very existence is contingent upon God's power and focuses all his energy on bathing himself in God's perfect light. He spends 11 hours a day in prayer and publicizes his spiritual insights to all the pagans on social media when he is on his bathroom breaks. He's memorized the Summa and reads three books on Christian spirituality per week. Like osmosis, this man's constant contact with perfection makes him believe he is perfect, saying like the Pharisee to the tax collector in Luke's Gospel, "'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity-greedy, dishonest, adulterous-or even like this tax collector" (Lk 18:11).

The fourth man is an interesting case. He accepts the spiritual universe as well as the physical world that surrounds him. He has a moral code and a quasi-understanding of metaphysics. But instead of accepting his limitations as a human, he allows the natural to be a direct translation of his spiritual favor. This man puts the cart before the horse. His natural state dictates his spirituality. Only Christ can dictate such things. A man like this cannot transform himself into Christ for he has already filled himself with his own nature-there's no room for Je-

There is a final contestant. He is fully aware of his imperfections and strives to limit any and all imbibing of sins that keep him inebriated. He knows this is impossible and calls upon the Lord to take his human nature

and replace it with the divine, to fill him with the life-giving water of mercy, God's forgiveness the elixir of true spiritual perfection. He hungers for holiness. empties himself, and lets God replace his earthly drunkenness with holy sobriety, "satisfying his longing, good measure, and flowing over" (Divine Office). He knows he is human, but he also knows he is destined to become like God, a partaker in the divine nature (2 Peter 1:4). This holy man knows that "Only by developing along the proper lines in the framework of earthly life can [he] mature for eternity" (Von Hildebrand, Transformation in Christ, Holy Sobriety, p.472). He "relies more on factual evidence than on inner voices and feelings" (VH 476). And he "is free from the obsession that his needs must be something unique and extraordinary... (VH 477)

Hopefully at this point, you can see people in your lives who fall into each category. You also recognize your own spiritual life in these categories. Spiritual life, and God, are essential in the Christian life and knowing our faults, helps us to see him more. We must turn to him as the person in the 5th category does. The others are creating an illusion which is not reality. My encouragement is to ask God for the grace needed to grow in your spiritual life to the point of knowing human weakness, and the greatness of God. Know of my continued prayers.







Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Today we continue our consideration of 1 Peter 1:2: "Elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace be multiplied." Let us recall that Peter is teaching us that God will see to it that certain things inevitably result in the lives of those He has chosen. The first, as we have seen, is sanctification of the Spirit. The point at which we resume today shows us another: As a result of God's election, believers will be led to obedience.

Obedience here refers primarily to obedience to the truth. We can see that if we look ahead at 1 Peter 1:22: "Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart." The expression "obeying the truth" is very important for us to understand; it refers to believing the gospel and the teachings of God's Word. Paul brings out the same concept in Galatians

3:1-2: "O foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you that you should not obey the truth, before whose eyes Jesus Christ was clearly portrayed among you as crucified? This only I want to learn from you: Did you receive the Spirit by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith?" Here Paul is rebuking the Galatians because some of them were turning away from reliance upon simple faith in Christ to works of the law in order to be saved. Paul describes their turning away from simple faith as "not obeying the truth." In other words, "obeying the truth" is used as a synonym for believing the gospel.


The point that both Peter and Paul are making is simply this: As far as God is concerned, the most important act of obedience is for a person to believe the gospel of His Son. People are always wanting to turn salvation into something which they can earn or contribute to by what they do. But in the Bible, it is always the other way around. The Bible teaches us that a person must be saved BEFORE he or she can do anything that pleases God. The Lord Jesus Himself made this same point. Some who had followed Him asked the question recorded in John 6:28: "What shall we do, that we may work the works of God?" Jesus answered them by saying, "This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He sent.'

abundantly clear in Scripture. Because all people are sinners, we cannot in our natural condition produce anything that is pleasing in God's sight. We read in Romans 3:10-12, "As it is written: 'There is none righteous, no, not one; There is none who understands; There is none who seeks after God. They have all turned aside; They have together become unprofitable; There is none who does good, no, not one." In God's eyes, nothing that an unbeliever does is acceptable to Him because it is all tainted with sin. What we as sinners need most is something that only God can do for us. We need a Savior first of all to pay the price for all our sins. And secondly, we need a Savior to give to us a righteousness which can make us acceptable to God. The Lord Jesus is the only One who can do these things. And the only way that anyone receives these two gifts from Him is by totally abandoning all hope in himself and his own works and by trusting completely in what Jesus has done for him in His death on the cross. Friends, is this true of you?


