It is once again time to remind all residents *it is an infraction of Bowman City Ordinance 3.0201.1 to blow GRASS CLIPPINGS* into the street. The mowing, raking or placement of grass clippings, leaves or other vegetation onto the street or other drainage into the city storm sewer system is **prohibited**. If heavy rains occur, buildup of the clippings in the sewers restrict the flow of water and can cause flooding in the storm sewer locations. Infractions can result in fines not less than \$25 up to \$500.



Mott Moving Forward With Plans For A Basic Care Nursing Facility

Since Sanford's gifting of the Mott Nursing Home back to the community, the Mott Health Care Center board and the community have been grappling with options on how to best utilize the facility. A survey was recently conducted to get input from the community. The survey asked five basic questions and allowed for additional comments to be made. Overall, 125 surveys were returned, mostly from the Mott community. The age of the respondents was relatively evenly distributed amongst the five age groups. The 18-30 and the 46-60 age groups had the lowest response rate. The other three groups each had 26 percent of the responses.

Utilizing the facility as a Basic Care Nursing Home, or some combination of Basic Care and other services, is the preferred use for the building. Those two answers had a combined 76 percent response rate. The remaining three response options each received less than 10 percent of the vote.

facility, 45 percent indicated that they would support it through monetary donations. Another 34 percent selected becoming a volunteer.

The question about when an individual would be interested in becoming a resident received mixed responses. Only 10 individuals responded that they would be interested in becoming a resident in one to five years. However, 28 people responded that they have a family member that may become a resident in zero to seven years.

The respondents overwhelmingly stated at 88 percent that their support for a Basic Care Nursing Home will not change whether it is community owned and operated or operated by a different health care provider.

The survey responses revealed one major misconception about the funding for the facility. None of the expenses that have been paid were paid with taxpayer money. The bills were paid with money that Sanford gave to the city when Sanford closed the facility. That pool of funding is available to assist in re-opening the facility.

The Mott Health Care Center board is moving forward with

the primary goal of having the Mott Clinic relocate to the north wing of the nursing home building. West River Health Services has signed the agreement to lease. The \$1.2 million grant to complete the renovations has been signed. The project is expected to go out on bids soon. Because the clinic is moving into the north wing, the Diocese of Bismarck is no longer interested in utilizing the rest of the building.

Based on the feedback from the survey, the Mott Health Care Center board has agreed to move forward with the plan to re-open the remaining two wings as a Basic Care Nursing Home. The next steps in the pro-

cess include filing an application with the State of North Dakota, hiring an administrator, creating policies and procedures, and requesting donations to help with opening the facility. The goal of the group is to have the facility accepting residents in 90 to 120 days.

Mott has a long history of having a nursing home. The board has been told numerous times by state officials and others that we have a nice facility. The community has been extremely generous with their time, talents, and money to support Good Samaritan and Sanford. The continued operation of a nursing home in Mott will be no different.

Expressions of HOPE



Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

In our last study we considered the shameful attitude of Jonah, resenting the fact that God showed mercy to the pagan Ninevites and relented from bringing judgment upon them. In the verse before us today, we see that he descends even further in his complaint and self-pity: "Therefore now, O LORD, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live!" (Jonah 4:3). Now we know that for the Christian, death is better. As the apostle Paul says in Philippians 1:21-23, "For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain. But if I live on in the flesh, this will mean fruit from my labor; yet what I shall choose I cannot tell. For I am hard pressed between the two, having a desire to depart and be with Christ, which is far better." But Paul's conviction expressed in these verses is not the mindset of Jonah at this point. Jonah is thinking only of how unhappy he is that God has given grace to the Ninevites.

The Israelites, God's chosen people, had not repented of their disobedience to His Law, though for many decades God had faithfully been sending

them prophets who called them to repentance. In stark contrast, the wicked Ninevites repented in a day after hearing Jonah's warning, and Jonah can see the handwriting on the wall. He can see that God is extending His blessings to the Gentile nations, and he doesn't like it. How differently would he have done things if he were God! And because he is utterly out of tune with God, he is now of all men most miserable. It is both ironic and tragic that the reason for Jonah's discontent and misery is the GOODNESS of God, which he himself had so recently experienced so dramatically in being delivered from a watery grave.

Friends, we can be very thankful that God does not answer every prayer in the affirmative—particularly one like this exceedingly foolish prayer of Jonah's. How often do we see or hear of people who, like Jonah, think that death is the answer to their problems. Perhaps they have been deceived into thinking that death means ceasing to exist. But God's Word tells us very differently. Death brings a person immediately into the presence of God. And if that person has not made peace with God by trusting only in Christ's payment for sin, then the suffering that was experienced in this life is far preferable to the suf-

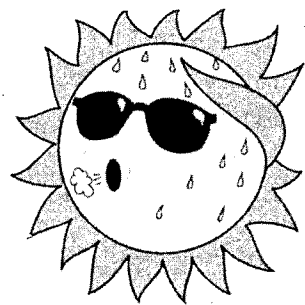

Expansion of the Homestead Tax Credit for 2023

Mott, N.D. (June 7, 2023): On April 27, 2023, Governor Doug Burgum signed House Bill 1158 into law. This legislation broadens the eligibility requirements and maximum reduction amounts for those applying for the North Dakota Homestead Property Tax Credit program. This program is aimed at homeowners 65 years of age and older or those who are permanently and totally disabled.

Income changes to the Homestead Credit for Tax Year 2023:

If your income is:	Taxable value is reduced by:	Maximum reduction of taxable value:	Maximum reduction of true & full value:
\$0 - \$40,000	100%	\$9,000	\$200,000
\$40,001 - \$70,000	50%	\$4,500	\$100,000

The credit does not reduce the liability of any person for special assessments levied upon any property.

With this new legislation, the asset limit of \$500,000 has been removed. Applications must be submitted yearly for approval.

If an individual has already applied for the credit this year, the application will be adjusted to reflect the new percentages.

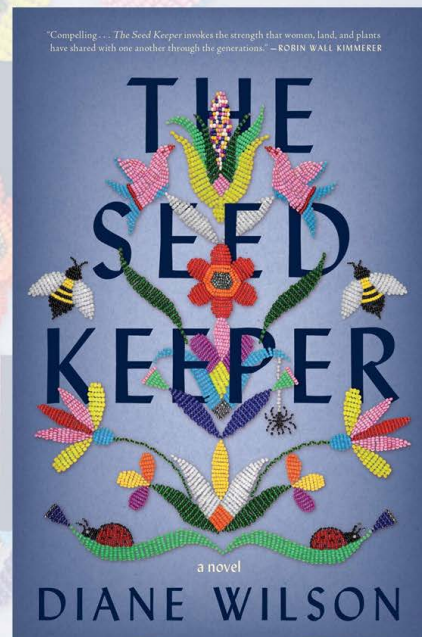

Cloud Seeding Operations Summary
June 1-4, 2023

BISMARCK, N.D. – The 2023 North Dakota Cloud Modification Project (NDCMP) began operations for the season on June 1. Overall, the southwestern corner of North Dakota received one-half to one inch of rain last week during an active period of showers and thunderstorms.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, aircraft conducted four total flights last week including three seeding flights and one flight for re-positioning.

Hot weather continues this week for southwestern North Dakota and daytime highs should soar into the 80s and 90s. The main chances for thunderstorms and precipitation are expected Friday into the upcoming week-end when an upper-level trough could begin breaking down the persistent high-pressure ridge and cooling high temperatures into the mid 70s.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at <http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb>. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.

What Is All the BUZZ About?

THREE-FOURTHS OF THE WORLD'S FLOWERING PLANTS AND ABOUT 35 PERCENT OF THE WORLD'S FOOD CROPS DEPEND ON ANIMAL POLLINATORS TO REPRODUCE. MORE THAN 3,500 SPECIES OF NATIVE BEES HELP INCREASE CROP YIELDS. SOME SCIENTISTS ESTIMATE THAT ONE OUT OF EVERY THREE BITES OF FOOD WE EAT EXISTS BECAUSE OF ANIMAL POLLINATORS LIKE BEES, BUTTERFLIES AND MOTHS, BIRDS AND BATS, AND BEETLES AND OTHER INSECTS.



BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES TO ATTRACT AND PROTECT POLLINATORS.

- PLANT NATIVE AND OTHER WELL-ADAPTED FLOWERING PLANTS FOR SEASONLONG BLOOM IN OR NEAR THE GARDEN.
- CREATE NESTING HABITAT FOR GROUND AND CAVITY-NESTING BEES.
- DO NOT SPRAY INSECTICIDES OR FUNGICIDES ON FLOWERING PLANTS OR FRUIT TREES JUST BEFORE BLOOM.
- IF PESTICIDE APPLICATIONS ARE NECESSARY CHOOSE A PRODUCT WITH THE LEAST TOXICITY TO BEES.

HOW TO BUILD A POLLINATOR GARDEN WRITTEN BY MARA KOENIG

WE AT THE U.S. FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE KNOW THAT POLLINATORS ARE THE ENGINE THAT RUN HEALTHY HABITATS. WHILE WE'VE BEEN ACTIVELY WORKING TO RESTORE AND CONSERVE MILLIONS OF ACRES OF LAND, WE NEED YOUR HELP. WHETHER YOU HAVE A FEW FEET ON YOUR APARTMENT BALCONY, A YARD IN NEED OF LANDSCAPING OR SEVERAL ACRES, YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE. FOLLOW THIS EASY STEP BY STEP GUIDE TO BUILD YOUR OWN POLLINATOR GARDEN AND HELP ENSURE THE FUTURE IS FILLED WITH POLLINATORS.

PLANNING YOUR GARDEN
CAREFUL PLANNING IS ESSENTIAL TO CREATING A SUCCESSFUL POLLINATOR GARDEN. FOLLOW THESE EASY STEPS TO MAKE SURE YOU HAVE EVERYTHING COVERED BEFORE YOU MAKE YOUR INVESTMENT.

CHOOSING YOUR LOCATION
WHILE FLOWERING PLANTS CAN GROW IN BOTH SHADY AND SUNNY LOCATIONS, CONSIDER YOUR AUDIENCE. BUTTERFLIES AND OTHER POLLINATORS LIKE TO BASK IN THE SUN AND SOME OF THEIR FAVORITE WILDFLOWERS GROW BEST IN FULL OR PARTIAL SUN WITH SOME PROTECTION FROM THE WIND.

IDENTIFYING SOIL TYPE AND SUNLIGHT
TAKE A LOOK AT YOUR SOIL - IS IT SANDY AND WELL-DRAINED OR MORE CLAY-LIKE AND WET? YOU CAN TURN OVER A TEST PATCH OR CHECK OUT THE SOIL MAPPER FOR YOUR COUNTY TO LEARN MORE. YOUR SOIL TYPE AND THE AMOUNT OF SUNLIGHT IT GETS WILL HELP DETERMINE THE KINDS OF PLANTS YOU CAN GROW.

CHOOSING YOUR PLANTS
RESEARCH WHICH VARIETIES OF MILKWEED AND WILDFLOWERS ARE NATIVE TO YOUR AREA AND DO WELL IN YOUR SOIL AND SUNLIGHT CONDITIONS. NATIVE PLANTS ARE THE IDEAL CHOICE, BECAUSE THEY REQUIRE LESS MAINTENANCE AND TEND TO BE HEARTIER. FIND A NURSERY THAT SPECIALIZES IN NATIVE PLANTS NEAR YOU - THEY'LL BE FAMILIAR WITH PLANTS THAT ARE MEANT TO THRIVE IN YOUR PART OF THE COUNTRY. IT'S ESSENTIAL TO CHOOSE PLANTS THAT HAVE NOT BEEN TREATED WITH PESTICIDES, INSECTICIDES OR NEONICOTINOID. YOU'LL ALSO WANT TO FOCUS ON SELECTING PERENNIALS TO ENSURE YOUR PLANTS COME BACK EACH YEAR AND DON'T REQUIRE A LOT OF MAINTENANCE.

REMEMBER TO THINK ABOUT MORE THAN JUST THE SUMMER GROWING SEASON. POLLINATORS NEED NECTAR EARLY IN THE SPRING, THROUGHOUT THE SUMMER AND EVEN INTO THE FALL. CHOOSING PLANTS THAT BLOOM AT DIFFERENT TIMES WILL HELP YOU CREATE A BRIGHT AND COLORFUL GARDEN THAT BOTH YOU AND POLLINATORS WILL LOVE FOR MONTHS!

SEEDS VS. PLANTS
ONCE YOU'VE IDENTIFIED YOUR PLANT SPECIES, YOU'LL NEED TO DECIDE WHETHER TO USE SEEDS OR START WITH SMALL PLANTS. WHILE BOTH ARE GOOD OPTIONS, YOUR CHOICE WILL DEPEND ON YOUR TIMELINE AND BUDGET. SEEDS ARE MORE ECONOMICAL, ESPECIALLY FOR LARGER GARDENS, BUT WILL REQUIRE MORE TIME. IF YOU'RE USING SEEDS, PLAN ON DISPERSING THEM THE FALL OR LATE WINTER AHEAD OF YOUR SUMMER GROWING SEASON. THIS GIVES THE SEEDS TIME TO GERMINATE. NURSERY-STARTED PLANTS COST MORE BUT WILL GENERALLY GIVE YOU A QUICK RETURN ON YOUR INVESTMENT AND BRING POLLINATORS INTO YOUR YARD DURING THE SAME GROWING SEASON.

PLANTING YOUR GARDEN

WHEN YOU'RE READY TO START PLANTING, YOU'LL NEED YOUR SEEDS OR PLANTS ALONG WITH ESSENTIALS LIKE GARDENING TOOLS TO BREAK THE SOIL AS WELL AS EXTRA SOIL OR COMPOST AND MULCH.

PREPPING YOUR GARDEN
IF YOU'RE CONVERTING AN EXISTING LAWN, YOU'LL NEED TO REMOVE GRASS AND CURRENT PLANT COVER AND TURN YOUR SOIL TO LOOSEN IT UP. IF YOU'RE PLANNING ON USING RAISED BEDS OR CONTAINERS, THERE ARE A LOT OF PRE-MADE OPTIONS AVAILABLE, AS WELL AS SIMPLE DESIGNS TO BUILD YOUR OWN. NO MATTER WHERE YOU DECIDE TO PLANT YOUR GARDEN, YOU'LL WANT TO ADD NUTRIENT-RICH COMPOST OR SOIL TO IMPROVE THE SUCCESS OF YOUR GARDEN.

PLANTING YOUR SEEDS OR FLOWERS
WHEN YOU'RE USING SEEDS, KEEP IN MIND THAT THEY WILL NEED TIME TO GERMINATE, SO FALL AND LATE WINTER ARE IDEAL TIMES TO GET STARTED. IN THE FALL, DISPERSE SEEDS AND COVER WITH SOIL. IN THE LATE WINTER, SCATTER SEEDS OVER THE SNOW. THE SUN WILL HEAT UP THE SEEDS AND HELP ANCHOR THEM INTO THE SNOW. THE MELTED SNOW PROVIDES MOISTURE THAT WILL HELP THE SEEDS GERMINATE.

IF YOU'RE STARTING WITH SMALL PLANTS, MAKE SURE YOU FOLLOW FROST GUIDANCE TO AVOID PUTTING YOUR PLANTS IN TOO EARLY. DIG HOLES JUST BIG ENOUGH FOR THE ROOT SYSTEM, THEN COVER AND REINFORCE THE ROOTS WITH SOIL OR COMPOST. ADD MULCH TO REDUCE WEED GROWTH.

WAIT, WATCH, WATER AND WEED
IT MAY TAKE SOME TIME, BUT YOU WILL EVENTUALLY SEE BUTTERFLIES AND OTHER POLLINATORS ENJOYING YOUR GARDEN. MAKE SURE TO WEED AND WATER YOUR GARDEN TO KEEP IT HEALTHY. KEEP IN MIND THAT IT MAY TAKE A COUPLE SEASONS FOR MILKWEED TO START PRODUCING FLOWERS.

NATIONAL POLLINATOR WEEK, JUNE 15-21

Planning your garden – think like a pollinator.

Go Native. Pollinators are "best" adapted to local, native plants, which often need less water than ornamentals.

Bee Bountiful. Plant big patches of each plant species for better foraging efficiency.

Bee Showy. Flowers should bloom in your garden throughout the growing season. Plant willow, violet, and mayapple for spring and aster, joe-pye weed and goldenrod for fall flowers.

Bee Patient. It takes time for native plants to grow and for pollinators to find your garden, especially if you live far from wild lands.

Bee Gentle. Most bees will avoid stinging and use that behavior only in self-defense. Male bees do not sting.

Bee Chemical Free. Pesticides and herbicides kill pollinators.

Bee Homey. Make small piles of branches to attract butterflies and moths. Provide hollow twigs, rotten logs with wood-boring beetle holes and bunchgrasses and leave stumps, old rodent burrows, and fallen plant material for nesting bees. Leave dead or dying trees for woodpeckers.

Bee Sunny. Provide areas with sunny, bare soil that's dry and well-drained, preferably with south-facing slopes.

Bee Friendly. Create pollinator-friendly gardens both at home, at schools and in public parks. Help people learn more about pollinators and native plants.

Bee Aware. Observe pollinators when you walk outside in nature. Notice which flowers attract bumble bees or solitary bees, and which attract butterflies.

Bee a little messy. Most of our native bee species (70%) nest underground so avoid using weed cloth or heavy mulch.

Bee Diverse. Plant a diversity of flowering species with abundant pollen and nectar and specific plants for feeding butterfly and moth caterpillars.

HERE ARE MANY FUN AND EASY WAYS TO DO THIS. FOR EXAMPLE:

- ENCOURAGE KIDS TO TAKE SHORTER SHOWERS
- TURN THE FAUCET OFF WHILE BRUSHING THEIR TEETH
- COLLECT RAINWATER IN A BARREL TO WATER PLANTS
- LET THEM HELP YOU WATER THE PLANTS, BUT MAKE SURE THEY DON'T OVERWATER THEM
- USE A BROOM INSTEAD OF A HOSE TO CLEAN DRIVEWAYS AND SIDEWALKS

FIVE WATER CONSERVATION ACTIVITIES FOR KIDS

#1 NATURE WALK

A FUN WAY TO TEACH KIDS ABOUT WATER CONSERVATION IS TO TAKE THEM ON A "NATURE WALK." FIND A NEARBY RIVER OR STREAM, AND EXPLORE ALL THE DIFFERENT CREATURES THAT RELY ON CLEAN WATER TO SURVIVE.

YOU'LL BE AMAZED AT THE VARIETY OF WILDLIFE THAT DEPENDS ON CLEAN WATER. AND, YOU'LL LEARN FIRSTHAND ABOUT THE IMPORTANCE OF CONSERVING THIS VALUABLE RESOURCE.

HELPING YOUR KIDS DEVELOP A RESPECT FOR NATURE IS A GREAT WAY TO ENCOURAGE THEM TO CONSERVE WATER.

#3 ENCOURAGE KIDS TO BE WATER DETECTIVES

HELP THEM TO LOOK FOR WAYS THAT WATER CAN BE SAVED AT HOME, SUCH AS FINDING A LEAKY FAUCET OR A RUNNING TOILET.

SHOW THEM HOW MUCH WATER IS WASTED WHEN THE FAUCET IS LEFT ON AND HELP THEM TO UNDERSTAND HOW MUCH OF AN IMPACT THOSE SMALL SAVINGS CAN HAVE.

BRAINSTORM OTHER WAYS TO SAVE WATER TOGETHER AND MAKE IT A GAME TO SEE WHO CAN COME UP WITH THE MOST CREATIVE IDEAS. BY TEACHING KIDS ABOUT WATER CONSERVATION, YOU CAN HELP THEM DEVELOP LIFELONG HABITS THAT WILL BENEFIT BOTH THEM AND THE PLANET.

#4 PLANT A DROUGHT RESISTANT GARDEN

IF YOUR KIDS ARE INTERESTED IN GARDENING, WHY NOT CREATE A SMALL PLOT IN YOUR YARD THAT IS JUST FOR THEM? HELP THEM PICK OUT NATIVE, DROUGHT-RESISTANT PLANTS THAT WILL DO WELL IN YOUR AREA. THEN SHOW THEM HOW TO WATER THE PLANTS AT THEIR ROOTS USING A WATERING CAN.

THEY CAN TEND TO THEIR PLANTS AND WATCH THEM GROW BIGGER ALL SEASON LONG! NOT ONLY WILL THEY HAVE FUN WATCHING THEIR PLANTS GROW, BUT THEY'LL ALSO LEARN ABOUT RESPONSIBILITY AND TAKING CARE OF LIVING THINGS.

#2 WATER CONSERVATION CHALLENGE

MOST OF US USE WATER EVERY DAY WITHOUT EVEN THINKING ABOUT IT. WE TURN ON THE FAUCET TO BRUSH OUR TEETH, TAKE A SHOWER, WASH OUR HANDS, AND FLUSH THE TOILET. BUT HAVE YOU EVER STOPPED TO THINK ABOUT HOW MUCH WATER YOU ACTUALLY USE IN A DAY?

ACCORDING TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY, THE AVERAGE AMERICAN USES NEARLY 100 GALLONS OF WATER PER DAY!

OF COURSE, WE ALL NEED WATER TO LIVE, BUT MAYBE WE CAN BE A LITTLE MORE MINDFUL ABOUT HOW WE USE IT.

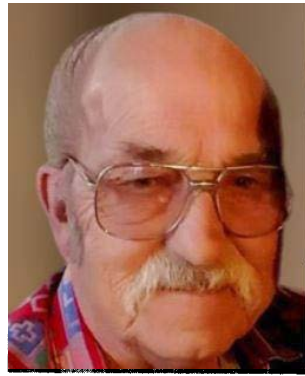
Robert Watson Rites

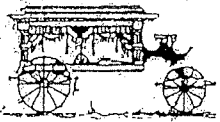

A Little Birdie Told Me

A Little Birdie Told Me: "Lefor, ND is a Close-Knit Community Who Have Their Hungarian Ancestors and Faith in God to Thank."

St. Elizabeth of Hungary Catholic Church will celebrate its 125th anniversary on June 18 with Mass at 10:30am. Immigrants from the Banat region of Hungary arrived by train to Gladstone, ND in 1898 and made their way south to the "Land of Milk and Honey" Lefor, ND. Being devote Catholics the first order of business after they'd built their sod homes was to build a sod church. Mass was held once a month with a priest from Assumption Abbey in Richardton, wagon seats were used for pews. By 1903 it was time to build a new church made with prairie rock and gumbo with plaster walls, parishioner Michael Raschko climbed the steeple with a bottle of wine to christen the new church.

As Lefor continued to grow St. Elizabeth continued to be the center of activity. In 1928 a fundraiser was held to begin building a new church, \$20,900 was raised and the cornerstone was dedicated on the Feast of St. Elizabeth, November 19,

1929. The Romanesque style church was completed in 1930 and Bishop Vincent Wherle dedicated St. Elizabeth Queen of the Prairie: The new building included six classrooms, gymnasium and church, which seated 450 people.


Two of the church bells came over with immigrants in 1898, manufactured in Temeschvo, Banat Hungary, donated by Joseph and Barbara Mayer and Peter and Katharina Herold. Josef Haack donated the third toll bell in 1927 manufactured in Hungary to be used at funerals, the bells rang three times a day: 6:00 am noon and 6:00 pm. On a clear day the bells could be heard five miles away, calling the farmers to Pray the Angelus.

In 1969 a renovation took place in the church covering up much of its original beauty: A complete restoration started in 2010 by Fr. Patrick Moore in an effort to bring the church back to its original glory. The church steeple spires were replaced in the fall of 2020 under the direction of Fr. Gary Benz, all the work was done by parish volunteers and St. Elizabeth, Queen of the Prairie stands proud once again.



Are we, the worker-achievers the stupid ones? I don't think so.

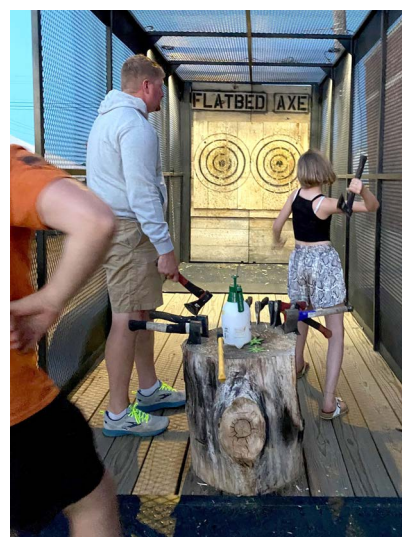

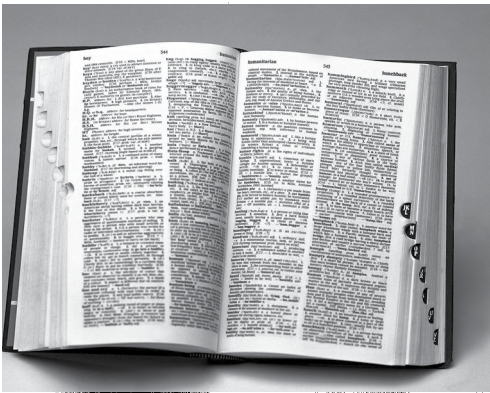

RECIPE
OF THE DAY

CRANBERRY PORK ROAST

1 - 2 1/2 - 3 lb. rolled Pork Loin Roast
1 - 16 oz. can jellied Cranberry sauce
1/2 c. sugar
1/2 c. Cranberry juice
1 tsp. dry mustard
1/4 tsp. ground cloves
2 Tbsp. cornstarch
2 Tbsp. cold water

Put meat in crock pot. In bowl, mash cranberry sauce' stir in sugar, cranberry juice, mustard and cloves. Pour over roast. Cover and cook on low 6-8 hours. Remove fat from juice -measuring 2 cups - adding water if necessary. Pour into pan and bring to boil. Combine cornstarch and water - make a paste. Stir into gravy. Cook until thickened. 4 - 6 servings.
