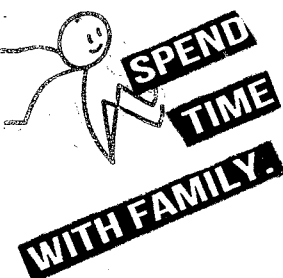

## GRASS CLIPPINGS BLOWN INTO THE GUTTER

It is once again time to remind all residents *it is an infraction of Bowman City Ordinance 3.0201.1 to blow GRASS CLIPPINGS* into the street. The mowing, raking or placement of grass clippings, leaves or other vegetation onto the street or other drainage into the city storm sewer system is **prohibited**. If heavy rains occur, buildup of the clippings in the sewers restrict the flow of water and can cause flooding in the storm sewer locations. Infractions can result in fines not less than \$25 up to \$500.

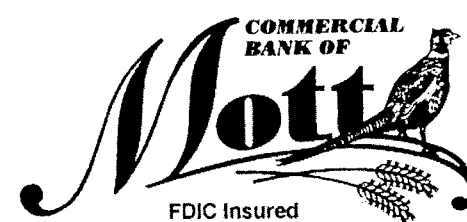



**Jesus Brings Healing**

In the church year, we are in the season of Pentecost. This season runs throughout the summer and into the fall. It's the time in the church calendar when our scripture readings for Sundays lead us through the teachings of Jesus. It's a season where we deepen and grow our faith through deepening and

growing our understanding of Jesus and what it means to be a disciple, a follower, of Jesus.

This Sunday our gospel reading from Matthew begins, "Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd" (Matthew 9:35-36). It is comforting news for us who often feel harassed and helpless in the face of our lives and our world today to know that Jesus is with us.

His presence brings us healing peace in the midst of struggle and turmoil.

As I pondered the teaching and good news and healing Jesus brings, a friend stopped by and shared a devotion that she found helpful and powerful, so impactful even that she keeps it as a picture on her phone and reads it daily. I agree with her opinion and am sharing it here in hope readers will find it helpful as well. This comes from the devotional resource called "Christ In Our Home," published by Augsburg Fortress in January 2023. The author, Lisa Smith, writes: *My friend is an alcoholic. She has stood at AA*

*meetings, stated her name, and said as much. She has been sober for more than thirty years. Another friend is also working on her sobriety and dealing with the occasional slip. There is no cure for the disease of alcoholism, according to Alcoholics Anonymous. But healing is possible.*

*Cure and healing are not the same. To be cured typically means becoming free of disease. In scripture, at the touch or prayer of Jesus or his apostles many people are dramatically cured—from paralysis, blindness, bleeding, and more. Yet even when someone is not cured, they can experience healing, because healing is about wholeness and takes many forms: emotional wellness, mental renewal, spiritual healing, restored relationships. Healing may even mean peace about lack of a cure.*

*We can certainly keep praying for cures, but we can also pray for healing. What healing do you seek from God on this day?"*

Our compassionate God hears our prayers and walks with us in all the joys and sorrows, trials and triumphs of life. May you experience the healing presence of God with you today and everyday.

Race day registration is at the east entrance of The Granary. Although this year's 4th of July lands on a Tuesday, we are hoping for another sensational turnout. After all, 100% of the net proceeds from the registrations, sponsorships, Raffle Ticket and new Bucket Draw tickets will go right back into the area community for healthy activities!

Speaking of raffle tickets, the WRHS Foundation is offering citizens a chance to win one of nine amazing prizes valued at \$3,050 for the purchase of a \$2 raffle ticket. Wow! A few weeks after the Fun Run & Walk, we will ask for area nonprofits to go to our website and participate with us in asking for what they need -- regarding healthy activities in their communities. Of course, the amount given back depends on how many tickets we sell, sponsorships and registrations we receive.

## Expressions of HOPE

### Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We resume our study today after seeing last time how the prophet Jonah expressed his anger to God for sparing the Ninevites from judgment after they repented. He went so far as to ask God to take his life. Today we see God's rebuke for His prophet in the form of a searching question: "Then the LORD said, 'Is it right for you to be angry?'" (Jonah 4:4).

We read of no response from Jonah because he shamelessly persists in justifying himself. Oh, may we never be guilty of carrying around such an attitude as Jonah exhibits here. Refusing to be happy about the blessings and successes of others is nothing less than resentment toward the goodness of God. Furthermore, thinking that we know better than God what ought to be done is the height of arrogance.

People believing in each other make a difference in their communities

God is going to respond to Jonah with a living parable, but first our chapter takes us back in time a few days to the point where Jonah was waiting to see the outcome of his preaching. Jonah 4:5: "So Jonah went out of the city and sat on the east side of the city. There he made himself a shelter and sat under it in the shade, till he might see what would become of the city."

Jonah would have initially approached Nineveh from the west. Now, having gone through the city with a warning of judgment, he would have been on the east side. There he made a shelter of branches woven together, which would provide shade while the leaves were fresh. And rather than admitting that he himself needs to repent, Jonah is waiting in hope of seeing the destruction of the enemies of Israel.

Our next verse can only leave us amazed at God's grace. For we are told in Jonah 4:6, "And the LORD God prepared a plant and made it come up over Jonah, that it might be shade for his head to deliver him from his misery. So Jonah was very grateful for the plant." How gracious is God to continue showing kindness to His recalcitrant prophet. In chapter one we saw that God prepared a great fish to deliver him from death. Now He prepares a plant to deliver him from his misery. Jonah is miserable from the heat and ap-

parently becoming ill despite the booth he made. But he is also miserable because he doesn't want the Ninevites to be saved. Yet God has not given up on His prophet and provides a plant to shade Jonah's head from the heat and from his misery. Let us not miss the irony here. Jonah was very grateful for the plant. The original Hebrew here indicates exuberant joy. Jonah is miserable and exceedingly angry about Nineveh's being spared while having great joy over a plant that sprang up.

What a pitiful sight is Jonah, looking over the city of Nineveh and hoping that God would destroy it. How different is the One greater than Jonah who looked out over Jerusalem and said, "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the one who kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, but you were not willing! See! Your house is left to you desolate" (Luke 13:34-35). Jonah grieved that the repentant city would be spared, while Jesus grieved that the unrepentant city would be judged. Christians, let us be like our Master. May we always be longing for and praying for the salvation of others.

Friends, God has prepared a way for us to be delivered from the misery of sin which, unrepented of, will lead to a miserable eternity in hell. The compassionate Lord Jesus willingly bore the punishment for all the sins of all His people so that we could receive forgiveness and eternal life through faith in Him. Please be sure that you are relying on Christ alone to make you right with God.



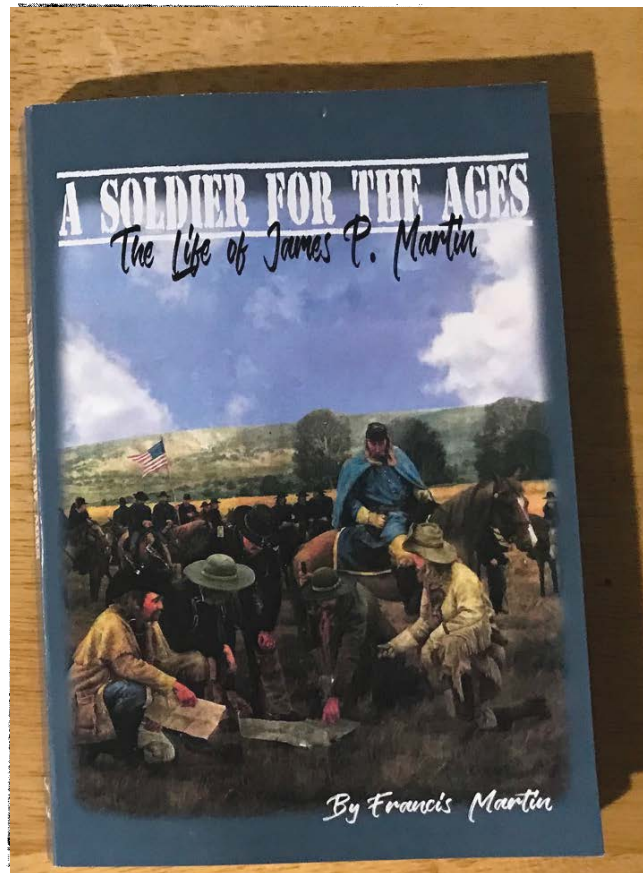

## Bertha Eileen Nelson Rites To Be Held

Bertha Eileen Nelson, 94 passed away on Good Friday,



April 7, 2023, in Rapid City, SD. She was born April 30, 1928 near Reva, Harding County.

Bertha was the fourth child of ten children born to Norwegian immigrants, Peder and "Esther" (Astrid Rasmussen) Tenold. Growing up in the Depression, Bertha learned to listen to others, respect her elders,

and work. Those ethics were hallmarks of Bertha's life.

Bertha attended grades 1-8 in Harding County country schools, grade 9 in Buffalo, SD and grades 10, 11 and 12 in Hettinger, ND. Bertha graduated from Hettinger High School in 1946.

Raymond and Bertha also rented and later purchased farmland to raise cereal grain crops. Bertha worked as the bookkeeper for the business and the farm.

Bertha and Raymond were blessed with three children, Larry, Barbara, and Ronald. The children learned the value of education, participation in school activities and working in business. Bertha was active in the home and she hosted many holiday dinners for Raymond's brothers. Bertha shared her sense of caring and community service for others through her involvement at Hettinger Lutheran Church where she was active in Ladies' Aid, Sunday school, and Bible school. Bertha also volunteered at the Clothes Closet in Hettinger. For many years, Bertha and her sisters provided daily care for Grandma Esther when she relocated from Reva to Hettinger.

ceded in death by his parents, Robert and Helen.

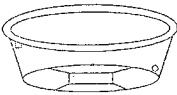

This is a learned trait. Unless you were born a psychopath, you learn to obfuscate. If the child has no hair to hide under, he will put his hands behind his back and stare at the floor. 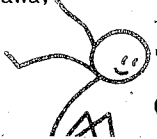

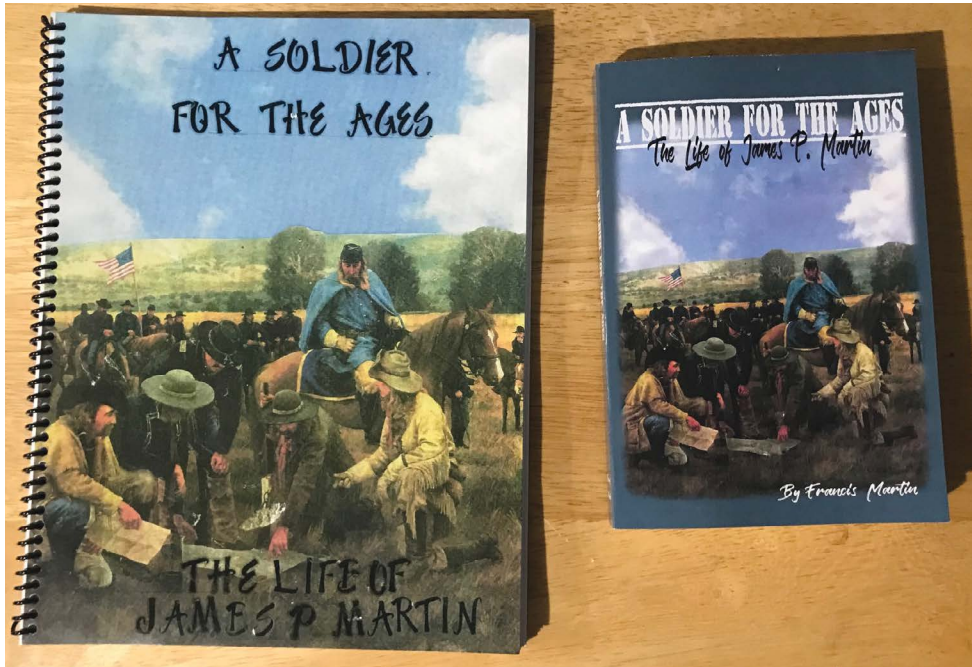
