GRASS CLIPPINGS BLOWN INTO THE GUTTER

It is once again time to remind all residents it is an infraction of Bowman City Ordinance 3.0201.1 to blow GRASS CLIPPINGS into the street. The mowing, raking or placement of grass clippings, leaves or other vegetation onto the street or other drainage into the city storm sewer system is prohibited. If heavy rains occur, buildup of the clippings in the sewers restrict the flow of water and can cause flooding in the storm sewer locations. Infractions can result in fines not less than \$25 up to \$500.

Please refrain from blowing clippings into the streets.



When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd" (Matthew 9:35-36). His presence brings us healing peace in the midst of struggle and turmoil.

As I pondered the teaching and good news and healing Jesus brings, a friend stopped by and shared a devotion that she found helpful and powerful, so impactful even that she keeps it as a picture on her phone and reads it daily. I agree with her opinion and am sharing it here in hope readers will find it helpful as well. This comes from the devotional resource called "Christ In Our Home," published by Augsburg Fortress in January 2023. The author, Lisa Smith, writes: My friend is an alcoholic. She has stood at AA meetings, stated her name. and said as much. She has been sober for more than thirty years. Another friend is also working on her sobriety and dealing with the occasional slip. There is no cure for the disease of alcoholism, according to Alcoholics Anonymous. But healing is possible.

Cure and healing are not the same. To be cured typically means becoming free of disease. In scripture, at the touch or prayer of Jesus or his apostles many people are dramatically cured-from paralysis, blindness, bleeding, and more. Yet even when someone is not cured, they can experience healing, because healing is about wholeness and takes many forms: emotional wellness, mental renewal, spiritual healing, restored relationships. Healing may even mean peace about lack of a cure.

We can certainly keep praying for cures, but we can also pray for healing. What healing do you seek from God on this day?







looking over the city of Nineveh and hoping that God would destroy it. How different is the One greater than Jonah who looked out over Jerusalem and said, "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the one who kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, but you were not willing! See! Your house is left to you desolate" (Luke 13:34-35). Jonah grieved that the repentant city would be spared, while Jesus grieved that the unrepentant city would be judged. Christians, let us be like our Master. May we always be longing for and praying for the salvation of others. 

Cloud Seeding Operations Summary for


June 5-11, 2023 BISMARCK, N.D. - Southwestern North Dakota received thunderstorms last Wednesday through Friday and a cold front brought a long-awaited reprieve from hot weather last weekend. Precipitation was fairly widespread; however, locally heavy rainfall occurred.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, aircraft conducted ten total flights last week including seven seeding flights and three flights for either reconnaissance or repositioning

The weather this week for southwestern North Dakota begins with seasonable high temperatures in the upper 70s to lower 80s and dry conditions. On Wednesday, thunderstorms could return as a cold front passes through. Thursday and Friday should be cooler, with normal highs in the 80s returning for the weekend.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.

Bob was born on September 18, 1946, in Miles City, Montana to parents Robert J. Wiffler and Helen (Erickson) Wiffler. His family later expanded to include a sister (Debby) and a brother (Trace). He grew up on the family farm/ranch in Rhame, ND, attending all 12 years of school in Rhame, graduating in 1964. Bob was an excellent athlete and excelled in basketball and baseball as a Rhame Piraterecently found out he was voted the basketball player with the best looking legs. Then it was off to college in Wahpeton, ND with his best friend, Gary Rue (everyone should have known this was trouble brewing)! After 2 years of fun and games, Bob's Dad said "enough, you are off to the military, young man"!! Bob enlisted in the Army in 1966, and was honorably discharged in 1968. 1971 was the year that life in Bowman started for the Wiffler family when Bob bought the Crystal Bar from Lowell Jones. From that time forward Bob was invested in the community through numerous business ventures and his work in community development. Business ventures included the Crystal Bar, Windy's Bar, the Main Bar in Scranton (owned all 3 of these at one time), the Sharivar Steakhouse, when he asked Bruce Jones to join him as a partner (a partnership that lasted over 40 years), Shuck's Gas and Oil which expanded to Prairie Fuels in Baker, Montana (when he went to Grafton, ND and convinced Larry and Paulette Merwin to move to Baker), Wiff Rentals, G&N Rentalscompanies that rented equipment in the oilfield in numerous states, an asphalite paving business in California, an ostrich ranch-the Wiffler ostrich business was featured on Good Morning America, hedeveloped the land West of the cemetery for the construction of the Industrial area, developing and selling land for the construction of Bowman's Assisted Living Facility and the expanded residential area on the West side of town, and he was one of the "Dirty Dozen" that owned Has Beens Bar. Bob believed in quality customer service and tried to treat all of his customers and employees with the respect he felt they deserved.

Bob loved to hunt--trips goose hunting to the Leeds/ York area in ND resulted in tales of glory, full freezers and friendships that have endured for many years. We think maybe limits of deer, duck, geese etc. may have been stretched just a little but silence is golden. The golf course was a pet project for Wiff over the years-he was the original dude that started the Crystal Bar Open, which became the Shuck's Gas and Oil Open, which then grew to become the oilfield opens at the Bowman and Baker Golf Courses. There may have been a weekend or two that saw a Gin and Tonic open also! He was a master of the garden and the yard—Paxton and Stephanie (and their friends) can attest to the fact the mowing came first! Bob was an avid antique collector, a history buff, liked visiting casinos and followed all sports—especially the Bulldogs, the Sioux, the Gophers and the Vikings.

I watched Saturday as Val, Sami, Vaughn and Kohen competed in the annual Otter Creek bike race in Mandan.


