

Highway 21 Treasure Hunt June 21-22

Discover some treasures and have some fun during North Dakota's 22nd annual 100-mile rummage sale, the Highway 21 Treasure Hunt.

The Highway 21 Treasure Hunt will be held from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. MT Friday and Saturday, June 21-22.

"With usually 100 or more rummage sales along the 100-mile route, this is the original of these unique rummage sale events in North Dakota," says Luann Dart, Elgin, who coordinates the event.

Listings this year include everything from antiques and collectibles to fun items like go-karts and even a 1964 Massey Ferguson tractor.

During the event, communities along Highway 21 host citywide rummage sales. Participating communities include St. Anthony, Flasher, Carson, Heil, Elgin, New Leipzig, Mott, Regent and New England. Rural residents host sales, too, so watch for signs along the route for additional sales. Also watch for sales along Highway 6 in the St. Anthony area.

"Anyone who enjoys rummage sales will love this event," Dart says. "It's fun to travel the route during this unique event and discover lots of treasures." Listings for each community's sales will be available at certain locations in that community, as well as on the Highway 21 Treasure Hunt Facebook page prior to the event.

- Regent: Regent Co-op Store and DFC, on Main Street
- New England: New England Community Store and The Hub, both on Main Street.

"Hundreds of people have discovered the treasures along Highway 21 during the annual Highway 21 Treasure Hunt," Dart says. "We encourage everyone to plan to attend the 2024 event."

Those holding sales are encouraged to keep their sales open throughout the scheduled hours both days unless otherwise listed.

A small group of volunteers from each community spearheads the event each year, with advertising expenses covered with donations from local, civic-minded organizations. Most recently, expenses were covered by the Elgin Lions Club, the Hettinger County Job Development Authority and West River Telecommunications Cooperative.



In these prayers we believe and entrust our prayer to God that he is there to listen.

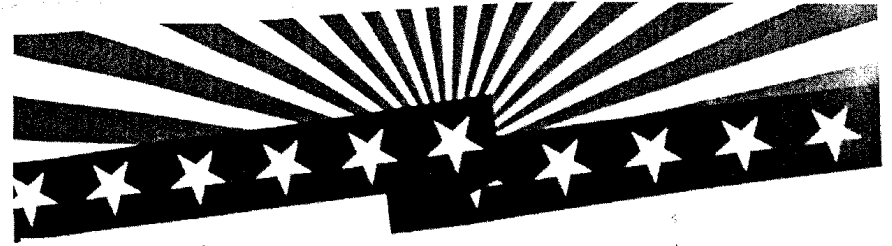
God is big enough to handle our prayers





Cloud Seeding Operations Summary for June 10-16, 2024

BISMARCK, N.D. - Rain showers and isolated thunderstorms occurred at the beginning and end of last week over southwestern North Dakota.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, aircraft conducted seven total seeding flights, three flights for reconnaissance, and two flights for repositioning. Rain enhancement operations were requested by county authorities last week.

This week, shower and thunderstorm activity should remain active because of a southwesterly upper-level weather pattern. High temperatures are forecast to be below normal this week in the 60s and 70s. This should also limit severe weather potential.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at <http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb>. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.



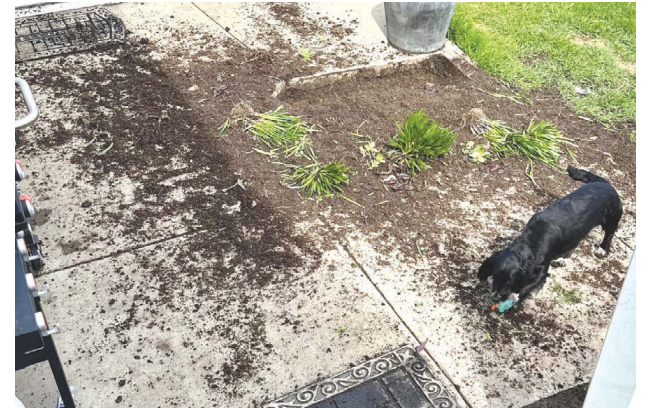
We also put in four raised beds, two with veggies and two with flowers. So far they've been

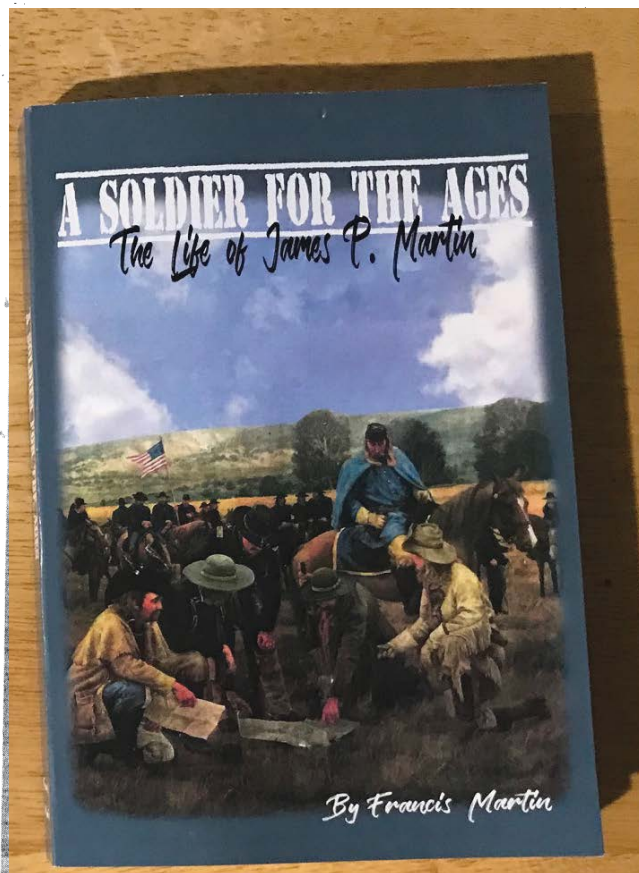

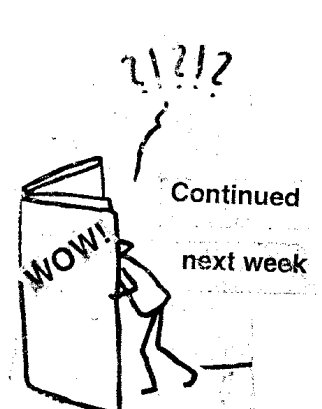

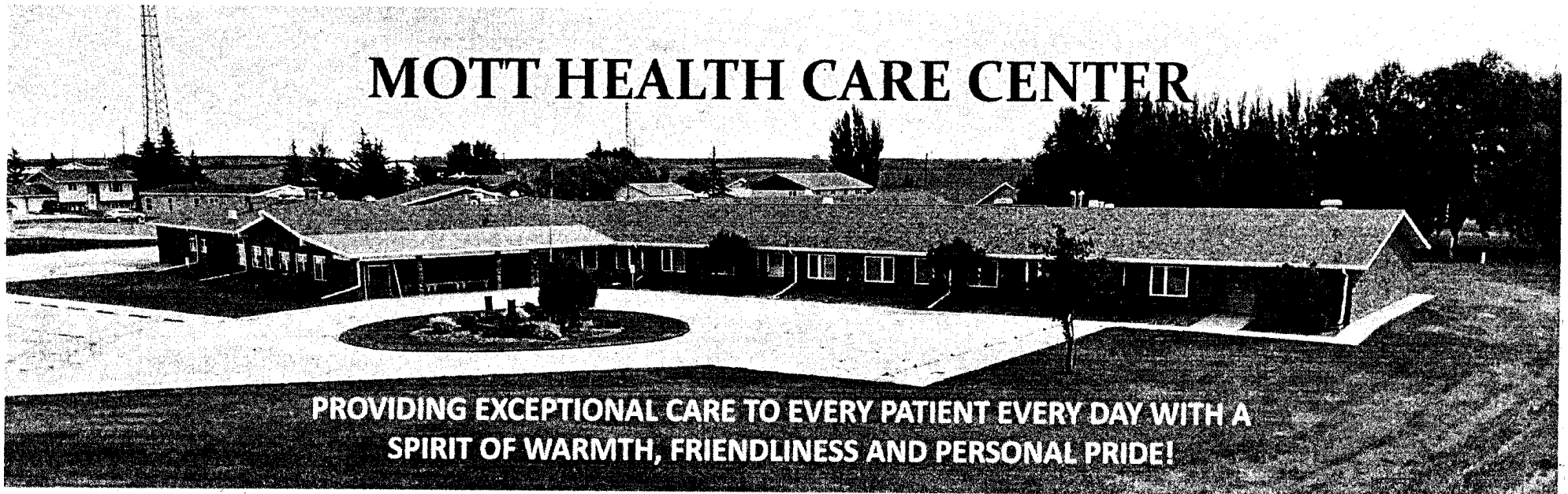

Those in the Mott area can eat in the Center or have them delivered. They are also delivered to Regent residents.

The Mott Health Center is the former Good Samaritan Nursing Home. It has been remodeled and repainted for a fresh new look. It is now considered a Basic Care Center with 20 rooms available. There are short term and long term options. They can help with short term recovery from surgery, medicine management or a customized care plan. Residents get 3 home-made meals a day, 24 hour health care, one floor living with no steps, Emergency Alert system, housekeeping and laundry, onsite beautician and nail care, religious services, therapy, activities, transportation services, safety, privacy and much more. You get all the benefits of assisted living without extra charges. Guests are welcome any time.

There will be an onsite clinic later this fall in the north wing of the building.

"Ensuring the CAHs in North Dakota remain in compliance is one of our top priorities," said Jody Ward, grant program director for Flex. "We were pleased to be able to coordinate this training with so many hospitals across the state."

Tressa Sacrey, director of compliance and education for Health Services Associates, facilitated the table top drills to meet the testing requirements.

The training included time for teams to pause and discuss their clinic's unique perspective for the scenario presented. A discussion guide, hotwash document, and formal After Action Report (AAR) was provided to track the clinic's response and meet all documentation requirements.

Each facility had a designated staff person to ensure all necessary discussion was held within each team and the documents were kept up to date. The full team was required to attend the virtual training.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have arrived in our study at the last phrase of 1 Peter 1:2: "Elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace be multiplied." Last time we considered the subject of grace, but there is something else which Peter wants to be multiplied in the lives of believers: peace.

The Greek word for peace is eirana, from which we get the name Irene. It has to do with peace in relationships and especially in the relationship between man and God. Many think that peace with God is automatic, that because He is a loving God, He will accept everyone. But His Word tells us differently. We read in Ephesians 2:3, "We all once conducted ourselves in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, just as the

The Bible calls it propitiation. Propitiation is the removal of God's wrath toward the sinner and the establishing of a relationship of peace. We read in Romans 3:24-25, "Being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God set forth as a propitiation by His blood, through faith." Here we see what the amazing grace of God has done for those who were His enemies and because of their sin, were under His wrath. He gave His only begotten Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, to come into this world in order that He might suffer in the place of sinners and with His own blood, pay the penalty of our sins against God.

Let us look again at the last two words of Romans 3:25. Paul says that redemption and propitiation are appropriated "through faith." In other words, all for whom Christ died will be brought to a point in their lives when they realize their desperate condition as sinners and place their faith in the Lord Jesus. As Paul wrote in Ephesians 2:8, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God." Friend, do

He came to give peace with God both for time and eternity. Be very sure of the condition of your soul. 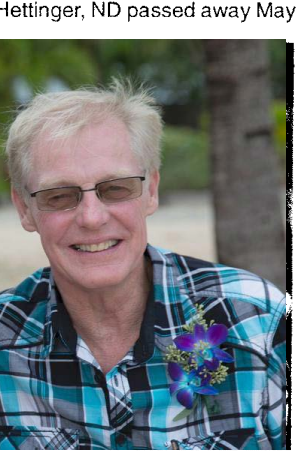


