



In verse 8 things become even worse for Jonah: "And it happened, when the sun arose, that God prepared a vehement east wind; and the sun beat on Jonah's head, so that he grew faint. Then he wished death for himself, and said, 'It is better for me to die than to live." Af-

ter preparing the plant and the worm, God has a third appointee: the wind. The fierce wind and beating sun caused Jonah to become faint, which probably means sunstroke. Being out of tune with God, Jonah repeats his request to die. We recall that he expressed a death wish back in verse three. His rationale there was that God's ways were, in his estimation, unreasonable. Why should God spare the wicked Ninevites, Israel's enemies? But here, Jonah has become preoccupied with himself. Just when he thought he was the object of God's favor, that sign of favor is removed, and he has a small taste of God's judgment. Having lost the plant that made his life tolerable, he sinks into despair. Jonah should have told himself, "My nice plant may be gone, but my God is not gone. And still having Him, I have all that I need." When the believer is out of step with the Lord, even little difficulties are magnified and seem unbearable.

How foolish for people to ask for death because they do not like their current circumstances, perhaps circumstances they themselves have created. We need to have the attitude of Paul who, though he believed dying and being with the Lord was "far better" than remaining in this world, had the attitude that whatever the Lord wanted for him would be best (Philippians 1:21-26).

Friends, I have heard many people say of a deceased person that he or she is in a better place, much better off now. That is true ONLY if the person was a believer in Christ. If we go out of this life the way we come into it-under God's wrath-we enter unimaginable suffering that will last forever. So please be sure that you are trusting in the Lord Jesus Christ alone to make you right with God. That is the only way we can have forgiveness, peace with God, and eternal life in heaven.



Reflections on the Words of Life

We left the prophet Jonah sulking in anger as he waited to see what would happen to Nineveh; while at the same time joyful over the plant that the Lord had prepared to shade him. 

Do we have to wave our pride in what we are and what we have over and above what everybody else has? Since when is our pride more important than everyone else's pride?

Life is a funny thing. We are told by our parents how proud they are of us when we are little when we do something they

think is right. We show talent or accomplishment in something and we are showered by compliments and love and we strive to get more of that feeling. again and again. It's what drives us to do well. That's not a bad thing as we should take pride in what we do if we do a good job or receive accolades for it, but at what point does pride in what we do turn into selfishness and self absorption? tray themselves as pseudo nuns and put on a show, that is considered acceptable behavior. Since when does making fun of someone's lifestyle or beliefs acceptable behavior. Do we not know better or are we failing to remember what we were taught when we were young? There have always been those that fly in the face of conventional thought just to make a point or create a sensation, but the majority have then expressed their objections which has hopefully made those people reconsider their actions as unacceptable behavior. However, lately any objection to such behavior has been slow in coming and actually has been crushed by the vocal minority. It is now unacceptable to object to any behavior that we may think of as unacceptable as it may offend the person or persons right to freedom of speech. In fact any objections are overwhelmingly rejected and any person is vilified for speaking those objections. So we have become a population of people who have stopped objecting to anything and now anything goes.

So has this now entered

And we know that that is false as that means hurting others and being unkind because it makes you feel good is right and we all know that is wrong or should know that. It appears that selfish behavior is the result of too much pride and is something that we need to realize has

become normalized.

So how do we change the current trend? Realization that it is an unacceptable trend would be first, but that is not a popular statement today. We need to teach our children what is right and what is wrong not only by words but by example. We need to spend more time reinforcing positive behavior and discouraging negative behavior. Cloud Seeding Operations Summary for June 12-18, 2023

BISMARCK, N.D. – Widespread rains of one-half to one inch fell over southwestern North Dakota during the middle of last week. Conditions were not favorable for cloud seeding operations due to the embedded nature of the rainfall.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, no flights were flown for seeding operations last week.

An active weather pattern for showers and thunderstorms returns to southwestern North Dakota this week with high temperatures cooling off into the 70s from Tuesday through the coming weekend.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.

From research I found that the Chaldeans (residents of Babylon & vicinity) were among the most superstitious people in ancient times. 





A Little Birdie Told Me

A Little Birdie Told Me: "Assumption Abbey and St. Mary's Church in Richardton, North Dakota have been sharing the Faith for Over a 150 Years.

The Assumption Abbey traces its roots back to the Benedictine revival in Europe following the anti-Catholic activity during the French Revolution and Napolean's rule in the mid-19th Century. Communities were established in the United States: First in Pennsylvania in 1846. The Benedictines of Assumption Abbey trace their roots back to this 19th century movement. The founder Fr. Vincent Wehrle a Swiss Monk was sent to the Dakota Territory after three years of after three years as a missionary in Arkansas and two years in Indiana as an assistant pastor.

In 1889 the Dakota Territory was divided into North and South Dakota, Rome divided the Vicariate of Dakota into two dioceses. The Diocese of South Dakota in Sioux Falls, and North Dakota in Jamestown.

During the 1880's Germans from Russia and Germans from Hungary began to settle the Dakota Territory. Catholics in southwestern North Dakota were underserved, in 1899 a handful of monks fom St. Gall's began monastic life at Richardton. In 1903 the community was raised to the rank of Abbey and Prior Vincent Wehrle was named Abbot of St. Mary's Abbey. Abbot Wehrle was embraced as "Apostle to the German-Hungarians and German-Russians.

Construction of the church took four years and on Christmas Eve 1908 the first Mass was held.

In 1924 the Abbey was forced into bankruptcy.

In 1926 a new superior was named by Roman decree and the Richardton Community began to experience a revival: in 1931 the community petitioned Rome for restoration of independent abbey status. The request was granted. By the 1940's the entire debt was paid and buildings renovated.

Assumption Abbey and St. Mary's Church have undergone many changes over its history including the renovations and renewal of the abbey church started by then Abbot Fr. Patrick Moore in 2000.

In 2006 Assumption Abbey community had some 60 members: 35 living and working at the Abbey involved in a vital life of liturgy and self-sustaining work on the Abbey ranch, garden, orchard, apiary, kitchen, carpentry, garage, offices, gift shoppe and wine cellar.
