

This past March, I wrote about the death of youth sports. What caused it? Post-COVID. in my personal experience, it was parents acting crazy at the games which was driving away coaches and referees. Estimated by the National Federation of State High School Associations to be, since 2018-19, a loss of 50,000 officials here just in the U.S. However, another phenomenon had blossomed alongside that nonsense. On January 2nd, reporter Stephen Borelli penned that "About 70% of kids drop out of organized sports by age 13 and the so-called 'professionalization of youth sports' can't be understated as a significant factor why." Not kids who grow up and move away or go to summer camp. Rather, my observation is that this particular parent either never played sports themselves or, wants to carry-over their personal angst to their child. Warm. fuzzy interference couched as "good parenting" but, in reality, destroying the cohesiveness of

the team concept of athletics by focusing on anything other than a child's obligations to their teammates and, regular, hard work. When I was a kid, my Dad always said-you sign up, you finish what you started. No excuses! And, if a parent doesn't want the child to compete, work hard, and learn something new, then, why sign up in the first place?

The same new narcissismwhat's in it for me? On Saturday, I got a call from an old top student from Texas. He's 67-yearsold now and, suffering from early onset Alzheimer's. He called to reminisce about the challenge and fun of martial arts training in the 1990's, the discipline he learned and, how it was keeping him going as he is slipping away. But, sadly, that is in the past. Today, when a child, for unstated reasons, drops out and wrecks an upcoming test, demo team preparation and, even participation in the classes themselves; that isn't creating any new new students waiting to comè onboard even for our free local program? It's simply not there in this new culture of blah, mediocrity as our youngsters tap away mindlessly on their screens and. then, complain that there's nothing to do. And, FYI, as I predicted last March, the impact of this whole mess is coming to fruition in the professional ranks too. Five of the top draft picks in the upcoming NBA draft are EURO-PEAN not American. Apparently, hard work, dedication, sacrifice, teamwork and honor are still viable in the old country. #### Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzia

Having looked together at the first two verses of I Peter, we now see the apostle breaking forth into praise. After naming some of God's blessings in verse 2, he is stirred to proclaim in verse 3, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten

us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.'

Throughout the New Testament, we find the apostles emphasizing the need for believers to focus on the tremendous blessings of their salvation. The apostle Paul does what Peter is doing in our passage when he writes in Ephesians 1:3, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ." Like Peter,


he is stirred to praise God as he remembers all the wonderful things that are true of believers in Christ. Let believers learn to cherish such things in our minds. Not only will this bring joy and stability to our lives as we remember what is true of us by God's grace; but it will also lead us to praise God, as it did the apostles.

All blessings that come to us are the result of God's grace. Peter in our verse reminds us that they are "according to His abundant mercy." Scripture repeatedly emphasizes this point. Mercy, in our verse, is a synonym for grace. It means that God blesses His people even though they are totally undeserving and in fact, deserve just the opposite. We saw this previously in regard to the doctrine of election. God's choosing some to be His people is not based upon anything in them but only upon something in God. Thus Paul writes in Ephesians 1:5 that God has "predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will."

There is another important aspect of God's mercy which we must not overlook. It is a JUST mercy, consistent with His absolute holiness. For sin to be forgiven, God's perfect character has to be satisfied. And the Bible makes it abundantly clear that there is only one thing that can satisfy the justice of God in regard to sin. It is the blood of Jesus Christ ALONE which cleanses from sin. For God to forgive sin, that sin must be paid for to the complete satisfaction of His justice. And the

only way for sin to be paid for in that way is for a person to come under the perfect sacrifice for sin. Jesus, by His blood shed on the cross, made the only perfect sacrifice for sin. Seeking to earn forgiveness or contribute to earning forgiveness by human merit, is equivalent to saying that the blood of Jesus Christ was not sufficient, thus demeaning His perfect saving

The assurance of Christ's sufficient payment for sin can and should be a solid basis for peace and joy for the believer. The Christian can know with certainty that while the forgiveness of sins is totally undeserved, yet it is perfectly just. For God, through the work of Jesus Christ on the cross, has received a full payment for the sins of all those who come to Him through faith in Christ. There is nothing left for him or her to do. There is no penance to be performed, and there are no works required to complete the payment. The believer is the beneficiary of the most glorious blessing there is. He or she is totally free from the guilt and penalty of all of sins, and the whole process of salvation is absolutely just. God is satisfied with the work of His Son on the believer's behalf. Friend, do you have this assurance? Are you trusting in the work of Christ alone to make you right with



#### Stilling Storms

Jesus got into a boat with experienced fishermen (most of them), he laid down and fell asleep. He slept so hard that even when the boat was being tossed to and fro, the waves were splashing into the boat, and the wind had to be blowing water in his face, he slept.

Mark 4:35-39 [Jesus] said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side." ... A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm.

Did Jesus have so much confidence in the boat that he could sleep knowing it wouldn't begin to fall apart? Or did Jesus have so much confidence in his experienced fishermen friends that they would guide them all safely across a lake that was known to have storms come up in the afternoons? Or did his faith land in the one true God who he trusted to keep them safe?-He had to have trust in God in order to sleep so peace-

becomes swamped). Some of our storms we create for ourselves and others come up out of nowhere. Sometimes our storms are beyond our control. When life seems overwhelming, we might have skills to prioritize and delegate but ultimately it doesn't help us when we worry and stress. Anxiety in itself is a real storm. If you don't struggle with mental health, you probably know someone who does, and it's difficult to find good treatment.

Jesus has invited us into this boat of life together. Although we don't place our faith in the boat or in each other, we each do our part. So often there is nothing we can do in our storms, but we can always call out to God. We are all in this boat together and yet we don't put our faith in the boat or in our friends. While admitting we still need the boot and our neighbors, we put our faith in our Savior Jesus. Jesus reminds us, during our storms (and when there is still calm), to depend on our faith. Trust in God to calm the storm. That doesn't mean the storm will go away, but maybe the wind and the waves will stop tossing you around.

Your storm might be a little different than my storm, but we are all in the same boat, with the same Savior. We all have Jesus with whom to leave our fears and sorrows and to rejoice We often overestimate our in our joys and celebrations. We are all in the same boat, and Jesus is there with us to calm our storms! Thanks be to God!




