



North Dakota Facts and Figures

Investing The Legacy Fund (Part II)

Last week I wrote about the two groups who are in charge of setting policy for the investing of the North Dakota Legacy Fund. I do need to mention that the Jodi Smith is the lead administrator of the Retirement and Investment Office (RIO) and the person who oversees the investments is Scott Anderson. Their job along with the RIO staff is to carry out the policies set by the Legacy and Budget Stabilization Funds Advisory Board and the State Investment Board. They are also have the responsibility of hiring the fund managers.

The following are the targets in the different asset classes that have been set by the State Investment Board and the Advisory Board on a long term basis to account for a) **extreme market conditions**, b) **specific composition of the Legacy Fund** and c) **long-term flexibility to invest in other assets.**

- Broad United States Equity** - Policy target is 27.5% - these funds are invested in the United States stock market.
- Broad International Equity** - Policy target is 19.0% - These funds are invested in stock market outside of the United States.
- Private Equity** - Policy target is 7% - these funds are invested in stocks of companies not publicly traded.
- Fixed Income** - Policy target is 28.5% - these funds are focused on protecting the investment from losses while generating attractive income. The funds are invested in investment-grade securities, government bonds, corporate bonds and mortgage-backed securities.

5. Private Real Assets - Policy target is 10% - these funds are invested in tangible, physical assets that are accessible through private market investment. Example a property that generates income such as rent.

6. In State Equity - Policy target is 3% - these funds are invested in private markets in North Dakota to support the state's growing entrepreneurial sector.

7. In State Fixed Income - Policy target is 5% - these funds provide low interest rates to investment rated companies in the state through the Match Program and low interest loans to political subdivisions, such as city infrastructure, school construction and water projects.

The list above is an investment portfolio for the State of North Dakota with the Legacy Fund. There are three policies that govern the investments of the Legacy Fund 1) **Risk Tolerance**, 2) **Investment Objectives** and 3) **The Prudent Investor Rule**. The above list of asset classes has diversity, some investment risk in equity investments, low investment risk in fixed asset investments and all funds are invested under the **Prudent Investor Rule which focuses on long term markets, diverse portfolio, balance risk and return and safeguards the financial well-being of the State of North Dakota.**

Remember there are a number of people who think they know how to invest the Legacy Fund and where it should be invested. This is public money and it is a constitutional fund that has to follow rules and guide lines and we are blessed to have some very skilled people managing the Legacy Fund!

Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the laborer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.'" Luke 10:1-9

Last weekend May 29th-31st was the 2026 Western North Dakota Synod Assembly and the theme was "Walking Together" inspired by the gospel scripture Luke 10:1-9. Pastors, synod authorized ministers, lay ministers, and visitors from ELCA Lutheran churches from across the state of North Dakota gathered to worship, pray, attend bible study and workshops. People from all walks of life attended this assembly. ciples. Jesus sends us out into this world maybe not equipped with Google maps, clothes, shoes, etc. but he has equipped us the Holy spirit to share the peace of Christ. Jesus does not say that our mission will be easy. He does not promise that walking down the road he has called us will be comfortable, but he gives us hope.

During this time in our synod there are many of our congregations have been through difficult days, months, or years. With a shortage of rostered ministers many churches are left without a pastor leaving a feeling of uncertainty and concern for the future. But the Holy Spirit has worked in these congregations to lift up synod authorized ministers and lay ministers, teachers, music coordinators, altar guild members, church councils, secretaries and many more working together to further their mission God has called them too.

We are disciples sent out by Jesus to share grace, peace, and mercy to those around us. Not just in church but in our daily life. In our jobs, homes, with our family, friends and strangers. Share the peace of Christ. Keep walking together. Keep blessing. Keep proclaiming peace. Care for one another. Do not lose heart when the road becomes difficult. Amen.

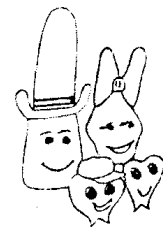

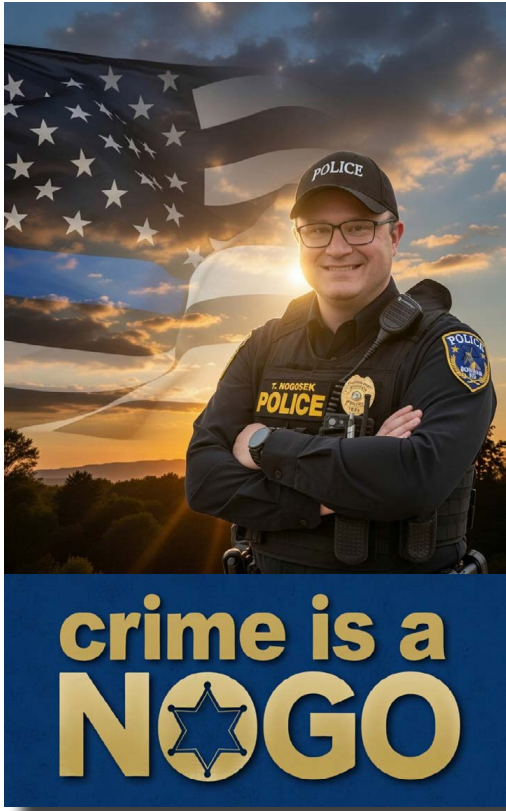

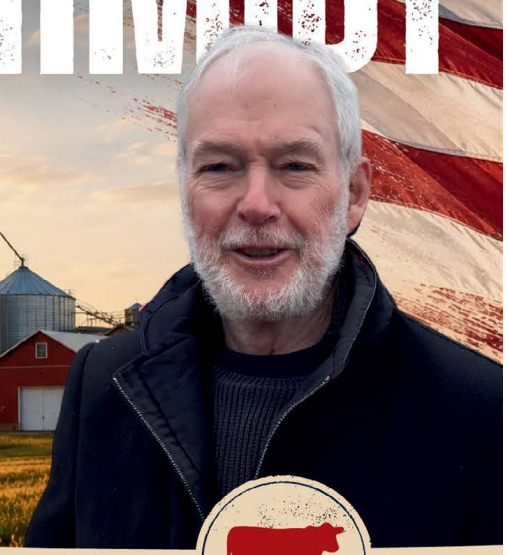

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We resume our study today at the end of 1 Peter 3:18: "For Christ also suffered once for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit." Last time we saw the importance of Christ's being put to death in the flesh in order to pay the wages of sin and secure the salvation of all who would place their trust in Him. We continue today, noting that though Jesus was "put to death in the flesh," He was also "made alive in the spirit." This is referring to the great contrast that took place. When Jesus died, He was put to death in the realm of the flesh. When He rose again, He was made alive in the spirit. In other words, Jesus was put to death as a real man by crucifixion. But when He arose, He existed in the glorified realm of resurrection life. This is comparable to what the New Testament says will happen to

believers at death. We now exist in the sphere of human life. But after death, we will exist in the glorified state of heaven.

This thought is continued in verses 19 and 20: "in which He also went and made proclamation to the spirits in prison, who once were disobedient when the patience of God kept waiting in the days of Noah, during the construction of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through the water." The words "in which" refer to the new condition of Christ after His resurrection. Jesus, after His resurrection, went and preached to the spirits in prison.

Just who were these "spirits in prison"? Verse 20 further identifies them as ones "who once were disobedient." There have been many suggestions about the identity of these "spirits in prison." The word translated "spirits" here always refers in the Bible to angels. Here, the reference is obviously to fallen angels because they "once were disobedient." Scripture does not give us all the details about fallen angels, who are also called demons. But we do know that angels who fell from their original condition have sealed their destiny. God never provided salvation for the fallen angels. Some demons, as we see in the New Testament,

are allowed by God to harass mankind and cause the kinds of problems we read about in the gospel accounts. And there is demon activity in the world to this very day.

There are other demons that God has put into some sort of prison to await the day of judgment. Two passages of Scripture bring this out. We read in 2 Peter 2:4, "For if God did not spare the angels who sinned, but cast them down to hell and delivered them into chains of darkness, to be reserved for judgment." And Jude 1:6 states, "And the angels who did not keep their proper domain, but left their own abode, He has reserved in everlasting chains under darkness for the judgment of the great day." Why God immediately imprisoned some of the demons and not others, we do not know. But for the purpose of understanding our passage, we need to realize that Jesus went to those demons that are already imprisoned by God and preached to them.

Lord willing, we shall continue in our passage next time. But I close by reminding us of the marvelous grace of God. For His own good and wise reasons, He did not choose to provide salvation for fallen angels; but in His abundant grace, He

has done so for fallen man. The eternal Son of God took on human flesh and became a man, not an angel. He came to pay in full the penalty for all the sins of all human beings who would ever place their trust in Him. Let us be forever amazed and grateful for this. And please be sure that you have received this gift of salvation through faith in Christ.

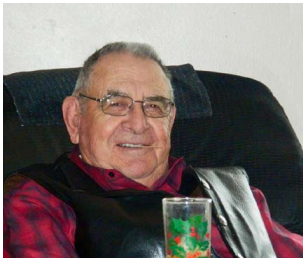

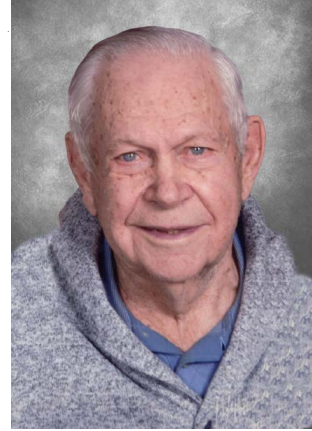

- **Concrete Replacement:** Removing all cracked, deteriorated surface from the clinic extending to west of the Mott Health Care Center solarium.
- **Drainage Correction:** Regrading and fixing the drainage ditch, directing water safely into the pipe on the north side of the parking lot.
- **ADA-Compliant Upgrades:** Building a smooth, safe walkway and new parking surface

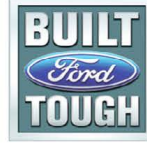
