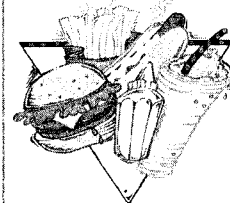

As predicted, all of this politically-charged Nazi, name-calling the past 6 years has struck near home now. And, the mainstream media's response? Condemn the FBI as being "juvenile" for "too quickly classifying the Boulder, Colorado, attack this week as terrorism." Too quickly? Really? I mean it's not like Mohamed Sabry Soliman was an illegal foreign national who was hiding in a sanctuary city and, decided to shout, "Free Palestine" as he used a make-shift flame-thrower on a crowd at a Mall in Boulder or anything, right? Six victims (aged 67-88), one of whom was an actual Nazi Holocaust survivor, required hospitalization with two being airlifted to a local burn unit. So, now, when a Hamas true-believer attacks a Jewish charity that is advocating for the release of October 7th hostages, it's just a local, minor traffic incident? I mean, that's what the local Police Chief Stephen Redfearn was implying at his press conference, "it would be irresponsible for me to speculate on Soliman's motive this early on." And, Harvard Professor Juliette Kayyem dog-piled too, until she passes judgment, "we all need to, to not follow the FBI's tweets."

The feds disagreed, "FBI personnel are on the scene... We are investigating this incident as an act of terror, and targeted violence. All of the necessary assets will be dedicated to this investigation. If you have any investigative tips please contact the FBI. And if you aided or abetted this attack, we will find you. the feds aren't playing! 18 USC 2331 defines domestic/foreign terrorism as activities that involve acts dangerous to human life which violate U.S. criminal laws and, appear to intimidate or coerce the public or, influence government policy through such acts in this country—particularly acts of mass destruction, bombings, assassination, or kidnapping. You know...like using a flame-thrower at a shopping mall. Federal penalties for terrorism-related offenses are severe, often resulting in lengthy prison sentences, life imprisonment, the death penalty and asset forfeiture.

And, in North Dakota, NDCC §12.1-17-04.1 defines "domestic terrorism" as any activity in North Dakota which is "done in cooperation with any federally designated terrorist organization that threatens (or appears to threaten) the sovereignty of the state or the USA; is a violation of criminal law and either involves violence intended to cause physical harm to intimidate lawful activity in the state or influence a political subdivision; or, involves the use of weapons of mass destruction including providing material support or obstruction for same. Unfortunately, such activity is only a class C felony—up to 5 years' imprisonment, a fine of \$10,000 or both. So, as we continue to watch these shenanigans, remember the adage—"If it walks like a terrorist, talks like a terrorist and acts like a terrorist...it's a terrorist" and, you should react appropriately. I mean better safe than sorry, right? Have a great week!

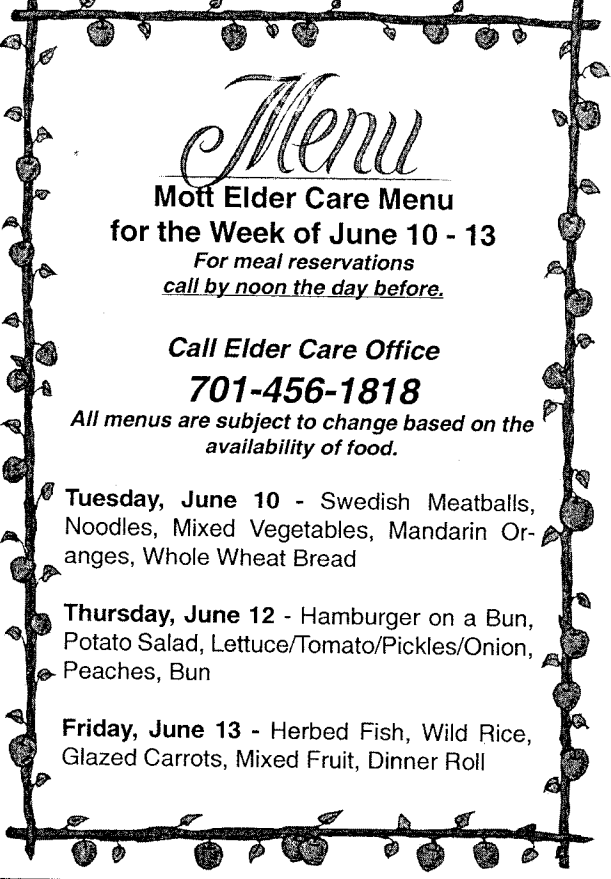

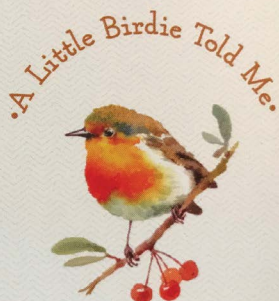

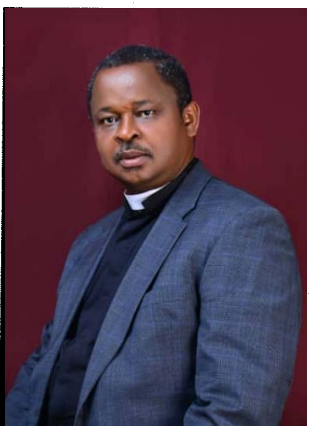
A Little Birdie Told Me

A Little Birdie Told Me: "It's A Small World After All!"

Fr. Stephen has served as Pastor in Hettinger/Scranton/Reeder and Mott/Regent New Leipzig and is now the Pastor in New Salem/Center/Almont. Fr. Stephen is from Nigeria and I first met him while working in Bowman and we have remained friends.

Fr. Stephen often visits The Dash thrift store in Hazen owned by my daughters. Two weeks ago we got a surprise visit from him but he was not his usual cheerful, joyful self we've come to know and love him for.



He explained his dear friend and brother priest Fr. Anthony Udogu also from Nigeria was playing tennis on Monday, which was his routine, collapsed and died: Fr. Anthony was only 60 years old.

The two priests met quite by chance in 1999 while Fr. Stephen was serving as a Transitional Deacon at a parish in

Largo, Maryland. Fr. Anthony visiting America for the first time: walked into a church and wanted to celebrate Mass. As it turned out Fr. Anthony was the Pastor of the church in Nigeria where Fr. Stephen's brother and family were members and knew them.

The two priests became friends and brothers. Fr. Anthony returned to the States every year to visit Fr. Stephen in every parish he has served. Fr. Stephen spent the afternoon with us at the lake, and was comforted a bit by our friendship. Experiencing grief is difficult but watching someone else grieve is almost more painful: you're grieving for yourself and for him or her.

If you are dealing with loss and grief I highly recommend a book by C.S. Lewis, A Grief Observed, written after his wife died.

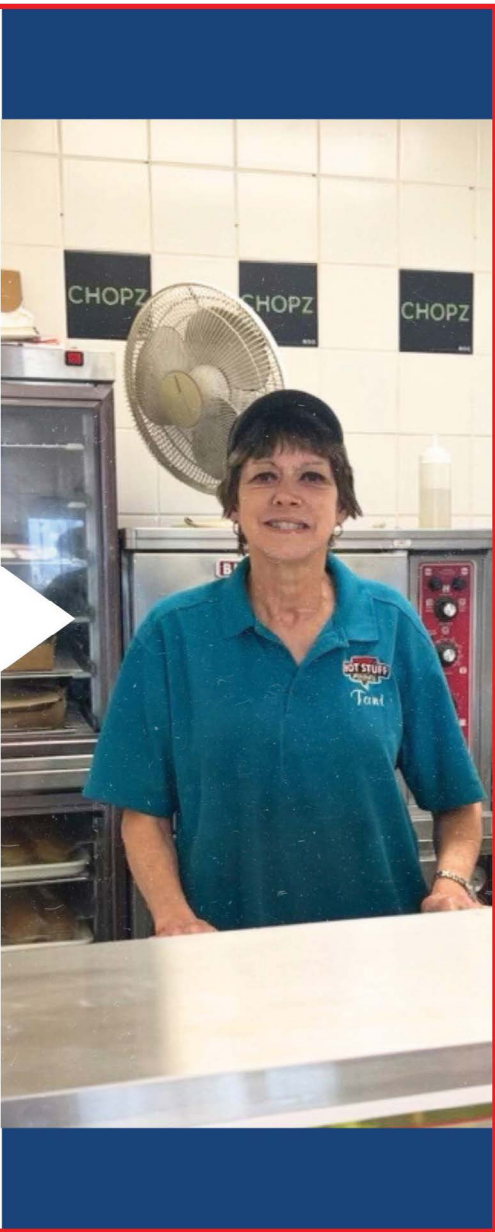

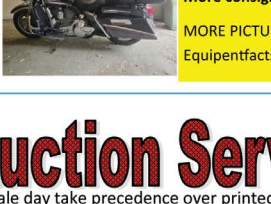

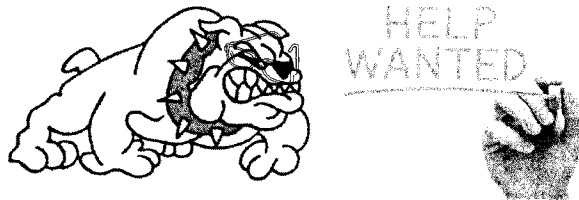

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We continue today to consider 1 Peter 2:7-8: "Therefore, to you who believe, He is precious; but to those who are disobedient, 'The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone,' and 'A stone of stumbling and a rock of offense.' They stumble, being disobedient to the word, to which they also were appoint-

ed." Previously we saw that Jesus is not precious to everyone, but is rejected by many as a stone of stumbling and rock of offense. We saw that all of us are born in rebellion against God. That anyone does believe on the Lord Jesus is the result of God's choice to make that person His own.

A striking instance of this is found in Acts 13:46-48: "Then Paul and Barnabas grew bold and said, 'It was necessary that the word of God should be spoken to you first; but since you reject it, and judge yourselves unworthy of everlasting life, behold, we turn to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us: 'I have set you as a light to the Gentiles, that you should be for salvation to the ends of the earth.'" Now when the Gentiles heard this, they were glad and glorified the word of the Lord. And as many as had been ap-

pointed to eternal life believed." Here we see why some Gentiles gladly embraced the preaching of Paul and Barnabas by believing the gospel. Very simply—they were appointed to eternal life.

This same truth is expressed in Romans 9:14-24, which would be too lengthy to quote here, but I cite a few verses: "What shall we say then? Is there unrighteousness with God? Certainly not! For He says to Moses, 'I will have mercy on whomever I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whomever I will have compassion.' So then it is not of him who wills, nor of him who runs, but of God who shows mercy.... You will say to me then, 'Why does He still find fault? For who has resisted His will?' But indeed, O man, who are you to reply against God? Will the thing formed say to him who formed

it, 'Why have you made me like this?' Does not the potter have power over the clay?" (verses 14-16, 19-21a).

Friends, this tells us that it is God's right to do as He pleases. He has to answer to no one. He has absolute sovereignty over all the universe. Man scorns this idea because man wants to be sovereign. This is why the false teaching of evolution has such widespread acceptance. It leaves God out of the picture. It lets man be in control, and not accountable to anyone. But God's Word is not afraid to tell the truth, regardless of man's reaction. The Bible would lead us to ask, "If God is the Creator of all and has the right to do as He pleases with what is His, then why does He put up with sinful, rebellious creatures?" And the answer it gives is that God is so amazingly gracious and loving that He sent His Son

into this world to die for sinners. Though He doesn't owe anything to anyone, He put forth His plan to save a people for Himself.

We whom God has blessed with salvation through faith in Christ should earnestly praise Him for having mercy on us and drawing us to Himself. But if you are not a believer in Christ, won't you ask God for His free gift of salvation? "But what if God has not chosen me?" someone might object. Friends, if you see your sin and wish to place your trust in the Lord Jesus Christ to save you, this is the best indication that you are among His chosen. You can still come to Him even now, and He will receive you. If you will ask God to pardon your sins and trust only in what Jesus did on the cross to satisfy God on your behalf, then you will be saved forever.

Duane Allen Kaitfors Death Notice

Duane Allen Kaitfors, 76, of Ft. Myers, FL, died Wednesday, May 28, 2025, of medical com-



plications in the intensive care unit in a hospital near his home. Duane was born October 6, 1948, (along with his twin sister Doreen Avis), the son of Nan-nie (Anderson) of Scranton, ND, and Lawrence Kaitfors, Ralph, SD, in Hettinger, ND. His parents farmed/ranched northwest of Ralph, SD, along with two of Lawrence's brothers Neale and Raymond. Duane and Doreen joined two older sisters, Linda (1944) and Laurel (1946). They were followed by Gail (1953) and Stan (1954), a cousin who lived with them from an early age and was considered from then on to be their younger brother. An "accidental" note - On the way to the hospital Lawrence

hit a pheasant which went right through the front window of the car and landed in the seat between Lawrence and Nan. Crazy as it may sound, after Lawrence got Nan into the hospital, he took the dead pheasant to the City Café where they cleaned and fried it for him to eat for supper! The Kaitfors clan loved music, and the radio was always on (this was before TV, cell phones, etc). Duane memorized the words to song-after-song and this continued throughout his life. He sang as he drove all over California. Nan and Lawrence also taught their children to dance in their living room, and they learned the two-step, waltz, polka, etc. In the earlier days there were community dances practically every other week in Harding County during the summertime and families were always there "cutting a rug". The family also attended Ralph Lutheran Church every Sunday, unless a major blizzard, etc, and Duane continued his faith journey. Duane and his siblings attended a one-room country school at Norbeck and then Scranton High School. Duane excelled at sports and was a member of the football and basketball teams and also ran track. In later years he also liked to go to the driving range and hit a "few" (sometimes 400) golf balls! After graduation he spent 4 years and a summer session at Black Hills State College,

Spearfish, SD, where he completed his Bachelor of Science degree in Education with an emphasis on physical education and communication. During his sophomore year he met his wife Cynthia "Cynde" Collins of Rapid City, SD. They both were members of the cast in the musical "Oklahoma". They were married in June of 1968. Immediately after graduation from Black Hills State in 1970, they moved to Ewing, NE, (a small town about the size of Scranton) where Duane began his first year of teaching and coaching high school and junior high P.E., along with speech and other classes. In his spare time, he was the head boys football coach, junior high basketball coach, track coach, and also directed the senior and junior class plays. Their son Jeremy was born in 1970 and their son Joshua in 1973. Immediately after the end of the school year in the spring of 1971, Duane retired from teaching and coaching. That fall they moved to Boulder, CO, where Duane began a career as a "new construction" painter and worked himself up to "journeyman" painter. In the fall of 1974, the family moved to Grand Island, NE, where Duane formed a partnership with a friend and began their own painting company. Life was good, but too much spray painting, lacquering, etc. was getting the best of his health so once again he made a career change. In August of 1975 the fam-

ily moved to Fresno, CA, (following his in-laws who had moved there the year before). Duane began an insurance and financial apprenticeship with the "California Farmers Insurance Company". It all worked well, and for the next 14 years he covered the Central San Joaquin Valley counties, Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo regions, working with farmers and ranchers. Duane was voted "District Manager of the Year" and had 10 agents working for him. In 1992 he left California Farmers Insurance Co. and began his own independent insurance firm "Kaitfors Insurance Company". In recent years he expanded his business to many different states and currently was a full-time resident of Ft. Myers, FL. Duane and his wife Cynde divorced in 2004. She remarried and still resides in California. Their son Jeremy is married to Shannon and they live in Kingsburg, CA. Jeremy has two daughters, Kaleigh and Kaitlyn. Joshua lives in Fresno, CA with his wife Tara. He has one daughter, Jayden. Duane said, "I am a very proud grandpa"!!! In October 2010 Duane had open heart surgery in Fresno to replace an aortic valve. Doreen flew out and stayed with Duane for 3 weeks to help during his recovery. He and his sons were able to go to Buffalo, SD, for the funeral of his dad Lawrence in December. Over the years Duane made

numerous trips back "home" to South Dakota, where he loved to visit his parents, family and friends. He enjoyed helping with projects on the ranch, attended local and family gatherings and Sunday church services at Ralph Lutheran or Grand River Lutheran in Buffalo where he always visited with everyone. Later, when his parents moved to Buffalo, he flew to Denver many times, where Doreen lived. She'd pick him up at the airport with the car packed and ready to go and he'd jump into the car and they would drive to Buffalo, where they'd spend a week or two with family. His sister Linda said, "We were always happy to "hang out" with Duane when he came and "sad" to see him leave when he went back to California or Florida". Duane also suffered some devastating injuries from a car accident, resulting in major health issues. In March 2012 while driving through an intersection, his car was hit by an SUV traveling at a high rate of speed. Duane was flown by helicopter to the Community Regional Medical Center Trauma Unit. He suffered a broken leg, fractured ribs, punctured lung, and heart damage, followed by hospitalization, operations and a long recovery time at home. On Halloween of 2016 his car was hit in an intersection in Florida by a male driver in a pickup who had tried to run a red light. Duane was transported by ambulance to the hospital with very high blood pressure

and a damaged shoulder. He later had two more hospitalizations for heart surgeries. Duane is survived by his 2 sons Jeremy and Joshua and their families; sisters - Linda (Wally) Stephens, Buffalo, SD, Laurel (Steve) Merkwon, Gayville, SD, Doreen (Don) Hazledine, Belle Fourche, SD, Gail (Rick) Tysdal, Spearfish, SD; 1 brother - Stan (Therese Scherrer) Kaitfors, Santa Rosa, CA; several nieces, nephews, cousins; and friends and clients who stated Duane was the most helpful, kind, and nicest man they'd ever met! He was preceded in death by his parents, Nan and Lawrence Kaitfors, his in-laws, Sam and Jean Collins, and several aunts, uncles and cousins. According to his wishes, Duane will be cremated, and a family service and burial will be held at a later date at the Ralph Lutheran Church and Cemetery.

More Than Marching Project Celebrates Success with Community Support

LEMMON, SD — The Grand River Arts Council's "More Than Marching" western dance program successfully concluded in February, bringing veteran-focused arts programming to the community through a \$20,000 Creative Forces Community

Challenge Grant.

The program ran from September 2024 through February 2025, offering five dance workshops and five community dances with live bands at American Legion Post #66. The Grand River Arts Council (GRAC) members Julie Goeres and Judy Larson identified a need for veteran programming and growing interest in western dancing when applying for the federal grant in winter 2023.

"When Julie came to me about dances and classes, I was skeptical about the num-

ber of bands being scheduled," said Jerry R. Mattern, Legion Manager at the time. "(But it worked), I like it when a plan comes together. THANK YOU FROM POST 66!! To all that were involved in setting this up and doing the hard work of running the program and making it successful. Also a Gigantic THANK YOU!! To all of the sponsors and bands for doing a wonderful job and supporting this. It was a great community event."

The program brought significant community impact: 62 students registered for dance classes with instructor Cindy Kahl, 53% of participants came from out of town, and the Legion saw an 80% sales increase during events. Six different local or regional bands performed throughout the series, with Zayda Rose Photos documenting the kick off dance and dance workshop!

"We connected with arts organizations working with military-connected communities on projects ranging from pottery to memoir writing to choreographed dance," Larson said.
