#### Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have spent quite a bit of time of 1 Peter 1:2: "Elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace be multiplied." This verse is packed with meaning, and I am sure we've barely scratched the surface. Last time we saw that obedience is a necessary result of election. Here in our verse this refers specifically to obedience to the truth of the gospel-or faith in Christ alone for salvation. Today we come to the phrase "and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ." Obedience, as far as God is concerned, is only found in those who have been sprinkled with the blood of Jesus Christ.


Sprinkling of blood is an obvious allusion to the Old Testament ritual of sprinkling the people of Israel with the blood of the animal sacrifices in order to set them apart as the special people of God. We read in Hebrews 9:19-22, "For when Moses had spoken every precept to all the people according to the law, he took the blood of calves and goats, with water, scarlet wool, and hyssop, and sprinkled both the book itself and all the people, saying, 'This is the blood of the covenant which God has commanded you.' Then likewise he sprinkled with blood both the tabernacle and all the vessels of the ministry. And according to the law almost all things are purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no

The writer of Hebrews tells us that without the shedding of blood, there is no remission of sins. Yet, he also tells us in Hebrews 10:4 that the blood of the animal sacrifices could not take away sin. So why did Moses sprinkle the people with animal blood? By doing so, Moses was picturing the blood that Jesus would shed on the cross. And so the writer of Hebrews goes on to say in Hebrews 12:24 that believers have come "to Jesus the Mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling."

Friend, are you sprinkled

with the blood of Jesus Christ?

In other words, are you trusting in His payment for sin on the cross to make you right with God? All other religions of the world are telling people how they might establish a relationship with God by something they do. But it will never work. It cannot work. Those poor people will never know the comfort of forgiveness of their sins and the cleansing of a guilty conscience. For the only way to become right with God is through the way He Himself has provided in the death of His Son. Are you relying on yourself or upon the Lord Jesus? If you are relying upon Jesus, then your sins are forgiven. Jesus paid in full the penalty for them. And if you are relying upon Jesus, then your life is going to change. God will be at work in you. The Holy Spirit will be changing your way of viewing God, yourself, and all of life. And you can look forward to an eternity of joy in heaven. Please be sure that this most important issue has been settled for you.



#### Thoughts for the Week

I saw a sign that had been hung on a box of decorative apples in a hobby store that said: 'don't eat these, they are not edible' and right below it was a statement by the person that wrote it saying: I can't believe that I have to write this. Is it possible that in our world that even the simplest things must be explained to prevent harm as if we do not, people will either do what they shouldn't or worse vet, sue the store for not telling them? I would like to say not. but I am thinking more and more that our society has become so accustomed to having people tell them what to do and think. that it is necessary

Growing up in North Dakota, I would like to think that we have done a better job of educating our children as to what is harmful and what is not, but I am also amazed at what I hear in the news, even in our little less populated state. Too many people seem to think that if we are not told it is wrong for us, then we should still do it, even if we know it is wrong, and if we get hurt, then we can always sue somebody and get loads of cash. So if we are stupid enough to eat a plastic decorative apple and get sick from it, even though we know it is not edible, but if someone didn't post it, now we should sue the store for not telling us and maybe we can sue the manufacturer of the decorative fruit as it should be stamped unedible. Does this sound as stupid to you as it does to me?

I realize that some things we did as children were not always safe. We did what others did and played with what we had. We used sticks to play fight with, we slid down hot metal slides, we played with toys that were metal and had sharp edges and we survived. We had bb guns and didn't 'shoot our eye out' but probably a few windows got broken that shouldn't have. We played in mud and we ate school glue, and we drank from water hoses and possibly from stock tanks. We got dirty on a regular basis and we had fun, and mostly we didn't get more than a few scrapes and scratches. Most of us when we were growing up, were taught simple jobs to do, we helped to feed chickens and cows, we swept out graneries and some of us were taught to drive by our Dads with a tractor, first standing beside him and seeing how the gears worked and then sitting in front of him as he worked the pedals and we learned to

steer. Young boys on the farm quite often learned to drive the smaller tractors to grade vards and other things, graduating to larger equipment to help out on the farm. I wonder how many do these things now.

However it is, there is a matter of common sense, and I am not sure how we strayed so far from that to the unbelievably strange situation that we are now in. If you know that a stove is hot or that a liquid that is poured from a pot from that stove into a cup that is given to you, is it the stove or the cup

that is at fault if you accidentally spill that liquid in your lap? Or is it that you did something that you should not have done, and must accept responsibility for the fact that you should have known better if you get burned? One of the first things my mother had to teach me, since we had a wood burning stove, was the word 'hot' so that I would not get burned on it. So who do we blame if a child is not taught what they need to know? Should we then blame an inanimate object? Or is it more likely that we should know that children should be taught basics of life when they are small and also to be taught to take responsibility for their own actions. That would make them a responsible person with the capabilities of accepting what is right and wrong and not blaming others for their own mistakes. If more people would start with those little things, maybe then the bigger things would also proceed from that point. Perhaps then more people would not eat the inedible fruit and we would not have to post the signs that say to stay away from it, and feel silly while doing it. God Bless you






