Joe and Annie, sat up late one evening watching an old movie. They loved the old times, for it seemed like now - - well - - family gone - snow - snow - prices - - so much to worry about, so they dug out their old DVR and popped in a good movie every nite. Joe popped in - - Annie hollered - “Cinderella you know I never liked that movie” - - it started - - “Oh well lets watch it tonight.” “Hump, you know Cinderella shoes will never fit me,” she screamed. So Joe put in another movie - - they watched and eventually said their good nights and went to bed.

That night, unbeknown to man they both went to sleep thinking of how perfect life could be if only Cinderellas shoe would fit. This is the story they matched to see how they both felt, the shoes they tried on, and realized their shoes were winning ones.

Here is the story they told their children.

Joe began - - “Put in Cinderella movie - mom didn't want to watch so watched something else - went to sleep and began to dream - -.

We were invited to a party - - everyone in community was there, farmers, ranchers, bankers, lawyers, city crew, garbage man - - widows, you name it - they were there. Mom took over - - “Had a good nights sleep - - woke in morning - - dad already taking care of cattle didn't have time to plough snow - - had to shovel to get to car - - walked into job - - phone ringing, computer locked up, called company, tried to fix over phone, customers wanting bills, looking for special papers we printed yesterday, where are they, I know I put them - - exhausted day at work - what next - -.”

“Have to get rid of these terrible shoes, so ran back to get different pair - - put on another pair - - oh they felt so good - warm - - walked outside and - - bam - - snowing - - exhausted I climbed into the snow remover - - street after street I cleaned - - looking back it was a hard day but the city looked good- - went to sleep feeling OK - - woke in morning - - streets were again packed with snow. ‘Not again I yelled,’ - - day after day this went on never a rest - - snow, snow, snow - - all I saw - - If only I had my own shoes I screamed.”

Alarm went off - - **time** to get up - - sat up in bed and there sat my shoes - - I jumped out of bed, hugged my shoes - - and everyday as I put on my shoes I try to do the very best right where my shoes take me - cuz I know that at one **time** or another we all think - IF ONLY - -.

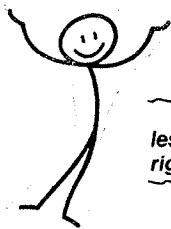

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have come in the remarkable story of the prophet Jonah to chapter three, having seen last week Jonah's prayer

of repentance and God's delivering him from the belly of the great fish. Jonah 3:1: "Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah the second time." The first nine words here are an exact repetition of the opening words of the book, and Jonah is right back where he started. God is giving His disobedient prophet a second chance to obey.

Now it would be a mistake to think that there will always be a second chance when we disobey God. Consider, for instance, the case of the prophet who was told not to turn back or eat with anyone in the place to where God was sending him, and he disobeyed God's command. We read in 1 Kings 13:20-23, "Now it happened, as they sat at the table, that the word of the LORD came to the prophet who had brought him back; and he cried out to the man of God who came from Judah, saying, 'Thus says the LORD: "Because you have disobeyed the word of the LORD, and have not kept the commandment which the LORD your God commanded you, but you came back, ate bread, and drank water in the place of which the LORD said to you, 'Eat no bread and drink no water,' your corpse shall not come to the tomb of your fathers.'" So it was, after he had eaten bread and after he had drunk, that he saddled the donkey for him, the prophet whom he had brought back. When he was gone, a lion met him on the road and killed him. And his corpse was thrown on the road."

But though there may not always be a second chance to obey, for believers in the Lord Jesus Christ there is always forgiveness. God says that through Christ He will remove our sins as far as the East is from the West (Psalm 103:12). God forgives and never holds a thing against the believer because He has been satisfied for those sins by the blood of Christ.

Consider who is it that God uses to do His work. Is it not saved, forgiven sinners? Who has been the instrument of leading more people to Christ than the apostle Paul? Yet that man was once called Saul of Tarsus and was zealously persecuting Christians before he became one himself. And think of John Newton, whose writings and hymns have been a blessing to so many through the centuries. He once commanded a ship that brought many captives into cruel slavery. Is not every preacher and missionary and gospel witness a testimony to the amazing grace of God? Is He not constantly demonstrating the "exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness towards us by Jesus Christ" (Ephesians 2:7)? Forgiven sinners make the best pleaders for others to become forgiven sinners. Friend, are you a forgiven sinner? Are you relying only on what Christ accomplished on the cross to make you right with God? If not, please do not put off that eternally important matter. As an unknown Christian wrote, "We often hear, 'Life is short; better enjoy it.' How about, 'Eternity is long; better prepare for it?'"

There is one more word that comes at the end of Jonah 3:1, noted above, which I will now include: "Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah the second time, saying." Lord willing, next time we shall consider what the Lord said to Jonah.



"RED Barns"

As American as 'Yummy Apple Pie' are pictures of cute "RED Barns" set against the lush green grass, or within the surrounds of a secured corral for livestock. How did this custom come into being? There are numerous stories concerning the rusty red color of early-day barns. Originally, barns weren't painted at all.

The early inhabitants of the New England Colonies lacked the financial funds to paint their farms. But by the late 1700s 'Farmers' started looking for ways to shield their barns' wood from the weather's elements. So they began experimenting to find ways to make their own protective paint. They sought an affordable method to safeguard their wood barn structures.

The New England Colony 'Farmers' created a recipe consisting of skimmed milk, lime, and ferric red iron oxide (rust). This combination made a red, rusty-colored, plastic-like mixture that became popular because it was cheap to make and lasted for years. 'Farmers' were able to easily obtain the rusty-colored, red iron oxide-compound that lends natural red clay its coppery color from the soil. Rust was plentiful on the New England Colony Farms because it killed fungi and mosses that might grow on barns, and it was very effective as a sealant. Linseed oil (orange-colored) derived from flax plants was also used to seal bare wood against rotting, and it stained the wood a dark coral hue. Barns remained

warmer in the Winter because of the coating's darker color which absorbed the Sun's rays and provided better protection, most assuredly- more than the plain-unpainted, bare tan wood. Soon after, manufacturers started using chemical pigments to create paint, because it was the least expensive. After that, "RED Barns" spread in popularity becoming an American Tradition that continues to this day. "RED Barns" look GOOD!

In closing, I'll mention that in the late 1800s, in addition to red paint, it became popular to paint barns with other color schemes, especially those designed to complement the architectural styles and finishes of the farm owner's house. These included various hues of greens, yellows, and browns. White paint was frequently applied to barns and houses as well.

But red paint remained popular on many farms because it was the most affordable. In 1922 the Sears, Roebuck Catalog offered red barn paint for just \$1.43 per gallon, while other colors of house paints sold for at least \$2.25 per gallon - nearly twice as much. "RED Barns" look GOOD!

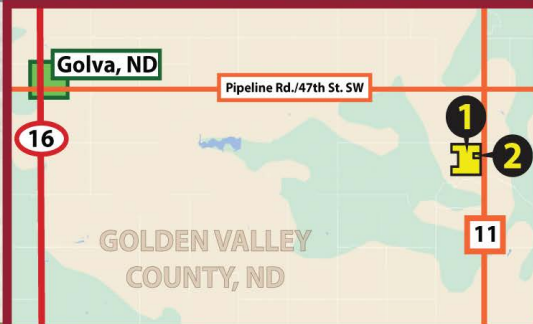

National Agriculture Week



National Agriculture Month

March is National Agriculture Month while National Ag day is March 21 during Agriculture Week.

National Ag Day was founded by the Agriculture Council of America in 1973 to promote agriculture and the first National Ag day was celebrated in 1979 in Washington DC. The organization is now 50 years old.

Most people don't understand the contribution of agriculture to our lives. Everything we eat, use, or wear every day is provided by agriculture as well as offering many employment opportunities. Less than 2 million people in our country are directly employed in the ag sector but about 22 million are employed in the industry.

American farmers produce abundant, healthy, nutritious and safe food for their families and the world. U.S. farmers are among the most productive and are proud stewards of our land, water and air while leading the way in conservation and preserving our nation's lands. One U. S. farm now feeds 166 people annually in America and abroad. In 1960 it was just 26 people.

North Dakota leads the nation in producing dry edible beans and peas, canola, flaxseed, honey, oats, durum and spring wheat. The state is second in non-oil sunflowers—the

kind you like to eat! We are third in producing sugarbeets and barley with much of that made into cattle feed or beer.

Our state annually produces enough wheat for 15.5 billion loaves of bread; soybeans to make 483 billion crayons; potatoes for 171 million servings of french fries; beef for 100 million hamburgers; wool for 421,500 sweaters; milk for 894 million glasses; pork for 41 million pork chops; sunflowers to fill 726 million bags of seeds to eat; and corn to sweeten 45 billion cans of soda.

The crops in North Dakota generate over \$6.6 billion annually. It is the most important sector of our state's economy and leads economies in at least 48 other states as well.

Over 26% of our state are farmers and ranchers or are employed in agriculture-related businesses or industries.

Each year less of the money for your food goes to the farmer. For 2001, the farmers only received 7.4 cents of every dollar spent on food, which was down .5 cents from the previous year. Where does the rest of the money go? Food services gets 33.6%, food processing is 15.2%, retail trade is 12.7%, wholesale trade gets 10.7%, finance and insurance is 3.6%, transportation gets 3.6%, energy is 3.2%, advertising gets 3.0%, packaging gets 2.9% and all other sources get 4.0%. The farmer's share was 23 cents in 1997. It dropped to 17

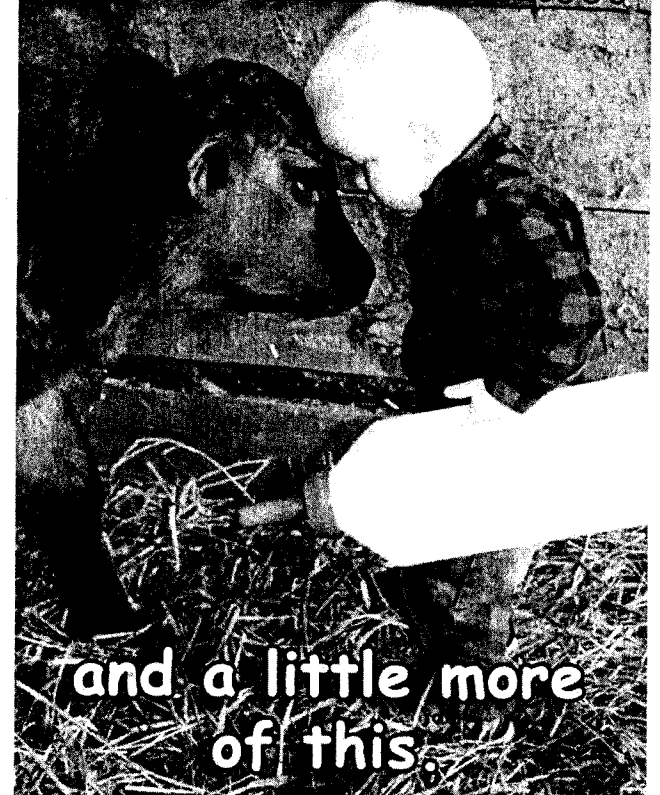
cents about a decade ago and has been going down.

The price for a bushel of wheat (60 lbs.) at this time is about \$7.78 and durum \$8.65. Prices for your foods are increasing but there is less than a nickel's worth of wheat for a farmer in the price of your loaf of bread. The cost of equipment, fertilizer, seed, chemicals and insurance has increased much more than the price of the grain. A new tractor or combine costs much more than most houses yet are used only a few months of the year.

Here are a few little known facts about things related to agriculture: A single coffee tree yields only one pound of roasted ground coffee annually. Lettuce was cultivated in 2680 B.C. in Egypt. Five pounds of potatoes have less fat than 10 roasted peanuts. Marshmallows are made from gelatin derived from animal hooves and bones. A cranberry vine can produce

berries for 150 years. Head cheese is made from a hog's head. There are 546 peanuts in a 12 ounce jar of peanut butter. Bananas, avocados, and watermelon are berries. Potatoes are native to South Africa and grown on every continent except Antarctica. Feta cheese is made from cow, sheep, or goat milk and cured in salt brine. Americans eat about 100 slices of pizza each day. Dog food is the most profitable food on the market. Yams and sweet potatoes are not the same thing. Chocolate milk was invented in Ireland. Durum makes your pasta. Canola is in your cooking oil and mayonnaise. Clothing can be made from cornstarch and ethanol also comes from corn. Soybeans are in tires, paint, foam cushions, and much more. Your food, clothing, fiber and fuel do not start in a store. Thank a farmer for their contribution to many things in your life.

High School Seniors: WRHS Foundation Healthcare Scholarship Applications Due April 1st!

If any area high school seniors are pursuing a healthcare-related degree in college this next fall, they are sure welcome to apply for our West River Healthcare Services Foundation "High School Senior Scholarships" by April 1st. Current Seniors can be pursuing a one-year, two-year or four-year healthcare-related college degree or certificate. Letters, posters and applications for the WRHS Foundation Scholarship Program have already been sent to sixteen area high school counselors/scholarship coordinators in Hettinger, Scranton, Bowman, New England, Mott, Elgin (Grant County), Richardson, Dickinson High, Dickinson Trinity, South Heart and Bel-field, ND; Baker, MT; Lemmon, Bison, Buffalo and McIntosh, SD. Of course, any graduating seniors wishing to acquire a healthcare-related degree and interested in applying, can either check with their local high school guidance counselor/scholarship coordinator or go online at wrhs.com/giving/application to find the required application materials.

By the way, did you hear the due date for scholarship applications to be submitted is April 1st? The address to submit scholarship applications is: WRHS Foundation, Attn: Ted Uecker, 1000 Highway 12, Hettinger, ND, 58639. If you have any questions or concerns regarding the scholarship application or need information, please call Ted Uecker direct at the WRHS Foundation office at 701-567-3666. We expect to receive the following from interested area senior graduates: 1) completed application, 2) high school transcript, 3) two letters of recommendation, 4) college letter of acceptance, and 5) 300 word minimum essay; describ-

ing your personal, educational and career goals; why you chose them and how you expect to achieve them; describe yourself in terms of how you see yourself and how you think others perceive you; and conclude by explaining why you would be a good candidate for this scholarship. Our hopes are to receive all applications by April 1st; review and score all applications by April 17th; make final selections by May 1st; notify recipients and applicants by May 5th; and notify area high schools/media by May 12th. Ambitious we are!

All applications are reviewed and scored by five WRHS Foundation Scholarship Committee Members. They utilize a 100 point scoring system with up to 40 points for GPA/Academics (performance in science courses given extra consideration); up to 30 points for letters of recommendation and involvement in school/community; and up to 30 points for essay. All scores are then reviewed by the WRHS Selection Committee and recipients are selected.

We have three family memorials establishing scholarships "In Memory" of Joyce Stippich, Irma Steinmetz and Lynn Feist. We also offer our Auxiliary Legacy Scholarships and General WRHS Foundation Scholarships. The Congregational Church Memorial Scholarship Fund is also available to our WRHS Foundation to help us fund scholarships for aspiring students.

The Joyce Stippich Memorial Scholarship is offered annually to area high school graduating seniors who are pursuing a Nursing degree, plan to be a full-time college student and are eventually interested in a nursing career at West River Health Services or Western Horizons Living Centers. The Stippich Family selects their own scholarship recipient(s). This scholarship amount has ranged from \$500-\$1,000 for each recipient.

The Irma Steinmetz Memorial Scholarship is offered annually to area high school graduating seniors who are pursuing a full-time healthcare-related degree. The WRHS Foundation Selection Committee determines the recipient(s). This scholarship amount has ranged from \$500-\$1,000 each.

The Lynn Feist Memorial Scholarship is offered annually to graduating high school seniors pursuing a full-time healthcare-related degree, with preference given to Lemmon, Bison, McIntosh and Faith, SD area seniors. The WRHS Foundation Selection Committee makes the selection. This scholarship

The Denim Day Scholarship has been given annually to a graduating high school senior



Maci Wehri was born and raised in Mott, ND and spent much of her time on weekends traveling to the family cattle ranch at Hebron, ND. The Wehri family raises Gelbveih cattle.
