




A Foundation for Growth and Community

Operation Epic Fury has been 46 years in the making and, once again, our public doesn't seem to have a firm grasp on what is actually going on. I first wrote about this in 2009 when my best friend Scott and I took over a college class on Shariah law when our buddy traveled to Liberia for a 6-month law enforcement tour. I had no idea about this topic since my area of expertise had been Central and South America, particularly, drug trafficking. It was Scott that had spent years dealing with the topic of radical Islam and the threat it posed to our civilian populations both here and abroad. 

called "Grandma FlyKiter" by the grandchildren she took kite flying. Her home was filled with music, and there were usually fresh flowers on her table. She adopted the neighborhood stray cat, Sarge, who made himself at home and brought companionship and snuggles. Most importantly, Betty loved her Lord. Throughout the illness that would eventually take her life, she was often found reading her little blue devotional. Betty's illness did not diminish her faith, but rather caused her faith to grow. 

Reflections on the Words of Life

Last time we saw from 1 Peter 3:9 the believer's call to love the brethren, to forgive when wronged, and to return good for evil: "Not returning evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary blessing, knowing that you were called to this, that you may inherit a blessing." The relationship Christians have with our fellow believers in Christ is indeed special, for it will endure even beyond the most intimate relationships of this life. The family of God is going to last forever.

We move on now to the next phrase in our verse: "knowing that you were called to this, that you may inherit a blessing." Friends, if you are a believer in Jesus Christ, it is because God called you. Back in 1 Peter 2:9, the apostle tells believers that God has "called you out of darkness into His marvelous light." The Bible clearly teaches that all people are born in a state of spiritual darkness and rebellion against God. But in His marvelous grace, God has effectually and irresistibly called some out of that condition, granted them the gift of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, and made them His own beloved children. And Peter tells us in our verse that every believer, as a part of his or her calling to become a child of God, is called to be a blessed person.

What kind of blessing is Peter talking about? This question is particularly relevant for our day because there are many voices being raised which teach that it is God's will for ALL believers to enjoy physical health and physical wealth and prosperity. But is that the kind of blessing that Peter is speaking about? Let us attempt to provide a careful answer to this question. In the first place, we need to realize that God does indeed take care of His children. In Philippians 4:19 we have the promise, "And my God shall supply all your needs according to His

riches in glory by Christ Jesus." But note that it does not say God will supply all that the believer WANTS. The claim made by proponents of the "health, wealth, and prosperity gospel" is that the Lord never wants His children to be sick and that He wants all of His children to be financially prosperous. Such teaching is an outright denial of other parts of the New Testament which tell us that God deliberately brings suffering into the lives of His children in order to cause them to grow spiritually and become more like Christ. I believe that the so-called health, wealth, and prosperity gospel is a serious error which is greatly disturbing many suffering believers. There are sincere believers who are seeking to live godly lives and yet are enduring physical afflictions or financial crises or persecution, and they have been told that this is because their faith is too weak. Friends, that simply is not true!

We need to understand that God certainly wants what is best for His children. And we also need to understand that God is the only One who really knows what is best for us. Every single believer in Jesus Christ is being put through a process which the New Testament calls sanctification. And a simple definition of sanctification is the process whereby God the Holy Spirit is working in each believer to make him or her like Jesus Christ.

Lord willing, we shall see more about the believer's blessedness next time. It is my hope that each one reading this has put his or her faith in the Lord Jesus Christ alone for salvation and is thus a partaker of God's choicest blessing.

"Teddy Rides Again" completed in 1993 was the second of the Enchanted Highway Sculptures to be completed by Gary Greff. Just as the Tin Family was a community project so was Teddy Rides Again. The Art Department at NDSU drew up the design to scale, farmers came and welded the pipes and sections together, North Dakota National Guard prepared the site, Regent High School Shop class constructed picnic tables and men from the community who were not welders build the four horses pulling the stage coach as well as constructing the fences located on the site. The biggest challenge for the welders was once they had the pipes welded on one side, they had to flip the sculpture over and

weld the pipe on the other side. Teddy on horse stands 51 feet tall and is built with 1 3/4 inch well pipe. The sculpture weighs over 9,000 pounds. The cost in 1993 was \$84,000 for labor and \$115,000 for materials for a total cost of \$199,000. 5,600 hours of labor over two years were dedicated to the project.

The Enchanted Highway Foundation will be featuring the sculpture Teddy Rides Again this summer to go along with the dedication of the Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library in Medora. Our slogan will be "TEDDY RIDES". You will be hearing more about the promotion in future articles.

WRHS Foundation Raises \$203,827 Leading Into and On Giving Hearts Day!

The West River Health Services Foundation entered its eighth consecutive year participating with "Giving Hearts Day," with anticipation and excitement, curious to see how this year's updates would unfold.

New guidelines introduced by the Impact Foundation significantly adjusted the timeline for matching gifts. Matching funds were eligible for donations made between October 1, 2025 and January 26, 2026. Then to "Match the Match," non-profits were only given from January 1 through February 12, 2026. In addition, the "Match the Match" opportunity was available to nonprofits from January 1 through February 12, 2026.

While the condensed timeframe created a new fundraising dynamic, the West River Health Services Foundation embraced the opportunity with energy, focus and enthusiasm.

Initially, the WRHS Foundation had thought they would go with a "43 Campaign." This included \$43,000 in Matching Funds and then trying to "Match the Match" with another \$43,000 raised in only 43 days. However, once the WRHS Foundation witnessed the terrific success of their "Giving Hearts Hoops Nights" on Jan 6 in Hettinger versus

Lemmon and January 9 in Scranton versus Bowman; plus the record-setting "Kennedy's Giving Hearts Truckload Sale" on Jan 22, the WRHS Foundation was determined to increase the matching funds to almost \$70,000.

There was still another "Giving Hearts Girl's Hoop Night" event scheduled

for February 5 in New England. Moreover, did it ever roar! The turnout was exceptional and the Greater New England, Hettinger, and Scranton communities had a ball! In fact, five of the bright red, "GIVING HEARTS DAY - ALL IN TOGETHER" game balls were auctioned off at halftime,

to the tune of \$3,600! And Legendary Freethrow for Pledges Shooter Jordyn Bender-Mason (returning to her hometown where she was a two-time ND All-State hoop star), scored ten of ten! It was a night to remember - even the elementary girls enjoyed hustling up and down the hardwood on the newly christened Daryl Jung Court at halftime of the JV game. But, oh, that

long, red-haired ref!

When the dust settled, the WRHS Foundation had raised \$203,827 through Giving Hearts Day efforts!

That total includes \$69,570 in matching funds received between October 1 and December 31, 2025, along with \$134,257 raised from January 1 through February 12 to "Match the Match."

And the generosity didn't stop there, just days after Giving Hearts Day, an additional \$15,000 was contributed, pushing the impact event further.

Generosity like this serves as a powerful reminder our local communities want top-quality healthcare close to home, just as much as we do. Onward to improving rural healthcare!
