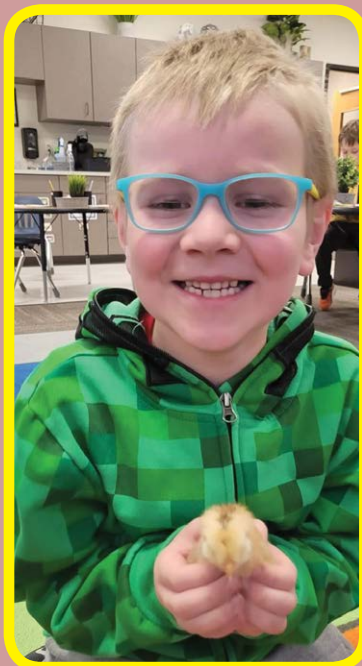

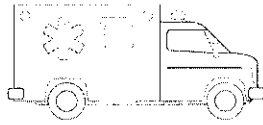

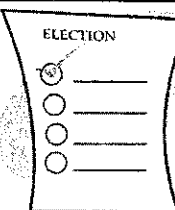

## It gets messy before it gets better

A recent home improvement project at a friend's house served as a reminder of a simple truth: things often have to get messy before they can get better. To seek relief from the repeated problem of water in the basement, my friend took on the task of installing a sump pump in the basement.

The project meant hauling in the plastic pit liner, the pump, shovels, a jackhammer and assorted other tools, a couple 5-gallon buckets of sand, several feet of plastic pipe and various other parts and pieces. It took a few trips up and down a flight of stairs and then the real work began. The floor was marked and the guys used a jackhammer to bust through the cement to the point where they could shovel the rest of the dirt out of the hole and dump it into empty buckets for hauling out of the house. The process was messy—dirt, dust, mud, stinky glue to seal the plastic pipe joints, the sweat of hard work. There was clean up to do afterward and the basement is forever changed—there's now a sump pump pit. The process was messy, but the change is

worth the mess.

Isn't that a lot like our lives? Whenever we need a change, the process is messy. First, we have to see the change we need. Then we take the steps to make it...and that's where it gets messy. Cleaning the house takes effort and action. It takes dust rags and brooms, vacuum cleaners and mop pails and time. Fixing the car is the same. There's effort involved and there is going to be a mess—greasy parts, gathering the right tools, struggling with sticky fittings, crawling under tight spaces, and trips for replacement pieces. But the end result is worth it—the car is fixed and will get you from place to place again.

The same is true of sweeping sin out of our lives. We have to see the change we need and take action to make it happen... and it gets messy. It takes effort to clean up and dig out those ideas and activities and desires that seek to keep us separated from God. It is hard work to keep

our tongues from tearing into the latest gossip. It takes sweat and discipline to make good choices about healthy living when sweet temptations line our way and giving into our desires seems irresistible. It makes our hearts pound and our hands clammy to think of taking a step toward reconciling and healing a fractured relationship with a friend or family member. There's a long list of unpleasant things we'd rather do than humbling ourselves before someone we have wronged and seeking forgiveness.

But the end result is worth it. The Apostle Paul reminds us of this when he writes, "God has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins (Colossians 1:13-14)." When we seek to change and turn away from sin we hear those gracious words of God: you are forgiven... and the change is worth it—our relationship with God is renewed, restored.

But like keeping up a home or a vehicle, we're never done;

there's always more projects to tackle, more maintenance to do. Our relationship with God

needs maintenance, it needs work. We have the tools to take on the task. Our tools are worship, prayer, scripture study and acts of service. It gets messy—we have to take the time to use the tools but the end result is worth it: our faith deepens and

our relationship with God grows and guides our daily living. Our struggle with sin will always be messy but we're not in it alone. We have each other... and we have God... and there's nothing else we need. Amen.

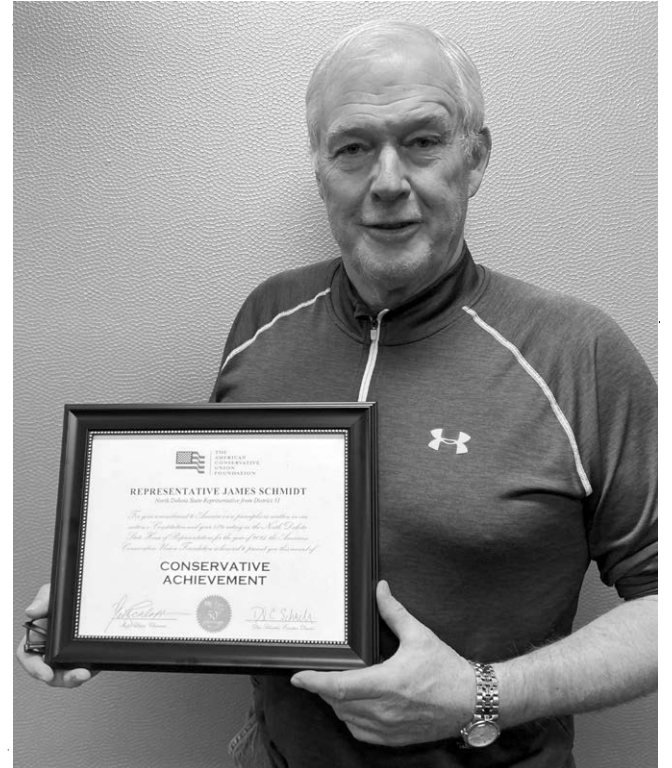


## Rep. Jim Schmidt Recognized for Conservative Achievement

## Rites Held for Marian Crook

Memorial Services for Marian Crook were held on May 14, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. at the First Lutheran Church in Rhame, ND. Burial followed in the Tuttle Cemetery, Rhame, ND. Fellowship followed at the Bowman Lodge where the family will be staying.



Marian Crook, 89, Mandan, spent one last night with her three daughters at Sanford in Bismarck before passing away peacefully in her sleep Monday, February 21, 2022, in true North Dakota form, in the midst of a blizzard.

Marian Magdalene (Silbernagel) Crook was born in the Rhame, ND, hospital, located above the bank, on January 6, 1933, the fifth daughter of Christian Anton (Andy) and Lillian (Hovick) Silbernagel.

Marian was raised on her parents' farm, just down the

road from her grandparents' Deep Creek Township homestead in Slope County in southwest North Dakota and was somewhat of a prodigy. She started school at the age of four because the teacher in the one-room Harmony School in Deep Creek Township wanted a girl in the school that, at the time, had only boys. During her second and third grade years, she boarded with the teacher in the school, returning to the farm on weekends and holidays and during the summer.

The Harmony School closed at the end of Marian's third grade year, and she moved to a one-room school in nearby Cash Township, where she attended and boarded with the teacher the next two years. She went to sixth grade in Rhame, and when the Deep Creek School re-opened in her seventh grade year, she went back to school there, and by then she was driving a car, so she did not have to board with the teacher anymore.

She learned to drive her parents' Model A Ford when she was about 8 years old, and by age 10 she was driving the tractor and helping her dad in the field. She later said her back troubles in her old age were a result of lifting 5-gallon gas cans to put gas in the tractor when she was 10 years old. Although she was the youngest of five

girls, she was her dad's "hired man" while her sisters spent their time "prettying up," and she drove the tractor until her last years in Slope County.

She graduated from Rhame High School at age 16 and enrolled in business school in Rapid City. While she lived there, she auditioned and was chosen for membership in the prestigious Paha Sapa Women's Choir, which toured all over South Dakota performing for large audiences. She and her lifelong pal Helen Brown had many adventures over the years.

When she finished school, she moved to the state of Washington, where her older sisters lived, and where she worked and cared for the Silbernagel grandkids. There she met a handsome soldier from Mississippi named Garland Crook, stationed at Fort Worden, and they were married in 1952.

They moved back to the farm north of Rhame after their wedding and Garland's discharge from the Army, but when the Korean War broke out, Garland re-enlisted, and they spent much of the next 20 years living around the country and the world, including several years on the island of Okinawa.

When Garland retired, they once again came back to North Dakota to the farm to allow "Mom and Dad" to retire, by this time with four children, Sarah, Andy, Lillian, and Thomas, in tow, and a fifth soon to be born. Sadiy, their marriage ended after those hard years on the farm, and Marian and her youngest daughter, Beckie, moved to Dickinson, where Marian earned her nursing degree. She said she had always wanted to be a nurse, but when she got out of high school she wasn't old enough to get into nursing school, and then she fell in love and followed her soldier husband around the world. During their Army years in El Paso and on the farm near Rhame, she was a LPN, and cared for many people at the nearby Bowman Hospital. At age 50 she went back to school and earned her RN degree.

After graduation, she and Beckie moved to Grand Forks, ND, where she worked as a nurse at United Hospital until her retirement. In her early retirement years, she moved around the country to provide child care for her grandchildren, before finally settling in Mandan, where she lived at Liberty Heights for many years, and Edgewood Vista, and for the last few years

she enjoyed entertaining the staff and watching the birds at her many feeders outside her window at Sunset Drive Nursing Home. She could name them all. She loved chocolate and she had a generous heart to the end. For a time she lived just down the hall at Sunset from her sister, Junette Henke, her longtime pinocle partner, until Junette's death in 2020. They were a mean pinocle team.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her four sisters, and her grandson Craig Charles McLaughlin II. Surviving her are her children, Sarah (Craig) McLaughlin, Andy Crook, Lillian Crook (Jim Fuglie), Thomas (Betty) Crook, and Beckie (Jason) Walby; grandchildren and their spouses, Eric (Carrie) Crook, Christina (Chris) Lowe, Kathleen McLaughlin (Jesse) Richardson, Tommy (Whitney) Crookson, Lisa Cassarly, Matthew (Jaimee) McLaughlin, Michael McLaughlin, Chelsea and Rachel Sorenson, Duncan and Loren Crook, and Jacob (fiancée Ashley Wanner) and Ryan Walby, and many great-grandchildren, and one great-great grandson.

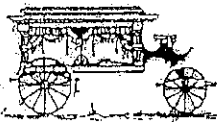

## Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

For the past few weeks we have been leading up to learning the content of King Nebuchadnezzar's second troubling dream. Last time we saw that after his so-called wise men in Babylon were unable to interpret the dream, he finally turned to Daniel. The king tells Daniel that the focal point of his dream was a huge tree that filled the earth and reached to the heavens. It was beautiful and fruitful, and it provided food and protection for all who came under it.

But suddenly the pleasant vision changed. Nebuchadnezzar describes this as follows: "I saw in the visions of my head while on my bed, and there was a watcher, a holy one, coming down from heaven. He cried aloud and said thus: 'Chop down the tree and cut off its branches, strip off its leaves and scatter its fruit. Let the beasts get out from under it, and the birds from its branches. Nevertheless leave the stump and roots in the earth, bound with a band of iron and bronze, in the tender grass of the field. Let it be wet with the dew of heaven, and let him graze with the beasts on the grass of the earth. Let his heart be changed from that of a man, let him be given the heart of a beast, and let seven times pass over him. This decision is by the decree of the watchers, and the sentence by the word of the holy ones, in order that the living may know that the Most High rules in the kingdom of men, gives it to whomever He will, and sets over it the lowest of men'" (Daniel 4:13-17).

Daniel's reaction was total astonishment. No doubt Nebuchadnezzar realized that this did not bode well for him, yet he urged Daniel to explain the dream. Daniel's answer is a remarkable combination of genu-

ine love for souls and extraordinary courage that would give to this king who had revealed how ruthless he could be, the unadulterated truth. Nebuchadnezzar is the tree who at the time was flourishing in his kingdom, but he was going to learn a lesson as few ever have. God was going to afflict him with lycanthropy. This is a disease in which a person so imagines himself to be a wild animal, that he actually lives like one. Nebuchadnezzar would, like the tree in the dream, be chopped down in his prime and go out and make his dwelling among the animals of the field. He would eat grass like the oxen and remain in that condition for a period described as "seven times." Quite a humbling thing, especially for the ruler of the world. The purpose for this is that Nebuchadnezzar might submit to the absolute sovereignty of God. In a moment, the God who is sovereign would divest him of all his regal glory and reduce him to a beast. But even in this solemn message of judgment, there is a ray of hope and a note of mercy given. When Nebuchadnezzar is finally humbled and realizes that he is but a creature of the sovereign God, then God will restore his kingdom.

Daniel concludes the interpretation with a word of personal counsel. He advises the king to "stop sinning, be righteous, and to show mercy to the poor." This is nothing less than a call to repentance.

As horrible as what lay ahead for Nebuchadnezzar was, much better to go through that than through an eternity in hell. God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble. Friend, if you have never humbled yourself and repented of your sin and believed on the Lord Jesus Christ as your Savior, won't you do so now? God will forgive all who sincerely come to Him through Jesus Christ. For Christ came to save proud sinners.

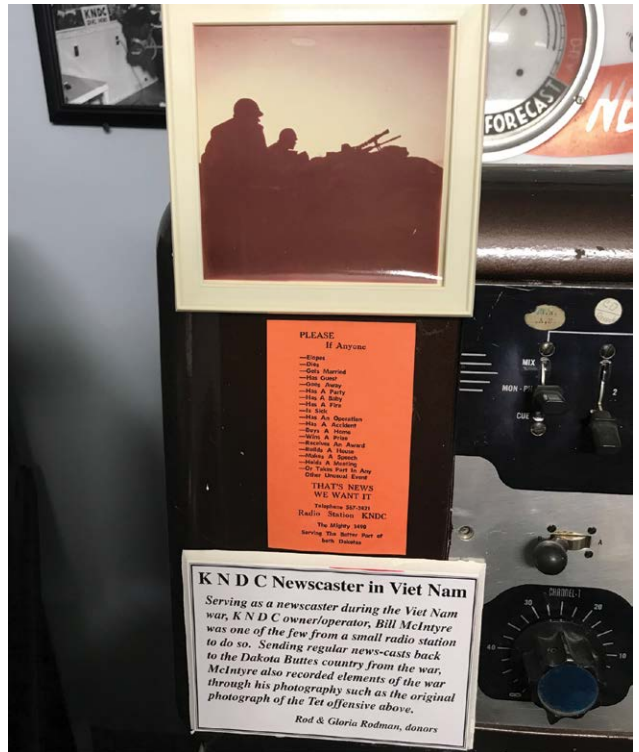


**A Little Birdie Told Me**

A Little Birdie Told Me: "Dakota Buttes Museum is a Must

See!" Hettinger ND is home to the Dakota Buttes Museum: Operated by the Dakota Buttes Historical Society, the official historical society of Adams County ND.

Dakota Buttes Museum is located in four redesigned and refurbished buildings. History comes to life in the well lit, clean and beautifully displayed items of the past. Bonnie Smith one of the several volunteers provided me with a tour, highlighting some of the museums most unique treasures.



Hettinger is home to the radio station KNDC. The radio station control panel is one of the museum's most interesting displays. Bill McIntyre owner/operator of KNDC was a Vietnam War newscaster. McIntyre sent newscasts back to Dakota Buttes country and recorded elements of the war through photography: An original photo of the Tet Offensive is proudly displayed along with his Uniform.

Ole Abelseth Titanic Survivor made his home near Hettinger as a shepherd. Olaus Jorgenson Abelseth (Ole) was born on a farm in Orskog, Norway in 1886. After arriving in America in 1902 or 1903 he started a livestock farm in Perkins County SD in 1908. He returned to Norway in 1911 to visit his family he returned to America on the Titanic in 1912. Ole would be one the 705 survivors

of the fated Titanic: 1522 souls were lost to the sea on April 4th, 1912. News articles, photos and interviews with Ole are on display in the Titanic exhibit a must see for any Titanic enthusiast.

"Dakota Buttes Historical Society/Museum works to discover, collect, preserve, display and make available to the public representative items and materials that illustrate the life and time of the area." The museum
