As some of the fairies were romping around one of the Faires caught his tiny foot in the grass. Others came along,



A recent home improvement project at a friend's house served as a reminder of a simple truth: things often have to get messy before they can get better. To seek relief from the repeated problem of water in the basement, my friend took on the task of installing a sump pump in the basement.

The project meant hauling in the plastic pit liner, the pump, shovels, a jackhammer and assorted other tools, a couple

worth the mess. Isn't that a lot like our lives?

It takes sweat and discipline to make good choices about healthy living when sweet temptations line our way and giving into our desires seems irresistible. It makes our hearts pound and our hands clammy to think of taking a step toward reconciling and healing a fractured relationship with a friend or family member. There's a long list of. unpleasant things we'd rather do than humbling ourselves before someone we have wronged and seeking forgiveness.

But the end result is worth it. The Apostle Paul reminds us of this when he writes, "God has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins (Colossians 1:13-14)." When we seek to change and turn away from sin we hear those gracious words of God: you are forgivthere's always more projects to tackle, more maintenance to do. Our relationship with God

needs maintenance, it needs work. We have the tools to take on the task. Our tools are worship, prayer, scripture study and acts of service. It gets messy we have to take the time to use the tools but the end result is worth it: our faith deepens and our relationship with God grows and guides our daily living. Our struggle with sin will always be messy but we're not in it alone. We have each other.... and we have God.... and there's nothing else we need. Amen.


"We had fun cleaning and


seeing the wildlife along the trail." Jaden Steiner as she told the story of ducks flying up off the river.



Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

For the past few weeks we have been leading up to learning the content of King Nebuchadnezzar's second troubling dream. Last time we saw that after his so-called wise men in Babylon were unable to interpret the dream, he finally turned to Daniel. The king tells Daniel that the focal point of his dream was a huge tree that filled the earth and reached to the heavens. It was beautiful and fruitful. and it provided food and protection for all who came under it.

But suddenly the pleasant vision changed. Nebuchadnezzar describes this as follows: "I saw in the visions of my head while on my bed, and there was a watcher, a holy one, coming down from heaven. He cried aloud and said thus: 'Chop down the tree and cut off its branches, strip off its leaves and scatter its fruit. Let the beasts get out from under it, and the birds from its branches. Nevertheless leave the stump and roots in the earth, bound with a band of iron and bronze, in the tender grass of the field. Let it be wet with the dew of heaven, and let him graze with the beasts on the grass of the earth. Let his heart be changed from that of a man, let him be given the heart of a beast, and let seven times pass over him. This decision is by the decree of the watchers, and the sentence by the word of the holy ones, in order that the living may know that the Most High rules in the kingdom of men, gives it to whomever He will, and sets over it the lowest of men" (Daniel 4:13-17).


Daniel's reaction was total astonishment. No doubt Nebuchadnezzar realized that this did not bode well for him, yet he urged Daniel to explain the dream. Daniel's answer is a remarkable combination of genu-

ine love for souls and extraordinary courage that would give to this king who had revealed how ruthless he could be, the unadulterated truth. Nebuchadnezzar is the tree who at the time was flourishing in his kingdom, but he was going to learn a lesson as few ever have. God was going to afflict him with lycanthropy. This is a disease in which a person so imagines himself to be a wild animal, that he actually lives like one. Nebuchadnezzar would, like the tree in the dream, be chopped down in his prime and go out and make his dwelling among the animals of the field. He would eat grass like the oxen and remain in that condition for a period described as "seven times." Quite a humbling thing, especially for the ruler of the world. The purpose for this is that Nebuchadnezzar might submit to the absolute sovereignty of God. In a moment, the God who is sovereign would divest him of all his regal glory and reduce him to a beast. But even in this solemn message of judgment, there is a ray of hope and a note of mercy given. When Nebuchadnezzar is finally humbled and realizes that he is but a creature of the sovereign

kingdom. Daniel concludes the interpretation with a word of personal counsel. He advises the king to "stop sinning, be righteous, and to show mercy to the poor.' This is nothing less than a call to repentance.

God, then God will restore his

As horrible as what lay ahead for Nebuchadnezzar was, much better to go through that than through an eternity in hell. God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble. Friend, if you have never humbled yourself and repented of your sin and believed on the Lord Jesus Christ as your Savior, won't you? do so now? God will forgive all who sincerely come to Him through Jesus Christ. For Christ

McIntyre sent newscasts back to Dakota Buttes country and recorded elements of the war through photography: An original photo of the Tet Offensive is proudly displayed along with his Uniform.

Ole Abelseth Titanic Survivor made his home near Hettinger as a sheepherder. Olaus Jorgenson Abelseth (Ole) was born on a farm in Orskog, Norway in 1886. After arriving in America in 1902 or 1903 he started a livestock farm in Perkins County SD in 1908 He returned to Norway in 1911 to visit his family he returned to America on the Titanic in 1912. Ole would be one the 705 survivors

Mott - 701-824-2605 - Bowman - 701-523-4577 of the fated Titanic: 1522 souls were lost to the sea on April 4th, 1912. News articles, photos and interviews with Ole are on display in the Titanic exhibit a must see for any Titanic enthusiast.




