

Recently I've been amazed, overwhelmed, and almost disgusted by the number of choices we have in the grocery store and literally everywhere else. Yesterday I had a pedicure, a little treat for Mother's Day, and the first thing I'm asked, "What color do you want?" Lying on the table are hundreds of color choices: according to Google just one nail polish company can have over 200 color choices.

Bottled water, sodas, energy drinks, and coffee just the choices at the gas station are more than I can take. The number of bottled water companies is 2,735 in the United States alone!

The bottled water craze started in the 1970's with a valuation of \$348.64 BILLION in 2024 and a projection of around \$500 BILLION by 2030! It's still JUST water! Breakfast cereal



choices went from 160 in 1970 to 340 by 1998 and now we have over FIVE THOUSAND choices!

It's not just food: cars, appliances, furniture, clothing- it goes on and on!

We are about to start the plumbing in our addition and just trying to pick a toilet has my head spinning: round bowl, elongated bowl, tall, short, white, off-white or a multitude of other color options, ranging from \$100 to \$1,000.

Managing thrift stores for the past 25 years has amplified by anxiety over the number of choices we have on any given day, maybe if we had fewer choices, we'd be more content with what we have. Instead, we are always wanting the next best thing and that only satisfies us until something better comes along, but where does it end?

Participating communities holding citywide rummage sales include St. Anthony, Flasher, Carson, Elgin, New Leipzig, Mott, Regent and New England. Heil typically has sales and rural residents are welcome to host sales, too.

Anyone holding a sale is encouraged to stay open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. MT both days. Those who plan to have their sale during different hours should state those hours on the listing.

"It's discouraging for folks to drive to our communities and find that some sales have closed early, so we need to try to avoid that," Dart says.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last time we began looking at 1 Peter 2:4-5: "Coming to Him as to a living stone, rejected indeed by men, but chosen by God and precious, you also, as living stones, are being built up a spiritual house, a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." We saw that Peter is comparing the church. consisting of all believers in the Lord Jesus Christ, to a building. Jesus is the chief cornerstone of that building. He is Head of the church. That is a title that no man can or should claim: it belongs to Christ alone. Believers are compared to the stones in the building.

That leads us to the next part of Peter's description of Christ: "chosen by God and precious." Here is God's estimation of the Lord Jesus. He is chosen by God because only He could accomplish God's purpose to save a people for Himself. God has turned the whole work of salvation over to the Lord Jesus Christ. He is the One who humbled Himself in order to become the Savior. He is the One who lived a life of perfect obedience to all God's commandments. He is the One who provided the perfect payment for sin by becoming the sacrifice for sin on the cross. He is the One who rose again from the dead and to whom all authority in heaven and on earth has been given. And God has given to Him the authority to be the final Judge who will determine the eternal destiny of every person.

There is none so dear to God as the Lord Jesus Christ. Their relationship is an eternal one. We cannot begin to imagine the depth of the love between God the Father and God the Son. We cannot imagine the intimacy which they enjoyed from all eternity. When the Son of God took on flesh, that was the beginning of a new form of existence for Him, but it was not the beginning of His existence. Jesus prayed in John 17:5, "And now, O Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was."

Jesus is precious to the Father above all others because He is God. And after taking on flesh, Jesus was the only person who loved God with all His heart, soul, mind, and strength. Only He obeyed God perfectly in every instance, and never once was His a grudging obedience. That is why on two occasions during His earthly ministry, the Father spoke these words from heaven: "This is My beloved Son in whom I am well pleased."

That brings us to verses 6-8a, where we see that because the Lord Jesus Christ is so precious to God, God has made what a person does with Him the determining issue of his or her eternal existence. We read, "Therefore it is also contained in the Scripture, 'Behold, I lay in Zion a chief cornerstone, elect, precious, and he who believes on Him will by no means be put to shame.' Therefore, to you who believe, He is precious; but to those who are disobedient, 'The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone,' and 'a stone of stumbling and a rock of offense."

Here we see why the Lord Jesus is called the chief cornerstone. He is the main stone in the building of God's spiritual house, the church. Without Him, there would be no spiritual house, no salvation, and no people of God. What a person does with Jesus Christ will ultimately either make or break him or her for all eternity.

Lord willing, we shall continue our study in this passage next time. I close with asking you to make sure that you are relying on the Lord Jesus Christ alone to make you right with God, that you are a living stone in God's building.

I was going to write, this week, about the new phenomenon I noticed at Mass starting a couple of weeks ago where folks sitting in the pew behind an empty pew had started putting their Missal and personal effects in the empty front pew creating the illusion that the seat was taken. Anyway, I resolved that problem and, then went to court this week. Which prompts me to ask, "Uh, have defendants taken some sort of new substance that is causing them to curse and act like idiots?" Boldt receives Felix Wirz Award For **Excellence** In Language Study

Thoughts for the Week






things, the chances of attaining your goals become slimmer.
