When questioned she just said he was a life long friend and everyone assuming it was a little thing she had done as age set in for she never really told the story about Joe.

Celebration was great. People came from miles around. In the process of visiting one of her long time ago students questioned? “Ann, got

any special stories you remember of long time ago?”

Ann smiled and began. Thank you for asking, Yes I have one story that had shaped my life. I was a new teacher, just out of school, first day of school, little guy, other said not very bright but I’ll never forget the smile on his face. Everyone said he was kind of a loner, not many friends, but the smile on his face could melt an ice berg.

I watched him through out his school years, no football or basketball star - - no swimming champion, not an honor student, but never lost that smile.

After graduation, not enough money for college, worked hard, eventually went to work for a couple who had no children - - took care of sheep, horses, cattle, just plain farm work - - nothing great. Every so often you would hear a story or two about this young man who really wasn’t much. His name was mostly associated with - - never did much with his life - - others went off to become college professors, lawyers, teachers but well he just stayed and worked. But he never lost his inviting, warm smile.

Ann, continued - - today I am 100 years old and of all the people I have known, well you know, it’s easy to forget names, faces, but a smile on someone, one never forgets - -.

Ann, thanked everyone for coming, her children for the celebration of a life time and - -. She closed with - - oh by the way his name was Joe and he’s just a farmer, one the most important people in the world, for without his smile, determination, faith we’d be awfully hungry.

Recently I've been amazed, overwhelmed, and almost disgusted by the number of choices we have in the grocery store and literally everywhere else. Yesterday I had a pedicure, a little treat for Mother's Day, and the first thing I'm asked, "What color do you want?" Lying on the table are hundreds of color choices: according to Google just one nail polish company can have over 200 color choices.

Bottled water, sodas, energy drinks, and coffee just the choices at the gas station are more than I can take. The number of bottled water companies is 2,735 in the United States alone!

The bottled water craze started in the 1970's with a valuation of \$348.64 BILLION in 2024 and a projection of around \$500 BILLION by 2030! It's still JUST water! Breakfast cereal

choices went from 160 in 1970 to 340 by 1998 and now we have over FIVE THOUSAND choices!

It's not just food: cars, appliances, furniture, clothing- it goes on and on!

We are about to start the plumbing in our addition and just trying to pick a toilet has my head spinning: round bowl, elongated bowl, tall, short, white, off-white or a multitude of other color options, ranging from \$100 to \$1,000.

Managing thrift stores for the past 25 years has amplified by anxiety over the number of choices we have on any given day, maybe if we had fewer choices, we'd be more content with what we have. Instead, we are always wanting the next best thing and that only satisfies us until something better comes along, but where does it end?

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last time we began looking at 1 Peter 2:4-5: "Coming to Him as to a living stone, rejected indeed by men, but chosen by God and precious, you also, as living stones, are being built up a spiritual house, a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." We saw that Peter is comparing the church, consisting of all believers in the Lord Jesus Christ, to a building. Jesus is the chief cornerstone of that building. He is Head of the church. That is a title that no man can or should claim; it belongs to Christ alone. Believers are compared to the stones in the building.

That leads us to the next part of Peter's description of Christ: "chosen by God and precious." Here is God's estimation of the Lord Jesus. He is chosen by God because only He could accomplish God's purpose to save a people for Himself. God has turned the whole work of salvation over to the Lord Jesus Christ. He is the One who humbled Himself in order to become the Savior. He is the One who lived a life of perfect obedience to all God's commandments. He is the One who provided the

perfect payment for sin by becoming the sacrifice for sin on the cross. He is the One who rose again from the dead and to whom all authority in heaven and on earth has been given. And God has given to Him the authority to be the final Judge who will determine the eternal destiny of every person.

There is none so dear to God as the Lord Jesus Christ. Their relationship is an eternal one. We cannot begin to imagine the depth of the love between God the Father and God the Son. We cannot imagine the intimacy which they enjoyed from all eternity. When the Son of God took on flesh, that was the beginning of a new form of existence for Him, but it was not the beginning of His existence. Jesus prayed in John 17:5, "And now, O Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was."

Jesus is precious to the Father above all others because He is God. And after taking on flesh, Jesus was the only person who loved God with all His heart, soul, mind, and strength. Only He obeyed God perfectly in

every instance, and never once was His a grudging obedience. That is why on two occasions during His earthly ministry, the Father spoke these words from heaven: "This is My beloved Son in whom I am well pleased."

That brings us to verses 6-8a, where we see that because the Lord Jesus Christ is so precious to God, God has made what a person does with Him the determining issue of his or her eternal existence. We read, "Therefore it is also contained in the Scripture, 'Behold, I lay in Zion a chief cornerstone, elect, precious, and he who believes on Him will by no means be put to shame.' Therefore, to you who believe, He is precious; but to those who are disobedient, 'The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone,' and 'a stone of stumbling and a rock of offense.'"

Here we see why the Lord Jesus is called the chief cornerstone. He is the main stone in the building of God's spiritual house, the church. Without Him, there would be no spiritual house, no salvation, and no people of God. What a person does with Jesus Christ will ultimately either make or break him or her for all eternity.

Lord willing, we shall continue our study in this passage next time. I close with asking you to make sure that you are relying on the Lord Jesus Christ alone to make you right with God, that you are a living stone in God's building.

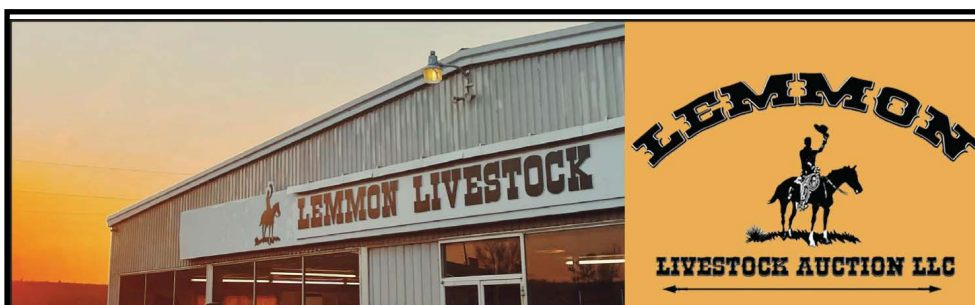

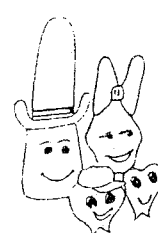

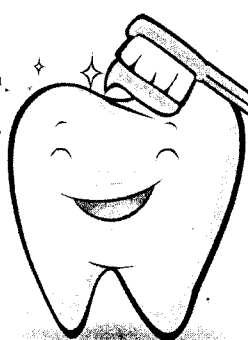

Donald Krambeer Rites to be Held

Donald Krambeer, 79, of Buffalo, SD passed away at the Fort Meade VA in Sturgis, SD on February 16, 2025. Celebration of Life for Donald will be held May 24, 2025 at the Ludlow Hall in Ludlow, SD beginning at 11:00 am.

Donald Robert Krambeer was born July 13, 1945 in Buffalo, SD to Robert "Bob" Krambeer and Violet (Wilkinson) Krambeer. He was the oldest of two children. Darlene (Welch), his younger sister, was born five years later. They lived in a sod house north of Sorum, SD during his childhood. Donald attended all of his grade school years at the Sorum School. He then attended all four years of high school in Hettinger, ND graduating in 1963. After high school, Donald worked and rodeoed until he was drafted into the Army in October 1965 during the Vietnam War. He went to Fort Leonardwood, MO for basic training, then onto Fort Gordon, GA and to Fort Meade, MD until he was discharged in 1967. Even though it was wartime, Donald never left the US.

Once out of the military, he continued to work and rodeo. In the fall of 1970, at the age of 27, Donald started college at Montana State University in Bozeman, MT on a rodeo scholarship majoring in Agronomy. In 1972, he was part of the national championship rodeo team, competing in saddle broncs and barebacks. He continued to compete in rodeos in the MRA, NRA, SDRA, PRCA, and the annual event of the Miles City Bucking Horse Sale, until the

college rodeo coach said No!

When college was not calling, Bozeman Livestock Auction Company was. Donald was part of the day crew and the night crew! He "camped" behind the sales ring with his friend Murry who also worked there.

Throughout college, Donald always found time to rodeo on the weekends no matter how busy school or work were. He and his buddies always enjoyed the July 4th rodeo weekend or as they called it their Cowboy Christmas! In 1972, they hired a pilot to fly them to rodeos in Ennis, Red Lodge, and Livingston in Montana and other rodeos in between. This helped Donald fill his PRCA card, and he now faced a choice to professional rodeo or finish college, ultimately college prevailed.

During Donald's sophomore year, he started working with Dr. Taylor, a winter wheat breeder, and became his research assistant. Donald helped with planting, managing field crews, irrigating, and harvesting twenty acres of field test plots in various stages of study. In 1973, Donald continued to work under Dr. Taylor for his research project required for graduation. This project involved a study looking at winter wheat survivability. This consisted of an extraction process that removed wax from the leaves and the more wax removed, the better the winter hardiness of the wheat. Many varieties of wheat became widely grown from this project including Winalta, Froid, and Cheyenne to name a few.

Donald maintained an honor roll status all four years of college. His research project put many varieties of wheat in the

fields in Montana, North Dakota, and South Dakota. In June 1974 at the CNFR, Donald came within a few points of the national championship in saddle bronc, so close, yet so far away! In September of that year, Donald and Jane Miller married at sunrise in the Soldiers Chapel near Big Sky, Montana. December 1974 brought early graduation and a move to Camp Crook, SD. There he helped manage the Linde Ranch, raising registered Herefords. Donald bought registered cattle and started his own seed stock business.

In the fall of 1977, Donald and Jane purchased the Lowell Bergstrom Ranch. Ranching kept him busy and so did a custom farming operation. He was very involved with the community including the Camp Crook Volunteer Fire Department, the Cemetery Board, the Harding County Fair, the Montana Grain Growers Association, the Montana Stockgrowers Association, as well as his beloved rodeo groups.

The summer of 1979, drought brought enough grasshoppers to cover the ground, eating everything including wood fences, posts, tree bark, even Jane's sheets hanging on the clothes line. Donald was elected by the neighboring ranchers to head up the spray project with the USDA. During the winter months, he and a friend repaired farm machinery, hunted coyotes, and in the evenings he could be found playing a guitar or piano to entertain neighbors that visited.

As Jane's parents neared retirement in 1980, Donald and Jane returned to Manhattan, MT to help run their ranch, but not before daughter Kathy was born in Belle Fourche, SD during a blizzard! In Manhattan, Donald and Jane formed a partnership with her parents and brother. Donald also opened Krambeer's Kustom Kure, a farm to fork endeavor providing beef, pork, and lamb to eager clients.

In 1993, Jane and Kathy moved off the family ranch and Donald remained in the partnership until 2000. Over the years Donald worked running a moulder that made wood trim and assembled machinery for Bozeman and Belgrade New Holland.

After Donald started having health issues from hip replacements, he moved back to Buffalo, SD in the fall of 2012 to help his sister look after their mother. Donald enjoyed being back in Buffalo enjoying time with family and friends. He loved a good visit and telling stories of the good ol' days. Donald will always be remembered for the twinkle in his eye, mischievous smile, laugh and his love for riding broncs.

He is survived by his daughter Kat Krambeer; his brother in

law Mick Welch; his nieces Lark Welch (Chad Schon), Jean (Will) Bellamy, Lacy (Jeromy) Schneider, great nieces Jaya Bellamy, Hannah Schneider, and great nephew Dawson Schneider; his aunt Bessie (Wilkinson) Campbell; and numerous cousins. He is preceded in death by his parents and sister and numerous aunts and uncles.
