

The Highway 21 Treasure Hunt is celebrating its 24th year.

North Dakota Facts and Figures

The coming year is going to be interesting when it comes to taxes, government spending, costs of services and the realization that we the people may have to allow cuts to the services we enjoy and need.

I read about legislative candidates making the comment that they are going to "Reform Property Taxes" if they are elected. My question is what does property tax reform look like? What they want is to pay a lower amount or no property tax and have the State of North Dakota pay for all local services. **Property taxes are a local tax, not**

a state tax. Another comment I hear is, "I paid for my house and now I am forced to pay rent and if I don't, I could lose my home". **Property taxes are not rent!** When people pay their property tax it is for services like fire and police protection, ambulance service, roads, streets, sewer, water and local government services. The State of North Dakota sent \$5.94 billion to local political subdivisions from the state's non-federal 2025-27 biennial budget of \$14.54 Billion. This is 41% of the non-federal dollars that are **ear marked for local services by the state legislature.** It is important to mention

that \$2.16 billion of the \$5.94 billion is property tax relief. The following fact I just received hot off the press from the Legislative Council Staff that starting in the 2007-09 biennium to the current 2025-27 biennium the North Dakota State Legislature has appropriated \$11.24 billion to property tax reduction to the people of North Dakota. The State of North Dakota and the Legislature have bent over backwards to assist with local needs and services.

The local County Commissioners, City Commissioners and School Board members work to keep costs down. However, inflation, decaying water and sewer infrastructure, street and road maintenance, demands in education, keeping quality employees, public safety services that are needed and the demand for lower property taxes put commissioners and board members between a rock and a hard place.

It does not matter how you reform property tax, the local political subdivisions need revenue to operate and provide services to the people. What can people do to lower property taxes? Tell the local leaders what services they think should be cut. When

communicating with commissioners and board members be respectful!! Also, remember majority rules and you need to be involved in your community.

Alive in Christ
 Pastor Ed Kvaale - Bowman Assembly of God
 Resurrection Sunday (Easter) is just behind us but the importance of Jesus' resurrection to the life of a Christian continues. Jesus' death and resurrection and His call for us to take up our cross and follow Him remind us that we need to ask ourselves questions like "Are we willing to sin less?" "Are we willing to live life differently?" After all, Jesus has called us to "put off the old self" and "put on the new self" through the power of the Holy Spirit working in us to transform us through Jesus' resurrection power. Paul challenges us in Romans 6:11 "So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin alive to God in Christ Jesus". Yes, we receive our salvation through grace alone and faith alone. Yet, we have been created to serve Jesus and others and do works of service for others. These works do not merit special grace to us, but like some in the early New Testament church we also need to be reminded that our salvation came at great cost to Jesus. His death and resurrection have given us the opportunity to live a new life alive in the Holy Spirit, alive to Jesus, and dead to sin for His glory. Since Jesus died we too can become dead to sin, allow the freedom of Jesus to set us free from sinful habits, and alive to Jesus. Lutheran theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer in his book Cost of Discipleship reminds us of one of the dangers of what he calls "cheap grace". Bonhoeffer said "Grace alone does everything, they say, and so everything can remain as it was before". Paul agreed wholeheartedly with Bonhoeffer in Romans 6:1 when he says "What then? Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means"! Rather Bonhoeffer says this about costly grace: "Such grace is costly because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs us our life, and it is grace because it gives us the only true life. It is costly because it condemns sin, and grace because it justifies the sinner. Above all, it is costly because it cost God the life of God's Son" 'you were bought at a price', and what has cost God much cannot be cheap for us". Let us continue to follow Jesus even if it means dying to self, because He has the power to resurrect us and make us fully alive in God!

Expressions of HOPE

Reflections on the Words of Life
by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Lately we have been looking together at 1 Peter 3, focusing on the apostle Peter's instructions to believers on how to cope with suffering. We come today to verse 16, where Peter tells them to handle suffering for righteousness' sake with a good conscience: "Having a good conscience, that when they defame you as evildoers, those who revile your good conduct in Christ may be ashamed." In other words, Christians should not give the enemies of Christ any ammunition for denouncing them. God calls His people to live with a clear conscience, and they should seek to honor the Savior by conduct that is above reproach. In this way, they will make it obvious that the claims of those run down their character are empty.

We should note that even the most conscientious Christians will not be able to escape having people disparage them. Christ promised His followers that they would be hated by the unbelieving world, just as He

was. But where there are truly holy lives, devoted to the Lord Jesus Christ, the false accusations will eventually melt away, and those making them will be ashamed of their blatant lies.

Verse 17 reiterates a concept we have seen before in our study: "For it is better, if it is the will of God, to suffer for doing good than for doing evil." As a result of sin, we live in a fallen, broken world. We see the ravages of sin everywhere, and suffering is inescapable. But suffering for righteousness' sake because they are following their Lord is something that only believers experience. The unbeliever does not have that kind of suffering. All suffering is hard and painful, but the suffering of the believer actually carries blessing along with it. Jesus taught in the Sermon on the Mount: "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when they revile and persecute you, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely for My sake. Rejoice and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven" (Matthew 5:10-12a). Only the believer has the promise of God's presence in his or her suffering. One of the most comforting promises in the Bible is found Isaiah 41:10: "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, yes,

I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand." God has promised never to leave or forsake His children. He will faithfully carry them through whatever suffering they may have to endure in this life. And one moment in heaven will more than make up for all the suffering they experienced. As Paul said in 2 Corinthians 4:17, "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory." If you have read the book of Acts, you would hardly call Paul's afflictions "light" or "but for a moment," but he was viewing them from the perspective of eternity.

Peter has told us that the right way to respond to suffering is not to retaliate or seek revenge. Rather the suffering should be used as an opportunity to present a picture of grace. We are in fact to continue to do good to the very ones who are causing our suffering. Next time, Lord willing, we shall see more about the suffering of Jesus, whose perfect example we are to follow.

Friends, have you placed your trust in the Lord Jesus Christ alone to make you right with God? Oh, what a blessed life is that of Christians. For though they will face suffering, they have precious promises that God will be with them and

uphold them throughout this life. And they can look forward to an eternity free from all suffering when they are in heaven with Jesus.

If there was a problem, she would get one of the guys out of bed and would help him deal with it.

Avis was the glue to the family on the farm; she became a second mother to the Alaska Howe boys who began working on the farm in 2000. She became known at this time not for teaching, but for making lunches, doing the family laundry and cooking all the meals for the family. Many people hoped to be on the Howe Farm during mealtime for her good home cooked meals.

Avis enjoyed many hobbies in her adult life including cards, music, volunteering, and travel. Avis was a devoted bridge player and even after moving back to the family farm, made monthly trips to Colorado for her bridge club. She also played weekly in Hettinger where she had a good group of friends. Pinochle was the game of choice at the farm. Many family members are hoping she left her lucky hands to one of them.

Her love of music started as a young girl playing piano. Later she played flute in high school and college. Avis often led the family in holiday favorites and hymns when they gathered, as well as introducing the family to old musicals which they all still enjoy.

Avis never turned down a trip whether local or international. Her journeys took her across the lower 48, to Alaska, and internationally visiting Norway, Scotland, UK, Greece, Peru, Africa, and the Panama Canal.

Avis had many medical issues but always bounced back with a smile and said she was ready to go home to the farm, even when that was far from the truth. Her heart was truly on the farm where she was born and raised.

Avis never married but loved her family and valued the time spent with her parents, siblings, nieces, and nephews. Avis's faithful companion for the last 19 years was her cat "Oliver" who brought Avis much happiness and was an important part of her life. Avis maintained her sharp mind and quick wit to the very end.

Avis passed away peacefully at home as she looked out the window at the North Grand River and rolling buttes that were a staple in her life. Family surrounded her praying and singing hymns, with "Oliver" purring softly on her lap.

This year was her 80th birthday and she celebrated with all 6 of her grandchildren and several great grandkids which was her pride and joy.

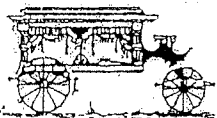
Betty was preceded in death by her husband Jerry, parents Frank and Lue, In Laws Earl, Irene, Stub, and brother Randy.

RECIPE OF THE DAY

BEEF, BEANS AND MACAARONI CHILI

1/2 lb. ground beef

 15 oz. can kidney beans, drain and save liquid
 2 tsp. chili powder

 3/4 c. uncooked macaroni

One of the things that used to be fun before you went to sleep at night years ago was the Johnny Carson show. Not that I am a fan of talk shows with celebrities, but the comedy part was always funny. He was a comedian that pretty much was apolitical, in that he made jokes on both sides, but nothing was mean. I remember him making jokes at Gerald Ford's expense, especially when his golf ball went a bit in the wrong direction or when he missed a step or two. But nothing was actually mean. And his Carnak the Great skit was truly funny with the answers that were sealed in a mayonnaise jar on Funk and Wagnal's porch, or something like that.

Over the years, comedy has taken many forms. It was used by many to make fun of the rich for the benefit of the poor, poking fun at the government. The jokes had to be pretty subtle as if the rich felt they were being insulted, being kicked out of the castle was the least of your problems and more than likely there were a lot more serious consequences than that - can you say a night in the stocks?

Some comedians over the years have used different formats to do this, from the slapstick comedians of Vaudeville days where falling down on a banana peel was considered humorous or the squirting flower made people laugh. During the age of Radio, there were lots of comedians that had to make their comedy funny enough to translate into sound without a picture such as Jack Benny and his penny pinching ways and Fibber Magee and Molly with the closet that should never be opened but always was at least one time so you could hear everything fall out.

In the 60's it became a bit more political with comedians such as Lenny Bruce who started to say some words that were

banned by the censors and he spent many days sitting in a jail cell for that. That moved on to comedians such as George Carlin that enjoyed making fun of the rich and their golf courses and of course he had the 7 words that were prohibited by the censors and proceeded to make a living by saying them. We still had comedians such as Lucille Ball that had a combination of slapstick humor and prat falls and one of the best skits with the chocolate factory and what to do when they come too fast down the conveyor belt. Then there was Carol Burnett who continued the slapstick type humor with Tim Conway and one of her famous skits
