



Controlled Burn **Procedure**

While the county is under a FIRE EMERGENCY and BURN RESTRICTION DECLARA-TION, the Controlled Burn Procedure is in place.

Being under the FIRE EMR-GENCY and BURN RESTRIC-TION DECLARATION means, that burning is allowed ONLY when the Fire Danger Index Rating is in LOW or MODER-ATE. There is no burning of any kind when the State Fire Danger Rating Index is in HIGH, VERY HIGH, EXTREME or a RED FLAG WARNING.

Be aware, that conditions

can change and anytime someone starts a fire, precautions need to be in place to ensure it does not get out of control.

You must remain on location of the fire at all times, while the fire is burning. Willful violation of this declaration can be considered guilty of a Class B Misdemeanor, up to 30 days in jail and a \$1500 Fine. Restitution for damages and Fire Suppression costs may be sought by the court as well.

The Burn Restrictions & Fire Danger Rating Map are both found on https://ndresponse. gov. The site is updated every

Hettinger County's procedure for those who want to have a controlled burn on their property is as follows:

Contact State Radio (911 Dispatch) at 1-800-472-2121 or 1-701-328-9921 before you begin to burn. Provide them with the following information:

- 1. Your Name.
- 2. The location where the burning is taking place.
- 3. What is being burned: field, garbage pit, tree piles, etc.
- 4. What time you plan to burn.
- 5. How long you expect it will take to burn. 6. A contact number where
- vou can be reached.

The Sheriff's Office is then notified of the location of the

burn. The Sheriff's Office will contact the fire chief of that district to let them know where the burn is located.

This allows State Radio to know where there is a controlled burn and if someone calls stating that they see a large fire or smoke, State Radio already knows the area of the controlled burn and will not call the fire departments out unnecessarily. This procedure ensures our volunteer fire departments are not called unless there is a real emergency

Once the fire is out, contact State Radio again to inform them the fire is completely out. Contact the Hettinger County Emergency Manager at 701-824-4227 or 701-209-0810 for more information.









FIRE EMERGENCY AND BURN BAN/RESTRICTION DECLARATION

FOR

HETTINGER COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA

WHEREAS, Hettinger County, North Dakota has endured abnormally dry conditions compiled with high winds, which has resulted in the potential for numerous fires; and

WHEREAS, all available resources remain committed to protecting life and property; and

WHEREAS, the impact of fires could threaten the health, well-being, and safety of citizens in Hettinger County, and

WHEREAS, the cost of response, inordinate equipment wear and fire damages may be in excess of available Hettinger County resources.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of the Hettinger County Commissioners declare a Fire Emergency and Burn Ban/Restriction to include a ban/restriction on ignition of fireworks, garbage burning, campfires, burning of farm or crop land, any open flame fires and unnecessary off-road motorized travel when the North Dakota Rangeland Fire Index rating is in the High, Very High, or Extreme category and/or a Red Flag Warning has been issued for Hettinger County, North Dakota. Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have lately been considering the repentance of the people of Nineveh after Jonah announced impending judgment upon them. The repentance of a pagan Gentile country, with almost no knowledge of the true God, is astounding when compared with repeated refusals to repent by the people of Israel, who claimed to know God and be His people. Jesus referred to this when He said in Matthew 12:41, "The men of Nineveh will rise up in the judgment with this generation and condemn it, because they repented at the preaching of Jonah; and indeed a greater than Jonah is here."

Today we arrive at Jonah

3:10: "Then God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God relented from the disaster that He had said He would bring upon them, and He did not do it." God saw that the repentance of the Ninevites was genuine in that it resulted in a serious change of behavior. The people turned from their evil way. Thus Nineveh repented, and God relented. It is important to note two verbs that are used in this verse The verb "turned," describing the action of the Ninevites, connotes a change of direction. But the verb used for God, translated here "relented," carries the idea of God's suffering; it is sometimes translated "moved to pity." Though veiled here, the term "relented" really contains the gospel in a nutshell. It tells how God the Son suffered in the place of all who would repent and trust in Him alone for

salvation. As we read in 2 Corinthians 5:21, "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." Jesus suffered more intensely than we could comprehend in order to pay the debt of sin for all His people.

God's goal in announcing judgment to Nineveh was to bring about just such a change of heart as occurred. And when that change occurred, God granted mercy instead of judgment. It delights God to show mercy to the repentant sinner. Camp ReCreation

I want to start out by simply saving hello. May seem silly, but inclusion can really be that simple, Just. Say. Hello, I was asked to write this article and given a pretty broad subject suggestion for it..."what camp means to me, my experience, how it can change lives, where people go for careers, or any combination of these ideas". Now, typically, you wouldn't disclose that and the story would just begin, but camp has been so many things to me and has touched my life in ways only God could have worked out in His plans that I'm compelled to share 'all the things'.

My first involvement with Camp ReCreation was back in 1997. I was seven years old when I first started showing up at the school every day as a helper. My first role was 'helper' because I was too young to sign up as a 1:1 counselor and take on the responsibilities involved in caring for an individual myself; rightfully so, I was seven.

I learned a lot that first week immersing myself in camp and learning how God has made each of us purposefully with various ability levels.

I went from helper to counselor real quick, and for quite a few years I had the privilege of

caring for campers one week at a time. Some of my fondest memories involve moments shared over these two week spans in the summers of my youth. I eventually progressed to camp teacher the last few years of high school.

2008 was the last year I fully attended camp in person for the entirety of two weeks, and at the time, I never imagined I wouldn't return every single summer. I mean, after camp that year I even got their logo tattooed on my ankle. Up to that point in my life, camp was the most important and impactful thing I had given my time to.

Looking back now, I see what God was doing. All the time I invested in camp, was really all the empathy and goodness that built my heart and the hearts of so many amazing friends met through the years. Camp taught me to see abilities before anything else. Camp taught me sometimes the most important thing you can do is just be there for people. Love them as they are. Support them as they are. Let them thrive in an environment made for them, as they are.

Goosebumps and tears hit me typing that one. My life has come full circle since I was that seven year old girl doing crafts, playing games, praying with/ over, and singing God's word into people that saw me for ex-

actly who I am while simultaneously allowing me to thrive without an expectation to be, look, or act a certain way.

Camp is where my life changed. Camp shaped me in ways I didn't know would come to fruition until decades down the road. After graduating high school in 2008, I knew I wanted the skills I acquired from camp and the physical connection of serving people to continue to work through me. After complet-

ing my cosmetology education, I immediately began pursuing an Associates Degree as a Human Services Technician with focus in Early Childhood Education. However, every elective I picked up 1 intentionally chose to pull from the developmental disabilities course plan.

The pieces all fell into place at the conclusion of my degree, while I completed my on the job training at my husband's hometown elementary school. It was there I was able to connect with a family and student that has Down Syndrome. This third grade ball of energy was everything I wanted to be a part of & everything that twirled God's work in my heart up to this point in my life. Early Childhood and developmental disabilities education intertwined with my personal experience as a 1:1 camp counselor landed me as the ideal hire paraprofessional to help one on one in the special education department of our school district.

More than a decade since I befriended my first camper in Richardton, I was placed into the roles of teacher, advocate, and friend of a boy, now young man, that reminds me every day to find goodness in the world. to never take anything too seriously, and that there's always time for some fun to be had. I remained a para with this child and school until I was married in 2015 & knew I was going to pursue growing my own family.

Fall of 2016 we welcomed our first daughter into the world & in 2018 we were ready to grow our family, again. October 2018, after an uneventful delivery, our second daughter was born healthy and well. On her fifth day of life, she began showing disinterest in eating and was overly tired, so we took her into the ED for observation. The next 24 hours were a whirlwind as we learned our daughter somehow contracted Human Parechovirus that caused meningitis (infection and inflammation of the protective membrane covering & fluid surrounding the brain), which then progressed to encephalitis (infection and inflammation of brain tissue). In our daughters case, the virus caused severe white matter brain damage and volume loss. This diagnosis took me personally from teacher, advocate, and

friend to parent and caregiver. Our daughter, Taylor, has since received multiple diagnoses including Spastic Quadriplegic Cerebral Palsy with Dystonia, which is a super fancy way of saying her the muscles in all four of her limbs and truck (core, chest, neck) are affected and her tone varies from spastic (tight) to low (floppy). Taylor also has a formal diagnosis of epilepsy and cortical visual impairment.

I share that to say I always thought I was someone that, thanks to Camp ReCreation, had an abilities first mindset and vantage point, but to be the caregiver and guardian of someone with intellectual or

developmental disabilities you witness firsthand the lens in which others with a typical development are viewed by the typically developing population. Regardless of how inclusive and accommodating we try to access the world through for our loved ones, there seems to always be some sort of pushback, be it intentional or inadvertent.

Camp allows us to close the gap by intertwining the populations from a young age. Where else can you find high school students actively taking responsibility as caregivers? Unless they are employed at a group home or something similar, it's not likely. I will also take a second and say what I have said for years and that is this camp is not for everyone, but why not owe it to yourself to try? You will come out of Camp ReCreation with more love, empathy, and understand than you ever knew you had. Camp challenges vou. Camp changes you. It's designed that way. A Christian based summer camp that intentionally pairs young adult counselors with campers that have special needs on a one-toone basis is something to really cling to. Camp is a bridge that God is allowing us to use to to build community through friendship by promoting respect and volunteerism.

If you're interested in joining the Camp ReCreation community, but are uncertain if the responsibility of one-to-one care is something you're ready for, reach out anyways! It takes a village to make camp a success and there are so many other opportunities to serve; task force, cooking, serving, teaching, nurse station staffing. I promise there is a place for you here.

I want to leave you with a bible verse that gets me through some of my heaviest days and always, always, reminds me of my camp family both counselors and campers alike.

"As he passed by, he saw a man blind from birth. And his disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him." ---John 9:1-3

So many times the world views the unique population that live with disabilities as tarnished or broken, when they really need to stop and realize they are the truest and most precious gifts God has given our world. The works of God are displayed through them and those that embrace all thy neighbors are those that embrace all that God has given unto us. I always try to remind myself to take a step back every once in a while, and really soak in what God has given me and the road He has taken me on. At the end of the day, the whole journey makes absolute sense. From seven years old God knew I would be transformed and He could trust me in raising a child that His works would be displayed through.

I urge you to come and feel God working through you in Richardton at Camp ReCreation. You are capable of being the hands and feet of Jesus this summer. I hope we see you there. God Bless.





An Impact Makes an **Impact**

A grateful farmer discovers exuberant appreciation for local healthcare after accident

When someone recounts their experience of being involved in a catastrophic highway accident, their demeanor isn't normally easygoing. Their attitude isn't normally casual or cheerful, and the overall outcome from such an ordeal isn't normally positive.

Duane Pierce is not normal. He knows this. Because normally no one would have walked away from the wreck he was in. And whether there was a factor of a high power looking over him or simply dumb luck, Pierce knows one thing for sure: things would have been a lot different had it not been for the souls of our local medical team. An ordinary day at West River Health Services made for an extraordinary impact for Mr. Pierce. And he wants you to know about it.

It's been six weeks since the collision. Six weeks since his semi careened into a ditch off the highway. Six weeks since his leg was lodged in a steering console. It's been six weeks and Duane Pierce is at home, walking, talking and joking on his 83rd birthday with his wife. And what better way to celebrate another year of living than to recount a moment in time when everything could have ended?

Other than working for the National Guard out of Fort Leonard Wood many moons ago, Pierce has been busy farming his neck of the woods with his family for as long as he can remember

"Well, you don't want to do that for fun," laughed Pierce as he began to recall the day of the accident. March 6th was a busy one as Peirce was running six trucks of wheat out to United Grain, west of Hettinger, with the help of his employees and two sons, Rob and Shawn. Pierce recollected how nonchalant everything was in this normal operation.

"I got there and I unloaded. Shawn was right behind me,' said Pierce. "I went around, got my ticket, and I headed back to the farm to get another load."

Gloomy, breezy, and chilly. North Dakota winter weather

was still in full effect on this side of the country. Bitter wind was in the air and frigid snow was on the ground as Pierce began traversing the highway in his empty semi, focused on getting back to the farm to load more wheat. "You know how accidents happen," said Pierce. "All at once... this snowplow was right in front of me and I just cranked the wheel to the left and I hit that thing really, really hard,"

The plow was in the process of blading snow off the shoulder of the highway when the collision occurred, demolishing the truck with Pierce inside who remained conscience the entire

"Theron Schalesky was driving the plow and I thank God he was going the same way I was and that we didn't crash headon," said Pierce.

After striking the plow, the passenger side of the cab was obliterated, and the truck was sent flying into the ditch with the trailer in tow. After finally coming to a rest, he radioed for his son,

"Shawn had already caught up with me, and was almost right where it happened," explained Pierce. "I told him I had a wreck and he said, 'are you okay', and I said, 'I'm okay!"

Still in shock, he quickly learned that he was pinned as his leg had become lodged in the truck's console. Before working on his encumbered leg, Pierce turned off the engine which was still miraculously idling. Once he got himself unstuck, he was able to open the door and crawl his way outside. As soon as his legs hit the dirt, his son Shawn and his employee, Kyle, were right there to assist.

"They grabbed ahold of me and put my arms around their neck, and we went down through the ditch where the snow was still three feet deep.' Pierce recounted.

Although Pierce had escaped the truck, he and his rescuers quickly found themselves

in an entirely new predicament. "Shawn told me we had to

keep going, that we had to get out of here. I looked up and we noticed that the sleeper on the truck was totally loose. I remember Shawn saying that it might fall over and that if it did, it was going to get us," said Pierce.

Evading the potential danger that loomed over them, Pierce was dragged to safety where he awaited the arrival of an ambulance, which according to him, wasn't very long at all.

"I just can't say enough good about the quality of the people and how everything worked when that ambulance got there," Pierce remarked. "I was in that ambulance in a very short time. And I was immediately on my way to the emergency room. They got me in there as fast as anybody could have possibly

The West River Ambulance crew quickly got to work, preparing him for his arrival at the West River Health Services just a few short miles away in Hettinger, where Doctor Josh Ranum and a host of nurses were waiting.

"Everybody knew exactly what they were doing," said Pierce. "Right there, they assessed me, took a bunch of x-rays and immediately came back with my results. Doctor Ranum told me that I had a bad, broken hip and in a very short amount of time, I was loaded back in the ambulance, and I was put on an airplane...it was the fastest trip to Bismarck, that I can tell you! From there, I had my surgery and stayed in Bismarck for a few days. Afterwards, 1 got to come back to West River Health Sevices in Hettinger, and it was the same wonderful experience all over again. Everything was just so

Enamored with the quality, professionalism quick-pace. and attentiveness of the medical staff he witnessed while in the care of West River Health Services, Pierce feels it is important for more people to know about

"The people of the community should realize, that just because we're in Hettinger or in a remote part of the state, we can get any place they want to and get us the care we need in a very short time," Pierce exclaimed. "The rooms were just so nice and clean. Nice, bright rooms. And when it came to treatment and service, you just don't realize what kind of team we have. Every nurse that came into my room was an absolute angei. They just don't get any better. It didn't make a difference if it was midnight or noon, they took care of me!"

Pierce continued to sing the praises of the facility and its staff, and particularly expressed his gratitude for the doctors that met with him, so much so that any notions of feeling pain, discomfort, or any negative connotations that come with being involved in horrendous accident seemed to be a total afterthought when compared to the services rendered at West River Health Services.

When asked if he felt as though he was in good hands from the moment the ambulance arrived, he was quick to agree, "I knew from the very, very beginning that I was going to get the best care I could pos-

sibly get. Everything was superior to any care I've ever had!"

Following his surgery and appointments in Bismarck. Pierce was able to see what was left of his truck since the accident. For the first time he was able to really absorb the magnitude of the situation and garner even more appreciation for the care he was given.

"Looking at the wreckage, I thought there could never be a chance for anybody to have survived," said Pierce as he took a deep breath. "There was nothing left and I'm very fortunate to be alive."

He attributes his survival to being in the right place at the right time, citing his placement in the cab during the crash, the assistance of his employees, family, and friends, and most certainly the services of our local hospital, which he expressed is far superior to any other facility he's been to. His newly found appreciation for West River Health Services is something he wants to extend to everyone, hoping they see this blessing without having to undergo such a horrendous experience to find it. In his words, West River Health Services is something of a secret if you don't know.

Vi Kostelecky, age 86 of Lemmon, passed away on May 3, 2023 at home in Bismarck. Visitation for Vi was held



ING". Vi served many years as





After all, all of the net proceeds from the registrations, sponsorships, Raffle Ticket and new Bucket Draw tickets will go right back into the area community for healthy activities!

Speaking of raffle tickets, the WRHS Foundation is offering citizens a chance to win one of nine amazing prizes valued at \$3,050 for the purchase of a \$2 raffle ticket. The prizes and sponsors include \$600 cash, \$500 Mizuno Golf Driver, \$400 Smart Watch, \$350 Hettinger Fitness Center Membership (City of Hettinger), \$350 Handmade Pub Table (Bosch Lumber), \$350 Mizuno Golf Putter, \$200 Charcuterie Basket (Velka Boards), and \$150 his/her Mizuno Running Shoes. All of the Mizuno gear is gifted by former Hettinger Alum Jeremy Galbreth and Mizuno USA. Thank you Jeremy! Now I'd say that's quite a selection of prizes for a \$2 or more investment, wouldn't you? And all of the net proceeds go right back into healthy area community activities.

In addition, this year we are also offering \$1 tickets for a Bucket Draw Contest. You purchase the \$1 ticket(s) and then place them in the Bucket with the prize(s) you'd prefer to win. Originally and for the first 30 or so years of this fun race, the net funds have been utilized within West River Health Services, mainly to improve the exercise equipment offerings at West River Rehabilitation & Wellness Center. The new twist was that \$800 was given back to the community (\$600 toward the Hettinger Backpack Food Program and \$200 for The Granary, the new home headquarters of this annual fitness event).

From the four years 2016-2018, with the addition of the astonishing sales of "Fun Run & Foundation raised \$18,728 in

total net proceeds! Therefore, it was decided to give back a little over 72% or \$13,228 to the community, especially to our youth -- \$2,000 for renovations to the Hettinger Swimming Pool; \$2,000 for Stephanie Staples to visit with our community about positive thinking; \$1,500 for Girls Softball and Baseball Programs; \$1,500 for six area Park Recreation Youth Programs; \$1,400 for Hettinger Backpack Food Program; \$800 for Cooking Classes; \$800 for the Granary; \$700 for Fitness Camps in Lemmon; \$500 for Summer Swimming Program; \$500 for Youth Golf; \$500 for Badlands Ministries Summer Camp; \$500 for Winter Open Swims; \$300 for the Hettinger-Scranton Cross Country Program; and \$228 for Little League Baseball. Last year, we gave 100% of the Fun Run 7 walk net proceeds back or \$9,400 back to our area communities -- including five \$1,000 gifts each to Adams County's Recreation Library, Scranton High School and Mott High School's Weight Room Equipment, Hettinger Band shell Renovation and Yoga Equipment for the Armory. 


