





## Perennial Plant Sale Raises \$2,000 Despite Crazy Rainy & Muddy Weather

Hettinger - From an idea that Carolyn Van Wyk and her crew of West River Health Services Auxiliary members dreamt up in the mid-1970s, the WRHS Perennial Plant Sale continues to shine - despite the stormy and muddy weather! Of course, we are not complaining - our area farmers and ranchers desperately needed this moisture, and boy, are we ever getting it!

For five years, the WRHS Foundation has continued accepting excess perennials and offering them to local area gardening enthusiasts for a goodwill donation. The net funds help provide the Auxiliary Legacy Scholarship to an area student pursuing a healthcare-related degree in college. In this way, we can maintain the legacy of the amazing WRHS Auxiliary and its members who gave their time and efforts to help our medical system prosper.

Leading into the annual event on the morning of Friday, May 16, before the 2-4 p.m. sale, fourteen area gardeners provided 307 containers and pots of perennial plants, houseplants, and small trees. On the event day, at 2 p.m. sharp, our West River Ambulance Garage witnessed nearly 50 determined "green thumbs" entering and purchasing perennial plants for their area gardens.

The fourteen plant donors-Barb West, Jennifer Seamands, Carol Seamands, Linda Schell, DeNae Henderson, Nettie Schumacher, Dena Jahner Kitzan, Linda Hammand, Teresa Wolff, Karen Clement, Doris Hoke, Vern Erickson, and a few others-must have dug up their excess perennials a week or two ago. The week leading up to this sale was likely one of the wettest ever experienced in the Greater Hettinger Area, with over 6 inches of steady rain falling over three days. And, it's still raining! When will it stop? This moisture is undoubtedly a blessing, breaking records across the Western Dakotas. Just think of the benefits for livestock with improved grass and hay and our new perennials!

Despite the smaller selec-

number of buyers, the goodwill donations for the "Auxiliary Legacy" healthcare scholarship were remarkably successful. A total of two thousand dollars was raised through donations of various perennials, including Tiger Lilies, Yellow Lilies, Easter Lilies, Lily of the Valley, Hollyhocks, Black-eyed Susans, Sahria, Liatris, Yellow Sedum, Purple and White Irises, as well as White, Shasta, and Common Daisies. Other donations included ever-bearing and June-bearing strawberries, Purple Coneflowers, Blue Delphiniums, Pink Phlox, Gaillardias, Violets, White Anemones, Dogwoods, and Rhubarb. Additionally, some houseplants were contributed, such as Pothos, Jade Plants, Snake Plants, Wandering Jews, Aloe Vera, Spider Plants, and Coleus, along with a few small trees like Ponderosa Pine.

A heartfelt THANK YOU goes out to the 14 different gardeners who generously supplied these plants. We are truly grateful for your support.

Thank you to the local gardeners who donated and/or collected new perennial plants. Without your support, we would not have the Perennial Plant Sale or the Auxiliary Legacy Scholarship. Over the past four years, the following students pursuing healthcare-related degrees in college, have each received a \$1,000 scholarship: Reagan Coyle (Bowman), Maria Gonzalez (Mott), Naomi Salazar (Hettinger) and Arial Engle (Faith).

As we move forward to the 49th and hopefully 50th Anniversary of our Perennial Plant Sale, we are always mindful of those Auxiliary Members who came before us - including Carolyn Van Wyk, Helen Lewis, Eva Knutson, Kaye McIntyre, Jan Sailer, Betty Nelson, Carol Ann Zimmerman, Mary Krein, Kathy Kennedy, Eve Safratowich, Peggy Gunther, Stacy Chadwick, Dana Andress and many more. "Listen - Hope"

We continue today our consideration of 1 Peter 2:7-8a: Therefore, to you who believe, He is precious: but to those who are disobedient, 'The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone,' and 'A stone of stumbling and a rock of offense." We noted last time how very precious Jesus Christ is to God the Father. Our passage tells us that Jesus is also precious to those who believe in Him. But to those who reject Him, He is a stumbling stone and a rock of offense. What Peter is showing us here is that every person must either come to Christ as Lord and Savior-or reject Him. There is no middle ground. Claiming to be neutral or noncommittal about Jesus is, in fact, rejection of Him.

When Jesus came to this earth, the different responses to Him were quite clear. The apostle John tells us in John 1:11: "He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him." For the Jews, Jesus was a stumbling block. He did not meet their expectations of the promised and long-awaited Messiah. They were expecting someone to come with great power to overthrow the Roman government restore Israel to its former greatness. They could not accept a Messiah who proclaimed that His kingdom was not of this world, who taught humility and love-even toward one's enemies.

In addition, Jesus greatly angered the religious leaders. Instead of praising the Pharisees as everyone else did, Jesus exposed their hypocrisy. For this reason, the religious leaders hated Him and sought to kill Him.

But to the typical Jewish mind, the final proof that Jesus was one they could reject was the fact that He died in the most offensive manner conceivable. In Deuteronomy 21:22-23 it was

ted a sin deserving of death. and he is put to death, and you hang him on a tree, his body shall not remain overnight on the tree, but you shall surely bury him that day, so that you do not defile the land which the LORD your God is giving you as an inheritance; for he who is hanged is accursed of God." In the phrase "rock of offense" in our passage, the word translated "offense" is the Greek word scandalon, from which we get our English word "scandal." To die by crucifixion, to the Jewish mind was the most scandalous offense possible. It was proof that such a person had been written off by God. In a sense, the Jews were right, but for the wrong reason. They assumed that Jesus was condemned and crucified as being personally vile. But the reason why Jesus was indeed condemned by God was that on the cross, He was bearing the sins of His people. And as He bore our sins in His own body, God punished Him as a Substitute for those who trust in Him.

Sadly, Jesus remains a stumbling block to many today. We live in an age of tolerance, and as long as Jesus is relegated to one's personal preference, as one way among many, the world does not have too much of a problem with Him. But our passage forces us to face these questions: Do you agree with God's estimation of Jesus? Do you see in Him the only way of salvation? Jesus is precious to those who trust in Him for salvation because they see that He is the God-man and that relying on His death on the cross as payment for their sins is their only hope of salvation. They have seen that the guilt and wickedness of their sin should have plunged them into an eternal hell under God's holy wrath. But they see that Jesus bore their punishment in their place, and upon His perfect saving work they have rested their whole souls for time and eternity. Friend, are you in this category of people? Is Jesus precious to






