## For Needed Medical Equipment





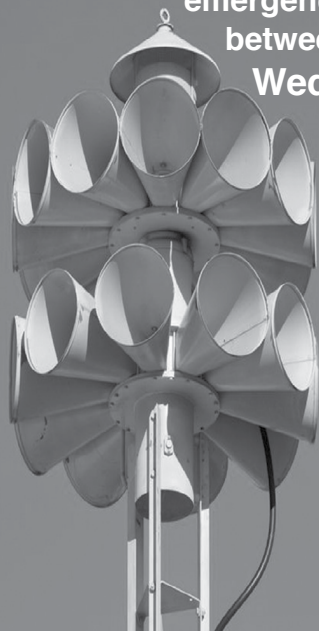

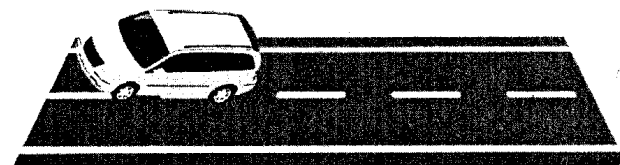

*Expressions of HOPE*

**Reflections on the Words of Life**  
by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We continue looking at 1 Peter 1:2 in our study today: "Elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace be multiplied." We saw one meaning of the word sanctify (root word of sanctification)—"dedicated or set apart to God." But there is another meaning of the word, and that is "to make pure." When God chose His people, He also determined that they would one day be perfectly pure. In other words, they would be completely free from sin in every way. As soon as a person places his or her trust in Jesus Christ, he or she is free from the guilt of sin.

There is nothing that God holds against the believer. Why? Because Jesus paid the price for that person's sin in full. But that is just the beginning of the sanctification process, which lasts throughout the life of the believer. In the process of sanctification, God deals with the presence of sin that remains in the believer's life. Though completely forgiven, the believer still has what the Bible calls the "old man." The old man is that part of the believer which still wants to sin and which still does sin.

In the sanctification process, God is gradually eradicating the old man with its sinful desires and is feeding the new man, which desires to please God. This results in the believer's becoming more and more like Jesus Christ, and this process is going to be perfectly accomplished in each and every believer. The apostle Paul brings together the same two doctrines of election and sanctification when he tells the Ephesians in Ephesians 1:4, "Just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love."

By the time the believer reaches heaven, God will see to it that there is no sin left in him. He will be completely pure and ready to dwell in God's presence forever. But in the meantime, believers are going through a process which is often painful. It is not a pleasant thing to be shown how sinful we are. God must humble us to the point that we agree with Him against ourselves that we are doing what is not right. We can be thankful that God the Holy Spirit is the One who carries on the work of sanctification, and He will never stop. If it were left up to us, we would fail completely. But the Spirit who lives in every believer will not fail. In His perfect wisdom, He knows everything about us. He knows where to work and how to proceed. He is all-powerful and can overcome even the most ingrained habits of sin. Because the believer's sanctification is in the Spirit's hands, the apostle Paul can write to the Philippians in Philippians 1:6, "Being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ." Nothing can stop the omnipotent sanctifying work of God the Holy Spirit.

# "Chloe, a Rancher's Wife"

"Chloe, a Rancher's Wife", married for 11 years, she's a Christian mother of four children and an active outdoor adventurer. She spends her time feeding farm animals, baking with her daughters, playing tractors with her two young twin sons, and, on rare occasions, reading an enjoyable book on the house's front porch built in the early 1900s. She lives in southwest North Dakota and raises Black Angus cattle with her family.

Chloe, who did not grow up on a working cattle ranch, happily admits that she was unprepared for what waited ahead after marrying her rancher husband. Today, she openly and warmly says that it was one of the best decisions she ever made in her life.

"Chloe, a Rancher's Wife", makes the following suggestions to other rancher wives who are just beginning this wonderful, occasionally demanding, special lifestyle:

...Make an effort to prepare a delicious supper meal every night, but don't count on your rancher husband to be there when it's done and ready to come off the stove. After a few days or weeks have

passed, ask your husband for a 'Date Night' in town, but realize that that could also end up being a fleeting possibility because of the weather or his workload.

...Your rancher husband will be pleased to have a full supper meal as soon as he settles things out with the livestock. Calves can find holes through fences, and bulls are sometimes stubborn.

...Always keep your cell phone and your muck boots close at hand. You may get a text message at any time asking for assistance opening a gate or helping a calf get into the barn. Whether you're wearing pajamas or not is meaningless. How quickly you can move in those muck boots will be all that matters.

...Make sure your laundry room has a door you can shut. It's unimaginably easy for the smell of gasoline, diesel, hydraulic fluid, and manure to penetrate clothing. The entire house will smell that way. Don't be shocked if the clothes, as well as your dryer, continue to smell like petroleum products even after you've cleaned them through the two rinse cycles and dried them with



a dryer sheet.

...You don't always just need to go to the grocery store, deliver kids to and from school activities, or have a hair appointment in town. Be prepared for a detour. It will probably also include a request from your rancher husband to visit the neighborhood farm/ranch store or parts store to pick up something you never knew was there. Ask a salesperson or counterperson about this mysterious object that makes you feel as though you are speaking in code, and they will be able to tell you exactly what you mean, even though there are three different versions of this item. Your rancher husband is on a tractor, so you'll have to call him three times while you're standing in front of the

clerk to find out which one he actually wants. Once he becomes upset, you'll have to hand the phone to the clerk.

...Install a reliable weather app. It is important to keep track of the weather several times a day. His and your weather apps will be compared, and there will be a discussion about which one is typically more accurate.

...Create a reliable

method for storing agricultural receipts until tax time. You will spend days gathering greasy, muddy, crumpled, and fading farm receipts from cup holders and glove boxes if your rancher husband is left to his own ways. It will be almost impossible to read those receipts months later.

"Chloe, a Rancher's Wife", most importantly, says to get ready for your

rancher husband to show up in the evening sometime, having been up since daybreak (or before), he wants to tell you about his anticipation of this year's hay crop, the excitement of seeing fresh spring calves born, and further conversation about his latest agricultural venture dreams, which he wants "YOU" to be part of.

**TROPHIES WILL BE AWARDED IN EACH CATEGORIES**

The course of fire is very simple. You shoot in three relays. You get 5 minutes to get to the bench and set up. Then you are allowed 5 minutes for sighters. A cease fire is called and then you get ready to scramble some eggs. At the commence fire signal you get 5 minutes to shoot 10 rounds. The shooter that hits the most eggs with the least rounds wins. Therefore 5 out of 5 would be a perfect round. And 15 for 15 would be a perfect score for the 3 relays. During the course of fire you may take a sighter shot but these sighter shots count towards your 10 shot limit. Any ties are broken with a sudden death shoot off.
