Soldiers follow as coffin was placed in hearse - - leading to church where last words would be said - - goodbyes given, hugs given and tears will be shed.

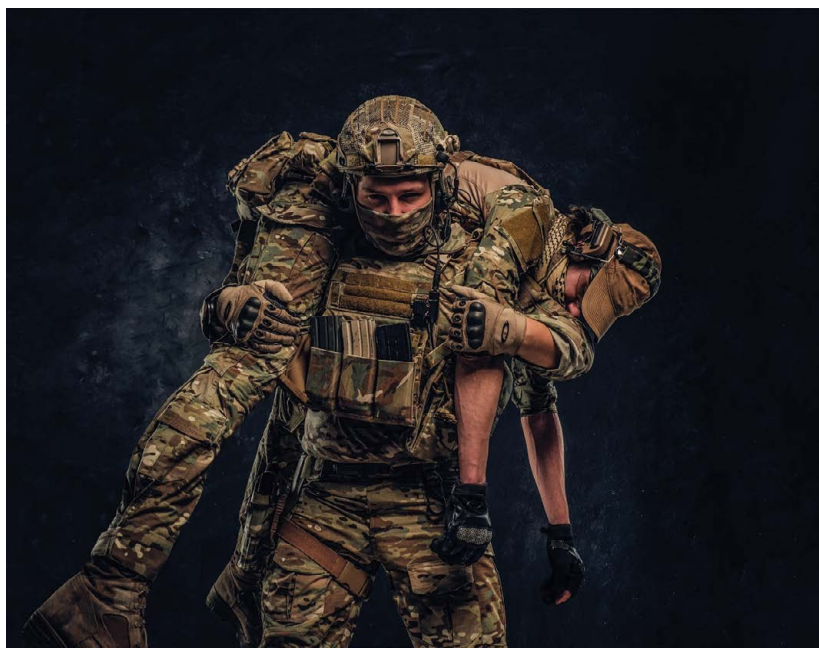
The honor guard, alert and holding back tears, lifted John out of the hearse, carried up the stairs and placed him in front of the altar. Family and friends followed - - church was packed.

Then I kinda changed and I wondered what Mom and Dad were doing and the funny thing is I remembered what you both always talked to us about and tried to convince us to be good examples to others - - We just laughed and said you were old, examples get us no where, we would never get rich by an example, We never see the world by example. You two really were weird but you were just our parents, and not to smart either.

Then one day I happened to be in a foxhole with another guy - he stood up, at the wrong moment,



got hit in the shoulder - - I was so frightened, knew I couldn't do anything for him, then to my surprise the other person in the foxhole threw him over his shoulder, ran thru rounds of fire being shot and carried him to the medic. I thought how brave, how could he do that, what a wonderful man he was - - then it dawned on me - - example - - what you taught your 4 children - - live by your example. It's not how much money you make, but what you do with it, that matters - - all these good things, phrases, words came back to me.

As the days went on, I paid close attention to all the little examples that I was shown - - one guy who was a heavy smoker, one right after the next, gave his last cigarette to a younger man who was shaking uncontrollably with fear. Another shared his last sandwich with a big fat man who we knew didn't need it - -.

Mom and Dad, I hope you get this letter, someday or another cuz I want you to keep showing us by your example that America is truly a place of freedom - may we never loose the importance of our examples. Much much love John”

Silence - - Pastor Joe wiped the tears from his eyes and closed the service with - - may we, like the service men who served, gave their lives for us, kept us free, always be an example to others of how great it is to live in America.

Jesus – “Good Shepherd”
Fr. Ben Franchuck -
St. Charles Bowman; St. Mels Rhame; St. Marys Marmarth
How often do you think of Jesus as the Good Shepherd in your life. Jesus himself says “I am the good shepherd. The Good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep” (John10:11) This sentence provides an opportunity to reflect on how we see Jesus in our lives and how his voice speaks to us. If we look at John 10:1-11 we find multiple characteristics to good shepherd and how we hear his voice.
How does the good shepherd treat his sheep? “The shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out.” (John 10:3) Think about this!

The Good Shepherd knows your name! Knowing a person’s name is proof of familiarity with that person, that they have taken the time to remember who we are. How many of us would rather a person call us by name than just say “Hey, you...” The second point is the Good Shepherd leads his sheep. When working with livestock, have you ever led from the front, and they willingly followed? I doubt it. The distinction to make here is love vs. fear. The Good Shepherd lead from the front out of love for his sheep, but also leaving the opportunity for the sheep to turn away. When we move livestock, it is usually a fear tactic. We make them move for our purposes instead of their own. The love of the Good Shepherd presented to us by him knowing

our name and leading us out in love instead of fear.

The gospel continues “he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice.” (John 10:4) I often get asked “how do I hear the voice of God and know that it is Him instead of just me or the Evil One?” It ultimately comes down to the passage “A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly.” (John 10:10) The voice of God will never condemn us! How often do we think we hear the word of God condemning us with this sense of should, would, could do these things. That is not God! God’s voice in our lives is one of invitation calling us to something more. It brings a sense of love, joy, and peace, not condemnation.

This message is one that should cut us to the heart. That Jesus is the Good Shepherd who knows our name and leads us out because of the love that he has for us. We hear his voice and choose to follow Him even though we have the choice to turn away from him. We follow the voice of love choosing to leave behind the voice of condemnation. This is the amazing truth that God has for us and should cut us to the heart to the point of following him even through the hard times in our lives. Continue to listen to the voice of God, cherish the love, peace, and joy, and take consolation in the words “I came so that they may have life and have it more abundantly.” God Bless!

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last week we concluded the third chapter of Jonah with the wonderful display of God's mercy and grace as He saw the repentance of the people of Nineveh and refrained from sending judgment upon them. What a contrast we have now in Jonah 4. This chapter is not a good one for Jonah, but the Bible does not hide the blots and stains on its characters, nor does it put the people of God on a pedestal. We read in Jonah 4:1, "But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he became angry." While God was pleased by what was happening in Nineveh, Jonah was not. In fact, he was angry. The Hebrews literally says that this "was very evil to Jonah." God's showing grace to Nineveh seemed evil to Jonah because he believed that they deserved punishment. The word used here for "became angry" actually means "to burn with anger." So apparently, forty days have now passed, and Nineveh is not destroyed, and Jonah is furious.

How many preachers do you know who are unhappy when their preaching produces such results as Jonah's did in Nineveh? Would they not all be overjoyed to see a whole city from the top down repenting and turning to God? But Jonah is

angry about this. Why? We see that in verse 2: "So he prayed to the LORD, and said, 'Ah, LORD, was not this what I said when I was still in my country? Therefore I fled previously to Tarshish; for I know that You are a gracious and merciful God, slow to anger and abundant in lovingkindness, One who relents from doing harm.'" So Jonah is furious because God is so gracious. Now we can understand why Jonah refused to obey the first time he was told to go to Nineveh. He simply could not accept God's being gracious to the enemies of Israel. He didn't want another nation besides Israel to enjoy such treatment.

Jonah obviously has no love for those to whom he was sent, and he thinks he is right in reacting the way he does. His real problem is with the very character of God Himself: "You are a gracious and merciful God, slow to anger and abundant in lovingkindness." Ironically, what Jonah says here, though he is not happy about it, is the main point of the whole book: God is a gracious and compassionate God. He had revealed this about Himself in Exodus 34:6: "The LORD, the LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abounding in goodness and truth." God spoke these words to Moses at the very time when the nation of Israel was deeply involved in idolatry, having recently made and worshiped the golden calf, and thus at a time when God would have been righteous and just to simply wipe them off the face of the earth. Jonah thinks that such grace in God should be reserved ONLY for Israel. He does

not want Ninevites to be saved. We must thank God that He is gracious to all peoples.

Lord willing, we shall have more to say about this subject next time, but I close by noting how thankful we all ought to be that God is gracious and merciful. Every person is born in a state of enmity toward God (Romans 8:7). If God gave us justice, we would all face eternity in

hell. But because He is gracious and merciful, He sent the One most dear to Him, the Lord Jesus, to pay the penalty for every sin of all who would ever place their trust in Him. By faith in Christ alone, we can be forgiven and restored to a loving relationship with God and look forward to spending eternity in heaven. Friends, please be sure that this is your condition and your hope.

I took just such a trip on Monday to Not Enough Thyme Greenhouse in Belfield and Taylor Nursery in Taylor. Denise Tibbs is celebrating her 25th year in business, a hobby that became an obsession. As I pulled into Taylor on Old Highway 10 I noticed the horse-drawn equipment on Heritage Hill. I drove to the top of the hill and heard a tractor running in one of the buildings. I snooped around and found Sherman Severson a Taylor Community Activities Board Member preparing to plant corn. Sherman graciously agreed to give me tour of the grounds and buildings. A 'Doghouse' is a small, roofed shelter specifically designed for 'Dogs'. If they reside outside in someone's yard, this is where they usually stay to rest and sleep; it is unrelated to punishment. 'Doghouses' didn't

become a common household item for people's 'Dogs' until well into the 19th century, and even then, the design would be rather rough-cut and ready because dog owners would use whatever materials they could scrape together to construct them. Did you know that the dictionary has to be updated every fifty years?

Diction is the manner of expressing thoughts with words. The word, dictionary, is a noun. Ary is a noun-forming suffix meaning, relating to. The king would not eat before each dish was sampled by the stewards just in case the food had been poisoned. There must be a moral to this story.


It seems to me that every generation of young people have their own language, and the words aren't, and never were in the dictionary. By the time the new dictionary comes out that has these words in them, a new generation of young people have developed a new language. They don't have to keep secrets anymore, just speak in their new language.

There should be a dictionary of words that have been coined by the introduction of the electronic revolution of wireless correspondence. Illust. Two young people are sitting in a booth in Wendy's. They are making google eyes at each other and they are both talking on cell phones. They are talking to each other.

The way to pronounce the word is the first thing you will find after the word. When I was in country school 84 years ago, we were taught how to pronounce a word by the icons over the word. There was a short dark dash over a vowel (A, E, I, O, U.) when it had a hard pronunciation, such as in ape. If it was a soft pronunciation, such as ah, it had a quarter circle over it. If the letter was an E and it was a soft e, such as in etch, it had that quarter circle over it. If it was a hard E such as in EEEK it had a long dash over it. A word with two oo's in it had a long line over it.

It's sign language in print. I have a Little Oxford Dictionary that doesn't have any icons at all. You have to be smarter than the dictionary.

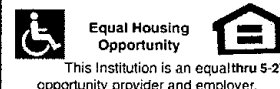
