Walking up to the porch Jo could tell that Sue was remembering same things, boys rough housing, but Jo could

see in Sues face, her remembrances were sad memories - - “Glad you came Jo” - - said Sue. “Me too” ware words as they embraced. “Just want to share some of the uplifting insights at Memorial Day service - - was different - - and Joe went on to tell Sue.

No matter where we are, never stop loving - - Sue then realized the death and pain had stopped her loving the fact that these two boys, her son and nephew had given their lives because of a love buried deeply in their hearts when they were born.

Strange Dream - maybe yes, maybe no!!

"Now is the time to start planning your sale by marking your items, finding a location and calling the community organizers to be listed," shares Luann Dart, who coordinates the event.

Participating communities holding citywide rummage sales include St. Anthony, Flasher, Carson, Elgin, New Leipzig, Mott, Regent and New England. Heil typically has sales and rural residents are welcome to host sales, too.

Anyone holding a sale is encouraged to stay open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. MT both days. Those who plan to have their sale during different hours should state those hours on the listing.

"It's discouraging for folks to drive to our communities and find that some sales have closed early, so we need to try to avoid that," Dart says.

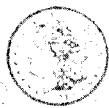

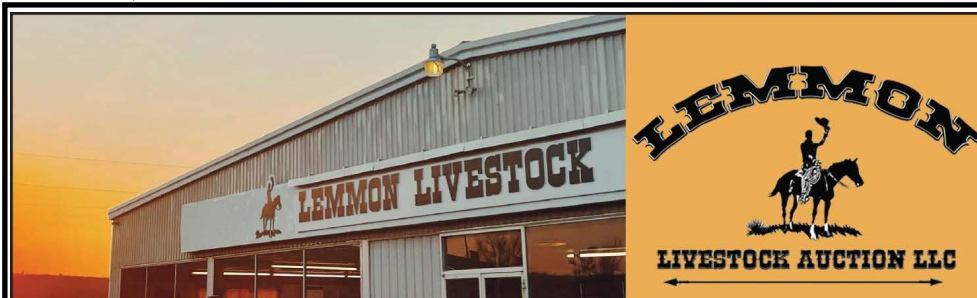

News from Senator Don Schaible District 31

The 69th Legislative Assembly adjourned May 3 around 4:00AM that Saturday Morning on the 74th day of the session. I thought it would be a good idea to provide some information on how we ended up and provide some insight in future articles on some of the details of legislation passed this session.

The budget that we passed for 2025-27 for all funding sources is \$20.26 billion. However, only 31% or \$6.26 billion is from the state General Fund. Federal Funds and State Special Funds make up \$14 billion of the total. This is a 2.6% increase in the General Fund and 3.2% increase in total spending from what was passed last session. I will get into greater detail in future articles.

Lawmakers sent a total of 601 bills to the governor's desk for consideration. Governor Armstrong signed 597 bills, including six bills that contained a total of seven line-item partial vetoes. Four bills were vetoed in their entirety which included SB2160- affecting state employee health insurance, SB 2307-Library content bill, HB 1540 School Choice Voucher bill, and SB 2261 tax credit for prison made produces. Governor Armstrong also used his line-item veto power on 7 other bills. Sec 12 of the AG Office budget which prohibits judges waiving fees to participants of the 24/7 sobriety program, Section 8 of the Park and Rec budget, providing legislator to be involved with naming or re-naming state parks, Section 6 of Legislative Branch budget that would made all of the 15th floor of the capital available to Legislative Council, it is now the home of Department of Career and Tech. Section 5 of the Ethics Commission budget would

have provided additional statutory immunity for legislators. Section 9 of the Department of Commerce budget created a \$350,000 carve out to build showers and rest area at the State Fair Facilities. Governor Armstrong also line item vetoed a section of Industrial Commissioners Budget. He took exception to a \$150,000 for a Native American Homeless Liaison but by removing that section he unintentionally vetoed \$25 million for homeless projects and \$10 million to address homelessness issues. This is one item that may need to be addressed in a special session. Budget bills take effect July 1 and policy bills take effect Aug. 1.

North Dakota lawmakers passed three ballot measures during the legislative session that will go to voters in 2026. The first one, HR 3003, would require 60% of voters to pass a constitutional ballot that would be brought forward by a citizen-initiated petitions and constitutional changes advanced by the Legislature. The second measure, SR 4007, would require the Secretary of State's Office to deny any citizen-initiated constitutional ballot petition that is comprised of more the one subject. The third measure, SR 4008, would amend the North Dakota term limits. Currently anyone may serve no more than 8 years in each legislative chamber for a total of 16 years. This measure would leave the 16-year limit in place but would allow the legislator to choose if they wanted to server all 16 years in one chamber of spend some of that time in the other chamber.

This is a very brief explanation of how we ended. I will be providing more articles of greater details of this past session starting with the property tax relief bill that was passed.



Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have been considering 1 Peter 2, which describes God's people, the church, as a building. The Lord Jesus Christ is the most important part of this building. He is Head of the church, the One who has provided salvation for all who are in it. He died for the sins of His people, and rose again and gives eternal life to those who believe in Him. This is why Jesus is called the chief cornerstone. Individual believers are called living stones in God's building.

But our passage brings us up against a solemn reality. Not everyone is a part of the church. We read in 1 Peter 2:7-8: "Therefore, to you who believe, He is precious; but to those who are disobedient, 'The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone,' and 'A stone of stumbling and a rock of offense.' They stumble, being disobedient to the word, to which they also were appointed." These verses bring out what is probably the most difficult doctrine in all the Bible for people to accept. This is the teaching that God has predestined those whom He will save and that in the exercise of His sovereign will, He has also pre-determined NOT to save some. Because this doctrine is such a hard pill for mankind to swallow,

I pray that the Holy Spirit will give us careful understanding and guard us against misunderstanding.

Perhaps the most important thing to realize about this subject is that God's predetermining who will and will not believe does not in any way subdue man's freedom to choose or reject Jesus Christ. Notice that the last sentence of verse 8, which quotes from Isaiah 8:14, tells us that those who stumble over Jesus are "disobedient to the word." Those who reject Jesus Christ reject Him because they want to. God never forces anyone to reject Christ against his or her own will. Some think that predestination means that God slams the door on people who were clambering to get into heaven. Nothing could be further from the truth. The Bible tells us plainly that those who reject Jesus Christ, finding Him a stone of stumbling and rock of offense, choose to do so. In fact, rejection of Christ is the natural inclination of every person. All of us are born in rebellion against God, and when presented with the gospel message will naturally respond with rejection. This is taught in both the Old and New Testaments. Quoting from Psalms, the apostle Paul states in Romans 3:10-11, "As it is written: 'There is none righteous, no, not one; there is none who understands; there is none who seeks after God.'" No one naturally seeks God, and the Bible tells us why. When Adam and

Eve sinned against God, the nature of the whole human race from that point on became one of sinful rebellion against God. So when God determines that some people will stumble over Jesus Christ, it does not mean that He must do something to them to make sure they will reject Christ. It simply means that God determines to let some follow their natural inclination.

This should cause us to see why salvation is such a wonderful gift of God's grace. God doesn't owe salvation to anyone. In fact, what God owes all people is eternity in hell for their natural sinful rebellion against Him. This is why the Bible teaches that for anyone to go against his or her natural inclination to reject Christ, God must do a supernatural work of grace in his or her heart.

There is more to say about this passage next time, but I hope this will cause you to ask yourself whether God has done that miracle of grace in your heart, causing you to turn from man's natural inclination and embrace the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. If this is your desire, tell God that you want to be saved. He never turns away such a request when made sincerely.

Cancer was only one of many challenges Bev faced with courage and grace. She seldom complained and enjoyed life despite enduring pain as a constant companion. She loved to read, watch TV, do puzzles, and play games and cards. She looked forward to visiting family and friends. Her will to live was inspiring.

Beverly Joan was the shy, blue eyed daughter of Elvin and Flora Ellingson born on July 15, 1939. She attended Glendo country school near their farm in Perkins County, SD. Leaving home just to attend a state spelling bee with her teacher made her homesick, so living with "sponsors" in town to attend high school was hard for her. She worked for her room and board, as a car hop at the Knotty Pine Drive-In, and as a candy striper at the hospital. Bev graduated from Hettinger High School in 1957. She earned her teaching certificate from Black Hills State Teachers College the following year and taught country school for one year. Her teaching career came to an end when she married Daryol "Tex" Byers on May 23, 1959, but she remained a teacher at heart.

Tex and Bev not only created a family partnership, they

also went into business together, owning and operating the Southwest Machine in Reeder for the next 31 years. 
