Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have been considering the practical instruction for believers in Christ from 1 Peter 2:17: "Honor all people. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the king." So far we have looked together at the first two commands, to honor all people and love the brotherhood. We come today to the third directive: "Fear God." It's likely that we don't hear much about this concept in our day, but it is a very important one. Now it is possible for the unbeliever to fear God in a sense, but that is not what Peter means here. The fear of God which the unbeliever has is the fear of getting caught and punished for doing wrong. Instinctively, people know that they should love and obey God. That is part of being created in His image. But unbelievers do not fear God rightly because they do not have a correct view of who He is.

Only the believer has the potential to fear God in the right way. That is because the Spirit of God has come into his or her life. And the Holv Spirit works through the Word of God to teach the believer that God is the most important Being there is, and what He thinks is supremely important. Furthermore, the believer is taught by the Spirit that God is awesome and holy and that if He gave us what we deserve, it would mean being sent to hell forever. This fear of Him. And the benefits leads to making Christians more of wisdom are immeasurable.

and more sensitive to sin and eager to put it away, not only to avoid the misery that sin brings, but because of the amazing grace and love of God, who loved and saved us even while we were His enemies. As believers learn more about God's character, we are led to worship and praise Him and to fear Him in the sense of holding Him in deep awe and reverence. This fear of God gives believers singleness of purpose in life, seeking to please Him by living more and more in obedience to His Brothers and sisters in the

Lord, let us be careful not to live for the approval of man. Something in all of us wants to avoid conflict and disagreement. Something in all of us wants everyone to like us. But that cannot always be the case for the believer. We are to live for God even if others disagree with us or call us fools. We must live in the fear of God even if it is not comfortable or convenient. We belong to Him. He has purchased us with the blood of Christ, and we need to keep the right perspective. We tend to live too much for the here and now. But this life is like a drop in the ocean compared to eternity. And the old saying is very true: "Only one life; 'twill soon be past; only what's done for Christ will last."

We read in Proverbs 9:10, "The fear of the Lord is the beainning of wisdom." In God's view, it is impossible to have true wisdom without the proper



Some are "renewers of the church", like Augustine of Hippo or Martin Luther, calling the people of God into better alignment with God's will and the teachings found in the Bible. God. Yet, as imperfect as we are, we are still God's beloved ones, and we can and do make a difference in the lives of those around us.

This weekend. serve All Saints' Day, remember your loved ones and others who have shaped your life and helped you grow in faith. Know also that for someone else, you may be a saint, a guide and example of faithful living. We, the people of God, are part of the saints of God. And sometimes without knowing it, we make a difference in someone's life, helping them see the light of Christ shining for them.



So the latest brou-ha-ha is regarding the White House renovations. It appears to some that a building that was constructed in 1791 should remain as it is. untouched by human hands in the interest of 'saving history' but if you research it at all, the building has actually gone through several renovations and additions over the years. Each President has had a chance to put their own 'stamp' on the building.

The White House was conyears to be constructed, and the time. However it got it's official name in 1798 because of a preventative coat of paint which gave it it's official color to protect it from the elements. There was a misconception during the war of 1812 that it had to be repainted because of the burn marks from the battle, but that is untrue, as recorded in official documents. However, it was actually set on fire by British forces during that war and had to be repaired, which was completed in 1818 at which time it was again opened to the public.

In 1902, Theodore Roosevelt occupied the position of President and he was the proud father of 6 children, so since he needed more room, construction of the West Wing was begun. In 1909, the Oval Office was added by President William

In 1927, during the Presidency of Calvin Coolidge, a third story was added, which included 18 new guest and service rooms. The roof was also replace at that time. The White House Historical Association notes that the rooftop upgrades included a solarium, or a 'sky parlor' frequently used for theraputic reasons by the first family.

In 1929, President Herbert Hoover remodeled the West structed in 1791 and took 8 Wing, including reconstruction work in the basement level and John Adams was the first to ac-remodeling the first floor; after tually reside in it, even though it a fire on Christmas Eve, the was still under construction at West Wing was repaired and reopened in 1930.

In 1934, President Franklin D. 
In 1948 through the 1950's, under President Harry Truman, the White House was completely gutted, leaving only the exterior walls behind. When the dust settled, the newly fireproofed building reopened with a 2 story basement and walls reinforced with concrete and 660 tons of steel according to the White House Historical Association.

In 1962, President John F Kennedy constructed the modern Rose Garden. Jacqueline Kennedy's primary work on the White House was a comprehensive restoration of its rooms and furnishings, transforming it into a living museum of American history. She established a committee to raise funds, personally appealed for historic items, and created the first White House guidebook to support the proj-

In 1970, President Nixon converted a third-floor bedroom into the White House game room complete with a pool and a ping pong table. A new outdoor pool was constructed by President Gerald Ford to replace the original pool.

Every President since 1952 has had the opportunity to change the White House, some being just modernizations, and some being major construction or reconstruction projects. The latest changes are no different than what has been done before, so personally I am not sure what all the fuss is about. The White House is the house of the people and will remain so long after this administration is no longer there. Personally, I am happy that they have all chosen to maintain one of the symbols of our country in such great condition and that it will also remain open for the people to tour when they are able to visit our Nations Capitol. It is something that every American can be proud of. God Bless you All.




