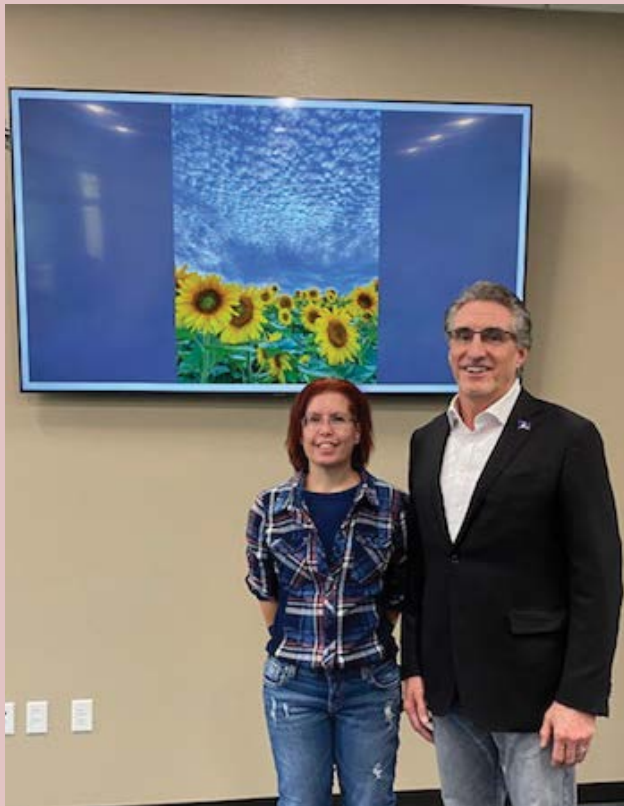

Child Find Program Needs Your Help

Every North Dakota child is like a snowflake, unique in his or her abilities, family heritage and potential to grow. But some infants and children face special challenges in getting a good

start in life.

The West River Student Services Unit and regional School districts have designated the week of November 14-18, 2022, a Child Find Week in their communities. Child Find was established through the Individuals with Disabilities Education Im-

provement Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act to help identify infants and children with delays in growth and development who may need supports and/or services.

It's important that all parents keep track of their children's growth and development. Not all children do the same things

at the same ages, but there are some general guidelines. Does the child's progress seem typical? Are there signs for concern?

Sometimes parents are too close to their own children to notice delays. A friendly comment from a neighbor or relative may help them take the first steps toward getting help.

If you are concerned that your child isn't developing as quickly or doing the same things as others of his or her age, contact your local school principal or West River Student Services at (701) 483-1257 ext. 4. A selective screening may be scheduled to help determine whether a delay is present. If so, special activities or services may be offered to help your child grow, develop, and learn. The sooner a child is identified, the sooner he or she can be helped.





A Little Birdie Told Me: "Pioneer Trails Museum in Bowman North Dakota is a Natural and Cultural History Gem."
Pioneer Trails Regional Museum is number 20 on my tour of museums in the EidoConnect circulation area. Having lived in Bowman for 20 years it wasn't my first visit to the PTRM, I found many new and interesting displays.

My favorite on this trip would be the Messer Pottery display. What attracted me to the high-fire stoneware are the unique glazes formulated by Joe Messer; the glazing on the pieces is absolutely stunning.

Joe Messer was born at Buffalo Springs, ND after graduating from Bowman High School he served in the Navy for 3 years. Joe married Eunice Olson in 1947 and in 1951 attended the Kansas City Art Institute where he studied oil painting, ceramics and sculpting. The Messer family returned to Bowman and both Joe & Eunice worked at the Farmer's Union Elevator with the hope of one day opening a pottery shop.

An old chicken coup served as the first pottery shop, the kilns were handmade by Joe using a "cut and try" process. Joe

repurposed an auto transmission, brake drum and a Maytag washer into needed equipment for the shop. Ceramics by Messer was established in 1952. The business moved in 1957 to a garage and became known as "The Pot Shop!" Today that would attract new type of clientele.

The Pot Shop closed five years later when Joe accepted a job at Josten's in Owatonna, MN as an artist, Joe worked for Josten's until his death in 1987.

Pioneer Trails Regional Museum is blessed to have two very knowledgeable staff members: Jean Nudell and Darrah Stephen.

Museum Administrator, Jean Nudell a native of Hettinger North Dakota got her Bachelor's Degree in Business and English from then Jamestown College: Jean went onto get her Masters Degree in Library Information & Science with an emphasis on Cultural Heritage Information Management from the Catholic University of America in Washington DC.

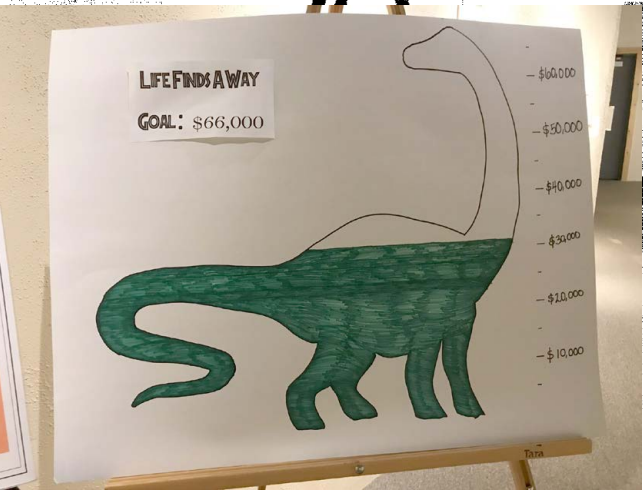
Paleontology Curator Darrah Steffen received her Bachelor's Degree in Geology from the South Dakota School of Mines and her Master's Degree in Geosciences from Fort Hays State University in Kansas.

The Museum is currently raising funds to improve sever-

al of the displays. The \$66,000 goal will help give the Triceratops exhibit a facelift, build a Champsoasaurus exhibit and install an exhibit featuring cats and animals that lived in the grasslands of ND over 32 million years ago. So far \$30,000 has been raised, if you are interested in donating contact the museum.

A good time to visit the museum will be December 7th for Santa Day in Bowman. The museum will be open until 8:00 pm with a sale in the gift shop. Museum hours are May - Sept 9-5 Mon - Sat. Reflections on the Words of Life

Last time we considered a brief introduction to the book of Jonah, and we are ready to begin digging into chapter 1. Jonah 1:1: "Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah the son of Amittai." Several Old Testament books begin with similar words. "The word of the Lord" is a phrase of grace in itself because it tells us that God condescends to communicate with His people in a way that can be understood. We speak words, and God uses words to reveal Himself and His will to us. The whole of creation reveals God, as "The heavens declare the glory of God" (Psalm 19:1). Yet it is His word that teaches us the way of salvation through faith in Christ alone.

Receiving the word of the Lord was the authenticating mark of a true prophet. It was a momentous thing for God to break into history and speak to mankind by means of a prophet. We are so used to having the Bible that we may forget that there were times when people had few of God's messages in writing and were dependent upon God's communicating through His prophets. We are far more privileged than Jonah and those who heard him because we have the complete revelation God wants us to have

in His word, the Bible. The message that Jonah received from God was actually for one of Israel's enemies: Assyria, and in particular its capital, Nineveh. Eventually the northern kingdom of Israel would be taken captive by Assyria, never to be part of Israel again. God told Jonah, "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry out against it; for their wickedness has come up before Me" (Jonah 1:2). There is an important principle here. God uses people to reach other people. God has all means at His disposal and could reveal His message without the aid of a prophet. But His way of reaching people is to use those who are already His people. Believers in the Lord Jesus Christ have a commission to take the gospel to the whole world (Matthew 28:18-20).

Note here the sovereignty of God. He does not ASK Jonah but TELLS Jonah to go. With no prior warning, He simply tells one of His creatures WHAT to do and WHEN to do it. No other information is given. No permission is asked. Psalm 135:6: "Whatever the LORD pleases He does, in heaven and in earth, in the seas and in all deep places." He is answerable to no one.

The words "Nineveh, that great city," indicate Nineveh's status as the capital of Assyria, a country that inspired terror in Israel. Israel was already paying tribute to Assyria, with

POTATO DUMPLING SOUP

5 c. water

6 chicken bouillon cubes

1 sm. onion chopped

2 lg. carrots shredded

1 stalk celery, cut up

1 tsp. parsley

6 potatoes cut up

pepper to taste

1 pt. half and half or 1 can evaporated milk

1/4 c. butter

3 eggs

flour

Bring water, chicken bouillon cubes, onions, carrots, celery, parsley, pepper and potatoes to a boil until the vegetables are tender. Add half and half or evaporated milk and butter. Bring to a boil. Prepare dumplings by mixing 3 beaten eggs, salt to taste and enough flour to make a stiff dough. Drop bits of dough into liquid and simmer for 15 minutes. Can add mashed potatoes to thicken if desired.

threat of further takeover looming. For God to send a prophet to Israel was common. But to send one to Israel's enemy was almost unheard of and without precedent. Many prophets prophesied against the Gentile nations, but they did so from Israel. Only Jonah was actually SENT to a foreign nation. Here again we see the amazing grace of God. Jonah's assignment is a foreshadowing of the astounding expression of God's grace found in Romans 5:6-10: "For when we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. For scarcely for a righteous man will one die; yet perhaps for a good man someone would even dare to die.

But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him. For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life." All of us are born "ungodly," "sinners," and "enemies," as expressed in these verses. But God sent His Son to pay the price for the sins of His people even in that condition. Friend, please be sure you are trusting in that payment alone for your salvation.

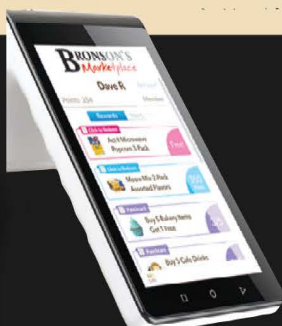

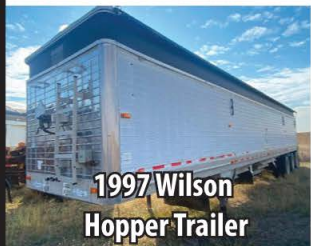

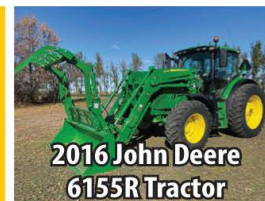

"Tasks of a County Commissioner"

County Commissioners are responsible for overseeing the county's management and administration, representing county interests at the State and Federal Levels, participating in long-range planning, and managing the county budget and finances. Commissioners are a county's key policymakers, overseeing the operation and administration of the county. Commissioners are the elected officials of a County's Legislative Branch, the County Board of Commissioners serves in a similar role as a City Councilmember or a State Representative or State Senator.

Each Commissioner is elected from their specific geographic County District. Your County Commissioner is responsible for representing the interests of your district's area of people during regular meetings of the County Board and at Official State and Federal Government Events.

County Commissioners

meet regularly in policy-specific sub-committees to thoroughly examine county issues. The number and topics of sub-committees are unique to each county, but most counties include committees related to the topics of parks, public health, public safety, etc. Commissioners can serve on their county's board of appeal and equalization to respond to disputes regarding appraised property values.

A Commissioner's time is often spent serving on advisory boards or commissions that provide direct and indirect county services. These include airports, libraries, community corrections, local public health boards, county social services, daycare centers, nursing homes, hospitals, and joint solid waste commissions.

County Commissioners also serve as county representatives at public and private industry events at the State and Federal levels. Commissioners com-

municate their home county's concerns to State Legislators and Federal Policymakers and promote economic development in the county at events for business groups and civic organizations.

State Law can define the roles and responsibilities of County Commissioners; including what Commissioners can regulate through ordinances and resolutions. Commissioners develop and adopt County Laws on a wide variety of topics such as public health, parks, solid waste management, county roads and highways, zoning, and land use.

One of the central roles County Commissioners perform in county management is overseeing the personnel system. Commissioners authorize personnel rules that affect county employee recruitment, classification, compensation, and termination. In some counties, County Commissioners hire an Administrative Head of the County who is responsible for the day-to-day management of the county's services. Commissioners are also responsible for filling mid-term vacancies for the elected county offices; for example, the Auditor, Treasurer, Sheriff/Coroner, County Attorney, or other county elected officials.

County Commissioners also participate in activities that shape the future of their county through long-range planning initiatives, such as:

...Capital Improvement Plans: Which are timelines for improvements to county assets such as administrative buildings, roads, bridges, and public works facilities. And-

...The Comprehensive Plan: Which is a guide for the future development of the county or any portion of the county including the development of policies, statements, goals, and interrelated plans.

In County Budgets and County Finances, County Commissioners have the difficult tasks of approving the annual county budget and determining the county's tax levy. Commissioners have to balance the needs of the county with the ability to raise revenues and pay for mandated state and federal programs. In their budget decisions, commissioners consult with county departments and their county constituents to decide the funding for programs and projects in transportation, human services, public safety, public health, and energy and environment.

Mandated State Programs (sometimes underfunded) are a major cost driver for County Commissions. So Commissioners then have to authorize the receipt of and/or application for State and Federal Grants to pay for these programs, in addition to using local property tax dollars to supplement costs.

County Commissioners also develop and approve the County's Capital Improvement Budget, which includes projects that usually last multiple years and require a significant public funding investment. Commissioners may adopt a capital improvement plan spanning several years and covering a wide variety of county needs from new road maintenance vehicles to remodeling a historic courthouse or other county-necessi-

tated buildings.

Once County Commissioners know the total expenditures of The County Budget, they determine The Property Tax Levy. Outside of raising the levy, Commissioners may explore other revenue sources such as new taxes and fees to cover the costs of the Operating and Capital Budgets. For example, Pennington County Commissioners (County Seat/ Rapid City, South Dakota) in 2021 implemented a Wheel Tax Ordinance that is currently charging \$2 per wheel with a \$24 per vehicle maximum which has generated \$1.4 million to help aid their road and bridge work needs. Furthermore, some County Commissions have brought a Local Option Sales Tax up for a vote in order to help support county roads and highways, and other transportation cost projects.

In addition to the Budget Approval Process, County Commissioners are responsible for the ongoing financial concerns of the county. Commissioners also settle invoices, bill expenses of the county, and monitor its overall fiscal health through reports from county officials and other county staff employees.

As of 2020, there are currently 3,143 counties and county-equivalents in the 50 states and the District of Columbia. If the 100 county equivalents in the U.S. territories are counted, then the total is 3,243 counties and county-equivalents in the United States of America.

In closing, I believe that the 'Hard-Working Leadership Tasks' of America's County Commissioners is a productive example of "How" these elected public servants help to move 'Our United States' beyond

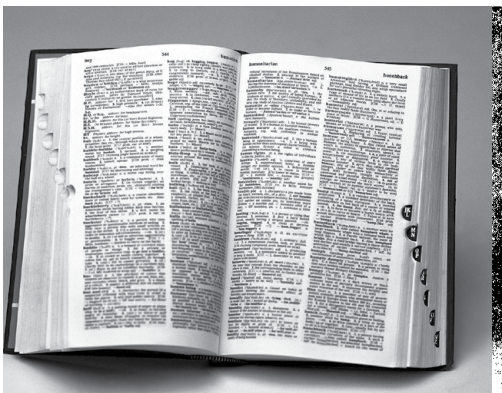
Bowman County FFA Attended the National FFA Convention and Expo

WRHS Foundation Is Back For 5th Consecutive Giving Hearts Day!

West River Health Services Foundation is now in its 5th year of being a member of the Impact Foundation. This fundraising coaching Foundation was created by the Dakota Medical Foundation and the Alex Stern Family Foundation to foster educational growth for nonprofit organizations in North Dakota and western Minnesota. Our \$825 annual membership **allows us to be part of the single largest online giving day in North Dakota – "Giving Hearts Day" (GHD) on February 9, 2023.**

Last year, GHD raised \$26.6 million from over 41,000 donors! Since 2008, or over the past 15 years, GHD has raised \$138 million! In addition to being part of GHD, our WRHS Foundation also receives the opportunity to promote other campaigns online (Healthcare Heroes Endowment Fund, Partners in Health Club, etc.), network with other nonprofits (we are part of a twelve member consortium in southwest ND for GHD), attend regular coaching sessions by trained fundraising professionals and more.

Now, our WRHS Foundation will be one of 538 nonprofit options for people to give toward on GHD, **February 9, 2023**. All people have to do is go online on this day to **givingheartsday.org**, type in "West River Health Services Foundation" and our screen will pop up describing our mission, who is providing the matching funds, and determine where their funds are going. In addition, **people can now write checks to "WRHSF," any time prior to February 9th, while at the same time writing "Giving Hearts Day" in the memo section of their check.** Cash gifts, as well as credit card gifts to our wrhs.com/giving website, do not count as Giving Hearts Day gifts.

Our WRHS Foundation has witnessed the positivity of Giving Hearts Day – raising over \$728,000 the last four years! Overall, our WRHS Foundation raised \$216,227 for Giving Hearts Day last year!

Our first goal this coming year is to raise \$100,000 to match our \$100,000 Matching Funds gift from the Roger Follmer Estate. Our second goal is to eclipse the \$250,000 milestone, which we have never done in four years of GHD.

Currently, our new "Healthcare Heroes Endowment Fund" has raised \$265,241 in only thirteen months (with a large amount of that raised leading up to and on GHD last year). Our initial goal was to raise

\$500,000 in five years or less. But what do you say, we all pull together and do it in three years?! We're already 53% there, in only a little over a year! We hope you'll consider a gift to our "Healthcare Heroes," as we desperately need more caregivers. Thank you area supporters and the Impact Foundation. Together we are making a difference for our top-notch rural healthcare "close to home."

As part of our membership, we are required to raise a minimum of \$3,000 in Matching Funds in advance of GHD. This year we have raised a whopping \$100,000 in Matching Funds from the Roger Follmer Estate. Plus, recently this estate gifted another \$250,000! Roger was a successful, lifelong Hettinger resident who farmed his family's land all his life. Thank you Roger for stepping up to the plate and gifting 25% of your estate for our patients. We are grateful.

Now our goal is to "match the match" or raise another \$100,000 or more prior to and on GHD on February 9th – either by acquiring checks ahead of time written out to "WRHSF" with "Giving Hearts Day" written in the memo section or giving by credit card gifts on February 9th at givingheartsday.org/westriverhealthservicesfoundation. We are asking that donors consider giving to our current "Healthcare Heroes Endowment Fund," as we are desperately trying to hire enough healthcare personnel to take care of our area citizens. Currently we have 45 job openings! Therefore, we have begun a campaign to raise \$500,000 within five years for our "Healthcare Heroes Endowment Fund." As mentioned above, we have raised \$265,241 so far. The interest from this fund will be utilized for: 1) significant academic loans for college upperclassmen pursuing a healthcare degree, and/or 2) signing bonuses for critical top-priority positions at West River and Western Horizons, and/or 3) bonuses for current healthcare heroes at West River and Western Horizons, and/or 4) reinvested to build more interest. Since we have not witnessed many scholarship recipients returning to apply for jobs at West River or Western Horizons, we are hoping to offer significant \$5,000-\$10,000 loans, whereby college upperclassmen contractually agree to apply for a job with us upon graduation. Their entire loan plus interest will be forgiven within one or two years of employment here (at \$500 per month).

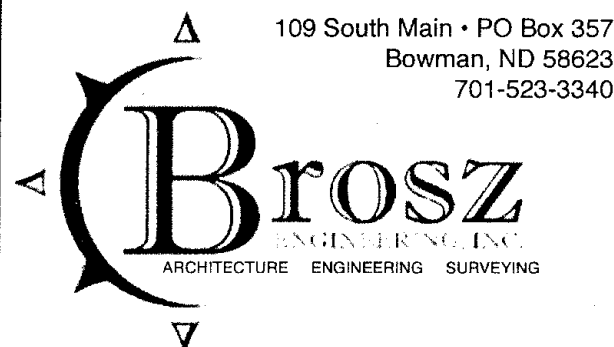
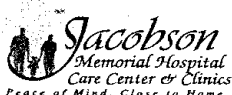

Today, I want to reflect on a very real experience of life and how I see God at work in my life hoping that someone can relate and see God in their own life. After Mass last weekend, I headed home to do a little deer hunting with my dad. I had a doe tag, so I figured it would be an easy hunt. I was wrong! We drove around Sunday evening and Monday seeing absolutely nothing. The blizzard changed the pattern of the deer so much that we saw absolutely nothing and gave up and went home. On the way home, completely by chance, we ran across a very nice buck just off the road. Not having a gun buck tag, we were both disappointed. Thankfully I had a bow tag and figured we better at least try (I've never bow hunted before). After getting permission from the landowner, I grabbed my bow and started walking towards the deer. I got within 20 yards of him before he jumped up and ran

off. Right after he jumped up, the doe he was with jumped up and ran off with him before my dad could even get a gun out. This was not the brightest moment in our hunting careers, but the reality of what happened.

Why am I sharing this? As any good hunter, on the way home, the what ifs started to run through our conversation. What if I would have shot at the buck laying down. What if I would have knelt so he would have had to get up to see me. What if my dad would have come with me with the gun. All things that could have changed the outcome of going home with nothing. I started getting down on myself that I was "unsuccessful." The reality though is I got to spend a day and a half with my dad, experiencing God's creation, and the providence that He has. It is what Matthew Kelly would call a Holy Moment. An experience of God in the ordinary events of our lives. While I could have gotten down, I realized that it was a great gift to go home with nothing because it helped me to see how God was at work in this very real experience.

We all encounter Holy Moments every day. These moments in our lives that by all accounts should cause some hurt or pain, but actually cause joy since we see God in them. Matthew Kelly starts his book "Holy Moments" with a story about monks in a failing monastery. What changed their lives was a simple point: "The Messiah is among you." This is a very true

statement. We live in a world that has abandoned God, but He is still among us and very active. Even more, we are coming to the Christmas season in which we prepare even more for his coming. Let's take this time before Christmas and prepare our hearts to see Jesus in our daily lives, even when it is hard. 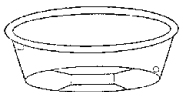


